Basic Sentence Formation

Class Objective:

I am able to form simple sentences in Malayalam.

Concept A: Introduction to basic sentence formation

In Malayalam most of the sentences end with the verb.

Examples:

I bet him. Naan avan adichu

I bought milk Naan pal vangi

Note: Malayalam is a word free order language. Generally Malayalam sentences have a Subject Object Verb (SOV) pattern. It can be SVO or OSV sometimes.

Example:

He went to the hostel. Avan hostelikke poye (SOV) Hostelik-ke adheham poye (OSV) Avan/adheham poye hostelik-ke (SVO)

English	Malayalam
He is a teacher.	Addeham oru addhyapakanan. അദ്ദേഹം ഒരു അദ്ധ്യാപകനാണ്.
He came.	Avan vannu. (informal) അവൻ വന്നം.
This is mine.	Ithu entetan. ഇത് എന്റേതാണ്.
She ate.	Aval kayiccu. (informal) അവൾ കഴിച്ചു.
He came fast.	Avan vegathil vannu. (informal) അയാൾ വേഗത്തിൽ വന്നം.
