



Hacer (to do/to make)

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Class Objective

To understand the verb hacer and be able to use it in making phrases.



Concept A: The present conjugation of 'Hacer':

- I do Yo hago.
- You do Tú haces.
- He does Él hace.
- We do Nosotros hacemos.
- You-all do Vosotros hacéis.
- They do Ellos hacen.

• Although hacer often is translated as "to make" or "to do," it can be

used in many other ways, including time and weather expressions.

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Concept B: Uses

• To indicate the making or creation of something: A number of
translations of the verb can be used in English depending on what is
being made.
1. Vamos a hacer una página web. (We're going to design a web
page.)
2. El árbol hace sombra. (The tree provides shade.)
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Concept B: Uses

As a general verb meaning "to do": Hacer can refer to an activity in general, or it can replace a verb used earlier. Hago mal en no estudiar. (I did wrong not to study.) 1. As part of an expression or idiom indicating an act of some kind: 1. ¿Quieres hacer una pregunta? (Do you want to ask a question?)
