Class Objective: To understand how to make positive, negative and interrogative future perfect

sentences.

The three main Perfect tenses are:

Past Perfect

Present Perfect

Future Perfect

In today's lesson, we will study about Future Perfect tense.

Concept A: What is Future Perfect and when is it used?

Definition: Future perfect is a verb form that describes an event that is expected or planned to finish at a point of time in the future. Perfect form means a completed action, therefore future perfect is the

action that is expected to complete in the future.

Example sentences:

Saurabh <u>will have</u> cleaned the house by this time.

Before she meets the professor, Geeta will have finished her presentation.

• It will have completed 10 years next year from the time we met.

• I will have slept by the time you reach home.

By this time next week, his training will have finished.

Concept B: How to make a positive Future perfect sentence

Sentence construction: Subject + will/shall + have + past particle of the verb

Example sentences:

They <u>will have</u> graduated by June next year.

By the time Deepa's plane lands, the office will have closed.
