



Mountain West Women's Basketball Championship – First Round
Postgame Notes | March 10
#9 Fresno State 62, #8 Air Force 44

Championship Notes

- The No. 9 seed advances to the quarterfinals for the first time since 2022 and seventh time overall.
- The No. 9 seed improves to 6-9 all-time in Mountain West tournament matchups against the No. 8 seed.
- Sunday's 18-point victory marked the largest win by a No. 9 seed since March 11, 2008, when Colorado State defeated UNLV by 19 points (68-49).

Fresno State Notes

- With the win, Fresno State advances to the quarterfinals of the MW women's basketball championship for the first time since 2021 and 10th time in the last 12 tournaments.
- The Bulldogs are now 18-9 all-time in MW tournament history.
- Fresno State will face top-seeded UNLV on Monday, March 11 at Noon PT. The Bulldogs will look to end the Lady Rebels' six-game win streak in MW championship play.
- Fresno State shot just 2-14 from beyond the 3-point line, marking the second time this season the Bulldogs have made only two or fewer 3-pointers in a win (11/6/23 vs. Fresno Pacific).
- The Bulldogs led for 35:41 in a game that featured just three lead changes.

Air Force Notes

- Air Force falls to 6-25 all-time in MW women's basketball championship history.
- The Falcons 44 points are the fewest points by Air Force in a tournament game since March 6, 2017 (40).
