UNLV TO OPEN MOUNTAIN WEST TOURNAMENT AGAINST WYOMING

First Round matchup set for Wednesday at 12 p.m. at Thomas & Mack Center; Runnin' Rebels have won 6 of last 9

The UNLV men's basketball team, which has won six of its last nine games, will open play in the 2026 Credit Union 1 Mountain West Men's Basketball Championship against Wyoming in the first round on Wednesday, March 11, at 12 p.m. at the Thomas & Mack Center.

The Runnin' Rebels (16-15, 11-9) are the No. 8 seed, while the Cowboys (18-13, 9-11) are No. 9. The two teams have met only once this season, with Wyoming winning that game on Jan. 6 in Laramie, 98-66.

UNLV had won two straight games before falling 89-86 on the road at San Diego State in the regular-season finale on Friday. Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored 32 points, while Tyrin Jones had a career-high 22 against the Aztecs.

The two-game win streak consisted of a thrilling 85-83 overtime win at home over intrastate rival UNR on Feb. 28 in which Gibbs-Lawhorn scored a career-high 42 points, including the game-tying 3-pointer with 33.4 seconds remaining in regulation, and Tyrin Jones made the game-winning basket with 8.1 seconds left in overtime. On March 3, the Runnin' Rebels dominated Mountain West regular-season champion Utah State, 92-65, at home, for their fourth Quad 1 win of the season. In that contest, Howie Fleming Jr. recorded his second triple-double in 10 days with 12 points, 10 rebounds, and a career-high 12 assists, while Kimani Hamilton (24 points) and Tyrin Jones (17 points) combined to score 41.

The Runnin' Rebels are averaging 80.2 points per game and have five players averaging 8.7 points per game or more: Gibbs-Lawhorn (21.0 ppg, 1st in MW/19th in NCAA), Kimani Hamilton (12.6 ppg), Tyrin Jones (11.9 ppg), Howie Fleming Jr. (9.2 ppg), and Issac Williamson (8.7 ppg). Fleming Jr. leads the team in rebounds at 6.3 rpg (5th in MW) and assists at 3.9 apg (6th in MW). Gibbs-Lawhorn is the team's steals leader at 1.7 spg (5th in MW), while Jones leads in blocks at 2.0 bpg (1st in MW/25th in NCAA).

The Runnin' Rebels are in their first year under head coach Josh Pastner. Although new to UNLV, he is in his 15th year as a collegiate head coach, having previously led Memphis and Georgia Tech for seven seasons each. He holds a career record of 292-202 (.591).

UNLV's roster has only one returning player, Jacob Bannarbie, and has welcomed 13 new faces. The newcomers include eight Division I transfers, a former international professional, a junior college transfer, and three freshmen.

MORE ABOUT THE ROSTER: This season's UNLV squad, which has had to deal with a rash of injuries, returned just one player from 2024-25: redshirt sophomore forward Jacob Bannarbie. The 2025-26 roster added 13 newcomers - eight Division I transfers, a former international professional, a junior college transfer, and three freshmen. The team features four seniors, three juniors, three sophomores, and three freshmen, with a position breakdown of seven guards, six forwards, and a center. Last season, Bannarbie appeared in 19 games (three starts), averaging 1.6 points and 1.8 rebounds in 6.6 minutes, and shooting 52.9% from the field on 17 attempts.

ABOUT WYOMING: The Cowboys (18-13, 9-11) enter the MW Tournament on a three-game win streak: vs. Air Force (66-62) on Feb. 28, vs. UNR (83-73) on March 3, and at San Jose State (88-78). Wyoming has won five of six overall. The Cowboys have four players averaging double figures in scoring, led by Leland Walker with 13.8 ppg. Khaden Bennett is the team's leading rebounder with 5.0 rpg, while Walker leads in assists with 3.6 apg, and Bennett in steals with 1.4 spg. The Cowboys are 3-9 in true road games this season and are 1-0 in neutral contests. Wyoming ranks 34th nationally in bench points per game at 29.3. The Cowboys were picked to finish ninth in the Mountain West's preseason poll. Wyoming's

15-man roster is made up of six upperclassmen. The Cowboys went 12-20 overall last season, finishing ninth in the MW at 5-15. Head coach Sundance Wicks is in his second season at the school with a 30-33 (.476) record, and is in his fifth season overall as a collegiate head coach with a career record of 78-79 (.497).

LAST TIME VS. WYOMING: In this season's first meeting between the two teams on Jan. 6 in Laramie, Wyoming won 98-66. The Cowboys' Leland Walker led all scorers with 28 points as three other Wyoming players also scored in double figures. The Runnin' Rebels were led by Kimani Hamilton's 19 points, while Tyrin Jones added 16 points and eight rebounds, and Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored 10. Wyoming shot 63.0% (17 of 27) from the field in the first half, including 8 of 11 (72.7%) on 3-pointers, taking a 48-26 lead into the break. The Cowboys made 8 of their first 11 shots, taking a 20-5 lead after the first 7:30 of play. Wyoming extended its advantage to 30-12, with UNLV shooting just 2 of 9 from the field at that point. From that point on, there was a series of 8-0 runs over the course of the rest of the half, two from Wyoming and one from UNLV. UNLV got to the free throw line 16 more times than Wyoming did; however shot just 25 of 45 from the charity stripe (55.6%).

BROADCAST INFO: Wednesday's game will be broadcast live on the Mountain West Network with Nate Kreckman and Terrence Oglesby calling the action. The radio broadcast may be heard on ESPN Radio 1100 AM with Matt Neverett, Curtis Terry, and Steve Cofield on the call. SERIES HISTORY

- This will mark the 70th meeting between UNLV and Wyoming in men's basketball.
- UNLV leads the all-time series 47-22.
- UNLV has won five of the last seven meetings with Wyoming, but has lost two of the last three.
- Wyoming won the only previous meeting this season, 98-66, which was on Jan. 6 in Laramie.
- UNLV is 31-5 all-time vs. Wyoming at home, which included 19 straight wins at the Thomas & Mack Center before falling to the Cowboys in the 2022 Mountain West Tournament.
- Wyoming won the last meeting at the TMC, 63-61, on Jan. 21, 2025.
- UNLV and Wyoming have faced each other in the MW Tournament on five previous occasions, with the Runnin' Rebels going 4-1 in those meetings.
- UNLV is 440-247 (.641) all-time against teams that currently make up the Mountain West.

UNLV'S MOUNTAIN WEST TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- UNLV has won the Mountain West Tournament three times (2000, 2007, 2008).
- The Runnin' Rebels have appeared in the championship game on eight occasions.
- UNLV is 29-21 all-time in the Mountain West Tournament.
- UNLV defeated Air Force last year in the first round (68-59), before falling to Utah State (70-58) in the quarterfinals.
- UNLV's last meeting against Wyoming in the MW Tournament was in 2022, which was won by the Cowboys (59-56).
- UNLV is 4-1 all-time against Wyoming in the MW Tournament.
- UNLV's last appearance in the MW Tournament semifinals was in 2014.

UP NEXT

The winner of the UNLV vs. Wyoming first round Mountain West Tournament game will move on to the quarterfinals to face top-seed Utah State on Thursday, March 12 at 12 p.m.

ALL-MOUNTAIN WEST HONORS

UNLV junior guard Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn and freshman forward Tyrin Jones have received All-Mountain West honors for the 2025-26 season, the conference announced Tuesday. The awards were voted on by the league's head coaches and select media. **Gibbs-Lawhorn** was named the **Newcomer of the Year** and received **first-team All-MW** recognition, while **Jones** was selected to the **all-defensive team** and earned **honorable mention All-MW**.

Gibbs-Lawhorn's Newcomer of the Year award is only the second in UNLV's Mountain West history and its first since Mike Moser earned the same recognition in 2012. In addition, Gibbs-Lawhorn is UNLV's first first-team recipient since Bryce Hamilton in 2022. Jones is UNLV's first all-defensive team member since Luis Rodriguez in 2024.

