

EUROPEAN MIXED TEAM RANKING

The European Mixed Team Ranking ranks Member Associations and National Olympic Committees for Mixed Team competition to be used for qualification within the European Games pathway.

PLAYING SYSTEM (TBC BY ITTF)

The ranking reflects the way Mixed Team matches are played. Each tie follows the system used at the Mixed Team World Cup:

- Match 1 — Mixed doubles
- Match 2 — Women's singles (player not playing mixed doubles)
- Match 3 — Men's singles (player not playing mixed doubles)
- Matches 4 and 5 — one women's doubles and one men's doubles

HOW THE RANKING IS CALCULATED

The ranking is based on each Member Association's or NOC's results in the European individual and team rankings, together with its doubles results at the most recent European Individual Championships. For each Member Association or NOC, seven results are taken:

- the highest-ranked player in the European Men's Singles ranking
- the highest-ranked player in the European Women's Singles ranking
- its position in the European Men's Team ranking
- its position in the European Women's Team ranking
- its best men's doubles final position at the most recent European Individual Championships (pairs eligible for the Olympic Games only*)
- its best women's doubles position at the most recent European Individual Championships (pairs eligible for the Olympic Games only*)
- its best mixed doubles final position at the most recent European Individual Championships (pairs eligible for the Olympic Games only*)

The seven results are added together, and the Member Association or NOC with the lowest total is ranked first, the next-lowest second, and so on.

Where a Member Association or NOC has no ranked player or team in one of the singles or team rankings, it takes for that result the result of the lowest-ranked player or team in that ranking. Where a Member Association did not enter one of the doubles events at the European Individual Championships, it takes the result of the lowest-placed pair in that event.

The singles and team results are taken from the European rankings. The European rankings do not include doubles, so doubles and mixed doubles results are taken from the most recent European Individual Championship, keeping the ranking based only on European results, rather than on the world doubles rankings.

From each singles ranking, only the best-placed player counts, because a Mixed Team tie has only one men's singles and one women's singles match.
