Use of Negative sentences (Korean Negation)

Class objective: I will be able to understand the negative sentences

Concept A: Introduction

Korean has four forms of negation for negative sentences. For ease of understanding, we'll break them down into two ways: short-form negation and long-form negation.

· Short-form negation: ♀ + Verb/Adjective

· Long-form negation: Verb/Adjective + 지 않다

· Short-form negation: 吴 + Verb

· Long-form negation: Verb + 지 못하다

	short-form	long-form
don't / isn't	안 + V/A	V/A + 지 않다
can't	못 + V	V + 지 못하다

First, let's learn two forms of Korean negation equivalent to 'don't/isn't.'

Concept B: Short-form negation: 만 + Verb/Adjective

The rule for putting a verb or adjective into the short negative form is very simple. Just add ! immediately before verbs and adjectives.

– 안 + Verb

가다 (to go) \rightarrow 안 가다 (not to go)

먹다 (to eat) \rightarrow 안 먹다 (not to eat)

사다 (to buy) 안 사다 (not to buy)

마시다 (to drink) 안 마시다 (not to drink)
