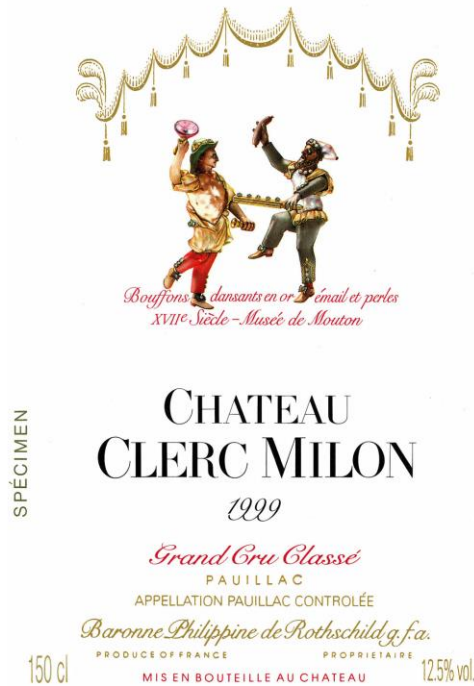

CHATEAU CLERC MILON

Cru classé en 1855, Château Clerc Milon a été acquis en 1970 par le Baron Philippe de Rothschild, et il est maintenant la propriété de sa fille, Philippine de Rothschild.

Ses vignes, plantées en cépages bordelais traditionnels, sont contiguës à celles de Lafite et de Mouton et s'étendent sur trente hectares le long de la Gironde. Son vin, classique et de bonne garde, est aujourd'hui considéré, dans sa catégorie, à l'égal des meilleurs. L'étiquette reproduit une œuvre qui figure dans le "Musée du Vin dans l'Art" de Château Mouton Rothschild : un couple de bouffons dansants inspiré de la *Commedia dell'Arte*, travail d'un orfèvre allemand de la fin du XVII^e siècle, ayant appartenu à l'impératrice Catherine de Russie.
