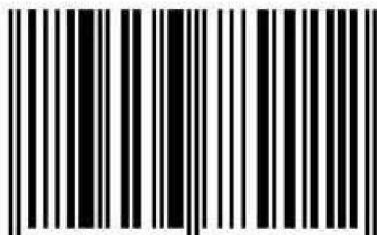

Enjoy its intense aroma, full taste with a marked presence of the grape, and long aromatic aftertaste.

Serve neat or on the rocks with a splash of water.

Enjoy with starters (meze) or at the end of a meal as a digestif.
