

Simple Future Tense

Class Objective:

I can use future tense appropriately in Malayalam.

Concept A: First person-Singular (I - njan)

English	Malayalam
I will do it.	Njan athu cheyyum.
I shall see you.	Njan ninne kanum.
Will I meet him?	Njan ningale kanumo?
I will call you.	Njan ningale vilikam.

Concept B: First Person - Plural (We - Njanganl)

English	Malayalam
We will see it.	Njanganl athu kanum.
We will need it.	Athu njangalkku aavashyamundu.
We will see you on Monday.	Njanganl ninne thinkalazhcha kaanam.
We will be busy tomorrow.	Njanganl naale thirakkil aayirikum.

Concept C: Second Person - Singular (You - Nee/ninakke)

English	Malayalam
You will get it tomorrow,	Athu ninakku naale kittum.
You will need it.	Ninakku athu aavashyamundakum.
Will you give me your book?	Nee enikku book tharumo?
You shall leave now.	Ninakku ippo pokam.

Note:

- Nee is used with younger ones or friends or close ones.
- Ningal is used with elders (denotes respect)
