Mountain West Men's Basketball Championship – Quarterfinals Postgame Notes | March 13 #2 Colorado State 67, #7 Nevada 59

Championship Notes

• The No. 2 seed is now 23-3 in the quarterfinal round of the MW men's basketball championship.

Colorado State Notes

- Colorado State earned a spot in the MW tournament semifinals for the fourth time in the last five seasons.
- The Rams won their eighth straight game, which is the 11th longest active win streak nationally and longest in the MW.
- Each of CSU's last eight wins have come by at least eight points, the longest such streak in program history.
- CSU's **Nique Clifford** led the game in scoring (25) and rebounding (14). This was his 29th game of the season with at least 10 points and five rebounds, only Kansas' Hunter Dickinson has more 10-5 games this season.
- Clifford now has 14 double-doubles on the year, the second most in the league (New Mexico's Nelly Junior Joseph; 16).
- Colorado State improved to 20-24 all-time in the MW championship.

Nevada Notes

- Nevada falls to 9-12 all-time in the MW championship.
- The Wolf Pack were held to just 59 points, their lowest scoring output in a MW tournament game since March 15, 2019 when they scored 56 points in a loss to San Diego State.
- Nevada is the first team to have zero bench points in a MW tournament game since New Mexico on March 14, 2014 vs. Boise State.
