



Grand Teton National Park

Grand Teton National Park, home to the Teton Mountain Range, is definitely worth a visit. Famous for its flora and fauna, the park is home to over 900 species of flowering plants, and 400 species of birds, hoofed animals, reptiles, rodents, carnivores (including grizzly bears and wolves!), and more. You'll probably spot many on a hike through the park. Spring, when animals come out of hibernation, is one of the best times. Just remember not to get too close! Continuing your hike, you'll end up in Jackson Hole, a silver-green valley with crystal-clear mountain lakes. Grand Teton is renowned for its spectacular hiking trails (totalling more than 380 kilometres throughout the park), as well as climbing routes up the high peaks for varying skill levels. In the winter, a trip to one of the world class skiing resorts won't leave you disappointed. In fact, the Tetons are known as the birthplace of extreme skiing in America – and one of the places with the heaviest snowfalls. But don't worry, not all the hills are extreme. There is something for everyone.


West Yellowstone


Glacier National Park

With mountain lakes, alpine meadows, glaciers and white peaks, Glacier National Park is reminiscent of Switzerland. That is, if Switzerland had grizzly bears, beavers, otters, moose and mountain goats! Glacier National Park is found in the Rocky Mountains on the border with Canada. Most park visitors explore the area via the infamous Going-to-the-Sun Road. This scenic highway is only open in the summer and runs from the west entrance all the way to St. Mary. You can stop regularly to enjoy the view. Movie buffs may recognise Wild Goose Island from the opening scene of Stanley Kubrick's film, The Shining. You can also explore Glacier National Park on foot or on the water. There are endless hiking trails of all different levels. Lake McDonald is a great place to go kayaking and spot sea eagles, or visit Two Medicine Lake in the early morning to watch the sunrise.

This is a 6-mile (9.65 km) day hike and leads through an area that is of great spiritual importance to the Blackfeet Nation. The landscape is rich in mountains, rivers, wetlands and wildlife. For over 10,000 years, creation stories and traditional customs have been passed down from generation to generation. Get carried away by the fascinating stories and impressive scenery, a tour like this does not happen often. During this tour, you will hike to the Two Medicine River, where you can have lunch.







Portland

Portland, Oregon's largest city, is a vibrant spot in the Pacific Northwest with a friendly atmosphere and a young population. There is a strong emphasis on sustainability here, as well as many beautiful city parks, including the gigantic Washington Park. This park is packed with flora and fauna from all over the world, plus a zoo, tennis courts and even an archery range. 
Bend

The town of Bend also has the High Desert Museum, which is well worth a visit, with its artistic performances and collection of wild animals. For the beer lovers, Bend has 22 microbreweries, which is more per capita than anywhere else in Oregon. Or, try out your hand at fly fishing. If you don't have much luck, the many local restaurants serve freshly caught salmon and trout.


Umpqua National Forest

There are about eight small natural pools big enough for two to four people. For a nice view of the surrounding mountains, you should go to Diamond Lake. 
Newport

There are countless adventures to be had on the water, and the beaches of Sauchuest Beach and Middletown are always popular with surfers.


Olympic Peninsula

Olympic National Park is located on the Olympic Peninsula, in the northwest corner of Washington State. The park covers an area of 4000 square kilometres, 95 per cent of which is pure untouched wilderness. This is a mosaic of mountainous areas, temperate rainforest, and forests that stretches all the way to the rugged coastline. If you walk through the rainforest at Hoh River you will see that every surface is covered with a thick layer of ferns and mosses. Try kayaking on the crystal-clear Lake Crescent or walking the 14km Ozette Loop along the coastline. This is perfect for beach-combing and reconnecting with nature. The park has plant species that don't exist anywhere else in the world. There are also various wild animals, such as black bears, moose, lynx, mountain goats and panthers to be on the look out for.




