Cardinal Numbers & Ordinal numbers

الأعداد الأصلية والأرقام الترتيبية

Class objective : We are going to learn cardinal and ordinal numbers in Arabic language and its usage along with how to make it.

Concept A- In this concept we will learn cardinal numbers along with examples and pronunciation.

Cardinal Numbers: 1 - 10

Here are the numbers from 1 to 10 in Arabic. The numbers are written out fully next to the symbol for each number.

1	Wahid	واحد	1
2	Isnan	اثنان	۲
3	Salasatun	נולנה	٣
4	Arba'atun	أربعة	٤
5	Khamsatun	خمسة	0
6	Sit'tatun	ستة	۲
7	Sabatun	سبعة	٧
8	Samaniyatun	ثمانية	٨
9	Tisatun	تسعة	ď
10	Asharatun	عشرة	١.

- First of all, you need to be able to recite these numbers in order without hesitation. Teach them to yourself now before you go on. You also need to be able to recognize the symbols immediately, so teach them to yourself right now too. Then continue.
- I said that you must be able to recite the numbers above easily and recognize their symbols. So go back and do it.
- Okay now we will discuss these numbers further. We will start with the number 1. The number 1 in Arabic is واجد and ١ is its symbol. If you want to say "one book" in Arabic you have two choices. The first is just to say "book," كَتَابٌ "this means both "a book" and "one book." However, واجد can follow the noun for emphasis. Thus "one book" can be rendered كَتَابٌ واحدٌ Since واحد Since واحد

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