- Gibbs-Lawhorn, who transferred to UNLV from Illinois before this season, led the Mountain West in scoring averaging 23.6 points per game (in conference-only games). He also ranked first in 3-point field-goal percentage at 47.7%, first in 3-pointers made per game at 3.6, second in field-goal percentage at 53.5%, sixth in free-throw percentage at 84.4%, and sixth in steals at 1.6 spg. He was third in minutes played per game at 35.7.
- He also had the two highest scoring games of the season in the Mountain West (conference-only games) with a career-high 42 points in an overtime win vs. UNR on Feb. 28 and 36 in an overtime win against Boise State on Feb. 13.
- Gibbs-Lawhorn, who won the Mountain West's Player of the Week award three times this season, started all 20 of UNLV's league games. He scored in double figures in all except one, registering 20 or more points in 14 games and 30 or more in six contests. He had 30 or more in five of the last seven games.
- Jones averaged 13.2 points per game during conference play and led the league in field-goal percentage at 60.3%. He also led the league in blocks with 2.0 per contest. He was named the MW Freshman of the Week on

two occasions, including this past week.

- Jones had two games in conference action where he was perfect from the field, 7 of 7 in a win vs. Fresno State on Dec. 20 and 5 of 5 in a victory at Air Force on Feb. 21. He made 10 starts in 17 conference games played, scoring in double figures in 14 games, including in each of the last eight. He scored 20 or more three times, including a career-high 22 at San Diego State on Friday.

QUAD 1 WINS

UNLV has four Quad 1 wins this season, placing them second in the country among those from a non-power league. Gonzaga is No. 1 in that category with six.

DRA GIBBS-LAWHORN'S 11-GAME TEAR

- Over the last 11 games, Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn has scored 20 or more points in 10 games and 30 or more five times, including five of the last seven games. Over a nine-game span from Jan. 30-Feb. 28, Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn averaged 29.7 ppg, while shooting 56.9% from the field (95 of 167), including 52.9% on 3-pointers (45 of 85). During that stretch, he made 5.0 3-pointers per game and went 32 of 34 from the free-throw line (94.1%).

HOWIE FLEMING JR. BECOMES 1ST UNLV PLAYER TO HAVE 2 TRIPLE-DOUBLES IN SAME SEASON

Howie Fleming Jr. recorded two triple-doubles in a 10-day span this season. He had 10 points, 10 rebounds and a then-career high of 10 assists on Feb. 21 at Air Force, marking the first triple-double for a UNLV player since Marvin Coleman had 11 points, 12 rebounds, and 11 assists vs. New Mexico in 2020. It also was just the second triple-double in 26 years for a Runnin' Rebel. Then, on March 3 against Utah State, he had another triple-double with 12 points, 10 rebounds and a career-high 12 assists to become just the second UNLV player to have two triple-doubles in a career and the only one to do it in the same season.

FLEMING JR.'S ASSIST-TO-TURNOVER RATIO THE LAST SIX GAMES

Over the last seven games, Howie Fleming Jr. has recorded 44 assists with only 5 turnovers for an assist-to-turnover ratio of 8.8-to-1. For the entire season, he has 112 assists to 54 turnovers (2.1).

WINNING TRENDS

UNLV is 14-1 when it shoots a higher field-goal percentage than its opponent. Additionally, the Runnin' Rebels are 11-2 when they record more rebounds in a game than their opponent, 10-3 when dishing out more assists, 14-7 when blocking more shots, 13-5 when scoring 80 or more points, 11-5 when leading at halftime and 8-4 when shooting 50% or better from the floor.

3-GAME WIN STREAKS

UNLV has had three separate three-game win streaks this season. Its most recent such streak was snapped with its home loss to Colorado State on Feb. 18. During that streak (vs. Grand Canyon, vs. San Jose State, at Boise State), Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn averaged 29.7 ppg, while shooting 51.6% from the floor (33 of 64) and 46.4% on 3-pointers (13 of 28). Against Boise State in the 23-point comeback, he single-handedly outscored the Broncos 22-19 over the final 11:55 of regulation and hit the game-tying 3-pointer with 38 seconds to go. Over that three-game stretch, UNLV averaged 82.7 points per game and 5.7 blocks per contest.

MOST POINTS FOR A UNLV INDIVIDUAL IN A GAME SINCE 2022

Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn's career-high 42 points vs. UNR on Feb. 28 marked the highest individual scoring total in a game by a UNLV player since Bryce Hamilton also had 42 points at Colorado State in 2022. Gibbs-Lawhorn has tallied double figures in scoring in 29 of his 31 games this season, including 20+ 17 times and 30+ on six occasions. He had a 15-game double-figure scoring streak snapped in the loss vs. New Mexico on Jan. 27 as he totaled just eight points, but responded with 26 points in his next game at UNR on Jan. 30, then 28 at Fresno State on Feb. 3, 29 vs. Grand Canyon on Feb. 7, 24 on Feb. 10 against San Jose State, 36 against Boise State, 31 vs. Colorado State, 21 at Air Force, 30 at Grand Canyon, 42 vs. UNR, 10 vs. Utah State, and 32 at San Diego State. His streak of 20+ points in nine straight games and 11 of 12 ended vs. Utah State. So, he has now scored 20 or more in 10 of his last 11 games and 30-plus in five of his last seven.

SEASON SWEEPS

UNLV recorded four season sweeps this season, winning both meetings against San Jose State, Boise State, Air Force and Utah State. The sweep over the Aggies was UNLV's first since 2013-14, while the one against the Broncos marked the Runnin' Rebels' first against them since 2019.

HASN'T HAPPENED IN 15 YEARS

With the Runnin' Rebels holding Air Force to just 39 points on Jan. 3, it marked the first time they have held a Division I opponent to under 40 points since 2010 in a 70-39 win vs. Colorado State.

DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE

In the Jan. 3 win, UNLV held Air Force to just 25.8% shooting in the second half (8 of 31), including 15.4% on 3-pointers (2 of 13). The Falcons finished the game at a 27.8% from the floor (15 of 54), which was a UNLV opponent season low, and 15.8% on 3-pointers (3 of 19).

SCHEDULE ANOMOLY

In a bit of a scheduling anomaly, UNLV only played four December games this season: at Stanford on Dec. 7, vs. Tennessee State on Dec. 13, vs. Fresno State on Dec. 20 and vs. La Sierra on Dec. 29. The Runnin' Rebels played nine games during the month of January this season and eight in February.

DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING

UNLV's leading scorer, Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn, has scored in double figures in 29 of the 31 games played this year, including a streak of 15 straight games that ended Jan. 27 vs. New Mexico. He scored a then-career-high 33 points against Boise State on Jan. 13, and then bested that with 36 on Feb. 13, also against Boise State. He followed that up with his second straight 30-plus point game with 31 vs. Colorado State on Feb. 18, and again had 30 points on Feb. 25 at Grand Canyon. On Feb. 28 vs. UNR he scored a new career high of 42 points. He has now had 17 games with 20 or more points, including nine straight and in 11 of 12 contests (that streak ended with 10 points vs Utah State on March 3). He tallied 30 or more in four of five games during that stretch. This all after averaging just 4.4 points per game in two years at Illinois. Kimani Hamilton has tallied double-figure scoring in 22 games this season, while Tyrin Jones has had 10 or more points in 19 games, including in each of his last eight and 15 of his last 18 (he missed three-plus contests semi-recently because of injury). He had a then-career-high 20-point performance at Utah State on Jan. 20 and bested that with 22 at San Diego State on Friday. Howie Fleming Jr. has tallied 10 or more points in 12 games (20+ in three games this season) and Issac Williamson has scored in double figures 10 times.

RODEO ROAD TRIP

With the National Finals Rodeo occupying the Thomas & Mack Center each December, UNLV had no home games during a 30-day span. The Runnin' Rebels hosted Saint Joseph's on Thursday, Nov. 20 and returned to the Thomas & Mack Center on Saturday, Dec. 20, to open Mountain West play against Fresno State, a game they won 84-72.

A FIRST IN 13 YEARS

With career highs of 18 points and 10 rebounds in his UNLV debut at Stanford on Dec. 7, Emmanuel Stephen became the first Mountain West player with a double-double in a road game against an ACC school since future NBA No. 1 draft pick Anthony Bennett did so at North Carolina in December 2012.

ON THE ROAD

UNLV went undefeated in true road games during non-conference play this season at 2-0. The Runnin' Rebels won at Memphis (92-78) on Nov. 16, and at Stanford (75-74) on Dec. 7. Overall, UNLV finished the season with a 6-6 record in true road games this season and won four of its last eight road contests: at San Jose State on Jan. 17, at Utah State on Jan. 20, at Boise State on Feb. 13, and at Air Force on Feb. 21.

THE "RUNNIN'" REBELS

The Runnin' Rebels are averaging 80.2 points per game. UNLV scored 101 in a win over Chattanooga on Nov. 8, which marked the program's first 100-point outing against a NCAA Division I team in eight seasons (Southern Utah, 101-82 on Nov. 25, 2017). Prior to the Players Era Men's Championship, UNLV had scored at least 81 points in all five of its games up to that point with the Nov. 20 win vs. St. Joe's being the fourth straight at 92+. UNLV has scored 80 or more in nine of its last 10 games: 96 at Fresno State, 80 vs. Grand Canyon, 82 against San Jose State, 86 at Boise State, 86 vs. Colorado State, 91 at Air Force, 85 vs. UNR, 92 vs. Utah State, and 86 at San Diego State.

TARGET PERCENTAGE OF BASKETS ASSISTED

Coach Pastner has talked about the team's goal of at least 60% of the team's field goals being assisted. That almost occurred in each of UNLV's first four games this season: 16 assists on 23 field goals made (69.6%) vs. UT Martin, 23 assists on 33 field goals made (69.7%) vs. Chattanooga, 21 assists on 35 field goals made (60.0%) against Montana, and 19 assists on 32 field goals made (59.4%) at Memphis. Other games that UNLV has assisted on at least 50% of its made field goals: 63.6% vs. Maryland (14/22), 53.3% vs. then-No. 8 Alabama (16/30), 56.0% vs. Rutgers (14/25), 71.4% vs. Fresno State (20/28), 53.9% vs. Air Force (14/26), 50% at Colorado State (10/20), 51.6% (16/31) vs. Boise State, 63.0% at San Jose State (17/27), 59.1% vs. New Mexico (13/22), 55.6% vs. Grand Canyon (15/27), 53.3% vs. San Jose State (16/30), 58.3% at Air Force (21/36), 55.2% vs. UNR (16/29), 61.8% vs. Utah State, and 50% at San Diego State (15/30).

REBOUNDING HIGH

UNLV pulled down a season-high 58 rebounds on Nov. 20 vs. St. Joe's, with 25 coming on the offensive glass. Its second-best performance in rebounding was on Dec. 29 vs. La Sierra with 50 total rebounds, 20 on the offensive side. Against Air Force on Jan. 3, UNLV had 49 rebounds with 15 on the offensive glass.

INJURY BUG

Injuries have been a major storyline for UNLV this season: Mason Abittan, Myles Che, Ladji Dembele, Tyrin Jones, Emmanuel Stephen, and Issac Williamson missed practice time during the preseason and the Oct. 19 exhibition at Washington, leaving just seven healthy scholarship players for that game. On Oct. 28 vs. Lincoln, Jones returned to play, and in the season opener on Nov. 4, Dembele returned to action. Williamson played in his first collegiate game on Nov. 11 vs. Montana, but UNLV was without Abittan, Che, and Stephen in each of its first eight regular-season games. Abittan was injured, then cleared to play but hasn't appeared in a game yet (It was decided that he will redshirt this season). Dembele was again out at Memphis and vs. St. Joe's, played against Maryland and then-No. 8 Alabama, but then has missed each of the last 24 games (Dembele and Che have been ruled out for the season). In addition, Jacob Bannarbie missed four straight games with a calf injury, returning to play on Dec. 13 vs. Tennessee State. Stephen made his debut on Dec. 7 at Stanford, and Howie Fleming Jr. missed that trip because of conjunctivitis. Jones missed three semi-recent games with a shoulder injury (occurred early in the New Mexico game on Jan. 27), while Fleming Jr. was out Feb. 7 against Grand Canyon with an ankle injury.

DRA GIBBS-LAWHORN EARNS 3RD MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR - MARCH 2

UNLV's Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn was named the Old Trapper Mountain West Men's Basketball Player of the Week for the third time this season, the league announced on March 2. The junior guard from Lafayette, Indiana, who transferred to UNLV from Illinois prior to this season, scored a total of 72 points in UNLV's two games the previous week for an average of 36.0 ppg on 57.1% shooting (24 of 42), including 56.0% from 3-point range (14 of 25). He also made 83.3% of his free throw attempts (10 of 12), and averaged four rebounds, three steals, two assists, and a block per game. In UNLV's thrilling



85-83 overtime win against intrastate rival UNR on Feb. 28, he scored a career-high 42 points, which marked the most points in a game for a UNLV player since Bryce Hamilton also had 42 in 2022 at Colorado State. Against the Wolf Pack, Gibbs-Lawhorn was 14 of 22 from the field (57.1%) and 8 of 14 on 3-pointers (57.1%). He also made all six of his free throw attempts, while collecting four rebounds, three steals, two assists, and a blocked shot. He made the game-tying 3-pointer with 33.4 seconds left in regulation, which ended up forcing overtime. In the 80-67 road loss at Grand Canyon on Feb. 25, Gibbs-Lawhorn scored 30 points on 10 of 20 shooting (50%), including 6 of 11 on 3-pointers (54.5%). He made 4 of 6 free throws, collecting four rebounds, three steals, two assists, and a blocked shot. This was the third Mountain West Player of the Week honor for UNLV this season.

DRA GIBBS-LAWHORN EARNS 2ND MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR - FEB. 16

UNLV's Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn was named the Old Trapper Mountain West Men's Basketball Player of the Week for the second time this season, the league announced on Feb. 16. The junior guard led the Runnin' Rebels to a 2-0 week the previous week, averaging 30 points per game in a home win over San Jose State (82-75) and an upset victory on the road at Boise State in overtime (86-83). The Lafayette, Indiana, native, who transferred to UNLV from Illinois prior to this season, shot 56.1% from the field (23 of 41) and 50% on 3-pointers (10 of 20) for the week, also dishing out 3.5 assists per game, and recording 3.5 rebounds and 2.5 steals per game. At Boise State on Feb. 13, he scored 25 of his career-high 36 points in the second half, including the game-tying 3-pointer with 38 seconds left, to lead the Runnin' Rebels back from 23 points down. He single-handedly outscored Boise State 22-19 in the final 11:25 of regulation. It marked UNLV's highest individual scoring total in a game since Bryce Hamilton had 42 points at Colorado State in 2022. Gibbs-Lawhorn, who played all 45 of the game's minutes against the Broncos, shot 13 of 22 from the field, including 6 of 12 from 3-point range. He also made all four of his free throw attempts, with three rebounds, and two steals. In the win over SJSU on Feb. 10, he played all 40 minutes and scored a game-high 24 points with five assists, four rebounds, and three steals. He was 10 of 19 from the field, including 4 of 8 on 3-pointers.

DRA GIBBS-LAWHORN EARNS MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR - JAN. 19

UNLV's Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn was named the Old Trapper Mountain West Men's Basketball Player of the Week on Jan. 19. The junior guard led the Runnin' Rebels to a 2-0 record the previous week with wins over Boise State at home and San Jose State on the road. He averaged a team-high 21.5 points per game, while shooting .500 from the field (15 of 30). He also averaged 5.0 assists per game and 4.5 rebounds per contest. The Lafayette, Indiana, native, who transferred to UNLV from Illinois prior to this season, scored a career-high 33 points with a career-high-tying six assists in the 89-85 overtime victory against the Broncos on Jan. 13. The 33 points marked the highest individual scoring total in a game by a UNLV player since EJ Harkless had 35 points in the 2023 Mountain West Tournament. Gibbs-Lawhorn was 11 of 23 from the field and 9 of 12 on free throws, also contributing five rebounds and a steal. In the 76-62 win at San Jose State on Jan. 17, Gibbs-Lawhorn scored 10 points on 4 of 7 from the field, including 2 of 4 on 3-pointers. He also had four rebounds and four assists with no turnovers.

