Alexander Valley is named after a man who arrived here on horseback in 1840. Pioneer Cyrus Alexander had ridden from San Diego, hired by Captain Fitch to look for undeveloped Southern land suitable for ranching.

A Pennsylvanian who sought adventure and fortune as a trapper in the Rocky Mountains and later as a gold miner in California, Alexander identified 48,000 acres of land which Fitch then acquired as a grant from the Mexican government. Fitch hired Alexander to sell the working ranch and promised to reward him with half of his own. The Mexican land grant became Horro's Salvoyna, and when Cyrus Alexander emigrated there in 1841, the 48,000-acre valley was the northern frontier of Mexico.
