The Damson plum, an ancient fruit, was introduced throughout Europe by the Crusaders and brought to American shores by early New World settlers. Over time, these small, crimson plums have become rare, losing popularity to larger and sweeter varieties. However, the Damson is the spiciest and most tart of all plums, making it a prized ingredient for culinary enthusiasts. Every year during New York State's Fall Damson harvest, we pick the plums and barrel press them to extract the juice along with the rich crimson color of the skins and combine this with our small-batch American gin.
