Mountain West Women's Basketball Championship – Quarterfinals Postgame Notes | March 10 #6 Fresno State 54, #3 Colorado State 52

Championship Notes

- This is the second consecutive year that the No. 6 seed has earned a spot in the semifinals.
- The No. 3 seed has failed to advance to the semifinals in back-to-back years.

Fresno State Notes

- Fresno State, which is advancing to the semifinals for the first time since 2021, has won multiple games in the MW tournament for the first time since 2021. The Bulldogs improved to 20-10 all-time in MW championship history.
- This will mark the Bulldogs' ninth semifinal appearance.
- Junior **Mia Jacobs** scored 20 points and pulled down 18 rebounds, becoming just the fourth Mountain West student-athlete to record at least 20 points and at least 18 rebounds in a MW tournament contest.
- **Jacobs'** 18 rebounds are tied for the fourth-most in a single tournament game and the most since Rodjanae Wade (UNLV) pulled down 21 rebounds on March 2, 2020.
- **Jacobs** has registered a double-double in back-to-back games, becoming the first student-athlete since Desi-Rae Young in 2023 tournament to record back-to-back double-doubles.
- Fresno State connected on 7-of-14 3-point attempts in the first half, becoming only the second team in MW tournament history to make 50% of its 3-pointers on at least 14 attempts. Utah also accomplished this feat on March 11, 2006 (8-16).

Colorado State Notes

- Colorado State is one-and-done at the MW tournament for the first time since 2021.
- The Rams tied their lowest scoring output of the season with 52 points. Colorado State scored 52 points in a victory against San Francisco on Nov. 4, 2024.
- Colorado State is now 19-25 all-time in the MW championship.
