James A. Yeend was born in Gloucestershire, England on the 8th of March 1856 to William and Ellen Yeend. The family left England when James was 14 years old and arrived in America in December 1870, settling on a farm north of Walla Walla. James remained with the family until his early twenties before beginning his own farming enterprise. In 1883, James sold his Walla Walla farm land to his father and moved to Whitman County where he took up a homestead and timber claim. On December 15th, that same year, James married Miss Lydia Chandler, also from Gloucestershire, England. James and Lydia sold the Whitman County property in 1896 and returned to Walla Walla to continue livestock and farming operations on nearly 400 acres. James was known as an energetic and progressive farmer. James A. Yeend was active in church, the local Republican Party and served as a member of the school board for sixteen years. He is the great-grandfather of Woodward Canyon Winery owner Rick Small. James A. Yeend died February 13th 1931.
