OFF THE BOUNCE (entering the Mountain West Tournament)

- As the 4-seed, San Diego State opens the 2025 Mountain West Men's Basketball Tournament against 5-seed Boise State on Thursday, March 13 at 2:30 p.m. PT at Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas, Nev., in a quarterfinal matchup.
- The Aztecs and Broncos are meeting for the 34th time with San Diego State holding a 20-13 advantage in the all-time series. In the Mountain West era, SDSU has a 19-13 lead in the series, and under Brian Dutcher is 1-1 against Boise State in the event. (see the box on page four for the complete series history)
- San Diego State has won 17 consecutive quarterfinal round games in the Mountain West Tournament and has earned a bye into the round for the 19th time in the last 20 seasons.
- The Aztecs have been the 4-seed in the Mountain West Tournament on five previous occasions; 2008, 2009, 2010, 2013, and 2019. San Diego State has a 9-4 record as the 4-seed and has won the tournament title from the position in 2010. SDSU has faced Boise State as the 4-seed once; in the quarterfinal round in 2013, a 73-67 win.
- San Diego State has played Boise State five times (4-1) in the Mountain West Tournament. Its wins have come in 2012, 2013, and 2017 in the quarterfinal round and in the semifinal round in 2020. The team's lone loss was in the championship game in 2022.
- Brian Dutcher is the only San Diego State head men's basketball coach to accumulate at least 21 wins in each of his first eight seasons.
- San Diego State's 47 victories at Thomas & Mack Center since the start of the 2008-09 campaign (28 neutral and 19 road wins) are the most by any team in any building in which it has not played at least one home game. Gonzaga is second with 37 victories at Orleans Arena.
- San Diego State, which reached the Sweet 16 in last year's NCAA Tournament, has lost the point production of its top seven scorers from a year ago. Six are no longer with the organization and one, **Reese Waters**, has not played this season due to injury. San Diego State scored 2,742 points a year ago, but just 232 of those points (8.5 percent) have suited up for the Aztecs this year. SDSU is 21-8 overall, 14-6 in the Mountain West, in fourth place in the league standings, and has multiple wins over top 25 teams and those receiving votes, including No. 4 Houston, Creighton, New Mexico & UC San Diego.
- San Diego State is the No. 2 ranked team in the nation in field goal percentage defense (.379) and one of two teams in the nation which is limiting opponents to no more than a combined 37.9 percent overall from the floor and 30.4 percent from long distance. (also: Tennessee)
- With defense as its calling card, San Diego State has been a menace to opposing offenses. Since the start of the Fisher/Dutcher era, the 1999-00 season, SDSU has held its opponent to 40.0 percent or less from the field 388 times in 859 games (45.2 percent), recording 340 wins in those 388 games (87.6 percent). Under Brian Dutcher, since the start of the 2017-18 campaign, the Scarlet and Black has played 264 games and has limited the opponent to 40.0 percent shooting or less 138 times (138-of-264; 52.3 percent) and won 125 of those games (125-13; 90.6 percent).
- San Diego State is 10-0 this season when it holds its opponent to 60 or fewer points. In the **Brian Dutcher** era, his Aztecs have held their opponent to 60 points or less 117 times and have won 110 of those games (110-7, 94.0 percent). Overall, Dutcher's Aztecs have held their opponent to 60 or fewer points in 44.3 percent (117-of-264) of the games he has coached.
- San Diego State, one of the most dominant defensive teams in the nation, ranked in the top 20 in Kenpom's Adjusted Defensive Efficiency

- SDSU has won at least 19 games in 19 straight seasons.
- SDSU has advanced to the postseason in 16 of the last 18 seasons in which a champion was crowned (2006 NCAA, 2007-09 NIT, 2010-15 NCAA, 2016 NIT, 2018, 2021-24 NCAA).
- SDSU has won 97 of its last 1034gms. when leading at the half.
- SDSU has won its last 136-of-147 when having a higher FG pct.
- SDSU is 5th nationally in winning percentage (.739) since the beginning of the 2005-06 season.
- Since its founding in 1999, no men's basketball program has won more Mountain West championships (regular-season and tournament) than San Diego State's 16.
- Since 2006, SDSU's 15 appearances in its conference championship game are tied for second most in Division I.

in nine of the last 14 years, in the top 10 in seven of the last 14 campaigns, and is currently No. 12 in that ranking. Additionally, the Aztecs are No. 1 in block percentage, No. 7 in 2-point percentage defense, No. 7 in effective field goal percentage defense, and No. 27 3-point percentage defense according to Kenpom.

- Head men's basketball coach **Brian Dutcher** reached a Mountain West coaching milestone with the team's 63-61 win over Wyoming on February 1. Dutcher became just the fourth coach in league history to record 100 conference wins (currently 106 victories). He joined Aztecs Hall of Famer Steve Fisher (No. 1 with 168 wins), Leon Rice (No. 2 with 158 wins), and Steve Alford (No. 3 with 129 wins) as the only coaches in Mountain West history to record triple digit league victories. Dutcher reached the milestone in 135 games, faster than any of the previous three. Alford did it in 151 games, Rice in 173 and Fisher in 190.
- This year San Diego State has had second half scoring runs of 20-0, 18-0 & 17-0 all which contributed to comeback wins. Overall, SDSU has had 19 scoring runs of at least 10-0 this season and is 13-1 in contests in which it strung together at least a run of 10-0. Since the start of the 2020-21 season, the Aztecs are 76-9 in games in which they score at least 10 straight points.
- Since the start of the 2013-14 season, when the current slate of teams in the Mountain West came together, San Diego State's 161-55 (.745) record is the best in the Mountain West in conference games. Boise State ranks second with a 146-74 (.664) mark.
- The Aztecs have held 13 of their 28 Division I opponents to less than 40 percent shooting, nine games of less than 35.0 percent and three under 30.0 percent. SDSU limited the California Bears to just 25.5 percent shooting on Dec. 21, the third lowest opponent field goal percentage shooting night in the **Brian Dutcher** era.
- San Diego State, which in 2024 reached the Mountain West Tournament championship game for the seventh time in head coach **Brian Dutcher's** first seven seasons, looks for its unprecedented 17th Mountain West men's basketball title. Entering the 2024-25 season, San Diego State has won nine regular season and seven Mountain West tournament titles, the most of any program that has ever been a member of the league.
- Brian Dutcher** is in his eighth season as San Diego State's head coach and his 26th season on the Aztec sidelines. In his seven-plus seasons as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to five conference titles, seven Mountain West championship game appearances, a 198-66 overall record and 106-38 mark in league games, both league leading in that time frame, has been named the national coach of the year, twice the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year and led this team to back-to-back Sweet 16s including a run to the 2023 NCAA national championship game.

THE AWARDS

- Sophomore guard **Miles Byrd** earned second-team all-conference honors in voting by the league's coaches and media that regularly cover the Mountain West and inclusion on the Mountain West All-Defensive Team. A 6-7 wing, Byrd paces the Aztecs in steals (60), 3-point attempts (168), 3-pointers made (52), free throw percentage (.824), and defensive rebounds (100). He is second in scoring (13.2 ppg), field goal attempts (299), field goals made (116), free throw attempts (91), free throws made (75), assists (78), and blocks (29). In the Mountain West, he ranks No. 2 in steals (2.29/game), No. 5 in free throw percentage, No. 9 in 3-point field goals, No. 13 in defensive rebounds (3.57/g), No. 14 in scoring and No. 19 in rebounding (4.5/game). Nationally, he ranks No. 26 in steals per game (2.14) and No. 45 in steals. Byrd has scored in double figures in 19-of-28 appearances with two double-digit rebounding games and his first collegiate double-double at UNLV on March 4. In total, he has topped the team in points nine times, rebounds five times and assists six times.
- Byrd is the only player in the nation who is shooting a minimum of .390 from the field, .309 from distance, .824 from the line with at least 78 assists, 60 steals and 29 blocks in 2024-25.**
- Senior guard **Nick Boyd** earned second-team All-Mountain West distinction. A 6-3 transfer from FAU in his first season on The Mesa, he leads the team in scoring (13.2 ppg), assists (11.6), defensive rebounds (100), free throw attempts (115), free throws (87), field goal attempts (300), field goals made (124), and minutes (866). He is second in 3-pointers made (47), 3-point attempts (135), 3-point field goal percentage (.348) and is third in steals (30) and free throw percentage (.575). Among Mountain West performers he ranks No. 6 in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.27:1), No. 7 in assists (4.0/game), No. 12 in free throw percentage, and No. 13 in scoring & 3-point field goals made (1.62/game). Nationally, his assist-to-turnover ratio ranks No. 76. Boyd has reached double figure scoring in 20-of-29 games, and has led the squad in points 12 times, in rebounds five times and assists 16 times.
- Boyd is one of two players in the nation, since February 11, to average at least 17.0 points per game on a minimum of 50.0 percent shooting from the floor, 38.5 percent from distance, and has at least 38 assists and 6 steals in 249 minutes or less. The other is Duke's Cooper Flagg.**
- Freshman forward **Magoon Gwath** was named the Mountain West Freshman of the Year, the Defensive Player of the Year, an honorable mention All-Mountain West performer and a member of the Mountain West All-Defensive Team. He leads the Aztecs in blocked shots (66), is second in rebounds (131) and offensive boards (47). Among Mountain West players, he leads the league in blocked shots (2.64/game), is No. 6 in offensive boards and No. 12 in rebounding. Nationally, he ranks No. 7 in blocks per game and No. 17 in blocked shots. He totaled eight double figure scoring games, five double figure rebounding games with four double doubles. His six blocks against Boise State are the most since Nathan Mensah swatted as many against Saint Mary's on December 22, 2020, and are one off the program's single-game freshman record set by Leonard Allen against Cal State Los Angeles on December 8, 1981. Gwath has led the Aztecs in scoring seven times, in rebounds 10 times and in assists once.
- Gwath is the only player in the nation who stands at least 7-0, has blocked at least 66 shots and is shooting at least 37.2 percent from beyond the arc, on a minimum of 43 attempts.**

IT'S SDSU DEFENSE...WERE YOU EXPECTING SOMETHING ELSE?

- With the regular season in the rear-view mirror, San Diego State continues to trend as one of the nation's best in defense. After the games of March 8, according to KenPom, the Aztecs are No. 1 in block percentage, No. 7 in 2-point percentage defense, No. 7 in effective field goal percentage defense, No. 12 in adjusted defensive efficiency and No. 25 in 3-point percentage defense.**
- San Diego State has won 120 of its last 129 games (120-9; 93.0 percent) when holding its opponent to less than 60 points.
- San Diego State is 110-9 (92.4 percent) the last 119 times it has outrebounded its opponent.
- San Diego State has won 217 of its last 251 games (217-34; 86.5 percent) when limiting opponents to 30.0 percent or less from 3-point range.
- In its last 460 games in which it has forced at least 10 turnovers, San Diego State has won 363 times (363-97; 78.9 percent).
- San Diego State is 95-23 (80.5 percent) in its last 118 games in which it has blocked at least three shots.
- San Diego State has won 38 of its last 45 games (38-7; 84.4 percent) when it limits its opponent to five or fewer offensive rebounds.
- San Diego State is 96-29 (76.8 percent) in its last 125 games in which it has at least five steals.

WHAT HAPPENS IN LAS VEGAS...IS USUALLY GOOD FOR SAN DIEGO STATE

- San Diego State's 47 victories at Thomas & Mack Center since the start of the 2008-09 campaign (28 neutral and 19 road wins) are the most by any team in any building in which it has not played at least one home game. Gonzaga is second with 37 victories at Orleans Arena.
- San Diego State is 39-11 in its last 50 games at UNLV's Thomas & Mack Center. Since March 5, 2014, San Diego State is 14-3 against the Rebels in TMC, while the rest of the country is 57-122 in the facility.
- Since the start of the 2008-09 season, no Division I team has won more road games against a single opponent than San Diego State's 19 victories over UNLV at Thomas & Mack Center. Saint Mary's (at Loyola Marymount) and Gonzaga (at Pepperdine) are second with 16 wins.**
- San Diego State is 19-6 in its last 25 games at Thomas & Mack and 36-11 in its last 47 games in the city, regardless of facility.
- In four regular-season MTEs in Las Vegas, San Diego State has three tournament titles (2010 Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic, 2019 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational & 2023 Continental Tire Main Event) and was the runner up at the 2015 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational.
- In going 9-2 in its Las Vegas MTEs, the Aztecs are 4-0 vs. ranked opponents with wins against No. 6/7 Houston & No. 21/19 Creighton this year and No.14/13 California & No. rv/22 West Virginia in 2015.

BOYD HEATING UP AT THE RIGHT TIME

Senior guard **Nick Boyd** has been on fire in leading the Aztecs to five wins in their last seven games.

- He has led the team in scoring in seven of the last eight contests...averaging 17.0 points.
- He has shot 50.0 percent in those seven games (48-of-96), 38.5 percent from the bonus distance (15-of-39), and 71.4 percent from the line (25-of-35).
- He has dishied out 38 assists (4.8/g), pulled down 28 boards (3.5/g) and added six steals.
- Against New Mexico (Feb. 25), Boyd became just the third Aztec since the 2013-14 season to record at least 17 points, 7 rebounds and 6 assists in the same game, joining Malachi Flynn (twice in the 2019-20 season) and Winston Shepard (Feb. 21, 2016 at San Jose State).
- Boyd is one of two players in the nation, since February 11, to average at least 17.0 points on a minimum of 50.0 percent shooting from the floor, 38.5 percent from distance and has at least 38 assists and 6 steals in 249 minutes or less. (also: Duke's Cooper Flagg)**

THE ELITE OF THE ELITE DEFENSE

Known for one of the staunchest defenses since former head coach Steve Fisher arrived on The Mesa prior to the 1999-00 season, current Aztecs' head coach Brian Dutcher has kept the stifling defense as the calling card of his program as well.

- San Diego State has ranked in the top 25 of KenPom's Adjusted Defensive Efficiency in each of the last five seasons: No. 10 in 2019-20,

No. 21 in 2020-21, No. 2 in 2021-22, No. 4 in 2022-23, No. 11 last year and No. 12 this year.

- **San Diego State is one of three programs in the nation who have been in the top 25 in Kenpom's Adjusted Defensive Efficiency ranking in each of the last five campaigns. The other two are Houston and Kansas.**

ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

With the 2024-25 regular season complete, here are some road and neutral site facts about San Diego State:

- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 113-71 (.614) record in true road games is the eighth best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 82-55 (.599) record in regular season road games against the Mountain West, leads the conference.
- **Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State is 73-35 (.676) in neutral site games which is the seventh best in the nation.**
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 186-106 (.637) record in road/neutral games is the fifth best in the nation.
- **In 2024-25, the Aztecs are 3-1 in neutral site games and has wins over No. 2 Houston and at the time No. 21 Creighton at the Players Era Festival as well as a 71-50 pounding of California at the San Jose Tip-Off. Its only loss came against No. 23 Oregon.**

STREAKS ON THE LINE FOR THE AZTECS ON THURSDAY

When the Aztecs play Boise State on Thursday here are the streaks that are on the line for San Diego State:

- 40-game win streak when scoring between 80-89 points.
- 33-game win streak in contests in which SDSU has limited its opponent to fewer than 60 points.
- 28-game win streak when holding its opponent to 35 percent or less shooting.
- 18-game win streak when leading the five minutes to play.
- **17-game win streak in the quarterfinal round of the Mountain West Tournament.**
- 6-game win streak when outrebounding the opponent.
- 6-game win streak when attempting more free throws than its opponent.
- 5-game win streak when wearing its white uniforms.
- 5-game win streak when its opponent scores between 60-69 points.
- 2-game win streak against Boise State, regardless of location.
- 2-game win streak in neutral site contests.

AZTEC BLOCK PARTY

With defense the calling card of San Diego State basketball, the 2024-25 Aztecs are dealing in the category of shot rejections.

- **San Diego State ranks No. 7 in the nation in blocks per game per (5.6) through the games of March 8.**
- Through 29 games 61.5 percent (99-of-161) of the Aztecs blocks come from its freshmen (**Pharaoh Compton, Taj DeGourville & Magoon Gwath**)
- The Aztecs have a game of 10 blocks, four of 9 blocks, five of 8 block contests, two of 7, two of six, and five of 5 blocks, has recorded multiple blocks in 23-of-29 games this year, and has been shut out just twice.
- Freshman **Magoon Gwath**, despite not playing the last five games, ranks No. 7 in the nation in blocks per game (2.64) and No. 17 in total blocked shots (66).

KEYS TO VICTORY

- San Diego State is 17-2 this season when leading at the half. (SDSU is 230-27 (.8945) in the last 257)
- San Diego State is 17-0 this season when leading with five minutes to play. (SDSU is 429-17 (.962) in the last 446)
- San Diego State 13-4 this season when scoring first. (SDSU is 248-62 (.800) in the last 310)
- San Diego State is 11-1 this season when it outrebounds its opponent. (SDSU is 282-44 (.865) in the last 326)
- San Diego State is 9-1 this season when it attempts more free throws than its opponent. (SDSU is 261-35 (.882) in the last 296)
- San Diego State is 20-2 this season when it shoots a higher field goal percentage. (SDSU is 326-24 (.931) in the last 350)
- San Diego State is 12-1 this season when its opponent shoots 40% or lower. (SDSU is 332-44 (.883) in the last 376)
- San Diego State is 8-0 this season when it holds its opponent to under 60 points. (SDSU is 108-8 (.931) in the last 116)
- San Diego State is 14-3 this season when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponent. (SDSU is 177-35 (.835) in the last 212)

DEFINITION OF A RIM PROTECTOR...LOOK NO FURTHER THAN MAGOON GWATH

In freshman forward **Magoon Gwath**, San Diego State looks like it has its next rim protector...and he is only a freshman.

- **Despite not playing the last five games, Gwath ranks No. 7 in the nation in blocks per game (2.64) and No. 17 in blocked shots (66).**
- **He is 1-of-3 freshman in the nation to have at least 66 blocks this season.**
- Gwath is rated No. 4 in the nation in block percentage per Kenpom and No. 1 in the Mountain West.
- Gwath passed Skylar Spencer's freshman program record (51 in 34 games) in his 21st college contest.
- With 66 blocks through 25 games, Gwath is in seventh place on the program's single season blocks list.
- Has recorded multiple blocks in 17-of-25 games this season and has at least one block in 23-of-25 games.
- His 6 blocks against Boise State equal the most in a game in the Brian Dutcher era (since 2017-18), matching Nathan Mensah, who sent 6 back against Saint Mary's on December 22, 2020. Gwath also has 5 block games against No. 3 Gonzaga, Oregon, and No. 6 Houston.
- **Against Occidental Gwath became just the second Aztec to record at least 15 points, 4 blocks and 2 three-pointers in the same game since the 1999-00 season.**
- His 66 blocks through 25 games is a San Diego State record to start a career.

THE MAN WITH THE PLAN

Brian Dutcher is in his 26th season on The Mesa, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time, he's experienced 584 victories, 16 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 18 postseason tournaments, including 13 NCAA appearances, four of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014, 2023 & 2024) and in 2023 guided the team past the Sweet 16, to the Elite 8, Final Four and national championship game.

- Since his ascension to the top job, prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured six Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each of his seven previous years.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 21 games in each of his first eight seasons.

- His 198 wins are No. 3 on the program's head coaching wins list.
- His 198 wins are a program record for victories in a coach's first seven-plus campaigns.
- His 198 wins to date are 17 more than any head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season.
- His 106 Mountain West wins rank No. 4 on the league's all-time win list.
- His .736-win percentage in Mountain West games is the highest in league history (min. 100 games)

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament 11 of the last 13 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance during that span as well. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2005-06 campaign, San Diego State has the sixth-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 278-38 home record, winning 88.0 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2024-25 regular season completed, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on:

- In its last 265 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 235-30 mark (88.7 percent), including a 127-14 record (90.1 percent) in its last 141 home games against non-conference competition.
- Since the start of the 2002-03 season, San Diego State has a 161-33 (83.0 percent) home record against conference opponents.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 180-25 (87.8 percent) at home, including a 77-10 (88.5 percent) record in non-conference home contests during that stretch and 75-7 (91.5 percent) against non-top 25 non-conference foes.
- SDSU is 102-14 (87.9 percent) in their last 116 MW home games and 109-11 (90.8 percent) in their last 120 non-conference home games.

SCHEDULING UP

San Diego State has never been afraid of playing anyone, anywhere, and it's borne out by the Aztecs having played, through the games of February 26, the 64th toughest schedule in the nation overall, and the 8th toughest non-conference slate according to KenPom.com.

- San Diego State has already played four of its 25 Division I games against ranked opponents with wins over then No. 21 Creighton and No. 2 Houston and defeats at the hands of No. 3 Gonzaga and now No. 15 Oregon.
- No other Mountain West program played an overall schedule which ranks under No. 78 and only three MW programs played a non-conference schedule which was ranked in the top 100...the Aztecs (No. 8), New Mexico (No. 50) & UNLV (No. 68).
- San Diego State's opponents in its seven losses, to Gonzaga, Oregon, Utah State, New Mexico, UNLV & Colorado State have a combined record of 136-51 (.727).

MISCELLANEOUS STATS

- SDSU is getting 42.2 percent of its points (876-of-2,074) in the paint.
- The Aztecs are getting 29.9 percent of their buckets (224-of-748) from beyond the arc.
- San Diego State is scoring 20.0 percent of its points (415-of-2,074) off its opponent's turnovers.
- The Aztecs are getting 66.4 percent of their offense (1,377-of-2,074) from their backcourt.
- SDSU has been tied or in the lead for 62.2 percent (727:30-of-1,170) of its minutes this season.
- San Diego State is getting assists on 51.1 percent (382-of-748) of its field goals this season.
- The Aztecs are 13-1 this year w/ at least one 10-0 scoring run in a game & have won 25 of the last 26 when putting together a double-digit run in a game.

AZTECS DOMINATE MW FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONORS IN 2024-25

- The Mountain West has bestowed its Freshman of the Week Award 15 times this season and Aztecs have picked up just short of half of the hardware which has been distributed.
- **Magoon Gwath** has earned the honor three times, while **Pharaoh Compton**, **Taj DeGourville** have earned the award twice each.
- The triumvirate are the first Aztecs to earn the distinction since the league began honoring freshmen in the 2021-22 season.
- The Aztecs are the only program in the conference who have had multiple honorees win the award multiple times in a season.
- The only team other than San Diego State to have three winners in one season was Air Force in 2021-22. Ethan Taylor was recognized four times while Jake Heidbreder and Lucas Moerman were honored once each.

MOUNTAIN WEST CENTURY CLUB

With the Aztecs 63-61 win over Wyoming on February 1...

- **Brian Dutcher** became the fourth head coach in Mountain West history to reach the 100-victory plateau in league games.
- Dutcher (106 wins) joins Steve Fisher (168), Leon Rice (158) and Steve Alford (129) as the only head coaches with at least 100 Mountain West wins.
- Dutcher is the fastest coach in league history to reach 100 victories ... Dutcher - 135 games (100-35), Alford - 151 games (100-51), Rice - 173 games (100-73) and Fisher - 190 games (100-90).

THE FUTURE IS NOW

Aztec freshmen are usually very well acquainted with the bench and limited minutes, but the team's three frosh: **Pharaoh Compton**, **Taj DeGourville** and **Magoon Gwath** are breaking that mold.

- The threesome makes up half of the top six on the Mountain West's freshman scoring list (Gwath No. 2, Compton No. 5, DeGourville No. 6).
- With a minimum of two field goal attempts per game, Compton's 64.4 percent shooting percentage leads MW freshmen.
- Gwath, who stands 7-0, has 16 three-pointers which is No. 7 among MW frosh and No. 6 in three-point field goal percentage (.372) among players who have at least 10 makes from the bonus distance.
- Gwath leads the MW freshman and the league in blocked shots (66) and is 26 ahead of the next closest freshman and 17 more than the next closest player in the league...despite not playing the last five games.
- DeGourville's 54 assists rank No. 2 among Mountain West frosh.
- Gwath is No. 2 (131), DeGourville No. 6 (86) & Compton No. 7 (71) in total rebounds among league freshmen.
- Gwath is No. 2 (83), Compton No. 4 (67) and Degourville No. 6 (52) in field goals made among Mountain West freshmen.
- Among the team's points from its regular rotation, it is getting 25.0 percent of its production from its three freshmen (518-of-2,074).
- Each of the three have won multiple Freshman of the Week honors from the Mountain West.

MORE HOME COOKING

- In the last 96 home games, San Diego State is 86-10, with an average scoring margin of +16.3 points in those victories. In 63 of those 86 home wins (.733), the game was decided in the Aztecs' favor by at least nine points.
- A 21-game non-conference home court win streak, the second longest in program history, trailing only a 27-game win streak which ran from November 22, 2008, to November 30, 2011, was snapped by Gonzaga, 80-67 on Nov. 18, 2024.
- San Diego State is 91-10 (.901) in its last 101 home games dating back to January 1, 2019.
- The Aztecs are 63-8 (.887) in their 71 Mountain West Conference home games since January 24, 2018.
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home en route to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on 10 occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2019-20, 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24).

GWATH NAMED MW FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK THREE TIMES IN FOUR WEEKS

Redshirt freshman **Magoon Gwath** emerged in the past month as evidenced by earning his third Mountain West Freshman of the Week award on February 17.

- In wins at San Jose State and against Boise State, Gwath averaged 7.5 points, on 58.3 percent from the floor and 33.3 percent from distance in an average of 31.5 minutes per game, with 5.0 rebounds, 5.0 blocks, 1.0 steal and 0.5 assists.
- The Eulless, Texas native's six blocks against Boise State are an SDSU freshman record, match an Aztec Viejas Arena record & program record in a Mountain West contest, and was one off the program single game mark.
- For the week, his one assist was on a 57-57 game-tying bucket at San Jose State. Six of his seven defensive boards limited the opposition to single-shot possessions, his three offensive rebounds led to six points, including four for himself and his two steals resulted in four points for SDSU.

IF YOU HAVEN'T HEARD... THE BYRD JUST MIGHT BE THE WORD

- Sophomore Miles Byrd was one of 10 semifinalists for the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award and is the only player in the nation who is shooting a minimum of .388 from the field, .310 from distance, .824 from the line with at least 78 assists, 60 steals and 26 blocks in 2024-25.
- Byrd played in four games off the bench in his initial college season, 34 last season, all off the bench, and starts in each of his 28 appearances this year...for a total of 66 games, the most on the roster for the Scarlet and Black in 2024-25.
- In the 38 games he played in his first two seasons, the Stockton, Calif., native reached double figure scoring twice and averaged 4.1 points, 2.3 rebounds and 1.0 assists. So far this year, in 28 starts, he has 19 double figure contests, including four contests of 20+ points, and has upped his point production to 12.8, his rebounds to 4.5 and assists to 2.8 per game.
- Against Colorado State (Jan. 14) became the first player in Mountain West history and one of three players in the nation in the last 16 seasons to have a game of at least 25 points, including five 3-pointers, seven steals and six rebounds.
- Byrd leads the Aztecs in 3-pointers made (52) and attempted (168), free throw percentage (.824), & steals (60), and he is second in points (359), field goals made (116), minutes (847), free throws made (75), and attempted (91), assists (78) and blocks (29). Among Mountain West performers, he is No. 2 in steals, No. 5 in free throw percentage, No. 9 in 3-pointers made (1.86/game) and blocks (1.0/game), No. 13 in defensive rebounds (3.57/game), No. 14 in scoring, and No. 19 in rebounding (4.5/game). In the team's 75-60 win over Colorado State (Jan. 14), he set a new career-best with a game-high 25 points.
- In the team's 69-50 win at Nevada (Jan. 25), he set a new career-best with nine assists.
- Was named a Players Era Festival All-Tournament Team member and Mountain West Player of the Week for averaging 14.7 points, 3.3 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 1.7 steals, 1.3 blocks and a 3:1 assist-to-turnover ratio in leading the Aztecs to a pair of victories against top 25 teams: No. 6 Houston and No. 21 Creighton at the event in Las Vegas.
- Byrd is in his third year at San Diego State but is a sophomore after getting his freshman season back through a medical redshirt.
- In the season opener against UC San Diego, the sophomore guard, in his first career start, became just the second player in NCAA Division I basketball over the last 10 seasons (since 2014-15) to record at least 20 points, 8 rebounds, 5 steals and 4 blocks in the same game. He's also the first Aztec since at least 1996-97 with that stat line.

HISTORIC NIGHTS FOR GWATH

Already a feared defender who can block and alter shots, as well as play defense on the perimeter, freshman **Magoon Gwath** displayed the offense that Aztec players and coaches see in practice every day in the team's wins at Fresno State (12/4) and Nevada (1/25).

At Fresno State

- Gwath became the first Aztec freshman to have a game of at least 25 points and 10 rebounds since Kawhi Leonard totaled 25 and 12 against Wyoming on January 9, 2010.
- Gwath became the first SDSU freshman to score at least 25 in a game since Matt Mitchell dropped 31 on Eastern Illinois on Nov. 20, 2017.
- Gwath is the only Aztec freshman in the Dutcher era to score at least 25 points in a conference game.
- Gwath's 10 boards at the time were the most in a game, as an Aztec freshman, since Keshad Johnson had 10 against Texas Southern on November 5, 2019.
- Through the games of January 25, Gwath is the only freshman in the nation with at least 25 points, 10 rebounds and four blocked shots in a game this year and one of five players nationally who have accomplished the stat line.

At Nevada

- Gwath was 7-of-7 from the field, including 1-of-1 from beyond the arc for game-high 15 points and a career and game-high 13 rebounds. Gwath is the first Aztec since the 1997-98 season to record a double-double shooting 1.000 percent from the floor since Roy Kruiswyk was (6-of-6) in a 13 pt/10 reb double-double against SMU on Jan. 15, 1998.
- Gwath's 13 rebounds are the most by an Aztec freshman since Jalen McDaniels grabbed as many on February 3, 2018, against Air Force.
- Gwath is the 12th player in Mountain West history to have double-double with a perfect shooting night, minimum of 7 field goal attempts, but if you include his successful 3-pointer, he is the only player in league history to accomplish the feat.
- For his efforts, Gwath was named the Mountain West Freshman of the Week.

