Concept A: Phrasal verbs- Blow

Blow away Meaning and Examples

1 Blow away

- Meaning: Cause to go away by blowing, or by wind
- Example: He blew away the dust which had collected on the book.

2 Blow away

- Meaning: Disperse or to depart on currents of air
- Example: I didn't have to rake. The leaves just blew away.

3 Blow away

- Meaning: Kill (someone) by shooting them
- Example: The kid just blew the clerk away.

4 Blow away

- Meaning: Flabbergast; to impress greatly
- Example: The critics were blown away by their latest album.

Blow down, Blow off Meaning and Examples

1 Blow down

- Meaning: Knock over with an air current, most often wind
- Example: I'll huff, and I'll puff, and I'll blow your house down.

2 Blow off

- Meaning: Let steam escape through a passage provided for the purpose
- Example: The engine or steamer is blowing off.

3 Blow off

• Meaning: Shirk or disregard
