Class objective: I will be able to recall all the concepts learnt previously and answer all the questions correctly.

Concept A- how to describe simple future in Arabic.

- As we learnt in the previous lesson, the present verb always begins with one of the following letters: (/ـــ/ ، /ـــ/ ، //.)
- The future means that the action happens after the time of speaking. If one says: Muhammad will go to work سَنَذُهَبُ مُحَمَّدٌ إِلَى الْعَمَلِ, this means that he will go after some time (an hour, day, week, etc).
- Having understood the meaning of the future tense, we will learn how to formulate the verb in this tense.
- In the upcoming table, we will notice that there are two verbs: the first is يَنِدُأ and its future form form of the verb is the same as the present tense with a pre-fixed letter seen (س) before the verb in the present tense:
