Postgame Notes | March 11

#6 Boise State 62, #3 Wyoming 54

Championship Notes

- The No. 6 seed advances to the semifinals of the MW women's basketball championship for the third time in the last four years.
- The No. 6 seeds now holds a 6-14 record against the No. 3 seed in the MW women's basketball tournament.
- The combined seed total of the semifinals is 19 (UNLV – 1, Colorado State – 5, Boise State – 6, San Diego State – 7), the highest total since 2012 (19).

Boise State Notes

- Boise State advances to its eighth MW women's basketball tournament semifinal (2024, '21, '20, '19, '18, '17, '15, '12).
- The Broncos trailed 50-47 with just 5:49 remaining in the game before going on a 15-4 run to end the contest. The Boise State defense held Wyoming without a field goal for over six minutes near the end of the game.
- The Broncos are now 19-6 (.760) all-time in MW tournament play, holding the highest win percentage in championship history.
- Boise State head coach **Gordy Presnell** remains in second place with 20 MW tournament wins, trailing only New Mexico's Don Flanagan, who racked up 21 victories from 1999-2011.
- The Broncos will face San Diego State in the semifinals at 7:30 p.m. PT on Tuesday, March 12. Most recently, SDSU knocked off Boise State in the opening round of the 2022 MW Women's Basketball Championship.

Wyoming Notes

- Junior Allyson Fertig tallied seven blocks, tying a MW women's basketball tournament single-game record. The seven-block mark has been reached on seven occasions, last by Fresno State's Bego Faz Davalos on March 6, 2017.
- The Cowgirls fall to 17-24 all-time in the MW championship.