TYRIN JONES EARNS 2ND MOUNTAIN WEST FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONOR - MARCH 9

UNLV's Tyrin Jones was named the Old Trapper Mountain West Men's Basketball Freshman of the Week, the league announced Monday. Jones helped UNLV to a 1-1 week during the final two games of the regular season last week with averages of 19.5 points and 5.0 rebounds per game. He shot 70.8% from the field (17 of 24), while also averaging 2.0 blocks and 2.0 assists per game. The Las Vegas native, who attended Layton Christian Academy in Utah, scored 17 points on 8 of 10 shooting in UNLV's 92-65 blowout of regular-season Mountain West champion Utah State on March 3 at home. He also had four rebounds, three assists, and a blocked shot. Jones followed with a career-high 22 points in an 89-86 road loss at San Diego State Friday night in the regular-season finale. In that game, he was 9 of 14 from the field, with six rebounds, three blocks, and an assist. This was the second Mountain West weekly honor for Jones. In all, UNLV received weekly honors five times this season as Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn was selected as the league's Player of the Week on three occasions.

TYRIN JONES EARNS MOUNTAIN WEST FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONOR - DEC. 23

UNLV's Tyrin Jones was named the Old Trapper Mountain West Men's Basketball Freshman of the Week on Dec. 23. Jones scored a career-high 18 points in UNLV's Mountain West season-opening 84-72 win over Fresno State at the Thomas & Mack Center on Dec. 20. It was the Runnin' Rebels' lone game of the week. The Las Vegas native, who attended Layton Christian Academy in Utah, was perfect from the field as he made all seven of his attempts, along with all four of his free throws. Jones also grabbed five rebounds, had three blocks, three assists, and a steal in over 38 minutes of action. His plus/minus was second on the team at +18.

STRONG NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

UNLV had a formidable non-conference slate this season: seven opponents made the postseason last year, including four NCAA Tournament teams. Seven of 10 Division I non-conference foes finished in the NET top 100 at the conclusion of the 2024-25 season. Key matchups included (last season's record in parenthesis):

- **Chattanooga (29-9):** Southern Conference champions and National Invitation Tournament winner.
- **Montana (25-10):** Big Sky regular-season and tournament champions; NCAA automatic bid.
- **at Memphis (29-6):** Return game after UNLV's 80-74 home loss; Tigers won the AAC regular season and tournament, reached NCAA Tournament.
- **Saint Joseph's (22-13):** NIT appearance.
- **Players Era Men's Championship:** Maryland (27-9, Sweet 16) opener, then No. 15 Alabama (28-9, Elite Eight).
- **at Stanford:** 21 wins; NIT second round.

TARKANIAN COURT WAS REDEDICATED NOV. 4 IN HONOR OF JERRY AND LOIS

UNLV Athletics rededicated the court at the Thomas & Mack Center to honor legendary Hall of Fame coach Jerry Tarkanian and his wife, Lois, during a special pregame ceremony prior to the men's basketball regular-season opener against UT Martin on Nov. 4. Originally named Jerry Tarkanian Court in 2005, the court was officially renamed the Jerry and Lois Tarkanian Court, celebrating their tremendous contributions to UNLV basketball and the Southern Nevada community. Coach Tarkanian is renowned for leading the Runnin' Rebels to four Final Fours and the 1990 NCAA Championship, while Lois was a respected public servant and advocate for education in Nevada. This rededication captures their inseparable legacy, emphasizing the impact of both on future generations, also coincided with Jerry and Lois's wedding anniversary.

LAST SEASON

The Runnin' Rebels went 18-15 in 2024-25 under the previous staff, finishing sixth in the Mountain West at 11-9 and falling to Utah State in the MW Tournament quarterfinals. Only Jacob Bannarbie returned for this season, after averaging 1.6 ppg and 1.8 rpg in 6.6 mpg.

IT HAD BEEN A WHILE

UNLV's Oct. 19 contest at Washington was its first exhibition game since 2019, when it beat West Coast Baptist College 112-54 at the Thomas & Mack Center.

MEET THE NEWCOMERS

The Runnin' Rebels have 13 newcomers on their roster, which are made of eight Division I transfers, a former international professional, a junior college transfer and three freshmen.

0 - Dravyn Gibbs-Lawhorn - G - 6-1 - 185 - Jr. - Transferred from Illinois: Originally from Lafayette, Indiana. Played two seasons as a freshman and sophomore at Illinois. A four-star recruit in the class of 2023, he was highly ranked by multiple recruiting services and concluded his high school career at Word of God Christian Academy in North Carolina. During his sophomore year at Illinois, appeared in all 35 games, averaging 5.9 points and 1.6 rebounds, with standout performances including a team-high 17 points against then-No. 11 Wisconsin. He previously scored a career-high 21 points in his season opener and had notable contributions throughout his freshman year as well.

1 - Ladji Dembele - F - 6-8 - 255 - Jr. - Transferred from Iowa: From Newark, New Jersey. Played two seasons as a freshman and sophomore at Iowa, appearing in 65 games for the Hawkeyes. During his sophomore year, he started 21 games, shooting 46.7% from the field and 38.2% on 3-pointers. He shared the team's Best Defensive Player Award as a freshman. A four-star recruit, originally from Mali, he had multiple offers, including from Wake Forest and Xavier, before committing to Iowa.



2 - Kimani Hamilton - F - 6-8 - 225 - Sr. - Transferred from High Point: Originally from Jackson, Mississippi. Transferred to UNLV as a 1,000 point college career scorer. At High Point he earned two First Team All-Big South honors and was a Lou Henson Award finalist. During the 2023-24 season, he helped lead the Panthers to the NCAA Tournament, averaging 13.1 points and 4.6 rebounds while shooting 52.0% from the field. He also started all 36 games in his sophomore season, contributing 14.9 points per game with a 46.9% shooting percentage. A four-star recruit from Clinton High School, he was named the 2021-22 Mississippi Gatorade Player of the Year, making history as the first father-son duo to win the award in the state.

3 - Howie Fleming Jr. - G - 6-5 - 210 - R-Sr. - Transferred from UTRGV: Originally from Louisville, Kentucky. As a redshirt junior at UTRGV, he averaged 12.3 points, 6.4 rebounds, and 2.4 assists per game while shooting 56%. He scored in double figures in 20 games, including five double-doubles. His collegiate journey began at Illinois State, followed by a season at Winthrop. For his career, he has played in a total of 95 games with 65 starts, averaging 12.5 points. A 2019 graduate of Louisville Male High School, he earned second team all-state honors, averaging 15.8 points and 7.0 rebounds as a senior while leading his team to the state semifinals.

6 - Tyrin Jones - F - 6-9 - 190 - Fr.: Originally from Las Vegas, went to high school at Layton Christian Academy in Utah. He signed with UNLV under the previous staff. Was ranked as a top-150 prospect by 247 Sports. Chose the Runnin' Rebels over New Mexico, Santa Clara and UC Santa Barbara. Played AAU for the Utah Prospects, who won the Adidas 3SSB National Championship.

7 - Al Green - G - 6-3 - 185 - Sr. - Transferred from Louisiana Tech: Originally from Sacramento, California. As a junior at La. Tech, he averaged 10.2 points and played in 30 games, making 10 starts. He scored in double figures 14 times, including three performances of 20 points or more, and led the Bulldogs in scoring during eight games. Green was the top 3-point shooter in Conference USA, making 48%. He set a program record with 28 points in a CUSA Tournament game against Middle Tennessee. Prior to La. Tech, he played at San Diego City College, where he helped his team achieve a 26-5 record and earned First Team All-PCAC honors with averages of 13.6 points, 3.0 rebounds, and 2.5 assists per game.

8 - Mason Abittan - G - 6-6 - 205 - Fr.: From Las Vegas, he graduated from Coronado High School. He signed with UNLV under the previous staff. He also attended Palo Verde High School in Las Vegas, where he averaged 19.6 points, 5.8 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 2.2 steals as a sophomore before transferring to Red Rock Academy, which is also in Las Vegas. He was one of the top players as a junior on the Puma PRO16 Circuit and was selected as a Las Vegas Sun Super Seven selection heading into his senior season at CHS. He chose UNLV over Colorado State and UNR. He played on Prominent Elite Basketball in AAU.

12 - Issac Williamson - G - 6-0 - 165 - Fr.: From Moreno Valley, California, he signed with the program after Pastner was hired. He led Eastvale Roosevelt High School to a CIF State Open Division championship this past season. He averaged 14.3 points and 2.5 steals per game this past season, while shooting 35% on 3-pointers. He was named to the 2025 All-CIF Southern California team and was the 2024 All-CIF Southern Section Defensive Player of the Year. 247Sports and On3 listed him as a three-star prospect. He originally signed with New Mexico, but was released from that commitment when the Lobos had a coaching change.

13 - Jalen Cunningham - G - 6-2 - 185 - R-So. - Transferred from Cabrillo College: Walk-on originally from Fullerton, California, attended Football High School in Henderson, Nevada, where he averaged 17 points and five rebounds per game as a junior. Graduated from Coronado High School in Henderson in 2021 but his senior season was canceled because of COVID. At Cabrillo, his team had its best record in school history at 25-6 and made it to the state playoffs for the first time, advancing to the Elite Eight. Averaged 15 points per game while shooting 45% on 3-pointers. Started all 31 games and also averaged four rebounds per contest.

22 - Walter Brown - F - 6-5 - 210 - Sr.: From Christchurch, New Zealand, Brown came to UNLV after playing professionally for the Canterbury Rams in the National Basketball League for the past five years. In the 2025 season, he averaged 13.5 points, 5.8 rebounds, 1.9 assists, and 1.3 steals per game while shooting 48.1% from the field. He has played on two NZNBL championship teams and won a title in the Australian NBL, earning the 2023 NZNBL Youth Player of the Year award. He debuted for the New Zealand National Team during the 2023 FIBA World Cup Asian Qualifiers and also played in the FIBA World Cup that year after a successful high school career at St. Bede's College.

24 - Naas Cunningham - F - 6-7 - 175 - R-Fr. - Transferred from Alabama: From West Orange, New Jersey, he redshirted at Alabama during the 2024-25 season. A former five-star recruit, he was ranked as the No. 43 overall player in the class of 2024 by 247Sports and recognized as the No. 15 small forward nationwide. He averaged 13.4 points, 5.3 rebounds, and 1.7 assists per game for Rolling Loud in Overtime Elite, having previously played for the NY Renaissance program where he averaged 11.6 points per game. He was also named one of 16 finalists for the 2021 USA U16 National Team and was rated as the No. 1 overall recruit by ESPN in 2022.

34 - Emmanuel Stephen - C - 7-0 - 230 - So. - Transferred from Arizona: Originally from Lagos, Nigeria. Played as a freshman at Arizona during the 2025-25 season. Was Pastner's first signing at UNLV. He was a four-star Top 100 recruit, completing his senior year at Dream City Christian in Glendale, Arizona. Having only started playing basketball in 2019, he trained at the NBA Academy Africa before moving to the U.S. and played for Paul George Elite on the AAU circuit, where he was named defensive MVP at the 2023 Peach Jam, averaging 3.8 blocks, 7.0 points, and 9.8 rebounds per game. Out of high school, Stephen chose Arizona over offers from notable programs like Kansas, Miami, Michigan, and USC.

77 - Myles Che - G - 6-3 - 190 - Jr. - Transferred from UC Irvine: Originally from Walnut, California. He started all 38 games as a sophomore at UC Irvine this past season, averaging 12.1 points, 2.8 assists, and 2.4 rebounds per game while shooting 40.1% overall and 42.9% from beyond the arc. He received All-Big West Honorable Mention honors and had an impressive career-high 31 points against UC Davis. UCI finished the season with a record of 26-5, advancing to the championship game of the NIT, where it lost in overtime by just one point. Prior to UC Irvine, he played his freshman year at Chattanooga, averaging 7.5 points and 2.4 rebounds per game, and he honed his skills in high school at The Skills Factory in Atlanta.

THE LONE RETURNER

10 - Jacob Bannarbie - F - 6-9 - 235 - R-So.: Originally from Anchorage, Alaska. Is in his third year with the Runnin' Rebels. As a redshirt freshman last season, he appeared in 19 games with three starts, averaging 6.6 minutes, 1.6 points, and 1.8 rebounds per game while shooting 52.9% from the field in 17 total attempts. He did not play in any games during 2023-24 (redshirt season). A 2023 graduate from Hillcrest Prep in Phoenix, Arizona, Bannarbie was a three-star prospect who previously played for the Oakland Soldiers AAU team, averaging 8.8 points and 6.1 rebounds per game in Nike EYBL competition.

PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST POLL

UNLV was picked sixth in the Mountain West preseason media poll announced Oct. 23 at Media Day at Resorts World in Las Vegas. Predicted order: 1) San Diego State (26 first-place votes), 2) Utah State, 3) Boise State, 4) Grand Canyon, 5) New Mexico, 6) UNLV, T-7) Colorado State, T-7) UNR, 9) Wyoming, 10) San Jose State, 11) Fresno State, 12) Air Force. Runnin' Rebel senior forward Kimani Hamilton was named to the Preseason All-Mountain West team.

"3-POINT GOAL..." - 1,291 CONSECUTIVE GAMES WITH A MADE 3-POINTER

Since the 3-point line was adopted in 1986-87, the Runnin' Rebels have made at least one 3-pointer in all 1,291 games they have played. Duke currently holds the NCAA record for consecutive games with at least one made 3-pointer as the Blue Devils have a streak of 1,295 straight games (since 1989-90 season).



HEAD COACH JOSH PASTNER

Josh Pastner was hired as the new head coach of the UNLV men's basketball program in March. Pastner, who has extensive experience as a head coach in the Atlantic Coast Conference at Georgia Tech (2016-23) and Conference USA/American Athletic Conference at Memphis (2009-16), came to UNLV after serving as a television analyst for the previous two years. As a collegiate head coach, Pastner (48), who is in his 15th season, has an overall record of 292-202 (.591).

He has led his teams to a total of four conference tournament championships, two conference regular-season championships and seven postseason appearances (five NCAA Tournaments, two NIT). He was named the 2017 ACC Coach of the Year and the 2013 C-USA Coach of the Year. In 2021, Pastner led Georgia Tech to its first ACC Championship since 1993 and first NCAA Tournament berth since 2010. He also led the Yellow Jackets to a runner-up finish in the 2017 NIT.

Six of his players (Josh Okogie, Jose Alvarado, Michael Devoe, Ben Lammers, James Banks III and Moses Wright) earned All-ACC honors and he was named the state of Georgia College Coach of the Year by the Atlanta Tipoff Club in 2021. The same year that he earned ACC Coach of the Year (2017), he was also selected as the National Association of Basketball Coaches' District 2 Coach of the Year.

He led Memphis to five postseason appearances: 2010 NIT and the NCAA Tournament in 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014. His teams won three C-USA tournament championships (2011, 2012 and 2013), and he won the regular-season league championships in 2012 and 2013. While in charge of the Memphis program, the Tigers signed the No. 1 recruiting class in the nation in 2010 and the No. 2 class in 2013.

Pastner was a student-athlete on the 1997 National Championship team at Arizona and was an assistant coach at Arizona under Lute Olson (2002-08) and Memphis under John Calipari (2008-09), both members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

Pastner earned his bachelor's degree in family studies from Arizona in 1998 and his master's in teaching and teacher education, also from Arizona, in 1999.

Coach Pastner and his wife, Kerri, have three daughters (Payten, Kamryn and Harper), a son (Cason), and a stepson (Ethan).

PASTNER'S STAFF

Pastner's staff is made up of experienced coaches, some of which have deep connections to the Runnin' Rebel program's history: associate head coach Scott Garson arrived at UNLV from Santa Clara with nearly three decades of coaching experience including stops at UCLA and Utah. Assistant coach Anthony Wilkins joined from UTRGV. He also spent time at Vanderbilt, Georgia Tech and Tulane. Justin Hawkins, a former standout player at UNLV, returned after three years at UNR, where he was director of player development. Hayden Sheridan is the director of strategy and analytics after serving the last seven seasons at Georgia Tech. DeShawn Henry continues as director of basketball operations, expanding his responsibilities after six years in the program. Runnin' Rebel legend Stacey Augmon has returned as Director of Community Engagement, focusing on community relations and student-athlete mentorship. Additionally, Anthony Marshall, another former player, joins as a graduate assistant, alongside Daniel Allen, Aly Dhanani, and Braden Parris, completing the GA staff for the 2025-26 season.

AT THE THOMAS & MACK CENTER

The 2025-26 season marks the 43rd year of Runnin' Rebel basketball in the Thomas & Mack Center. UNLV has posted an all-time record of 564-166 (.773) in the arena since it opened in 1983. The Runnin' Rebels had won five straight games at the Thomas & Mack Center before losing to San Diego State on Jan. 24, and are 10-5 in the building this season.

68TH YEAR OF RUNNIN' REBEL BASKETBALL

The 2025-26 season marks the 68th year of Runnin' Rebel basketball at UNLV. Since the program's inception in 1958-59, the Runnin' Rebels have posted an all-time record of 1,409-667 (.679).

TOP-10 WINNINGEST PROGRAM EVER

Entering 2025-26, UNLV was 1,349-630 (.682) against four-year American institutions and ranks top 10 all-time in NCAA Division I by winning percentage (minimum 25 years in Division I). Other programs in this tier include Kentucky, North Carolina, Kansas, Duke, UCLA, Syracuse, and Arizona. UNLV has posted a winning record in 61 of its 67 seasons.

NBA DRAFT PICKS

From 2013-16, UNLV produced four NBA Draft picks: Anthony Bennett (No. 1 overall, Cleveland Cavaliers, 2013); Rashad Vaughn (No. 17 overall, Milwaukee Bucks, 2015); Patrick McCaw (No. 38 overall, Golden State Warriors, 2016); and Stephen Zimmerman Jr. (No. 41 overall, Orlando Magic, 2016).

RUNNIN' REBELS IN THE NBA

When the start of the 2025-26 season began, two former Runnin' Rebels were on NBA rosters: Derrick Jones Jr. (Los Angeles Clippers) and EJ Harkless (Utah Jazz). Both went undrafted. Jones is in his 10th season and sixth team (Suns, Heat, Trail Blazers, Bulls, Mavericks, Clippers) and won the 2020 Slam Dunk Contest in Chicago, edging Aaron Gordon (Feb. 15, 2020). Harkless is in his second season after signing a two-way deal last year. Jones played at UNLV in 2015-16; Harkless in 2022-23.

THE JOSH PASTNER RADIO SHOW

The Josh Pastner Radio Show airs live during select weekdays during the season in Las Vegas on ESPN Radio 1100 AM from 6-7 p.m. The show originates from Bailiwick at The Orleans Hotel & Casino and is hosted by Matt Neverett, UNLV Sports Properties' play-by-play voice of UNLV Athletics, along with former Runnin' Rebel and current radio analyst Curtis Terry and ESPN Radio personality Steve Cofield. Featuring UNLV men's basketball head coach Josh Pastner, fans are encouraged to attend the show in person. The season's final show occurred on March 4.

REBZONE TV SHOW ON FOX 5

Now in its 13th season, KVVU Fox 5 is the home of the official UNLV television coach's show. Sports Reporter Paloma Villicana joins UNLV head coach Josh Pastner Sundays during the season for a unique half-hour of game reviews, previews and program features. The award-winning "RebZone Sports Show" airs Sundays nights at 10:30 p.m. exclusively on Fox 5. The show is also available on an archived basis on YouTube. The season's final show aired this past Sunday, March 8.

SHORT-HANDED RUNNIN' REBELS OPEN EXHIBITION SLATE WITH 77-62 LOSS AT WASHINGTON

Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored 14 points, while Naas Cunningham added 11 in UNLV's first exhibition game since 2019

SEATTLE (UNLVRebels.com) - The short-handed UNLV men's basketball team opened its exhibition season Oct. 19 with a 77-62 loss at Washington at Alaska Airlines Arena. It was the Runnin' Rebels' first exhibition game since 2019.

UNLV was without six scholarship players because of injury, while Washington also was missing key players. Out for the Runnin' Rebels were Mason Abittan, Myles Che, Ladji Dembele, Tyrin Jones, Emmanuel Stephen and Issac Williamson, leaving just seven scholarship players available.

A GAME OF RUNS: Washington used a 14-3 run to take a 15-point lead with 9:01 to play until halftime. UNLV cut its deficit to nine three minutes later, but the Huskies led 39-25 at the break.

The Runnin' Rebels kept fighting and trimmed their deficit to nine points again with 12:15 to go. After another Washington run, UNLV trimmed the lead to just 10 points with 3:55 to play, but that was as close as it got.

LEADERS: UNLV was led by Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn's 14 points and five rebounds, while Naas Cunningham scored 11. Washington was led by Hannes Steinbach's double-double of 22 points and 16 rebounds, while Bryson Tucker added 14 points and Wesley Yates III contributed 11.

STATS OF THE GAME: Washington shot 52.5% from the field, while limiting UNLV to just 33.8%. Both teams struggled from 3-point range with the Huskies shooting 29.4% and UNLV at 21.9%.

SHORTHANDED RUNNIN' REBELS CRUISE TO 123-59 EXHIBITION WIN

Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored a game-high 31 points as five UNLV players recorded double figures against Lincoln University (California) at the Thomas & Mack Center

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) - The shorthanded UNLV men's basketball team wrapped up the exhibition portion of its 2025-26 schedule with a 123-59 win over Lincoln University (Calif.) on Oct. 28 at the Thomas & Mack Center.

UNLV was without five scholarship players because of injury: Mason Abittan, Myles Che, Ladji Dembele, Emmanuel Stephen and Issac Williamson, leaving just eight scholarship players available.

Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored 20 of his game-high 31 points in the first half as the Runnin' Rebels raced out to a 66-33 lead at the break. A total of five UNLV players scored in double figures, while four recorded double digits in rebounds. Naas Cunningham contributed 23 points and Walter Brown had a game-high 14 rebounds.

Laolu Kalejaiye led the Oaklanders with 16 points, while Claude McKesey scored 15 and Brandon Williams scored 11.

MORE INDIVIDUAL STATS: Gibbs-Lawhorn was 12 of 16 from the field, including 5 of 8 on 3-pointers. He also dished out a game-high seven assists with no turnovers, had three blocked shots and a steal. Jacob Bannarbie and AI Green each scored 14 points for UNLV, while Kimani Hamilton had 13. Bannarbie, Howie Fleming Jr. and Green each had 10 rebounds. Green and Cunningham each had four steals, while Tyrin Jones had seven points, seven rebounds and three blocks.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV out-rebounded Lincoln 72-31, including pulling down 28 on the offensive glass (16 second-chance points).

BIG RUN: UNLV held a two-point lead almost six minutes into the game, but outscored Lincoln 50-19 the rest of the half. That included a 13-0 run over 2:31 that turned a 43-28 advantage into a 56-28 lead.

LARGEST LEAD: UNLV led by as many as 65 points near the end of the game.

QUOTABLE: "I was proud of our young men. We should have won the game and by a good margin, which we did. I thought the ball really moved well and we found the open man. Our goal is to get 60% of our field goals assisted and we did a nice job there. We got great paint touches and rebounded well on the offensive glass. Defensively, we need to be better with our transition defense. However, there were a lot of positives tonight and always good to get a win." - UNLV head coach Josh Pastner

Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn led UNLV with 18 points in 86-81 loss at the Thomas & Mack Center

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) - The shorthanded UNLV men's basketball team lost to UT Martin 86-81 at the Thomas & Mack Center on Nov. 4 in its regular-season opener.