THE BIG NOTES

- With his Nevada victory (March 8), **Brian Dutcher** won his 21st game of the year and is the only Aztec men's basketball coach to win at least 21 games in each of his first eight seasons leading the program. To date, he is averaging 24.8 wins per season.
- With the triumph over Nevada (march 8), the Aztecs won their 103rd straight home game when shooting at least 50 percent from the field

- Miles Byrd, at UNLV (March 4) became the first player in Mountain West history and third player in the nation since at least the start of the 1996-97 season with 15 points (including multiple 3-pointers), 10 rebounds, six assists, four steals and three blocks in a game.
- Miles Heide, since February 18, is one of two players nationally to shoot at least 82.6 percent from the field in a minimum of 23 shots attempts.
- San Diego State defeated Wyoming (March 1) for the 13th straight time, regardless of location, extending its current longest active win streak against a Mountain West opponent. Wyoming has not defeated San Diego State since December 27, 2017.
- San Diego State has secured a bye into the quarterfinal round of the Mountain West Tournament for the 19th time in the last 20 and for the eighth straight season.
- The Aztecs held an opponent to under 30.0 percent shooting from beyond the arc 15 times this season.
- San Diego State was limited to 23 rebounds at Wyoming (March 1). It is the fourth time under Brian Dutcher the Aztecs were limited to 23 or fewer boards, but it has a 3-1 record in those games.
- New Mexico (Feb. 25) came into the game averaging 83.0 points per game and shooting 46.5 percent from the floor. The Aztecs held the Lobos to 65 points on 34.4 percent shooting.
- UNM has been to under 70 points just three times this season in 28 games - 61 at Wyoming on Jan. 7, 62 vs. San Diego State on Jan. 11 and 65 tonight at San Diego State.
- Two of New Mexico's four worst shooting efforts this season have also come against the Aztecs.
- Boise State's 47 points in the Aztecs 64-47 win, were its fewest in a conference loss since it joined the Mountain West in 2011-12. The only time the Broncos have scored fewer points in a Mountain West game was when they beat the Aztecs, 42-37, in San Diego on Jan. 22, 2022.
- San Diego State improves to 37-4 in its last 41 games immediately following a loss.
- The Aztecs have had runs of 20-0, 18-0 and 17-0, all in the second half, in three of the last four games and two of those runs (18-0 on January 28 & 17-0 on February 11) have come at the expense of San Jose State
- Magoon Gwath**, at Colorado State (2-8-25) breaks the San Diego State freshman blocks record. He has 52 passing Skylar Spencer who set the mark in the 2012-13 season. Spencer took 34 games to set the previous record and Gwath broke it in 21 games. He is now tied with Malcolm Thomas for No. 9 on the program's single season list and one behind Valentine Izundu for eighth place on the list.
- Brian Dutcher** wins his 100th Mountain West game as San Diego State's head men's basketball coach (100-35), in the team's 63-61 win versus Wyoming, and is one of four coaches in league history to win at least 100 league games. San Diego State rallied from a 21-point deficit against San Jose State (January 28) to win (trailing, 33-12, with 7:03 left in the first half). It was the largest deficit overcome to win by the Aztecs since also coming back from a 21-point deficit vs. UNLV on March 8, 2017 (trailing, 37-16, with 18:25 in the second half and won, 62-52, in overtime).
- Among the 17 programs San Diego State has played at least 50 times, its 73.6 winning percentage (67-24) against Air Force is its best in program history.
- Freshman wing **Magoon Gwath** enjoyed a 25-point, 10-rebound and four-block game in the team's 84-62 win at Fresno State on December 4. He became the first Aztec freshman to have a game of at least 25 points and 10 rebounds since **Kawhi Leonard** totaled 25 and 12 against Wyoming on January 9, 2010, and is the only freshman in the nation with a game of at least 25 points, 10 boards and four blocks this year.
- Against Colorado State (Jan. 14) Miles Byrd became the first player in Mountain West history and one of three players in the nation in the last 16 seasons to have a game of at least 25 points, including five 3-pointers, seven steals and six rebounds.**
- SDSU has handed Colorado State its largest margin of defeat in a Mountain West game in three of the last four seasons, all at Viejas Arena (15 on Jan. 14, 16 on Feb. 13, 2024, and 30 on Jan. 8, 2022). San Diego State also beat the Rams by 19 on Feb. 21, 2023, at home, which was tied for the second-largest MW loss by CSU in the 2022-23 campaign.
- Miles Byrd's** seven steals against CSU (Jan. 14) matched the most by a San Diego State player since at least the 1996-97 season (also Chase Tapley vs. UC Davis on Nov. 13, 2011, and Deandre Moore vs. Colorado State on Feb. 1, 2003).
- New Mexico's 62 points are its fewest this season, 23.4 points below its season average.
- San Diego State gave up only 14 points in the second half against Air Force, which is its second fewest allowed in a second half since at least the 1996-97 season.
- The 38 points allowed by the Aztecs to the Falcons are their fewest given up since also allowing 38 vs. Air Force on March 1, 2017. They matched the fewest allowed since giving up 34 vs. New Mexico on Jan. 26, 2014.
- San Diego State is the only Division I team leading its conference in blocks per game, scoring defense, opponent field-goal percentage and opponent three-point percentage. The only MW team to ever do that in a full season was the Aztecs in 2021-22.**
- The Aztecs showed California what stifling defense looks like back on December 21, in holding a Golden Bears team that shot 47.5 percent from the floor coming into the game to just 25.5 percent, Cal's fourth worst shooting game in the last 30 years. SDSU also limited Cal, a 38.1 percent shooting team from the bonus distance to 20.8 percent.
- The Aztecs held California to 15.6 percent shooting (5-of-32) in the first half which is its best defensive half this season and the second best first half since at least 1996-97. The only better first half for SDSU was on March 1, 2017, when it held Air Force to 15.0 percent (3-of-20).
- The Aztecs held California to 25.5 percent shooting (14-of-55) from the field for the game, it's fourth worst shooting night for the Golden Bears since at least 1996-97.
- Magoon Gwath**, at Fresno State, is the first Aztec freshman to have a game of at least 20 points and 10 rebounds since Kawhi Leonard had 25 points and 12 rebounds against Wyoming on January 9, 2010.
- With his four blocks at Fresno State (Dec. 4), **Magoon Gwath** is the only freshman in the nation to have a game of at least 25 points, 10 rebounds and four blocks.
- With the Houston win, **Brian Dutcher** improved to 16-11 against top 25 competition, including a 3-3 mark against teams ranked among the top 6 teams in the nation.
- Against Creighton, **BJ Davis** became just the second Aztec, since at least the 1996-97 season, who stands 6-2 or less, to have a game of at least 18 points and 9 rebounds (also: Malachi Flynn vs. UNLV, 2/22/2020).
- Against UC San Diego **Miles Byrd** became just the second player in NCAA Division I basketball over the last 10 seasons (since 2014-15) to record at least 20 points, 8 rebounds, 5 steals and 4 blocks in the same game. He's also the first Aztec since at least 1996-97 with that stat line. Only two other Aztecs have had a similar stat line of at least 20 points, 8 rebounds, 3 steals and 3 blocks over that time frame (Jamaal Franklin, twice and Randy Holcomb once).

- Wayne McKinney III** passed the 1,000-point milestone vs. Boise State (February 15) and enters the Mountain West Tournament with

- **Nick Boyd** passed the 1,000-point milestone vs. Fresno State (February 18) and enters the Mountain West Tournament with 1,090 career points.
- **Jared Coleman-Jones** is 190 points from 1,000 (810 career points).
- **Reese Waters** is 175 points from the 1,000-point plateau (825 career points).

- Gwath's 13 rebounds at Nevada (Jan. 25) are the most by an Aztec freshman since Jalen McDaniels grabbed as many on February 3, 2018, against Air Force.
- Gwath was 7-of-7 from the field, including 1-of-1 from beyond the arc, for game-high 15 points and career and game-high 13 rebounds at Nevada (Jan. 25). He is the first Aztec since the 1997-98 season to record a double-double shooting 1.000 percent from the floor since Roy Kruiswyk was (6-of-6) in a 13 pt/10 reb double-double against SMU on Jan. 15, 1998.
- His 66 blocks represent 41.0 percent of the team's total of 161 for the season.
- Gwath is the 12th player in Mountain West history to have double-doubles with a perfect shooting night, minimum of 7 field goal attempts, but if you include his successful 3-pointer, he is the only player in league history to accomplish the feat.
- His 2.64 blocks per game and 66 total blocks rank No. 7 and 17, respectively, in the nation.
- His 66 blocks are nearly double the next closest freshman in the Mountain West. (No. 2 is Fresno State's Elijah Price w/ 39).
- His 66 blocks are greater than or equal to the TEAM total of 28 Division I programs this season.
- His 66 blocks through the first 25 games of his career are the most for an Aztec since at least the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-00).
- Was on pace for 80 blocks this season before hyper-extending his knee and missing the last five games.
- One of three members of the team who are of South Sudanese heritage. (Also: redshirt Thokbor Majak & Director of Player Development Aquek Arop)

- Has a strong game from the midrange and getting to the rim and is working to improve his defense and shot behind the arc.
- One of three active players in the nation standing 6-0 or less, who has scored at least 1,041 points while shooting at least 41.7 percent from the floor and has blocked at least 27 shots.
- A powerful guard who uses his strength to get to the rim, can score from three levels and is a spark off the bench.
- Has shot at least .400 from the field in each of his three previous college seasons.
- Led USD in assists (93), steals (42), minutes (962) and starts (32) and appearances (32) in 2023-24.
- His 31 points at Pacific (2/10/24) are a career high and the most for a Torero, who stands no more than 6-0, since Johnny Dee scored 30 vs. Pepperdine on March 1, 2012.

- Set SHs in points (14), rebounds (6), assists (5) and steals (2) vs Occidental (11-12-24).

- Has led the team in assists four times and rebounds in three games.
- Leads Aztecs' freshman, ranks No. 2 among Mountain West frosh, and No. 3 on the team with 54 assists.

- Has been successful in his last 17 field goals.
- Leads the team with 47 offensive boards and for his career, 90-of-183 boards (49.2 percent) have been on the offensive glass.
- **Ranks No. 1 on the team with 4.3 offensive rebounds per 40 minutes & 1-of-2 players in the nation grabbing 4.3 offensive boards in no more than 446 minutes.**

SERIES HISTORY VS. BOISE STATE

- This is the 34th meeting between Boise State and San Diego State with the Aztecs holding a 20-13 advantage in the series.
- These programs has met five times in the Mountain West Tournament and SDSU has won four of those encounters, three of which have come in the quarterfinal round and all have been won by the Aztecs: 65-62 on March 8, 2012, 73-67 on March 13, 2013, and 87-68 on March 9, 2017. The only semifinal matchup was on March 5, 2020 and was an 81-68 win for SDSU. The lone loss was in the most important game of the event, the championship of the 2022 tournament, a 53-52 Boise State victory.
- Since 2012, when Boise State joined the Mountain West, San Diego State has won 10 of the 14 regular season meetings (10-4) in Viejas Arena, including seven of the last nine.
- Ten of the 15 meetings in San Diego have been decided by 10 points or less, the exceptions being an 83-65 Aztecs win on Jan. 11, 2020, an 78-66 victory on Feb. 27, 2021, 72-52 in on Feb. 3, 2023 & 64-47 on Feb. 15, 2025.
- The Aztecs have won seven of the last nine (7-2) at Steve Fisher Court, with the only defeats being a 37-45 slug-fest on Jan. 22, 2022 and 77-79 in overtime on March 8, 2024.
- SDSU is 5-8 in games played in Boise, all since the start of the 2011-12 season. In its five wins, the Aztecs' margin of victory is 8.6 points with a pair of double-digit victories. In its eight losses, three have come by 10-plus points and the average margin of victory has been 8.3 points.
- The first meeting, a 78-68 Aztecs win in Peterson Gym, came on Dec. 12, 1976 and the programs didn't get back together until 36 years later when they were Mountain West Conference opponents, on Feb. 1, 2012.
- As head coach, Brian Dutcher has been in the lead chair on the Aztec sideline for the last 18 games against the Broncos and is 10-8 against Boise State.
- These programs have met 13 times when SDSU has been ranked in the AP top-25, regardless of location, and the Aztecs are 11-2.
- All-time series meetings against Boise State can be found in the column on page four.

SAN DIEGO - Nick Boyd registered 24 points to lead San Diego State to a dominant, 64-47 victory over Boise State on Saturday night. The victory gives the Aztecs six wins in their last seven games.

SDSU (17-6, 10-4 MW) had its best shooting performance of conference play, making 26-of-48 (54.2 pct.) including 5-of-12 (41.7 pct.) from beyond the arc.

Defensively, the Aztecs held Boise State (17-8, 9-5 MW) to a season-worst .345 shooting percentage.

San Diego State scored the first bucket but found themselves trailing 9-4 at the first media timeout with Andrew Meadow scoring the Broncos' first seven points of the night.

Boyd and Magoon Gwath put the team on their back in the first half, recording 17 of the team's first 19 points. Boyd finished the half with 16 of the team's 28 first half points.

With 5:15 left in the first half, a Tyson Degenhart layup gave the Broncos a one-point lead but was quickly erased with the Aztecs going on

an 11-0 run to end the half. SDSU held Boise State to 0-for-7 in the final minutes of the first leading to a 28-18 advantage at the break.

The Aztecs came out of halftime and hit four of their first five shots before sparking a 12-0 run. It is the fifth time this season they have had multiple scoring runs of at least 10-0. Between the final five minutes of the first and first seven minutes of the second, SDSU outscored the Broncos 29-5 and would eventually extend its lead to as many as 23 points.

Boise State responded with 12-0 run of their own, but San Diego State's lead would not dip below 11 the rest of the way as they cruised to the 64-47 victory at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

Boyd's 24 is a career-high for the senior transfer and his second 20-point performance for the Scarlet and Black. He also tied the team-high with six rebounds on the night.

Miles Byrd and Wayne McKinney III both reached double-figures with 10 points apiece. For McKinney, it gives the San Diego native 1,000 points in his collegiate career. Magoon Gwath filled the stat sheet with eight points, six rebounds and a career high six blocks.

The Broncos were led by Tyson Degenhart's double-double of 17 points and 12 rebounds. Seven of his boards came on the offensive end.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State shot 54.5 percent from the floor and four players reached double figures in its 80-61 victory on Saturday night over the Nevada Wolf Pack at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

Nick Boyd led the offensive attack with 18 points and was joined by Miles Heide who had a career-best 14 points, Pharaoh Compton who equaled his career-high with 13 points and BJ Davis added 10.

The Aztecs 54.5 percent shooting (30-of-55) is their best since February 16, 2024, against New Mexico, when they hit 56.9 percent.

The Aztecs led 8-7 with 14:49 to play in the first half and then went on a 24-3 run over an 8:40 span to extend their advantage to 32-10 and never looked back. They led by 22 points at the half, 43-21. The 22-point advantage is their largest halftime lead of the season.

SDSU's largest margin, 28 points, came with 17:54 to play, 49-21. The Wolf Pack got as close as 14 points, 59-45 with 9:56 to play, but the Aztecs responded with an 8-1 run and put Nevada away 80-61.

San Diego State honored six senior on Saturday, Ryan Schwarz, Desai Lopez, Demarshay Johnson Jr., Kimo Ferrari, Wayne McKinney III and Jared Coleman-Jones in a ceremony prior to the game.

GWATH STANDS ATOP SDSU FROSH BLOCKS LIST

Redshirt freshman **Magoon Gwath** is the best freshman shot blocker in San Diego State history.

- With two blocked shots at Colorado State (2-8-25), the Eules, Texas native, had 52 swats in 21 games and passed Skylar Spencer, who blocked 51 shots in 34 games in the 2012-13 campaign.
- Entering the New Mexico game, Gwath's 66 total blocks places him No. 7 on the program's single season list and is five swats from equaling Nathan Mensah for No. 6 on the list.
- At his current place (2.64 blocks per game) he would finish with 80 blocks in the 30 games guaranteed to the Aztecs, which would slot him into No. 4 on the single season list.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' FOR SDSU...CALIFORNIA NIGHTMARE FOR IN-STATE OPPONENTS

- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 151-35 (.812) against the other 26 current Division I schools in California and have a winning record against all but four (UCLA, 7-16; Southern California, 3-11; Stanford, 2-4; Pepperdine, 18-36) of those 26 opponents.
- In program history against the 26 schools, the Aztecs are 485-326 (.598) overall.
- In the last 113 home games against those same 26 opponents, and starting in 1999-2000, San Diego State is 102-11 (.903).
- San Diego State, during the 2024-25 season is 8-0 against its California brethren having defeated UC San Diego (63-58), Fresno State (84-62 & 83-60), San Diego (74-57), California Baptist (81-75), California (71-50) and San Jose State (71-68 & 69-66).

GWATH NAMED MW FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK...IN BACK-TO-BACK WEEKS

Redshirt freshman **Magoon Gwath** was named the Mountain West Freshman of the Week for the week ending on February 2. It is his second award of the season and his second in as many weeks.

- The forward from Eules, Texas, averaged 19.0 points and 9.0 rebounds as well as 2.5 blocks and 1.0 assists in a pair of victories versus San Jose State (Jan. 28) and Wyoming (Feb. 1) to propel the Aztecs to an 8-3 league record.
- For the week, he shot 51.9 percent (14-of-27) from the floor, 36.4 percent from distance (4-of-11) and 85.7 percent from the line (6-of-7) in an average of 36.0 minutes per contest.
- In the two games, 12 of his 14 defensive rebounds ended the opposition's possession with a single shot and one of his four offensive boards resulted in two Aztec points. His two assists were on five SDSU points and his four turnovers turned into zero points from SJSU and Wyoming. His five blocks turned into two points by him going the other way and limited the opponent to two single-shot possessions.
- The previous week, he averaged 12.0 points and 10.0 rebounds as well as 2.0 blocks, 1.5 assists and 1.0 steals in a pair of road victories last week: at Air Force and at Nevada to propel the Aztecs to a 4-1 league road record so far this season.
- For that week, he shot 71.4 percent (10-of-14) from the floor, including 33.3 percent (1-of-3) from the bonus distance, and 60.0 percent (3-of-5) from the line.
- In the Aztecs 69-50 win at Nevada on January 25, Gwath was 7-of-7 from the field, including 1-of-1 from beyond the arc for game-high 15 points and a career and game-high 13 rebounds. He is the first Aztec since the 1997-98 season to record a double-double shooting 100 percent from the floor since Roy Kruiswyk was (6-of-6) in a 13 point, 10 rebound double-double against SMU on Jan. 15, 1998.
- Gwath is the 12th player in Mountain West history to have double-doubles with a perfect shooting night, minimum of seven field goal attempts, but if you include a successful 3-pointer in the stat line, he is the only player in league history to accomplish the feat.
- Eight of his defensive boards limited the Wolf Pack to a single-shot possession and two of them led directly to four points going the other way. In addition, one of his four offensive rebounds led to two points for the Scarlet and Black.
- On January 22 at Air Force, he was 3-of-7 from the field, 3-of-5 from the line with a team leading seven rebounds to go along with a career-high and game high three assists, two blocks and a steal in the team's 77-76 overtime win.
- His three offensive boards led directly to six points. Three of his four defensive rebounds limited the Falcons to a single shot possession. His three assists led to eight points and one of his two blocks resulted in three points the other way. In addition, he assisted on the bucket after the block which gave SDSU what would turn out to be the largest lead for either team, nine points.

Eighth Season • 26th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his eighth season as San Diego State head men's basketball coach and is coming off back-to-back Sweet 16 appearances and a run to the program's first national championship game appearance in the 2023 NCAA Tournament. He is building on the previous seven years in which he led the Aztecs to seven title games in Mountain West tournament, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th, 14th, 15th & 16th Mountain West crowns, and to a bid to the NCAA tournament in five of the six years in which a champion was crowned. He is the only coach in the 103-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first seven seasons. His 177 victories in six seasons (177-58) are the most for any Division I head coach whose first year guiding his current program was 2017-18 and the accompanying win percentage, 75.3 percent, is the highest for any head basketball coach in San Diego State history.

Dutcher has been recognized twice, following the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons, with Mountain West Coach of the Year honors and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year in both those years as well. In addition, Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year distinction following the 2019-20 campaign and was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

His teams have faced top 25 ranked opponents on 24 occasions and posted a 14-10 record, which includes wins over No. 1 Alabama, Gonzaga (twice), UCLA and Arizona State as well as Nevada (four times) and Colorado State (twice). From the start of the 2018-19 season to its demise after the 2023-24 campaign, his Aztecs were 8-3 against Pac-12 opponents and 11-6 in multi-team events. Since the start of the 2017-18 season, SDSU has the seventh best home win percentage in the nation (89.8 percent), and in the last five years, San Diego State has posted a 92.1-win percentage (70-6) in Viejas Arena, the fourth best in the nation.

The team's success on the court is reflected in the honors his players have earned. In 2020, Malachi Flynn was a consensus All-American, the third Aztec to earn that honor. The following season Matt Mitchell was recognized by the Associated Press with the All-American moniker and 2024 Jaedon LeDee was named the Karl Malone Award winner for the best power forward in the nation as well as being named an All-American by multiple organizations.

San Diego State put a player on the USBWA's All-District IX first team in 2020 (Flynn) and 2021 (Mitchell). The NABC has bestowed its All-District 17 honors eight times to an Aztec in the last seven years. In 2019, Jalen McDaniels earned first-team designation. Flynn and Yanni Wetzell were first team and Mitchell was second team in 2020. In 2021, Mitchell and Jordan Schakel earned first team and second team honors, respectively. In 2022, Matt Bradley was a second team performer and in 2023, LeDee was a first-team designee.

Within the Mountain West, Flynn was named the 2020 Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year, Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Newcomer of the Year, and a member of the All-Defensive Team. In the same season, KJ Feagin was named to the all-defensive team and one year prior, Jeremy Hemsley was included on the league's all-defensive team. In 2021, Mitchell earned Mountain West Player of the Year, first team All-Mountain West and inclusion on the all-defensive team along with Nathan Mensah. In 2022, Mensah was the Defensive Player of the Year and a member of the all-defensive team. Bradley was the Newcomer of the Year. Chad Baker-Mazara was named the Sixth Man of the Year and Lamont Butler garnered all-defensive team honors. 2023 saw Mensah again named the Defensive Player of the Year, a third-team performer, and a member of the all-Defensive Team, while Bradley earned first-team honors and Lamont Butler was a third team and All-Defensive Team designee. Last year, Butler was the Defensive Player of the Year, a member of the All-Defensive Team and an honorable mention performer, while Jaedon LeDee was tabbed a first-team honoree.

His players have earned 20 all-Mountain West designations and 21 players of the week honors. Three Aztecs, Trey Kell in 2018, Mitchell in 2021 and Bradley in 2023, were named Mountain West tournament MVP among 13 SDSU players who have been included on the league's all-tournament team. In his seven seasons, his charges have garnered 18 league all-academic team distinctions, a pair of Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar awards, and Flynn was named to the 2020 NABC Honors Court.

The 2022-23 season saw SDSU fulfill a promise coach Dutcher, and Hall of Fame coach Steve Fisher, made the day they stepped on campus prior to the 1999-00 season... that the program's goal was to compete for national championships. The Aztecs finished with a 32-7 record, played Connecticut for the NCAA championship in Houston's NRG Stadium in front of more than 72,000 spectators and finished the season as the national runner-up. The team ranked No. 2 in the final USA Today Coaches poll, the highest the program has ever achieved.

SDSU's 32 victories are the second most in a season in San Diego State history, trailing only the 34 wins in 2010-11. In conference play, SDSU was 15-3 and secured both the regular-season and tournament titles to earn a No. 5 seed, its third consecutive season with a single-digit seed in the NCAA Tournament. Five of the team's seven losses were by nine points or less, with three of its losses coming against top 25 opposition and in each of its seven losses its opponent was receiving votes in the national polls. Senior guard Darrion Trammell was named the South Regional Most Outstanding Player with Lamont Butler also included on the South Regional All-Tournament Team. Butler, who hit the biggest shot in SDSU history, the game winner as time expired against Florida Atlantic in the Final Four to send the Aztecs to the national championship game, earned a spot on the 2023 NCAA All-Tournament Team.

The 2021-22 campaign featured a 23-9 record and SDSU's second straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament, garnering a No. 8 seed. Six of its nine losses were by six points or less and after Dec. 8, 2021, four of the team's six defeats were by three points or less. Twice during that stretch, the Aztecs defeated nationally ranked Colorado State.

In 2020-21, he guided San Diego State to the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns and earned a No. 6-seed in the NCAA tournament. The Aztecs went 23-5 and finished the regular season ranked No. 7 in field goal percentage defense (.387), No. 8 in scoring defense (60.6), No. 12 in scoring margin (+13.5), No. 14 in total steals (233), and No. 16 in turnover margin (+3.9) nationally. Among the Mountain West teams, San Diego

State led the league in turnovers forced (15.15), steals per game (8.19), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25:1), three-point field goal percentage (.381), field goal percentage defense, scoring defense, scoring margin, turnover margin and total steals. The team posted a 14-game win streak, which is the fourth longest in school history and is the third of at least nine games under Dutcher.

The 2019-20 squad ripped off a program-record 26-straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both national polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2, including 17-1 in Mountain West play.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the fourth most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program and Mountain West history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak, which set a new Mountain West record.

In 2017-18, Dutcher was the only Division I coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament in his initial season after going 22-10, including winning the 2018 MW Tournament championship.

Over the course of his 25 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 18 times, including 13 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 16 Mountain West titles and record 19 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, SDSU has four NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014, 2023 & 2024) and NIT semifinal (2009, 2016) appearances, won at least 25 games nine times and captured 16 MW championships (nine regular season, seven tournament).

In his first year on The Mesa (1999-00), as an assistant coach, the Aztecs won only five games but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

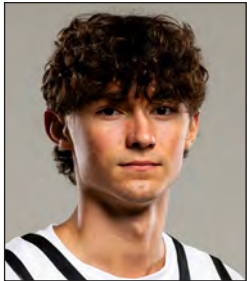

SAN DIEGO — On the back of a career performance from Miles Byrd, San Diego State opened their season with a 63-58 victory over UC San Diego on Wednesday night. In his first career start, the sophomore recorded career highs in points, field goals, three-pointers, steals and matched his career high in blocks.

SDSU (1-0) has now won 14 straight games against UCSD (0-1) and 13 straight on its home floor against the Tritons. The win also marks their 18th in a row in home openers against unranked opponents.

Byrd filled the stat sheet with 20 points on 7-of-12 shooting and 4-of-6 from three with eight rebounds, five steals and four blocks. He is the first Aztec with that stat line since at least 1996-97 and just the second to do so in the NCAA over the last decade.

Magoon Gwath started the night with his first career block on the first possession of the game which quickly led to a Nick Boyd layup on the other end for the game's first basket. Gwath added a second block minutes later giving him a pair before the first media timeout on his way to three total for his official debut.

The Aztecs were slow to build on the early excitement though making just two of their first 11 field goal attempts heading into a timeout on the floor. However, they came out of the quick break on a 10-0 run while holding UC San Diego to 0-for-12 from the field in that same stretch until the eight and a half minute mark.

UC San Diego would battle back, closing out the first on a 10-3 run reducing the Aztec lead to just two points through the first 20 minutes.

The Tritons carried their momentum early into the second half claiming the lead within the first two minutes, but the Scarlet and Black answered with eight straight points. UCSD quickly responded with seven straight of their own to take the lead right back.

With just under nine minutes left in the contest, Byrd took over, made three field goals to spark a 13-2 scoring run and put the Aztecs back out in front.

San Diego State reclaimed the lead with 5:26 left in the contest and never looked back, holding on for the season opening win. With the defense holding the Tritons to just 58 points, it is the 21st consecutive victory when holding the opponent between 50-59 points.

The starting backcourt of Nick Boyd and BJ Davis recorded 11 points apiece in their first official starts on The Mesa while Jared Coleman-Jones added nine points along with nine boards.

UC San Diego's Tyler McGhie led all scorers with 21 points on 8-of-15 shooting. Aniwaniwa Tai-Jones added 13 for the Tritons.

The Aztecs will be back in action next week hosting Occidental College on Tuesday, Nov. 12 at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena. The game will be streamed live on Yurview and the Mountain West Network.

San Diego State is now 160-12 when leading with 5:00 left in the game in the Brian Dutcher era. The Aztecs are also 92-7 when holding their opponent to less than 60 points.

San Diego State 100 Occidental 49

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State moved to 2-0 on the season with a 100-49 defeat of Occidental College on Tuesday Night. The win marked their 12th straight over the Tigers, tied for the program's third longest active streak.

The game is the first 100-point game for the Aztecs since a 100-97 overtime victory on Nov. 19, 2023 over Washington. It is the first time they have hit the century mark in four quarters of regulation since Nov. 14, 2018, when they defeated Texas Southern 103-64 at the Maui Jim Maui Invitational.

Magoon Gwath, Wayne McKinney III and BJ Davis matched each other with a game-high 16 points. Davis added a career high five steals to his stat line while Gwath recorded a career high four blocks.

Gwath's four blocks marks the most by an Aztec freshman since at least 1996-97.

Taj DeGourville filled the stat sheet with 14 points, six rebounds and five assists while Nick Boyd added 10 points as the final SDSU player to reach double-digits.

The Aztecs got off to a scorching hot start connecting on their first six shots before their first miss, including three three-pointers. With that came an 18-0 run to open the contest before Occidental made their first field goal almost five minutes in.

McKinney III led the stretch with 11 points on 4-of-4 shooting, 3-of-3 from beyond the arc, through the first five and a half minutes. SDSU had the score up to 25-2 by the first media timeout.

Everyone was involved in the first half scoring for the Scarlet and Black as all 10 players that saw time on the court registered at least one point en route to a 54-17 advantage at the break. Further, nine of the 10 Aztecs that played made at least one field goal.

San Diego State came out of the break on fire again shooting 5-of-6 from the field and 3-of-4 from three extending their lead to 40 points. Their advantage reached as many as 61 points down the stretch cruising to the 100-49 victory.

For Occidental College, Nasir Luna matched the game high with 16 points on 6-of-13 shooting. Ethan Hanning also reached double-figures for the Tigers with 12 points.

In their annual celebration of Native American Heritage Month, SDSU wore their turquoise uniforms on Tuesday night. In the nine games, the Aztecs own an 8-1 record.

The 51 points is the largest margin of victory for San Diego State since Nov. 20, 2013 when it defeated San Diego Christian by 52 points (93-41).

San Diego State connected 18 three-pointers (18-of-40), one shy of the program record for most three's in a game (19, vs. Occidental College on Dec. 2, 2022).

San Diego State will host No. 4/5 Gonzaga on Monday, Nov. 18 at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena. Tipoff will be at 7 p.m. PT on CBS Sports Network.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State nearly outshot No. 3/4 Gonzaga, but ultimately fell 80-67 on Monday night at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena. The loss to the Zags is the first for the Aztecs under head coach Brian Dutcher.

The Aztecs (2-1) were killed at the free throw line with Gonzaga (4-0) owning a 27-13 free throw advantage on the night.

Nick Boyd had game-highs in both points and rebounds with 23 and nine, respectively. The 23 points is a career high for the senior transfer. BJ Davis added 15 points and Wayne McKinney III added 11 in the loss.

On the other side, Graham Ike matched Boyd's totals for the game highs with 23 points and nine rebounds of his own. Twenty of his 23 came in the second half after battling foul trouble in the first. Ryan Nembhard recorded a double-double with 19 points and 10 assists.

SDSU never led in the contest, tying the game on two separate occasions. The first of those came at the 14:20 mark in the first half after McKinney entered the game for the first time and registered six straight points off the bench.

The Zags would eventually go on an 8-0 run through the middle of the first and increase their lead into double-digits and ultimately own a nine-point lead at halftime.

Coming out of the break, SDSU battled back to single-digit deficit with a 7-0 run starting at the 16:45 mark. However, Gonzaga had an answer in the form of Ike scoring 12 of the team's first 17 second half points.

San Diego State went cold down the stretch, shooting just 2-of-9 to close out the game. For the night, they shot 23-of-61 (37.7%) from the field and 8-of-25 (32.0%) from three in the loss.

Next up for the Aztecs is a trip to Las Vegas for the Players Era Festival. Their first matchup of the three-game week will be against No. 14/13 Creighton Tuesday, Nov. 26 at 11 a.m. PST.

LAS VEGAS — BJ Davis scored a career-high 18 points and Miles Byrd added 16 points as San Diego State men's basketball knocked off No. 21/19 Creighton 71-53 at MGM Grand Garden Arena in the first game of the Players Era Festival on Tuesday.

The Aztecs (3-1) bounced back from last week's defeat to No. 3/4 Gonzaga and earned their fourth win in their last five games against the Bluejays, all taking place on neutral courts.

San Diego State handed Creighton (4-2) its second consecutive loss after the Bluejays began the season with four straight wins. Creighton fell 74-63 to Nebraska last Friday.

SDSU dumped the ball inside in the first half, scoring 18 of 32 first-half points in the point on its way to a 32-28 halftime lead. Davis had 10 points at halftime including the Aztecs' only two three-pointers in the opening period to go with six rebounds. Creighton's Pop Isaacs led the way for the Bluejays at halftime with 10 points while San Diego State held standout big Ryan Kalkbrenner to just one field goal and two rebounds in the first 20 minutes. The Aztecs had 6-0 and 9-0 runs in the first half to stay ahead of Creighton with Magoon Gwath hitting a floater as time expired in the first half to finish with the four-point halftime lead.

In the second half, the Aztecs had a three-point barrage to wash away the Bluejays. San Diego State shot 6-of-11 from the beyond the arc in the second half, outscoring Creighton 39-25 to close out the contest. Davis tacked on eight points while Byrd scored 12 of his 16 points in the final 20 minutes. Isaacs and Kalkbrenner combined for 17 of the Bluejays' 25 second-half points. San Diego State's perimeter defense held strong with Creighton going 1-of-16 from deep in the second half.

Three Bluejays finished in double figures: Isaacs scored 18, Jackson McAndrew had a double double with a dozen points and 14 assists and Kalkbrenner scored 11. The other seven Creighton players combined for 12 points, all coming from Fredrick King (7) and Jamiya Neal (5).

San Diego State shot better from the field (48.4%-33.9%), from deep (47.1%-19.4%) and the line (42.9%-38.5%). SDSU also outscored Creighton off turnovers (13-7) and on fast breaks (15-1). Each team had 40 boards while the Aztecs led in assists (13-12), steals (8-1) and blocks (9-7).

Creighton falls to 3-10 (.231 winning percentage) against Mountain West teams since January 1, 2009, compared to a 362-184 (.663 winning percentage) overall record in that time. The Bluejays' last regular season win against a Mountain West squad came on November 19, 2018, against Boise State. Creighton is 0-5 against the MW in the regular season since that game.

BJ Davis became the second Aztec 6'2" or shorter with at least 18 points and nine rebounds in a game since 1996-97. He joins Malachi Flynn, who had 24 points and nine rebounds against UNLV on February 22, 2020.

The Aztecs continue the Players Era Festival against the Oregon Ducks at 1 p.m. PT tomorrow. The game will be televised on Max with a radio broadcast on San Diego Sports 760.

LAS VEGAS — BJ Davis (18), Nick Boyd (15) and Miles Byrd (10) scored in double figures, but it was not enough as San Diego State men's basketball fell 78-68 to Oregon at MGM Grand Garden Arena in the Players Era Festival on Wednesday.

The Aztecs (3-2) fall to a game above .500 this season.

Oregon (7-0) keeps its perfect record and advances to Saturday night's Players Era Festival Championship game.

Most of the first half was close with Boyd hitting a three-pointer to tie the game at 27 with 4:49 remaining. The Ducks pulled away after that point, outscoring the Aztecs 14-4 over the final four and a half minutes of the first half, leading to a 41-31 score at halftime. Boyd led the way for SDSU in the first half with 13 of the team's 31 points and all but two of his 15 points coming in the first 20 minutes. TJ Bamba had 11 points in the first half for Oregon while Keshawn Barthelmy had nine in the same time frame. The main difference in the first half was rebound differential, with Oregon leading 24-12.

In the second half, the teams scored at similar rates until Oregon took a 56-44 lead with 13:06 remaining in the game. The Aztecs rallied, scoring the next nine points. BJ Davis started the run with a three-point play before a Magoon Gwath dunk, Miles Heide layup and Boyd jumper reduced the deficit to three points with just inside of 11 minutes remaining. Oregon pulled back ahead on the back of three-pointers and free throws as the Ducks scored 12 of their final 22 points from beyond the arc and eight more from the charity stripe. Tuesday's hero, Davis scored a dozen points in the second half to match his career-high 18 points from the victory over Creighton. Bamba scored another 11 points in the second half for the Ducks.

In addition to Davis, Boyd and Byrd finishing in double figures, Pharaoh Compton contributed a career-high eight points while Magoon Gwath matched a career-high with five blocks.

For Oregon, Bamba led the way with 22 points. Nate Bittle neared a double double with 11 points and nine rebounds and Barthelmy finished with 16 points while Brandon Angel and Jackson Shelstad added a dozen points each.

San Diego State shot better from the field (50.9%-44.6%) but Oregon was better from beyond the arc (45.5%-31.6%) and at the line (69.2%-50.0%). SDSU outscored Oregon in the paint (36-28) while the Ducks were better on second chance points (18-4). Oregon won the rebounding battle (41-24) while the Aztecs were better at blocking shots (9-5).

As a team, San Diego State has recorded eight or more blocks in all five games this season including nine in each of its last three contests. No other team has been as consistent blocking shots and SDSU's 8.6 blocks per game this season are the best in the country as of the conclusion of Wednesday's game.

The Aztecs wrap up the Players Era Festival on Saturday.

LAS VEGAS — San Diego State men's basketball surged down the stretch to force overtime as it knocked off No. 6/7 Houston 73-70 in the third-place game of the Players Era Festival at MGM Grand Garden Arena on Saturday. Miles Byrd's 18 points and Jared Coleman-Jones' 16 led the way for SDSU.

The Aztecs (4-2) bounce back after falling to Oregon on Wednesday. SDSU is now 2-1 against ranked opposition this season after a win over No. 21 Creighton to open the tournament on Tuesday.

Houston (4-3) falls to just a game above .500. This was the first unranked loss for the Cougars and first loss against a non-SEC opponent, whose other losses have come to No. 11 Auburn and No. 9 Alabama.

The first half was a defensive struggle. San Diego State scored the first six points and led 10-5 before Houston tied the score at a dozen. The Cougars carried that momentum into a 28-21 lead with two minutes remaining in the first half but a Coleman-Jones three helped SDSU trim the deficit to five points (30-25) heading into halftime. Compton had eight of his points in the first half for the Aztecs while Emanuel Sharp had 12 at the break for the Cougars.

Milos Uzan hit two three-pointers to begin the second half and extend the Houston lead to 11. Coleman-Jones made consecutive buckets to cut the deficit back to six points, but the Cougars responded with four points of their own. The Aztecs went on a 7-1 run to make it a four-point game. After Houston extended the lead back up to 50-41, Nick Boyd made three straight baskets including a pair of threes to bring SDSU within two points. Following a Cougar two, BJ Davis drained a three to make it a one-point game. The Aztecs kept within five points for the remainder of the second half as Byrd made a pair of free throws with 13 seconds left to tie the game at 65 and force overtime.

In the bonus period, San Diego State took a one-point lead on a free throw from Magoon Gwath. After Uzan put Houston back on top, Davis hit a pair of free throws to reclaim the lead and Boyd made layups to put the Aztecs up 72-67. Cryer drained a three-pointer to make it a one possession game before one more Gwath free throw put SDSU back up three and Cryer's last second shot missed as the Aztecs triumphed 73-70.

Byrd added six rebounds with his team leading 18 points. Coleman-Jones scored nine of his 16 points from beyond the arc, tying his career-high with three triples. Pharaoh Compton reached a career-high with 13 points of his own including a trio of dunks. Boyd also reached double figures with a dozen points of his own along with seven rebounds. Davis (five steals) and Gwath (five blocks) anchored the Aztec defense.

San Diego State shot better from the field (40.4%-37.1%) but Houston was superior from beyond the arc (45.8%-36.0%) and at the line (76.5%-66.7%). SDSU outscored Houston in the paint (26-18), on fast breaks (7-0) and off the bench (16-7). The Aztecs had eight steals and just seven turnovers while the Cougars had a lone steal and turned the ball over 12 times.

San Diego State improves to 2-0 against the No. 6-ranked team in the AP poll under Brian Dutcher. The Aztecs knocked off No. 6/6 Nevada 65-57 on February 20, 2019.

FRESNO, CALIF. — San Diego State men's basketball outscored Fresno State 55-38 in the second half thanks to 25 points and ten rebounds from Magoon Gwath as the Aztecs defeated the Bulldogs 84-62 in their Mountain West opener on Wednesday night in Save Mart Center.

The Aztecs (5-2, 1-0 Mountain West) maintain their momentum from last week's success in Las Vegas, where SDSU defeated No. 6 Houston and No. 21 Creighton. San Diego State picked up a win in its first true road game of the season.

Fresno State (3-5, 0-1 MW) drops its third straight game after falling to Washington State and California Baptist last week. The Bulldogs will be on the road for their next two games at Santa Clara and Brigham Young.

The first half was a defensive struggle. It took almost three minutes for either team to score and the Aztecs got on the board with a Jared Coleman-Jones layup four minutes and 46 seconds into the game. The game stayed close for most of the first half. With the Aztecs leading by a point, Gwath drained a three-pointer with just under five minutes remaining in the first half. Following a pair of free throws by each team, Gwath hit two more threes to extend the Aztec lead to ten points. Fresno State's Alex Crawford made a layup and a three pointer as the half came to a close to cut the lead down to five points heading into the break.

The scoring ramped up for the Aztecs in the second half. After Fresno State scored on its opening possession, the SDSU defense held the Bulldogs without a basket for nearly four minutes, allowing the lead to build back up to nine points. BJ Davis and Wayne McKinney III each made a three-pointer to extend the lead to 13 points. The lead would stay in the teens until a Pharaoh Compton dunk pushed it to 20 with around seven and a half minutes remaining. Several minutes later, a pair of Gwath dunks made it a 22-point game with four minutes left. The subs came on for SDSU and closed out the game with Demarshay Johnson Jr. scoring on a dunk and a layup.

In addition to Gwath's 25 points and ten rebounds, the Aztecs were spearheaded by their guard play. Davis scored 13 points with seven rebounds while Miles Byrd finished a point away from a double double (nine points, ten rebounds) and McKinney III scored a dozen points off the bench. Johnson Jr.'s pair of buckets in the closing minutes helped him reach the highest point total of his career against Division I opposition.

San Diego State shot better from the field (48.5%-27.3%) and beyond the arc (30.4%-19.2%) while Fresno State was better at the line (70.0%-64.7%). SDSU outscored the Bulldogs in the paint (50-26), on fast breaks (21-16) and off the bench (29-19). The Aztecs won the rebounding battle (54-39) and did a better job distributing the ball (12-4) while Fresno State had more steals (12-3).

Magoon Gwath became the first Aztec freshman with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds in a game since Kawhi Leonard had 25 points and 12 boards against Wyoming on January 9, 2010.

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Nick Boyd scored 17 points, including five in four seconds early in the second half, and No. 24 San Diego State beat San Diego 74-57 on Saturday night in the first meeting between the crosstown rivals in five years.

Miles Byrd and Jared Coleman-Jones added 13 apiece and Pharaoh Compton had 12 for the Aztecs (6-2), who won their third straight game.

Bendji Pierre scored 17 for USD, including five 3-pointers.

Boyd made a layup for a 41-37 lead 4:25 into the second half and was fouled. He missed the free throw and Wayne McKinney III rebounded and passed to Taj DeGourville, who fed Boyd for a 3-pointer.

San Diego: The Toreros held their own into the second half. Although they fell behind by double digits late in the first half, they took a 35-33 lead on Deven Dahlke's free throws 1:20 into the second half. The Aztecs then pulled away behind Boyd and Byrd.

San Diego State: The Aztecs, who entered The Associated Press poll on Monday for the first time this season, were playing at home for the first time in nearly three weeks. They improved to 33-19 in the series between the local rivals, whose campuses are about eight miles apart, and to 22-9 in games played on Montezuma Mesa.

With 13 1/2 minutes left, Compton had a steal and passed to DeGourville, who made an alley-oop pass to Compton for a slam dunk that gave SDSU a 48-42 lead and brought the crowd to its feet.

While Pierre made 5 of 11 3-pointers, the rest of the Toreros combined to make just 1 of 21 from behind the arc.

USD hosts Long Beach State on Tuesday night while SDSU hosts California Baptist on Wednesday night.

SAN DIEGO — No. 23/24 San Diego State won their fourth game in a row, defeating California Baptist 81-75 at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena on Wednesday night.

Miles Byrd led the Aztecs (7-2) with 19 points, 15 of which came in the second half. Nick Boyd added 16 points and a career high eight assists. Magoon Gwath scored 10 points and added two more blocks to his season total while Miles Heide registered a career high 10 points of his own and a team-high five rebounds.

The Lancers (5-5) were led by Dominique Daniels Jr.'s game-high 22 points and six assists. Kendal Coleman and Adam Moussa reached double-figures with 13 and 10, respectively.

California Baptist put points on the board first with a pair of free throws on their first possession. After a Gwath bucket, Boyd drilled a three for the Aztecs' first lead with the senior transfer scoring seven of the team's first 12 points of the night.

The offense was clicking for both sides early as CBU was 8-of-11 shooting to begin the contest along with SDSU's 6-of-10.

The Aztec defense settled in down the stretch though forcing five Lancer turnovers leading to a 40-33 lead at halftime. It is the most first half points for the Aztecs against a Division I opponent this season.

San Diego State came out of the break on fire, opening the second half 8-of-9 from the field and 3-of-3 from deep. With 14:07 on the clock, the Aztecs extended their lead to double digits to begin a 14-2 scoring run and reach their largest lead of the night of 19.

However, California Baptist answered; outscoring SDSU 24-9 over the next seven minutes and change to make it a two-possession game.

A Boyd layup and pair of Byrd free throws in the final minute and a half kept the home team out front to hang on for the 81-75 victory.

SDSU shot a season best 54.9% (28-of-51) from the field and 52.9% (9-of-17) from beyond the arc. Also, shooting 80% (16-of-20) from the free throw line, it is SDSU's fourth 50/50/80 shooting game in the Dutcher era and first since Jan. 26, 2019 vs. UNLV.

The Aztecs hit the road for their next game, and their final non-conference opponent, as they head to San Jose, Calif. for a neutral site matchup with California on Sat. Dec. 21. The game will air on ACC Network at 7:30 p.m.

SAN JOSE, Calif. (AP) Nick Boyd shook off a rough shooting first half to score all 17 of his points after halftime and No. 23 San Diego State beat California 71-50 on Saturday night.

After missing all six of his shots in the first half, Boyd hit two 3-pointers in the first minute of the second half to help send the Aztecs (8-2) to their fifth straight win.

BJ Davis and Miles Byrd each added 12 points for San Diego State.

Jeremiah Wilkinson scored 13 points and Andrej Stojakovic added 10 for the Golden Bears (7-5). Cal shot 25.5% for the game, its fourth worst shooting game in since at least the 1996-97 season, and lost its 19th straight game against a ranked opponent.

In limiting the Golden Bears to just 15.6 percent shooting in the first half (5-of-32), San Diego State had its best defensive shooting first half of the year and its second best in the last 30 years, only bested by limiting Air Force to 15.0 percent in the first half (3-of-20) on March 1, 2017.

San Diego State: The Aztecs missed 11 of its first 12 shots before going on a 16-1 run late in the first half. They then made 8 of 15 from 3-point range in the second half.

California: The Bears missed 16 straight shots in the first half. That led to some frustration for coach Mark Madsen, who was called for a technical foul late in the half.

Byrd hit a 3-pointer late in the final minute of the first half to end a streak of 21 straight misses from 3 for both teams to start the game. San Diego State missed its first 10 tries and Cal was 0 for 12 in the first half.

The Bears had scored at least 80 points in six straight games for the first time since 1972 before getting held to 50 by the Aztecs.

SAN DIEGO — Miles Byrd and Nick Boyd had 14 points each, but it was not enough as No. 20/20 San Diego State dropped a heartbreaker 67-66 to Utah State in its conference home opener at Viejas Arena on Saturday.

The Aztecs (8-3, 1-1 Mountain West) snapped their five-game win streak, which started with a 73-70 victory over No. 6/7 Houston on November 30.

Utah State (12-1, 2-0 MW) wins its second straight road game against elite competition following a win over the Saint Mary's Gaels in UCU Pavilion in Moraga, California, last Sunday.

San Diego State was dominant in the first half. The Aztecs scored the first seven points of the game, capped by a Byrd three-pointer. After Utah State got within four points just inside of 16 minutes, the Aztecs raced back ahead with Byrd draining another three to go up 25-12 with 8:31 remaining in the half. SDSU kept pushing as a Jared Coleman-Jones free throw put the team up 40-22 with just under two minutes left until halftime. The Aggies closed the half on a run, scoring five points in the final nine seconds of the first half to make it a 43-32 game at the break. Byrd had 12 of his 14 points in the first half while Falslev had 11 of his 16 in the opening 20 minutes.

The second half was a different story. The teams traded jumpers with Byrd scoring his final points of the game with 18:22 remaining. Utah State scored the next eight points to make the score 45-42 with 15 minutes left. Boyd responded with two straight buckets, but the Aggies went on a 14-6 run to take their first lead of the game, 56-55, with six minutes remaining. Each team made a pair of free throws before the Aztecs scored eight straight points to go up 65-58 with 1:56 to go. After grabbing an offensive board, the Aggies drove towards the basket and made a layup. A foul was called against Byrd on a close play, sending Utah State to the line, where it made a free throw as well. The Aggies made a three with 1:16 left to make it a one-point game before Nick Boyd got to the line and made a free throw to put the Aztecs back up two. Utah State made another three with seven seconds left to take the lead. Wayne McKinney III took a shot with three ticks left on the clock, but the ball bounced away as the clock struck zeroes.

Boyd and Byrd were the two Aztecs who finished in double figures. Boyd and Coleman-Jones had five rebounds each while Magoon Gwath paced the team with seven. BJ Davis did a good job distributing the ball, finishing with a career-high four assists, all of which came in the first half.

San Diego State shot better from the free throw line (90.9%-71.4%) while Utah State was better from beyond the arc (28.6%-25.0%) and the field (44.0%-38.5%). The Aztecs won the rebounding battle (31-27).

The Aztecs made at least 20 free throws with a 90% (20-of-22, 90.9%) or higher free throw percentage for the second time since February 2011 (SDSU shot 22-of-23 [95.7%] from the line at Air Force on January 21, 2023).

The Aztecs are off during the week before a road game at Boise State next Saturday at noon MT/1 p.m. PT. It will be televised on CBS with the radio call on San Diego Sports 760.

BOISE, IDAHO — Miles Byrd set a new career-high with 22 points as he helped San Diego State hand Boise State its first home loss of the season at ExtraMile Arena on Saturday afternoon by the score of 76-68.

The Aztecs (9-3, 2-1 Mountain West) returned to their winning ways after faltering 67-66 at home against Utah State last weekend.

The loss snaps Boise State's (11-4, 3-1 MW) five-game winning streak going back to non-conference play in mid-December.

The first half was back and forth. The teams exchanged baskets early leading to Boise State holding a 10-9 lead with 13:30 left to play. The Broncos made consecutive threes to go up seven, their largest lead of the game, before Wayne McKinney III connected from deep to bring the deficit back to four. Boise State made a layup to go back up six before Byrd went on a run, scoring the Aztecs' next nine points and bringing SDSU within a point 22-21 at the under-eight media timeout. San Diego State scored the next five points of the game on a BJ Davis jumper, a Jared Coleman-Jones layup and a Demarshay Johnson Jr free throw to take its first lead of the game and go up four points. The Broncos scored four consecutive points on free throws to tie the game and eventually retake the lead before Johnson Jr. took it right back with a putback dunk with three minutes remaining. The Aztecs extended the lead to four before Boise State had a three-point play in the final minute of the first half and the teams headed to the locker rooms for halftime with the Aztecs on top 33-32. In the first half, Byrd had 14 points while Tyson Degenhart was held to just five (all on free throws).

SDSU did not trail in the second half. Byrd opened the half with another three and the Aztecs treaded water, staying up between one and four points until a Byrd lob to Magoon Gwath was slammed home to make it 47-41 with 14:23 to go. The Broncos scored the next six points to tie the game, but Miles Heide reclaimed the lead for San Diego State, followed by another McKinney III to extend it. Coming out of the under-eight media timeout, Alvaro Cardenas scored five straight points to bring the Broncos back within one. After an Aztec timeout, the team was unfazed, as Byrd made a layup before two consecutive Boise State turnovers led to Taj DeGourville layups on the other end including a free throw on the second to make it 65-57. SDSU was able to get the lead as high as ten, but the Broncos cut it back down with the final score ending up 76-68.

Beyond Byrd's career-high 22 points, DeGourville was a key contributor off the bench for SDSU with 13 points (one shy of his career-high against Occidental) and a team leading six rebounds. Coleman-Jones battled his way to nine points and five boards and Nick Boyd chipped in seven points while dishing out five assists. McKinney III was also important off the bench, adding a pair of three-pointers.

San Diego State shot better from the floor (44.3%-37.7%) and from deep (41.2%-23.3%) while Boise State was better from the free throw line (84.0%-62.5%). The Aztecs won the rebounding battle (39-29) and had more steals (7-4). SDSU scored more points in the paint (30-22) and on second opportunities (21-9).

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State men's basketball started slow, but ultimately cruised to a 67-38 win over Air Force at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs (10-3, 3-1 Mountain West) have now won 17 straight home matchups against the Falcons (3-12, 0-3 MW), the longest active streak against any team.

Nick Boyd led all scorers with 16 points on 6-of-10 shooting. BJ Davis was second with 15 points on 5-of-9 shooting. Both had 13-point halves with Boyd's coming in the first and Davis' in the second.

Jared Coleman-Jones had a milestone day with a career-high 14 rebounds to surpass 500 total for his career. He also added 10 points for his first double-double as an Aztec and ninth of his career.

The Aztecs were ice cold to start Wednesday night's contest, shooting 3-of-19 (15.8%) through the first 10 minutes on the court.

On the other side, Air Force made their first three field goals and five of their first six shots to jump out to an early lead. In a six-minute stretch from 17:14 to 11:01, the Falcons went on a 17-2 scoring run for a 12-point advantage.

The momentum shifted quickly around the 10-minute mark when SDSU's defense forced a shot clock violation, the first of four consecutive Air Force turnovers and the start of a 22-2 scoring run for the Scarlet and Black.

For the remainder of the first half, the Aztecs made 10-of-16 from the field on offense and forced nine Air Force turnovers on defense to lead by nine at the break.

The second half started with a 14-0 Aztec run thanks in large part to four consecutive field goals and 11 points from BJ Davis. The stretch gave SDSU a 21-point advantage and never fell below that mark the rest of the night.

San Diego State's defense was dominant in the second half surrendering just 14 points and holding the Falcons to just 2-of-16 shooting from the field and 1-of-10 from beyond the arc in the final 20 minutes on its way to the 67-38 victory.

Next up for the Aztecs is a trip to New Mexico on Saturday to take on the Lobos. Tipoff on CBS will be at 10 a.m. PT (11 a.m. MT).

San Diego State called a timeout down, 20-8, with 11:01 left in the first half. The Aztecs outscored the Falcons, 59-18, the rest of the way, including at one point a 40-4 run.

San Diego State's 14 second half points allowed is the second fewest points allowed in a second half since at least 1996-97. The 38 total points allowed is tied for third fewest in a Mountain West game.

The Aztecs' +25 rebound margin (49-24) is the largest for the program in a Mountain West game.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. — Miles Byrd (14 points) and Jared Coleman-Jones (10 points) each reached double figures, but it was not enough for San Diego State as the Aztecs came up short 62-48 at New Mexico on Saturday morning.

The Aztecs (10-4, 3-2 Mountain West) dropped a game for the first time in 2025. The team returns to America's Finest City to take on Colorado State and UNLV next week.

New Mexico (14-3, 6-0 MW) has not lost since suffering an 89-83 defeat at home against their rival, New Mexico State, on December 7.

Magoon Gwath scored on the opening possession of the game and Coleman-Jones scored his first bucket the next time down the floor to give the Aztecs a 4-2 lead early. New Mexico scored the next 12 points to go ahead 14-4. SDSU responded with five of the next seven points to get within seven. After the Lobos pushed their lead to 14, Coleman-Jones drained a three-pointer just inside of four minutes. He scored eight of his ten points in the opening 20 minutes. Each team would make just one more shot in the first half with Byrd making his first three with 45 seconds left to finish the scoring in the first half with the Aztecs trailing 30-20.

Byrd opened the second half with a three-point play and a Coleman-Jones layup just 46 seconds into the second half cut the Aztec deficit to five points. Byrd would drain a pair of three-pointers just two possessions apart around five and six minutes into the second half to bring SDSU back within nine points. The Lobos would push the lead back out again, culminating with a Donovan Dent layup with 3:52 left in the game, but it was all Aztecs the rest of the way. While the Aztec defense shut out New Mexico for the remainder of the game, Wayne McKinney III made two baskets and Nick Boyd connected on a pair of free throws as the Aztecs fell 62-48.

While Byrd and Coleman-Jones led the way scoring for the Aztecs, Boyd dished out five assists and Gwath swatted four shots for the sixth time this season.

Donovan Dent (16 points, 5 assists) was the top scorer for New Mexico while Tru Washington (13 points) and Mustapha Amzil (10 points, 11 rebounds) also finished in double figures. Filip Borovicinanin (nine points, nine rebounds) and Nelly Junior Joseph (nine rebounds) crashed the boards for the Lobos.

San Diego State shot better from the line (52.9%-40.0%) and beyond the arc (31.3%-21.4%) and the teams were nearly identical from the field (35.8%-35.4% in favor of UNM). The Aztecs blocked more shots (8-7). SDSU bench players outscored their Lobo counterparts (9-8).

Byrd is averaging 13.5 points per game when playing at New Mexico in his career compared to 6.4 points per game overall in his career.

SDSU returns home to Viejas Arena next week to take on Colorado State on Tuesday night at 8 p.m. The game will be broadcast on CBS Sports Network and San Diego Sports 760.

Byrd's 25 points, seven steals and five threes are all career highs while his eight field goals matches his career high.

The Aztecs (11-4, 4-2 Mountain West) have now won five consecutive games against the Rams (10-7, 4-2 MW) when playing at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

Colorado State jumped out to the early 11-8 lead at the first media timeout, but Wayne McKinney III and Pharaoh Compton combined to go on an 8-0 scoring run to give the Aztecs their first lead of the night.

Byrd scored 11 of his 15 first half points in the final nine minutes of the half to help keep the Scarlet and Black out front.

The Rams, however, put together a quick 7-0 run to make it a one-possession game with less than seconds remaining. BJ Davis promptly took the inbound down court and banked in a three before the horn for a 35-29 SDSU advantage at the break.

San Diego State's lead reached double-digits on a Byrd three with 17:16 on the clock and never dipped below it the rest of the way leading by as many as 20 points at the 4:23 mark.

The 75-60 victory extends SDSU's win streak to 11 straight games when leading with five minutes left to play.

BJ Davis added 12 points in the victory, his ninth time in double-figures this season. Magoon Gwath had nine points along with a game-high seven rebounds while Wayne McKinney III had nine off the bench.

SDSU forced 20 turnovers on the night leading to a one-sided 22-8 points off turnover advantage. The bench players also made a difference with the Aztecs owning a 20-2 advantage.

San Diego State returns to action on Saturday afternoon as they welcome UNLV to Viejas Arena. The game will tip at 5 p.m. on CBS Sports Network.

Miles Byrd is just the second player in the NCAA this season to record 25 points and seven steals in a game, joining Long Beach State's Devin Askew who had 28 points and seven steals against Hawai'i on Dec. 7.

Byrd's seven steals make him the third Aztec with seven steals in a game since the 1999-00 season and is tied for the most by an Aztec in a Mountain West game, joining Deandre Moore vs. Colorado State on Feb. 1, 2003.

USAF, Colo. — Wayne McKinney III scored a season-high 18 points, the last two coming on a full court driving layup as time expired to give San Diego State a 77-76 win at Air Force in overtime on Wednesday night.

The Aztecs (12-5, 5-3 Mountain West) won their 11th consecutive game against the Falcons and sixth straight in Clune Arena, but it was the first time of the 11 that a game went to overtime and first game of the six to be decided by single digits.

Air Force (3-16, 0-8 MW) will continue to seek its first win since December 7, and first win of conference play when it hosts Utah State on Saturday afternoon.

