

Countable and Uncountable nouns

Class Objective:

I will be able to list out and use countable and uncountable nouns in Dutch.

Concept A: Countable nouns

As in English, countable nouns represent those nouns that can be counted.

- Het huis - the house
- Het bord - the plate
- De schoen - the shoe
- De bloem - the flower

Expressions:

Wij bouwen twee huizen.	We build two houses.
Er staat een bord op tafel.	There is a plate on the table.
Hij heeft zes paar schoenen.	He has six pairs of shoes.
Jullie krijgen bloemen van haar.	You get flowers from her.

Concept B: Uncountable nouns

- De liefde - the love
- De melk - the milk
- Het geld - the money
- De muziek - the music

Expressions:

Hij geeft haar veel liefde.	He gives her a lot of love.
Ik drink graag veel melk.	I like to drink a lot of milk.
Wij verdienen veel geld.	We make a lot of money.
Zij luisteren de hele dag muziek.	They listen to music the entire day.

Concept C: More about countable and uncountable nouns

Countable nouns can be modified by denominators, prototypically numbers, and have a morphologically marked plural form:
