

Jumbled sentences 1

Class Objective: I will be able to understand and converse on this topic.

Concept A-

Jumbled sentences are words of a sentence or few parts of a sentence are mixed up (jumbled).

You are to rearrange those parts to make the sentence meaningful.

For example: In the evening / do television/ your parents watch?

Answer: Do your parents watch television in the evening.

In the first sentence, the words are mixed up (jumbled).

Hence we cannot deduce any Clear meaning of the sentence. But when we have rearranged the mixed up words, the sentence is giving a clear meaning.

Concept B- The objective is to reorder the words or phrases into a syntactically coherent and complete sentence. Following are some exercises that you can do to make yourself better at solving jumbled sentences.

- Person / my / is a / grandfather/ very busy.
Answer: My grandfather is a very busy person.
- God / to / we / daily / pray.
Answer: We pray to God daily.
- hear / the / cannot / old man / clearly .
Answer: The old man cannot hear clearly.
- By car / office / to / goes / Richard / his
Answer: Richard goes to his office by car.

Some more examples:

1. to be a/kind/this was/of protest/considered/unique
2. could not/the soldiers/Alexander/to move/persuade/ahead
3. finally/them/he/asked/to retreat
4. final/his/this/decision/was
5. lead/army/the/the/decision/to/further/move back

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