The teams went back and forth in the first few minutes of the game with the Falcons taking an 8-6 lead four and a half minutes into the game. The Aztecs offense responded by firing off an 11-0 run, taking a nine-point lead as Jared Coleman-Jones made a pair of three-pointers and Taj DeGourville added one. Air Force was able to get back within one possession before a Kim Ferrari three brought the lead back up to five with just under five minutes remaining in the half. Ethan Taylor scored the last seven points of the half for the Falcons, cutting the deficit to a point before a Coleman-Jones jumper and free throw gave the Aztecs a 35-31 lead heading into the halftime break.

Magoon Gwath had a three-point play on the opening possession of the second half and McKinney III scored the next 10 points for San Diego State to go up 48-38 with 14:33 left in the game. Air Force responded with a 15-4 run to take a one point lead, its first since 8-6, with 8:47 remaining in regulation. The teams traded baskets with the Aztecs still down a point after a Coleman-Jones layup with 4:50 left. The Falcons made three free throws to go up four but two Miles Byrd free throws and a pair of DeGourville jumpers put the Aztecs up two with 49 seconds remaining. Kyle Marshall scored a quick layup immediately afterwards to tie the game but missed a free throw to take the lead. McKinney III and DeGourville had looks but were unable to convert and the game went to overtime tied at 68.

The Falcons won the jump ball in overtime and Taylor was fouled shooting a three. He would convert all his free throws to take a three-point lead. BJ Davis was fouled on the other end and made a free throw for SDSU. After the Aztecs forced a turnover, Davis made a layup to tie the game at 71 with 3:47 left. Luke Kearney was fouled on the other end and made his free throws to retake a two-point lead. Following missed shots on both sides, McKinney made two foul shots to tie the game at 73. San Diego State got a stop followed by a DeGourville jumper to take the lead. A Gwath block on the other end helped lead to a shot clock violation but the Aztecs were unable to take advantage, and the Falcons got the ball back with 27 seconds left. Yoda Oke went to the line and made his first free throw but missed the second. However, Celichowski tipped the ball in to give Air Force a 76-75 lead with four seconds left. The Aztecs had a chance to regroup during a review of the tip in. DeGourville threw the ball in to McKinney, who got a crack screen from Coleman-Jones and drove to the basket for a layup as the buzzer sounded, sending the Aztecs home victorious, 77-76.

Along with McKinney III's 18 points, Coleman-Jones (14 points, six rebounds) and DeGourville (11 points, seven rebounds) finished in double figures for the Aztecs. Gwath chipped in nine points with seven rebounds, three assists and two blocks. Byrd excelled defensively with four steals and three blocks.

Air Force scored at a higher rate from the field (43.2%-41.5%), beyond the arc (40.0%-22.2%) and the free throw line (68.2%-63.0%). San Diego State had eight steals and seven blocks, only turning the ball over six times, while the Falcons tallied just one block and three steals while turning the ball over 17 times. The Aztecs scored more from the field, draining 27 field goals to Air Force's 19 and outscoring the Falcons off turnovers (19-8), in the paint (38-22), and off the bench (34-9).

The Scarlet and Black improved to 4-0 under Brian Dutcher and 19-5 in their last 24 games when wearing red jerseys.

RENO, NEV. — Magoon Gwath was 7-of-7 from the field and finished with 15 points and 13 rebounds and Miles Byrd dished out nine assists as San Diego State earned a convincing 69-50 road win over the Nevada Wolf Pack at Lawlor Events Center on Saturday night.

The Aztecs (13-5, 6-3 Mountain West) improved to 14-4 against the Wolf Pack in the Brian Dutcher era (since 2017-18). SDSU climbs to 4-1 on the road this season and 7-2 away from Viejas Arena on the campaign.

Nevada, (11-9, 3-6 MW) which opened Mountain West play with four consecutive losses before rattling off three straight wins, drops its second contest in a row. The Wolf Pack will look to rebound at Boise State on Wednesday.

BJ Davis opened the game with a three-pointer and Jared Coleman-Jones made a layup to put the Aztecs up 5-0. The Wolf Pack responded with an 11-0 run and scored 13 of the next 15 points to go up 13-7 with just under 11 minutes remaining in the half. The run represented more points than the Aztecs would allow for the rest of the half combined. San Diego State battled back with a 13-0 run of its own including threes from Taj DeGourville, Kim Ferrari and Gwath to take a 20-13 lead with six minutes to go in the half. Nevada rallied with eight of the next ten points to get within a point with three minutes left but back-to-back buckets from Gwath and a Davis layup as the half came to a close gave the Aztecs a 28-21 advantage heading into the locker room.

The SDSU defense locked down to begin the second half, not allowing a basket for the first 4:54 of the latter period. Byrd made his first three during that stretch as the Aztecs grew their lead to 11 with 11:30 to go. San Diego State put the pedal to the metal with a 13-3 run as another DeGourville three ballooned the lead to 21 points (52-31) with seven minutes left in the contest. DeGourville drained two more threes and Byrd added another of his own as Nevada was not able to shrink the deficit to lower than 16 points the rest of the way. Pharaoh Compton tacked on two dunks in the final 1:05 including one with five seconds remaining to put the exclamation point on San Diego State's 69-50 victory.

In addition to Gwath (15 points, 13 rebounds) and Byrd (11 points, nine assists), DeGourville finished in double figures with 14 points thanks to a quartet of three-pointers. Nick Boyd tallied seven points and dished out six assists while not turning the ball over once.

Justin McBride (13 points), Kobe Sanders (12 points, eight rebounds) and Xavier DuSell (11 points) finished in double figures to lead Nevada.

San Diego State shot better from the field (48.2%-29.4%), from deep (36.0%-19.2%) and from the free throw line (75.0%-68.2%). SDSU had 21 assists to Nevada's 11. The Aztecs scored more in the paint (36-12) and on fast breaks (10-2).

Miles Byrd became the first Aztec since at least 1996-97 with nine assists, three steals and a block in a game.

Magoon Gwath became the first Aztec to have a double double with a perfect shooting night since Roy Krusiswyk was 6-of-6 from the floor and finished with 13 points and ten rebounds in an 80-78 loss to Southern Methodist on January 15, 1998.

SDSU returns to America's Finest City for a pair of home games next week. The Aztecs will face San Jose State at 7:40 p.m. on Tuesday night and Wyoming at 5 p.m. next Saturday. Tuesday's game is a redout with the first 5,000 fans receiving a replica of San Diego State's red jersey, which the team will wear against the Spartans. It will be broadcast on FS1 and San Diego Sports 760. Saturday's contest will be televised on CBS Sports Network with the radio call on San Diego Sports 760.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State overcame its largest deficit of the season en route to a 71-68 victory over San Jose State on Tuesday night.

The Aztecs (14-5, 7-3 Mountain West) trailed by as many as 21 points in the first half but closed the night on a 21-6 scoring run holding the Spartans (10-12, 3-7 MW) to 2-of-15 shooting in the final eight and a half minutes.

Magoon Gwath led all scorers with 24 points on 9-of-15 shooting (3-of-6 from three) to go along with seven rebounds. Miles Byrd (13) and Nick Boyd (11) also recorded double-digits with Boyd matching the game high with nine rebounds.

On the other side, San Jose State were led by 23 from Latrell Davis and 21 from Josh Uduje. The duo each made five triples combining for 10-of-16 from beyond the arc.

Uduje was scorching hot to begin the contest, scoring 16 of the team's 19 points giving them a 19-10 lead at the second media timeout. San Jose State's lead would reach double-digits at the 12:20 mark.

About the same time, San Diego State went ice cold. Over a nine-minute stretch, they were 1-of-8 from the field with nine turnovers including seven consecutive minutes without a point. The drought ultimately helped the Spartans extend their lead to 21 points with 7:03 left in the half.

A Taj DeGourville sparked a 13-3 (11-0) scoring run over the next four minutes, but SDSU still found themselves down 41-29 at the half.

San Jose State's sharp shooting from beyond the arc was a major factor as the Spartans were 9-of-16 from three through 20 minutes.

After Gwath totaled 14 points in the first half, he continued to spark the Scarlet and Black offense with six of the team's first eight second half points.

With 7:58 left in the game, an 18-0 San Diego State scoring run gave it its first lead since making the first bucket of the game 27 seconds after tip.

The Aztecs would finish the game holding San Jose State to one field goal in their final 12 attempts as part of a 21-6 run until the horn sounded.

San Diego State remains at home for its next opponent as they host Wyoming on Saturday. Tipoff at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena will be at 5 p.m. PT on CBS Sports Network.

The 21-point deficit overcome matches the largest since overcoming a 22-point deficit against Green Bay on Nov. 20, 2010 (also at UNLV March 8, 2017). It is the second largest comeback victory since at least the 1996-97 season.

SAN DIEGO — Magoon Gwath finished with a double double and San Diego State had a 20-0 run in the final minutes of the game to rally back from a late nine-point deficit and finish with a 63-61 win over Wyoming at Viejas Arena on Saturday night.

The Aztecs (15-5, 8-3 Mountain West) picked up their fourth straight victory and will look to carry that momentum through a bye to a road game at Colorado State.

Wyoming (11-11, 4-7 MW) has alternated between wins and losses in its last five contests and returns to Laramie for a pair of home games against Utah State and UNLV.

The opening 20 minutes were a back-and-forth defensive battle with the largest lead coming after a BJ Davis three-pointer put San Diego State up 18-12 with 8:54 remaining in the half. Wyoming led by a point with three minutes left before a Gwath jumper with 57 seconds left and two Miles Byrd free throws with three ticks remaining gave the Aztecs a 28-25 lead at the break. Jordan Nesbitt scored all nine of his points in the first half for the Cowboys. Gwath had six points and five rebounds in the first half.

The second half was a game of runs. After threes from Gwath and Nick Boyd, the Aztecs led 34-28 with 16:05 left. Wyoming responded with a 9-0 run to take a three-point lead with 12:53 to go. The teams battled back and forth for the next few minutes but two threes from Dontaie Allen put the Cowboys up nine with 6:35 remaining. San Diego State turned up the heat from there, battling back with a 20-0 run and holding Wyoming to just one more field goal the rest of the way. The 20 points came from Byrd (5), Gwath (5) Miles Heide (4), Boyd (4) and Davis (2) and were all from inside the arc. San Diego State went up 61-50 with 15 seconds left. From there, Wyoming had an eight-point possession with all eight points coming from the free throw line in a two second span. Taj DeGourville made a free throw with seven ticks left to extend the Aztec lead back to four. Wyoming made its first field goal in 6:33 when Obi Agbim hit a three to get within one with two seconds left. Kimo Ferrari went to the line for the first time as an Aztec with less than a second remaining. He drained the first shot and bounced the second one off the rim to end the game with a 63-61 Aztec victory.

Along with Gwath (14 points, 11 rebounds, four blocks), Boyd contributed 13 points, Byrd chipped in 11 points with eight rebounds and four assists, and DeGourville reached double figures with ten points. Heide added in nine points on 4-of-6 shooting in his third career start.

San Diego State shot better from the field (36.7%-36.5%) and from the free throw line (78.6%-68.2%). Wyoming was better from beyond the arc (30.8%-22.7%). SDSU had eight blocks to Wyoming's three.

San Diego State won its 17th consecutive home game against the Cowboys, which is tied with Air Force for the Aztecs' longest active home winning streak against any opponent.

SDSU is off during the week and will return to action next Saturday with a game at Colorado State at 8 p.m. MT/7 p.m. PT. It will be broadcast on CBS Sports Network and San Diego Sports 760.

FORT COLLINS, COLO. — Magoon Gwath put up a 15-point, ten-rebound double double but San Diego State fell 68-63 to Colorado State at Moby Arena on Saturday night.

The Aztecs (15-6, 8-4 Mountain West) had their four-game win streak snapped, falling for the first time in three weeks.

Colorado State (15-8, 9-3 MW) gets back in the win column following an 87-65 loss at New Mexico on Wednesday. Next up for the Rams is a trip to Logan to face the Utah State Aggies on Tuesday night.

The game was tight in the first half. Colorado State opened with a 7-1 run before Taj DeGourville scored the Aztecs' first field goal. Jaylen Crock-er-Johnson hit a three to put the Rams up seven, which would be the largest lead of the half. The teams traded buckets for several minutes before a Pharaoh Compton layup and a Miles Byrd three brought the Aztecs within a point, down 17-16 with 8:15 to go. After the Rams scored, Jared Coleman-Jones hit a pair of threes over the next few minutes to lower the deficit back to one with four minutes remaining. Gwath made a free throw to tie the game. Following a Nique Clifford jumper to put the Rams up 27-25, Nick Boyd made a layup to tie the game and Coleman-Jones, in his first game back from a shoulder injury, made a pair of free throws to take the first Aztec lead of the game, 29-27 with 2:29 left. CSU scored the next six points to retake the lead and went into the halftime break with a 38-35 lead.

The Aztecs opened the second half with a Gwath layup and a BJ Davis three to go up 40-38. After Clifford evened the score, Davis hit again from deep to put the Aztecs back up by three points. A minute later, DeGourville made a three to give the Aztecs a 46-42 lead, their largest of the contest. Kyan Evans responded with a three of his own and another minute later, Clifford tied the game with a three at the 13:36 mark. The Rams would score nine of the next ten points to take an eight-point lead with 9:24 remaining, the largest of the night for either side. The score remained at 59-51 until a Wayne McKinney III three-pointer at 6:37. He made two free throws shortly afterwards to bring the Aztecs within four, 60-56 with just under six minutes remaining. CSU went back up eight with three minutes left but Davis made another three and Nick Boyd connected on two free throws to make it a three-point game with a minute remaining. The Rams would make four more free throws before a Magoon Gwath layup would cap the scoring to end with a 68-63 final in favor of the Rams.

In addition to Gwath's double double, Boyd had eight points, eight assists, five rebounds and three steals and Davis scored nine points, on three second-half threes, for the Aztecs.

Colorado State shot better from the field (41.5%-37.9%), beyond the arc (36.8%-34.8%) and from the free throw line (70.8%-52.4%). SDSU had eight turnovers while CSU had a dozen. The Aztecs bench players outscored their Rams counterparts 24-17.

Magoon Gwath broke the San Diego State record for blocks by a freshman. His two blocks on Saturday moved him to 52 on the year and he passed Skylar Spencer, who previously held the record with 51. Spencer needed 34 games to reach his total while Gwath took just 21. The 52 blocks also tie Gwath with Malcolm Thomas for the ninth most in a season in program history. The blocks statistic was created ahead of the 1978-79 season.

SAN JOSE, CALIF. — Nick Boyd tallied 14 points, four assists and three steals in the second half to lead San Diego State's 49-point second-half outburst. The Aztecs began the latter half on a 17-0 run and outscored San Jose State 49-29 in the second period on their way to a 69-66 triumph at the Provident Credit Union Event Center on Tuesday night.

The Aztecs (16-6, 9-4 Mountain West) bounced back from Saturday's loss at Colorado State and improved to 37-4 in their last 41 games immediately following a loss.

San Jose State (12-14, 5-9 MW) drops its second straight game following consecutive wins. The Spartans will look to get back in the win column on Friday night against Nevada.

The Spartans did not trail in the first half and led the rest of the half after taking a 6-4 lead. SJSU managed a 10-0 run near the end of the half and held the Aztecs to just six field goals in the first half as San Jose State carried a 37-20 lead into the halftime locker room.

