

Zion National Park

The eye-catching Zion National Park in Utah lives up to its name. Zion means 'sanctuary' in Hebrew. The park received this name from Mormon pioneers who settled in this area in 1860. Zion National Park consists of huge orange rock formations that are cleaved by deep canyons. The most beautiful, Zion Canyon, is 24 kilometres long and 800 metres deep. The Virgin River runs through the canyon and this makes the valley green and fertile. The green vegetation that rises from the water contrasts beautifully with the warm glow of the orange sandstone formations. The park offers many hiking possibilities from short family-friendly walks to long strenuous hikes to remote viewpoints. The good news is that the easy trails lead to fantastic views. Visit the Emerald Pools with their waterfalls and hanging gardens. You can also explore different driving routes, such as the Kolob Canyons Road or the Zion-Mount Carmel Highway.



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Springdale lodge Springdale







Experience Zion in comfort and style! Situated in Springdale, Utah, this lodge is less than two miles from the south entrance of Zion National Park. Amenities include a seasonal outdoor swimming pool and hot tub. The lodge boasts 17 acres of lawns, gardens and pasture with a barbecue and picnic area along the Virgin River. You can also enjoy a spectacular meal on the scenic patio at King's Landing Bistro.

Grand Canyon South Rim

The Grand Canyon is arguably the most famous natural phenomenon in the United States. Carved some six million years ago from erosion by the Colorado River, the Grand Canyon is actually bigger than the entire state of Rhode Island, and it's so big in fact that it influences the weather. To give you some perspective, there is an entrance on the north rim and the south rim to Grand Canyon National Park. These entrances are about 16 kilometres apart - but only if you're a bird and can fly from one to the other. If you're driving through the park, you have to go over the Colorado River and loop around the canyon, meaning you actually have to travel almost 350 kilometres to see both sides. The south rim of the park never closes and is home to Grand Canyon Village. Hermit's Road and Desert View Drive leading from the village will take you on a journey along the rim. Off these roads are various walking routes to get up close and personal with the gorge. Parking is sometimes difficult, but there is a free shuttle bus available. The most spectacular part of the Grand Canyon are the sunsets, best seen with few visitors at Pima Point, Yaki Point and Grandview Point. The Grand Canyon's enormity is not to be missed! There are few other places that will instil inside you the same sense of wonder, and there is no other place that offers the same view.



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Grand Canyon South Rim lodge Grand Canyon Village



Stay at a lodge located in Grand Canyon National Park, which offers you the ideal comfortable base for exploring the iconic South Rim. Thanks to the short distance to the South Rim, you can effortlessly enjoy the breathtaking views, challenging hikes, and an array of activities both inside and outside of the Grand Canyon. Start your day with a cup of coffee at the on-site Yavapai Café, or enjoy a tasty meal of Southwest American cuisine at the Yavapai Dining Hall. In the evening, relax at the Yavapai Tavern with Arizona craft beer, wine and dishes like moose burgers and vegan street tacos, while enjoying live music on the terrace.

Mojave Desert

The Mojave Desert owes its name to its original inhabitants, the Mojave Native Americans. This desert is largely located in California, but also partly in the states of Nevada, Utah and Arizona. As you can guess, it's huge! Over 57,000 square kilometres to be exact. As is expected with a desert, it's very hot. Home to one of the driest and hottest places in the world - Death Valley - the Mojave Desert is a pretty unforgiving place. Crossing this area on historic Route 66, you don't want to run out of petrol and you should always pack snacks. In July and August, make sure you don't cross any roads with water flowing across them, too. But even considering all this, the Mojave Desert has some spectacular places to discover. One of the most popular spots is Joshua Tree National Park, a nature reserve with hundreds of trees of the strangest shapes (known to some because of the Irish rock band, U2). Another fun attraction is Ash Meadows, the largest oasis in the Mojave Desert. And of course, Ghost Towns such as Kelso and Bodie State Historic Park are also fascinating to explore.

The park is located in the Sierra Nevada mountain range and the biggest attraction is Yosemite Valley. This valley was carved out by a glacier and is flanked by two gigantic granite rock walls. Many rock climbers come to the park to try to climb the famous cliffs. Others chose to hike to the beautiful waterfalls or through Mariposa Grove. Here, the trees are so high that you cannot even see the tops. Other highlights are Glacier Point, where you have a spectacular view of the valley, and Tioga Road, the highest road in the US. The park is home to ancient giant sequoias and to hundreds of species of birds and mammals. Experience the true tranquility of the High Sierra.

San Francisco

San Francisco saw the birthplace of the hippie movement in the 1960s and today it is still a haven for the free spirit. There is so much to do here – you will need some time to take in all the iconic sites. Take a ferry to Alcatraz Island, once home to some of the most dangerous criminals in the US. Admire the flower gardens of Lombard Street. Stroll along Fisherman's Wharf, with its restaurants and attractions. Or have a picnic in Alamo Square Park, opposite the colourful Victorian houses known as the 'Painted Ladies'. It's a must to cross the famous Golden Gate Bridge. You can do this on foot, by car or by bike, but you can also see this masterpiece of engineering from the water on a sailing trip through the bay. The best way to get around San Francisco's various neighbourhoods is by taking the old-fashioned trams.

Monterey Bay

Monterey Bay is found between the cities of Santa Cruz and Monterey in California. You can visit these cheerful animals by kayak, but keep an appropriate distance as they are protected.

Central California Coast

The coastal town of Morro Bay is known for Morro Rock, an ancient volcanic mound at the end of Morro Rock Beach. It is one of the Nine Sisters, a 21 million-year-old rock chain stretching all the way south to San Luis Obispo. This ancient rock formation is found in Morro Bay State Park, also home to lagoons, trails, and a bird-rich saltwater swamp. The coastal area offers fantastic opportunities for kayaking, hiking and camping. For a nice view of the city and the bay, walk to Black Hill. History buffs will love the park's Museum of Natural History, filled with fascinating ecology exhibits of the area, as well as local Native American culture that developed over centuries. Also visit Arroyo Grande, a family-friendly town with beaches, dining options and attractions, such as Pismo Dunes Natural Preserve and Lopez Lake Recreation Area. Arroyo Grande is close to Lopez Lake, which is a large reservoir that offers great hiking opportunities.

Santa Barbara

On Sundays, it is fun to visit the Santa Barbara Arts and Crafts Show with over 200 stalls selling homemade art.