REBELS RUN AWAY FROM CHATTANOOGA 101-69 FOR PASTNER'S FIRST UNLV WIN

Five Runnin' Rebels scored in double figures as the team scored more than 100 points for the first time since 2017

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) - The UNLV men's basketball team (1-1) ran away from Chattanooga (1-2) 101-69 on Nov. 8 at the Thomas & Mack Center to give new Runnin' Rebel head coach Josh Pastner his first victory at the school.

Five Runnin' Rebels scored in double figures as the squad tallied more than 100 points for the first time in eight years (101-82 vs. Southern Utah on Nov. 25, 2017).

Naas Cunningham led UNLV in scoring with a game-high 25 points, while Kimani Hamilton added 19 with a game-high nine rebounds. Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn and Howie Fleming Jr. each contributed 13 points, while Jacob Bannarbie chipped in 10.

The Mocs were led by Teddy Washington Jr.'s 14 points, while Jordan Frison scored 13.

SHORTHANDED BECAUSE OF INJURIES: UNLV was again without four scholarship players because of injury: Mason Abittan, Myles Che, Emmanuel Stephen, and Issac Williamson.

RAN AWAY WITH IT: UNLV led 47-36 at halftime, then outscored Chattanooga 54-33 in the second half thanks to a 57.6% shooting performance over the final 20 minutes of play. The Runnin' Rebels led by as many as 32 points with under 30 seconds to go.

STATS OF THE GAME: UNLV outrebounded Chattanooga (42-20), committed just eight turnovers, led in points in the paint (46-28), and led in bench scoring (42-25). Additionally, UNLV grabbed 16 offensive rebounds, converting those into 22 second-chance points, and recorded 23 assists on 33 made field goals (69.7%).

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) - The UNLV men's basketball team suffered a 102-93 loss to Montana on Nov. 11 at the Thomas & Mack Center.

RUNNIN' REBELS RECORD 92-78 WIN IN PASTNER'S MEMPHIS RETURN

Howie Fleming Jr. and Issac Williamson combined for 50 points as UNLV defeated the Tigers at FedExForum

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (UNLVRebels.com) - Howie Fleming Jr. and Issac Williamson combined to score 50 points as the UNLV men's basketball team (2-2) recorded a 92-78 win over Memphis (1-2) at FedExForum on Nov. 16.

It was the Runnin' Rebels' first road game of the season, which also marked a return to Memphis for UNLV head coach Josh Pastner. A video tribute played in the arena pregame for Pastner, who spent seven seasons as the Tigers' head coach.

Fleming Jr. and Williamson each scored career highs of 25 points in the game, with the former also pulling down a game-high 12 rebounds for his first double-double of the season. For the freshman Williamson, it was just his second college game.

HOT START: After Memphis scored the game's first five points, UNLV went on an 18-3 run which included the Runnin' Rebels making all five of their first field goal attempts of the game. UNLV increased its lead to as many as 16 points (45-29) with 2:54 until halftime. Fleming Jr. scored 21 of his points in the first half, shooting 8 of 10 from the field. As a team, the Runnin' Rebels made 55.2% of their field goal attempts in the first half and led in fastbreak points 11-2 over the game's first 20 minutes.

STREAK SNAPPED: The victory for the Runnin' Rebels snapped Memphis' 11-game home win streak.

THESE REBELS ARE RUNNIN': UNLV has scored at least 81 points in all four of its games this season with Sunday being the third straight in the 90s. UNLV is now averaging 91.8 points per contest.

MORE ON FLEMING JR. AND WILLIAMSON: Fleming Jr. shot 9 of 16 from the field, while Williamson was 8 of 13, including 6 of 10 on 3-pointers. Williamson also added five steals.

MEMPHIS' TOP SCORER SHUT DOWN: UNLV held Dug McDaniel, who entered the game as the Tigers' leading scorer with 13.0 ppg, to just 1 of 10 shooting. He also was forced into committing six turnovers.

RUNNIN' REBELS' THREE-GAME WIN STREAK HALTED WITH LOSS AT WYOMING

Cowboys shot 63.0% from the field and made 8 of 11 3-pointers in the first half, finishing with a 98-66 decision in Laramie

LARAMIE, Wyo. (UNLVRebels.com) - The UNLV men's basketball team suffered a 98-66 loss on Jan. 6 at Wyoming at Arena-Auditorium, seeing its three-game win streak come to an end.

The Cowboys' Leland Walker led all scorers with 28 points as three other Wyoming (11-4, 2-2) players also scored in double figures.

The Runnin' Rebels (7-7, 2-1) were led by Kimani Hamilton's 19 points, while Tyrin Jones added 16 points and eight rebounds, and Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored 10.

STAT OF THE GAME: Wyoming shot 63.0% (17 of 27) from the field in the first half, including 8 of 11 (72.7%) on 3-pointers, taking a 48-26 lead into the break.

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Cowboys made 8 of their first 11 shots, taking a 20-5 lead after the first 7:30 of play. Wyoming extended its advantage to 30-12, with UNLV shooting just 2 of 9 from the field at that point. From that point on, there were a series of 8-0 runs over the course of the rest of the half, two from Wyoming and one from UNLV.

FREE THROWS: UNLV got to the free throw line 16 more times than Wyoming did; however shot just 25 of 45 from the charity stripe (55.6%).

QUOTABLE: "Wyoming played with desperation, and we played soft. We just couldn't score; we missed free throws and layups, and that's a bad combination. We just got our butts kicked. They just punched us in the face, and we didn't respond. Just really disappointed with our lack of hit-first mentality and our lack of toughness. But that is going to get corrected in a hurry, because we have a quick turnaround with Colorado State on Friday." - UNLV head coach Josh Pastner

OTHER NOTES:

- Walker was 9 of 15 from the field, including 4 of 6 on 3-pointers, and 6 of 6 on free throws.
Wyoming outrebounded UNLV, 43-29.
Wyoming finished the game with a 55.0% shooting percentage, including 42.9% from 3-point range, while UNLV was 37.5% on field goals and 45.5% on 3-pointers.
Wyoming shot 79.3% on free throws (23 of 29).
Wyoming had 14 offensive rebounds to UNLV's 11, but outscored the Runnin' Rebels in second-chance points 16-8.
Wyoming led in points in the paint, 46-26, and in bench scoring, 34-9.

The Rams closed the game with a 16-4 run to win 70-62; Issac Williamson led UNLV in scoring with 14 points

FORT COLLINS, Colo. (UNLVRebels.com) - The UNLV men's basketball team lost its second straight Mountain West road game on Jan. 9, 70-62, at Colorado State.

The Rams (11-5, 2-3) had four players score in double figures, led by Brandon Rechsteiner's 15 points.

Issac Williamson's 14 points led three Runnin' Rebels (7-8, 2-2) in double digits.

DOWN THE STRETCH: In a game that featured six lead changes and nine ties, UNLV led 56-51 with just under seven minutes remaining. However, the Runnin' Rebels made just one field goal over the game's final nine minutes, and Colorado State closed the game on a 16-4 run, during which UNLV went scoreless for almost four minutes.

STAT OF THE GAME: Colorado State shot 52.2% from the field in the second half (12 of 23).

QUOTABLE: "I'm proud of our young men for the way they bounced back from Tuesday's game (98-66 loss at Wyoming), because our whole message over the last three days was how you are going to respond is going to show your character. I thought we responded the right way. We had great fight and we had a chance to win the game. It's a fine line sometimes between winning and losing, and we fell a little short. RUNNIN' REBELS WIN FIFTH STRAIGHT HOME GAME WITH OT VICTORY OVER BOISE STATE

Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored a career-high 33 points with a career-high-tying six assists in an 89-85 win at the Thomas & Mack Center

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) - The UNLV men's basketball team won its fifth straight home game on Jan. 13 with an 89-85 overtime victory against Boise State at the Thomas & Mack Center.

The win also snapped a two-game losing streak for the Runnin' Rebels (8-8, 3-2), giving them a fourth win in their last six games.

Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored a career-high 33 points for UNLV, adding a career-high-tying six assists. The 33 points marked the highest individual scoring total in a game by a UNLV player since EJ Harkless had 35 points in the 2023 Mountain West Tournament.