San Diego State came storming back to open the second half. The Aztecs nearly matched their first half total before the first media timeout of the second half, starting out on a 17-0 run to tie the game at 37 with 16 minutes remaining. The run included three-pointers from Magoon Gwath and BJ Davis as well as seven points from Nick Boyd. After the Spartans went back up 44-41, Boyd made a layup to cut the deficit to one and Wayne McKinney III made a three to give the Aztecs their first lead of the game at 46-44. The Aztecs added on, going up 55-50 on a Davis layup with 8:33 to go. Following a 7-0 Spartans run, SDSU responded with a 6-0 run of its own to go back up four. The Aztecs led by between one and four points for the remainder of the game and Miles Byrd made a key three-pointer with 80 seconds left as San Diego State held on to win 69-66.

On the game, Boyd finished with 17 points, four assists and three steals. Davis scored 13 points while Jared Coleman-Jones contributed nine points and eight rebounds in his return to the starting lineup. Gwath chipped in seven points while blocking four shots.

San Jose State was led by Latrell Davis (21 points) and Donavan Yap Jr. (19 points). Robert Vaihola grabbed nine boards to go with five assists and three blocks.

San Diego State shot better from the field (40.7%-40.6%) and the free throw line (77.3%-30.0%) while SJSU was better from beyond the arc (33.3%-17.4%). SDSU had 42 rebounds while the Spartans had 35. The Aztecs scored more on fast breaks (17-6), off turnovers (25-16) and in the paint (38-28).

San Diego State outscored San Jose State by 20 points in the second half. It is tied for SDSU's largest second-half point differential in the Mountain West era (since 1999). The Aztecs also outscored Nevada by 20 in the second half on January 23, 2013.

SDSU finally returns home to America's Finest City. The Aztecs host Boise State at 7 p.m. on Saturday and Fresno State at 8 p.m. next Tuesday. Both games will be broadcast on CBS Sports Network and San Diego Sports 760.

SAN DIEGO — Nick Boyd registered 24 points to lead San Diego State to a dominant, 64-47 victory over Boise State on Saturday night. The victory gives the Aztecs six wins in their last seven games.

SDSU (17-6, 10-4 MW) had its best shooting performance of conference play, making 26-of-48 (54.2 pct.) including 5-of-12 (41.7 pct.) from beyond the arc.

Defensively, the Aztecs held Boise State (17-8, 9-5 MW) to a season-worst .345 shooting percentage.

San Diego State scored the first bucket but found themselves trailing 9-4 at the first media timeout with Andrew Meadow scoring the Broncos' first seven points of the night.

Boyd and Magoon Gwath put the team on their back in the first half, recording 17 of the team's first 19 points. Boyd finished the half with 16 of the team's 28 first half points.

With 5:15 left in the first half, a Tyson Degenhart layup gave the Broncos a one-point lead but was quickly erased with the Aztecs going on an 11-0 run to end the half. SDSU held Boise State to 0-for-7 in the final minutes of the first leading to a 28-18 advantage at the break.

The Aztecs came out of halftime and hit four of their first five shots before sparking a 12-0 run. It is the fifth time this season they have had multiple scoring runs of at least 10-0. Between the final five minutes of the first and first seven minutes of the second, SDSU outscored the Broncos 29-5 and would eventually extend its lead to as many as 23 points.

Boise State responded with 12-0 run of their own, but San Diego State's lead would not dip below 11 the rest of the way as they cruised to the 64-47 victory at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

Boyd's 24 is a career-high for the senior transfer and his second 20-point performance for the Scarlet and Black. He also tied the team-high with six rebounds on the night.

Miles Byrd and Wayne McKinney III both reached double-figures with 10 points apiece. For McKinney, it gives the San Diego native 1,000 points in his collegiate career. Magoon Gwath filled the stat sheet with eight points, six rebounds and a career high six blocks.

The Broncos were led by Tyson Degenhart's double-double of 17 points and 12 rebounds. Seven of his boards came on the offensive end.

San Diego State stays home for its next game, hosting Fresno State on Tuesday night. Tip will be at 8 p.m. PT on CBS Sports Network.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State dominated Fresno State, 83-60, at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena on Tuesday night. The victory is SDSU's third in a row and seventh in its last eight games.

The Aztecs (18-6, 11-4 MW) have now won 12 consecutive games against the Bulldogs (5-22, 1-15 MW) with the streak starting Jan. 1, 2020.

SDSU led from start to finish beginning with a Nick Boyd three as the game's first score. Five minutes later, the senior guard made a layup for the 1,000th point of his collegiate career. He finished the game with 19 points and seven assists.

When the clock hit 7:45 left in the half, San Diego State started a 15-4 scoring run extending its lead to 20 points reaching as many as 23 before the break.

The Scarlet and Black shot .514 percent from the field in the half and were red hot on two-point field goal attempts making 15 of its 21 shots inside the arc. It aided in a 30-18 advantage on points inside the paint on the way to a 43-23 lead heading into the locker room. It is SDSU's largest halftime lead in a Mountain West game this season.

San Diego State dished out 20 assists on its 34 made field goals led by Boyd with seven. It is their most assists as a team against a Division I opponent this season. On the defensive side, SDSU forced 16 turnovers — 11 in the first half — leading to a 20-9 advantage in points off turnovers.

Along with Boyd, Wayne McKinney III and Magoon Gwath both reached double-figures scoring 15 and 14 points respectively. Gwath also add six rebounds and three blocks.

Fresno State had two in double-digits with Jalen Weaver scoring 16 points and Alex Crawford right behind him with 15.

Next on the schedule is a pivotal Mountain West matchup as the Aztecs head to Utah State to face the second-place Aggies. Tipoff will be at 6 p.m. MT (5 p.m. PT) on CBS Sports Network.

Nick Boyd led the Aztecs with 15 points. It's the 17th time this season the senior has scored in double figures.

With a career-high four three-pointers, BJ Davis finished with 14 points and five rebounds.

Utah State's Akanno Dexter led all scorers with a career-high 26 points, 21 of which came from beyond the arc. Ian Martinez and Deyton Albury each added 18 for the Aggies.

Utah State jumped out to an early lead in what was a low-scoring first half. The Aztecs struggled to get their offense going after Magoon Gwath went down with a leg injury less than three minutes into the game. Pharaoh Compton was able to spark the offense with SDSU's first field goal at the 14:49 mark.

Six first-half threes from Utah State had the Aztecs behind 29-15 with four minutes to go, but after piecing together an 11-4 run, the Scarlet and Black entered the half down 33-26.

The Aztecs stayed hot out of the break, scoring the first eight points of the second half to quickly take a 34-33 lead, fueled by two three-pointers from Davis.

With the help of 14 second-half points from Dexter, the Aggies were able to regain the lead, which they held on to until the final five minutes. The Aztecs scored seven straight points to lead 69-65, but were unable to hold on. The Aggies closed out the game on a 14-2 run.

San Diego State returns to action next Tuesday, hosting New Mexico at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena, scheduled to tip at 8 p.m. on FS1.

SAN DIEGO — The San Diego State men's basketball team had four players in double figures, including a career-high matching 10 points from forward Miles Heide, and defeated New Mexico, the team at the top of the Mountain West standings, 73-65 at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena on Tuesday night.

Joining Heide, who also had seven boards, two assists, a steal and a block, were Nick Boyd (17 points, seven rebounds, and a team-high six assists), Miles Byrd (13 points, a team-high nine boards, three assists, three steals and a block), and Jared Coleman-Jones (12 points, three rebounds, three blocks and two assists).

Boyd became just the third Aztec since the 2013-14 season to record at least 17 points, 7 rebounds and 6 assists in the same game, joining Malachi Flynn (twice in the 2019-20 season) and Winston Shepard (Feb. 21, 2016 at San Jose State).

For the game, San Diego State limited New Mexico (22-5, 14-3 MW) to 34.4 percent shooting from the floor. It is the second lowest field goal percentage shooting night of the season for the Lobos. The only worse shooting game they have endured was a 33.3 percent effort in a loss at Wyoming on January 7.

San Diego State (19-7, 12-5 MW), in its two games against New Mexico, has not allowed the Lobos to total more than Tuesday night's 65 points. In its game earlier this year, a loss at The Pit on January 11, the Aztecs limited UNM to 62 points. In each of those contests, SDSU held New Mexico to 18 points below its season average.

The Aztecs led for 35:41, with New Mexico's only lead, three points, coming 11:55 to play in the opening half. That lead was short lived after Heide and Pharaoh Compton, who finished the night with eight points, three rebounds, two blocks and two steals, scored on back-to-back possessions. Heide's was a putback on an offensive board and Compton scored on a monster dunk with 10:36 on the clock.

San Diego State had its biggest lead of the half, nine points at 28-19 with 5:49 to play. But New Mexico closed the half with a 10-5 surge and the teams went to the break with SDSU up 33-29.

The Aztecs built their first double digit advantage on a Byrd dunk. BJ Davis stole the ball and fed Byrd who slammed it home for a 42-32 lead at the 16:14 mark, but New Mexico never went away. The Lobos kept the game to single digits most of the season half, with SDSU able to move to a double-digit lead again on a pair of Byrd free throws with 7:17 left on the clock. After a pair of successful Boyd shots from the charity stripe, San Diego State had the biggest lead of the game, 61-49 with 6:38 to go.

Three times, in the final 3:09, San Diego State led by 10 points before finishing off New Mexico 73-65.

LARAMIE, Wyo. — With 18 points each, Miles Byrd and BJ Davis led San Diego State men's hoops to a hard-fought 72-69 win over Wyoming at the Arena-Auditorium on Saturday night.

With this victory, the Aztecs (20-7, 13-5 Mountain West) earn their 19th bye into the Mountain West Tournament quarterfinal in the last 20 years.

The Cowboys (12-18, 5-14 Mountain West) suffer their third straight loss after falling 84-61 at Nevada on Tuesday.

Three Aztecs scored in double figures. With 18 points and four rebounds, 11 and three of which came in the second half, BJ Davis helped spark the Scarlet and Black in the final 20 minutes of the back-and-forth battle. The sophomore shot 4-7 from behind the arc, matching his career high. He also finished with three steals and one assist, and was 4-5 from the line.

Miles Byrd tied Davis as San Diego State's leading scorer, picking up 18 points, three assists, two rebounds and two steals. It's the 18th time this season the sophomore has scored in double figures.

Jared Coleman-Jones added 12 points, five rebounds, one assist and one steal for the Aztecs.

Wyoming's Obi Agbim led all scorers with 21 points. Playing all 40 minutes, the senior also posted six rebounds, two assists, one block and one steal.

Dontaie Allen scored 16 and Matija Belic put up 12 for the Cowboys. The game was back-and-forth from the get-go. The Aztecs found their largest lead of the half early on, taking an 11-5 advantage at the 15:47 mark. The teams exchanged baskets through the following 15 minutes, resulting in five lead changes. Rebounding proved to be a problem for San Diego State, only grabbing eight off the glass and giving the Cowboys nine second chance points in the first half. Wyoming went on an 8-2 run with six minutes left, which put the Aztecs behind 34-33 at the break.

The second half continued to be a battle. The teams quickly traded two three-pointers apiece, with Belic, Davis, Agbim and Nick Boyd each draining one in less than two minutes. Davis hit another one with 15:29 to go to give the advantage back to the Aztecs. The lead would continue to change four more times before San Diego State held on through the last 11 minutes of play. Rebounding was a difference-maker for the Scarlet and Black, improving to 15 in the second half. The Aztecs were able to overcome nine points in the final minute by the Cowboys to capture the 72-69 victory.

Next up, San Diego State faces UNLV in Las Vegas, scheduled to tip at 8 p.m. PT.

LAS VEGAS — Miles Byrd logged his first career double double and Nick Boyd scored 19 points, but the stellar guard play was not enough as San Diego State fell by a 74-67 score to UNLV at the Thomas & Mack Center on Tuesday night.

The Aztecs (20-8, 13-6 Mountain West) came in as winners of five of their last six games.

UNLV (17-13, 11-8 MW) wins its third straight game and sixth of its last seven. The Rebels finish their regular season at New Mexico on Friday night.

The teams kept pace with each other in the first half. Neither team led by more than six or went on a run of more than six consecutive points. The opening 20 minutes featured six lead changes with SDSU going up 30-28 with 1:22 remaining when Boyd drained a three-pointer. SDSU led for the rest of the half and carried a 34-32 lead into the locker room after Boyd made a layup with six seconds to go in the half.

On the opening possession of the second half, Byrd found Miles Heide for a layup to go up 36-32 but the Rebels would respond with seven consecutive points to take a 39-36 lead with 17:54 remaining. The Aztecs battled back, briefly going up 42-41 before the Rebels went back on top 46-42. Byrd had an incredible putback dunk followed by a three-pointer on the next possession to put SDSU up by two with 13 minutes left. UNLV took back the lead with ten minutes and change on the clock via a Jalen Bedford three and did not look back, leading the rest of the way. The Rebels went up seven points with just under five minutes remaining, but the Aztecs pushed back with a 5-0 run to pull within two points with 3:37 left. UNLV led by as much as nine points with 16 seconds to go but a Miles Byrd layup in the final ten seconds brought the final score to 74-67.

Byrd finally reached his elusive double double and finished with great numbers across the board (15 points, ten rebounds, six assists, four steals and three blocks). Boyd's 19 points were a team-high and he grabbed four rebounds. Two more Aztec starters, BJ Davis and Heide, each finished with ten points, matching a career-high for Heide. SDSU's other starter, Jared Coleman-Jones grabbed seven boards and blocked a pair of shots.

UNLV was led by Julian Rishwain (26 points, four assists), Jaden Henley (17 points, four assists), Jalen Hill (11 points, six rebounds) and Bedford (ten points, eight rebounds).

The Rebels shot better from the field (51.0%-40.0%) and beyond the arc (50.0%-24.1%) while both teams shot 60.0% from the free throw line. The Aztecs scored more on fast breaks (11-5) and in the paint (30-20).

Miles Byrd became the first player in Mountain West history and the third player in the nation this century to total 15 points, 10 rebounds, six assists, four steals, three blocks and multiple three-pointers in a game.

SDSU wraps up its regular season on Saturday with a home game against the Nevada Wolf Pack. The game is set to begin at 7:30 p.m. PT and will be broadcast on FS1 and San Diego Sports 760. The Aztecs will honor their seniors prior to the game and fans are asked to wear white.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State shot 54.5 percent from the floor and four players reached double figures in its 80-61 victory on Saturday night over the Nevada Wolf Pack at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

Nick Boyd led the offensive attack with 18 points and was joined by Miles Heide who had a career-best 14 points, Pharaoh Compton who equaled his career-high with 13 points and BJ Davis added 10.

The Aztecs 54.5 percent shooting (30-of-55) is their best since February 16, 2024, against New Mexico, when they hit 56.9 percent.

The Aztecs led 8-7 with 14:49 to play in the first half and then went on a 24-3 run over an 8:40 span to extend their advantage to 32-10 and never looked back. They led by 22 points at the half, 43-21. The 22-point advantage is their largest halftime lead of the season.

SDSU's largest margin, 28 points, came with 17:54 to play, 49-21. The Wolf Pack got as close as 14 points, 59-45 with 9:56 to play, but the Aztecs responded with an 8-1 run and put Nevada away 80-61.

San Diego State honored six senior on Saturday, Ryan Schwarz, Desai Lopez, Demarshay Johnson Jr., Kimo Ferrari, Wayne McKinney III and Jared Coleman-Jones in a ceremony prior to the game.

With the win, San Diego State is the 4-seed in next week's Mountain West Tournament and will face 5-seed Boise State at 2:30 p.m. PT on Thursday in a quarterfinal matchup.
