



## Adverbial Pronoun Y (Le Pronom adverbial - Y)





# **Class Objective**

To learn about the Adverbial pronoun Y and its usage in French.



- Adverbial pronoun Y is used to replace places, ideas and things
  (indirect object) that follow the preposition à (all its contracted article
- forms), and other prepositions of places.
  - It replaces the prepositions of place such as à, dans, sur, en, chez and the place as well.
  - It is not used for people.
  - When Y replaces places, it means there.
  - When Y replaces ideas and things, it means it.



#### Examples:

#### Y used to replace places:

- 1. Je vais à **Londres**. (I go to London.)
  - a. J'y vais. (I go there)
- 2. Est-ce que tu vas à l'école? (Do you go to school?)
  - a. Oui, J'y vais. (Yes, I go there.)
- 3. Est-ce tu es allé chez Pauline? (Did you go to Pauline's house?)
  - a. Non, Je n'y suis pas allé. (Non, I did not go there.)
- 4. Nous allons au marché?
  - a. Oui, allons y! (Yes, let's go there!)



5.	Elle met ses bijoux dans la boîte? (She puts her jewellery in the
box?)	
a.	Oui, Elle y met ses bijoux. (Yes, she puts her jewellery there.)
6.	Le chat est <b>sous la table</b> ? (The cat is under the table?)
b.	Non, il n'y est pas. (Non, it is not there.)
Y used to	o replace ideas:
7.	Je pense à <b>cette idée</b> . (I think about this idea.)
a.	J'y pense. (I think about it.)
8.	Je pense à <b>ta décision.</b> (I think about your decision.)
b.	J'y pense tout le temps. (I think about it all the time.)



#### Y used to replace things:

- Le téléphone sonne. Réponds y. (The telephone is ringing. Answer it.)
- 2. Tu penses à ton livre ? (You think about your book?)
  - a. Oui, j'y pense. (Yes, I think about it.)
- Please note, that Y is not used in case of à + Person, in that case we use indirect object pronouns.
  - Tu penses à ton frère ? (You are thinking of your brother?)
    - Oui, je pense à lui. (Yes, I am thinking of him.)
  - Je parle au professeur.
    - Je lui parle.
