## **Concept A: Vocabulary:**

- 1. Convention: A national meeting of a political party, where delegates formally elect a party's nominee
- 2. Dark Horse: A long-shot candidate
- 3. Delegate: A representative to a party's national convention chosen by local voters to vote for a particular candidate. Each state is assigned a certain number of delegates based on its population.
- 4. GOP: Grand Old Party, nickname of the Republican Party
- 5. Grass Roots: Political activity that originates locally, or arises from ground level
- 6. Ideology: An integrated system of ideas about politics, values, and culture. Those who espouse an ideology are sometimes criticized as rigid and narrow-minded.
- 7. Incumbent: A current officeholder

## Role play1: Interview with Narendra Modi:

### Interviewer: Is it frustrating that many people still define you by 2002?
