CREDIT UNION 1 MW MEN'S BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP – QUARTERFINAL **#2 San Diego State vs. #7 Colorado State Postgame Notes**

Championship Notes

- San Diego State advanced to the semifinals of the 2026 Credit Union 1 Mountain West Men's Basketball Championship with a 71-62 victory over Colorado State. San Diego State awaits the winner of No. 3 New Mexico and No. 11 San José State. SDSU split the season series against New Mexico and won the lone meeting against San José State.
- The Aztecs are now 45-19 all-time in the Mountain West tournament, including 21-6 in the quarterfinals.
- SDSU's 21 semifinal appearances are eight more than the next best team (UNLV).
- San Diego State is the third team today to attempt 40+ free throws in a MW tournament game. Prior to this year, there had never been more than one team to do that in a single MW tournament, let alone the same day.
- Colorado State made 12-more threes than San Diego State, the largest 3PM differential in a MW tournament game. CSU also attempted 23 more threes than SDSU, which is also a tournament record for 3PA differential.
- San Diego State made 17 more twos than Colorado State, the largest 2PM differential in a MW tournament game.
- The Aztecs also attempted 29 more free throws than CSU, the largest FTA differential in Mountain West tournament history.

San Diego State Notes

- SDSU's one made 3-pointer is tied for the fewest ever in Mountain West Tournament history.
- Prior to tonight (San Diego State, -12), the largest 3PM differential overcome by a team to win a MW tournament game was 10 by Colorado state vs. Wyoming in the 2000 tournament.
- San Diego State now has 30 games this season where at least eight players have scored a point, the most by any MW team this season.

Colorado State Notes

- Brandon Rechsteiner led all scorers with 16 points on 5-of-8 shooting and 3-of-5 from 3-point range. It was the 11th consecutive game that Rechsteiner knocked down at least one 3-pointer.
- Tonight was CSU's seventh game this season having at least four players make multiple 3-pointers, the most by any MW team this season.
- While the Rams shot well from 3-point range (13-of-34, 38.2 percent), they struggled from 2-point range going just 6-for-23 (26.1 percent).
