



Mountain West Women's Basketball Championship – Quarterfinals

Championship Notes

- UNLV's 48-point margin of victory is the largest win in MW tournament history (men's and women's). This is just the third 40-point win in women's basketball championship history, as New Mexico defeated Air Force by 43 points on March 10, 2009 and BYU beat San Diego State by 41 on March 8, 2000.
- The No. 1 seed has qualified for the MW tournament semifinals in 23 of 25 years.

UNLV Notes

- UNLV has won back-to-back Mountain West women's basketball tournaments and is currently riding a seven-game win streak in the championship. The seven-game win streak is tied as the fourth-longest all-time in tournament history: Boise State – 13 (2017-21), New Mexico – 9 (2003-05), New Mexico – 8 (2007-09) and Fresno State – 7 (2013-15).
- The Lady Rebels will appear in the semifinals of the MW championship for the third consecutive year and 10th time overall.
- UNLV shot .571 (12-21) from beyond the arc, tied as the fourth-highest 3-point shooting percentage in a single tournament game.
- UNLV improves to 19-22 in the MW tournament.
- The Lady Rebels are looking to become just the third program to 3-peat at the MW women's basketball championship, joining Boise State (2017-20) and New Mexico (2003-05).
- Head coach Lindy La Rocque earned her 100th career victory on Monday afternoon.

Fresno State Notes

- With the loss, the Bulldogs dropped to 18-10 all-time in the MW tournament.
- Fresno State was held to just 35 points on Monday, its lowest scoring output in MW women's basketball tournament history.
