#### Concept A - Pronominal / Pronoun Adverbs:

- Pronoun adverbs are the combination of a preposition and a pronoun. They are used only to refer to things (not for living things).
  - Beispiel: daran, darauf, hieraus, hierauf, woraus, wovon, usw.
  - The adverbs wo and da coupled with prepositions become helpful tools in day-to-dayGerman conversation. By themselves, wo means "where" and da means "there", butby adding prepositions, it changes their whole meaning.



#### Concept B - Adverbs "da-" + preposition:

- When objects following prepositions refer to inanimate objects or things,
- and we want to say 'with it', 'for it', 'to it', etc., we cannot simply replace the
- full noun with apronoun. Instead, German replaces the noun with da-, which
- it attaches to the front of the preposition.
- The adverbs "da-" + preposition are used very often and their translation
- depends on the context.



## Concept B - Adverbs "da-" + preposition:

ADVERB	MEANING
dar <b>an</b>	at it
dar <b>auf</b>	On it
dar <b>aus</b>	From it
da <b>bei</b>	In the process , at the same time
da <b>gegen</b>	Against it



### Concept B - Adverbs "da-" + preposition:

dar <b>in</b>	In it
da <b>mit</b>	With it
dar <b>über</b>	About it
da <b>zu</b>	additionally
da <b>für</b>	For it
dadurch	Thereby, in doing so
