Let us learn the basic sentence structures in Hindi.



## Concept A : Basic Sentence Structure

- Hindi sentence structure can be confusing at times but generally tend to follow a Subject-Object-Verb pattern.
- Hindi nouns have genders: Masculine and Feminine.
- Masculine usually ending in “aa” (आ) and Feminine usually ending in “i” or “iya” (इ और ई)

Example :

Masculine	In Hindi	Feminine	In Hindi
Husband	पति (pati)	Wife	पत्नी (patni)
Boy	लड़का (ladka)	Girl	लड़की (ladki)



## Concept A : Basic Sentence Structure

Example sentences:

	Subject	+	Object+	Verb
I eat food -	मैं		खाना	खाता हूँ।
	(Main)		(khana)	(khaata hoon)
I go to market-	मैं		बाजार	जाता हूँ।
	(Main)		(bazaar)	(jaata hoon)



## Concept B : Five basic sentence structures

There are five basic sentence structures in English.

### 1. Subject-Verb

- The boy plays.

Ladka Khelta hai.

लड़का खेलता है।

- Jaya eats.

Jaya khaati hai.

जया खाती है।



## Concept B : Five basic sentence structures

### 2. Subject-Verb-Object

- I love apples.

Mujhe seb pasand hai.

मुझे सेब पसंद हैं।

- Bittu kicks the ball.

Bittu gend ko kick marta hai.

बिट्टू गेंद को किक मारता है।
