Concept A: Vocabulary needed to discuss the topic

Preferable - more desirable.

Window seat- a seat next to a window in a bus, train or aircraft

Aisle- seat situated at the end of a row.

Concept B: Sitting in front or back when travelling in car

- We need to always wear the seat belt wherever we sit in a car.
- Children should ideally sit in the back seat of the car as they might disturb the person driving the car.
- The seat choice can impact the safety of the person.
- The middle seat in the back of the car is the safest position.
- In the case of elderly person, it is best to sit in the front seat in the car.
- It is easy to get down from a window seat.
- If you are in a cab, then sitting at the back is preferable as you can continue to work or talk on your phone.
- The person sitting next to the driver must not fall sleepy or disturb the driver.

Concept C : Sitting near window in a bus

- Getting a window seat is usually rare considering the number of people using the transport service. It gives extra joy to the whole trip.
- Since the bus is at the height, the view is beautiful.
- It gives total privacy, no one can disturb you by talking or asking unnecessary questions.
- We can look out the window and enjoy the view.
- We can rest our head and doze away.
- We can listen to music on our phone.
- There is no disturbance from the other passengers or the conductor.
- We can dream and ponder, watching the outside world.
- We can enjoy seeing the city with a different view watching the blue sky, the green trees, the other vehicles on the road, the birds and people from everyday life.
- We can notice little things which we don't usually do.
- There is a feeling of calmness and solitude while you are busy enjoying the view.
