During World War II, an airbase was established at the foothills of the Rattlesnake Mountains. After the war, it was sold to the Miller Family. For four generations, the family has farmed the surrounding area, using the old airbase as their farm headquarters. Wine grapes were planted at "Airfield" in 1968, and the family has been perfecting its craft ever since.

WINEMAKER'S NOTES This Unoaked Chardonnay showcases lush, ripe fruit with heady aromas of pink grapefruit and lychee, which carry through to a crisp, dry finish. This fruit-forward wine is delightful on its own or pairs nicely with pork and seafood dishes.
