## Concept A: Particles

### Particle へ

#### - Note -

In general へ is pronounced “he”, but when it is a particle, it is pronounced “e”.

- ・ へいわ へいわ heiwa (noun): peace
- ・ 山 やま へ い 行く yama e iku (particle): I will go to the mountain

This particle may be translated as the preposition “to” in English.



## Concept A: Particles

- 2) Destination : Like the particle に, the particle へ can also indicate the destination.

 らいねん  
来 年 ケン は イギリス へ 行きます。  
Ken will go to the UK next year.


 こんしゅうまつ  
今 週 末 イタリア へ 旅行 します。  
I'm going on a trip to Italy this weekend.




## Concept A: Particles

### Particle を

- 1) The particle を indicates the direct object of a transitive verb.

 きのう にほん えいが み  
昨日 日本の映画を見ました。  
Yesterday I saw a Japanese movie.

 まいあさ の  
毎朝 コーヒーを飲みます。  
I drink coffee every morning.




## Concept A: Particles

### Particle に

The Particle に may be translated as the preposition “to / at” in English.

■ 3) Specific time : The particle に indicates a time.

 なんじ でんしゃ  
何時に電車は来ますか。  
What time will the train come?

 8時<sup>じ</sup>に<sup>で</sup>うちを出ます。  
I leave home at 8 a.m.
