

Mountain West Women's Basketball Championship – First Round Postgame Notes | March 10 #7 San Diego State 72, #10 San Josè State 51

Championship Notes

- The No. 7 seed improves to 10-1 against the No. 10 seed since the Mountain West championship expanded to its current format in 2014.
- Only three times in the 25-year history of the MW tournament has the No. 7 seed won a game by at least 20 points: 28 – Wyoming over Utah State; 22 – San Diego State over Nevada; 21 – San Diego State over San Josè State.

San Diego State Notes

- With the win, San Diego State advances to the quarterfinals of the MW women's basketball championship for the third-consecutive year.
- The Aztecs are now 19-22 all-time in MW tournament history. The 19 wins are the fourth-most all-time in championship history.
- The Aztecs opened the game with an 8-0 run and never trailed in Sunday's contest, on their way to a 21-point win. This is SDSU's first double-digit win in the Conference tournament since 2016 when it defeated Wyoming 62-44 in the opening round.
- SDSU's bench outscored San Josè State's 30-9, led by Meghan Fiso's 15. Fiso entered the game averaging 4.4 points per game.
- San Diego State will face No. 2 New Mexico on Monday, March 11, at 5 p.m. PT. The Aztecs and Lobos split the season series, with each team winning at home.

San Josè State Notes

- San Josè State falls to 5-10 all-time in MW women's basketball championship history.
- Freshman guard Sydni Summers attempted 20 shots, setting a single-game career high and was just three attempts shy of the tournament freshman record.
