## Grammar Concept A: N1 no N2

You learned in Lesson 1 that の (no) is used to connect two nouns when N1 modified N2. Now you will learn two other uses of this の.

1) N1 explains what N2 is about.

これは コンピュータの本 ほんです。

Korewa konpyuuta no hon desu.

This is a book about computers.



## Grammar Concept A: N1 no N2

2) N1 explains who owns N2.

**これは わたしの本<sup>ほん</sup>です。**

Korewa watashi no hon desu.

This is my book.

- N2 is sometimes omitted when it is obvious.

- When N2 means a person, however, you cannot omit it.



## Grammar Concept A: N1 no N2

あれは だれの かばんですか。

Arewa dare no kaban desu ka.

Whose bag is that?

...佐藤さ とうさんのです。

Satou san no desu.

...It's Satou's.



## Grammar Concept A: N1 no N2

この かばんは あなたのですか。

Kono kaban wa anata no desu ka?

Is this bag yours?

...いいえ、わたしのじゃありません。

lie, watashino jya arimasen.

... No, it's not mine.