The Broncos (9-8, 1-5) were led by Drew Fielder's 23 points, with Andrew Meadow adding 21.

BACK-AND-FORTH: The game featured an incredible 18 lead changes and 19 ties. Boise State's biggest lead was seven points late in the first half, while UNLV's largest margin was five early in the second half.

STAT OF THE GAME: Although the turnovers were fairly even, with Boise State committing 15 and UNLV 13, the Runnin' Rebels scored 29 points off turnovers, while Boise State managed just 12.

OTHER NOTES:

- Fielder made a 3-pointer with 0.2 seconds remaining in regulation to force overtime at 76-76.
Howie Fleming Jr. added 17 points, while Kimani Hamilton scored 16.

RUNNIN' REBELS WIN 76-62 AT SAN JOSE STATE

UNLV made a season-high 11 3-pointers in second straight victory

SAN JOSE, Calif. (UNLVRebels.com) - The UNLV men's basketball team (9-8, 4-2) made a season-high 11 3-pointers in a 76-62 win at San Jose State on Jan. 17.

The victory was the Runnin' Rebels' second straight and fifth in their last seven games.

Howie Fleming Jr. led four UNLV players in double-figure scoring with 21 points and a season-high eight assists. Tyrin Jones added 12 points, while Kimani Hamilton had 11 and Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn contributed 10.

The Spartans (6-12, 1-6) were led by Melvin Bell Jr.'s 22 points and eight rebounds.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV shot a season-high 47.8% from 3-point range for the game (11 of 23).

FIELD GOALS ASSISTED: In the first half UNLV recorded 11 assists on 14 made field goals, finishing the game with 17 assists on 27 makes (63%).

QUOTABLE: "Really proud of our guys. Really great win. Winning is hard. Winning on the road is especially hard. I told our guys for the last 48 hours, to win this game you've got to be so defiant to compete for every inch and you can't give an inch, that's what it comes down to. We found a way to really have a high level of compete. I was extremely proud of our young men for growing into the grit and toughness that we talked about, and the competitive fire and competitive excellence." - UNLV head coach Josh Pastner

OTHER NOTES:

- This was UNLV's fifth straight win against SJSU and the 15th in the last 17 meetings. It also marked UNLV's ninth win on the road vs. SJSU in the last 10 meetings. UNLV shot 54% from the field (27 of 50) and a season-high 91.7% on free throws (11 of 12). UNLV improved its record to 4-1 this season when shooting 50% or better from the field. UNLV held SJSU to just 38.5% shooting in the second half (10 of 26). The Spartans finished the game at 41.3% shooting from the field (19 of 46). Fleming Jr. (6 of 11), Jones (5 of 8), Hamilton (4 of 5), and Gibbs-Lawhorn (4 of 7) combined to shoot 19 of 31 from the field (61%). Hamilton was 3 of 3 on 3-pointers, Fleming Jr. was 3 of 6, and Gibbs-Lawhorn was 2 of 4. Emmanuel Stephen led the team in rebounds with six, and Gibbs-Lawhorn added four assists without committing a turnover. UNLV committed a season-low seven turnovers. San Jose State outrebounded UNLV 31-22, including 13-5 on the offensive glass. The Spartans led in second-chance points 9-2. UNLV led 40-31 at halftime. UNLV has made at least one 3-pointer in a NCAA-record 1,277 straight games.

RUNNIN' REBELS COMPLETE SECOND-HALF COMEBACK TO UPSET UTAH STATE 86-76

Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored 21 points, and Tyrin Jones had 20 in UNLV's third straight win

LOGAN, Utah (UNLVRebels.com) - The UNLV men's basketball team (10-8, 5-2) came back from 14 points down in the second half to upset Utah State 86-76 at Dee Glen Smith Spectrum on Jan. 20.

It was the Runnin' Rebels' third straight win and sixth in their last eight games.

Five UNLV players scored in double figures, led by Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn's 21 points and Tyrin Jones' career high of 20.

The Aggies (15-3, 6-2) also had five players score in double figures, led by Mason Falslev's 21 points and six rebounds.

STREAK SNAPPED: It marked UNLV's first win at Utah State since 2016. The Runnin' Rebels had lost seven in a row in Logan and eight of its previous nine on the road against the Aggies. UNLV entered the game having lost eight of its last nine overall to Utah State.

SECOND-HALF COMEBACK: Tied 38-38 at halftime, Utah State opened the second half with a 20-6 run to take a 58-44 lead with 12:44 to go. UNLV fought back, eventually taking a 66-65 lead with 5:53 to play. The Runnin' Rebels closed the game on a 13-3 run over the final 2:52 as they made six of eight field goals during that stretch.

STATS OF THE GAME: UNLV shot 57.1% from the field in the second half (16 of 28), made 7 of 14 3-pointers for the game (50%) and connected on 21 of 25 free throws for the game (84.0%).

NO LONGER UNDEFEATED AT HOME: Utah State entered the game with a 15-2 overall record, including 7-0 at home.

QUOTABLE: "Utah State is a really good basketball team and they are very well coached. I have been at many places - in the ACC, in the real Pac-10 back in the day, and other conferences - and this is as good of a home environment as there is in the country. So to win on the road here is almost impossible, and for us to be able to pull that off after being down 9-0 to start the game, and down 14 in the second half, was a credit to our grit and toughness." - UNLV head coach Josh Pastner

OTHER NOTES:

- With the win, UNLV improved its record in true road games this season to 4-2. UNLV committed 12 turnovers, but went the final 13 minutes of the game without committing one. There were a total of seven lead changes and 10 ties throughout the game (three lead changes and six ties in the first half). UNLV found itself down 9-0 to start the game. Later, it used a 10-1 run to take its first lead of the game at 33-30 with 4:05 until halftime. UNLV was in foul trouble early with Gibbs-Lawhorn, Kimani Hamilton and Howie Fleming Jr. each with three fouls at halftime. Emmanuel Stephen, Gibbs-Lawhorn, and Fleming Jr. all ended the game with four fouls, while Hamilton fouled out of the contest with 7:28 remaining. UNLV shot 50% from the field for the game (29 of 58), improving its record to 5-1 when shooting 50% or better. UNLV held Utah State to less than 30% shooting from 3-point range (7 of 24, 29.2%). Utah State shot 44.8% from the field (26 of 58), but made just 54.8% of its free throws (17 of 31). UNLV made 14 of 16 free throws in the second half (87.5%). UNLV outrebounded Utah State, 40-31, improving its record to 7-1 when recording more rebounds in a game than its opponent. Each team had 13 offensive rebounds. UNLV's Walter Brown tied his career high with 10 points, while Stephen also scored 10. Gibbs-Lawhorn was 8 of 12 from the field, including 3 of 5 on 3-pointers. Jones made 10 of 12 free throws. Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored 31 points in 91-86 setback at the Thomas & Mack Center

BOISE, Idaho (UNLVRebels.com) - Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored 25 of his career-high 36 points in the second half as UNLV came back from 23 points down to win at Boise State, 86-83, in overtime on Feb. 13 at Extramile Arena.

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) - Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored 31 points, but the UNLV men's basketball team suffered a 91-86 loss to Colorado State on Feb. 18 at the Thomas & Mack Center.

Gibbs-Lawhorn's point total was the highest scoring game by a UNLV player since Bryce Hamilton tallied 42 points in 2022 at Colorado State.

Tyrin Jones added 20 points for the Runnin' Rebels (13-13, 8-7), while Kimani Hamilton scored 13 points with eight rebounds. Howie Fleming Jr. added nine points with a game-high 10 rebounds.

Kimani Hamilton added 13 points for the Runnin' Rebels (13-12, 8-6), while Tyrin Jones added 12.

The Rams (16-10, 7-8) were led by Jevin Muniz' 20 points, while Brandon Rechsteiner added 18 and Rashaan Mbemba had 13.

Drew Fielder led four Boise State (15-10, 7-7) players in double-figure scoring with 27 points.

REBEL RALLY: CSU led by 15 points with 7:09 (78-63) to play as UNLV cut it to three on two occasions with under 30 seconds to play. Hamilton stepped out of bounds as he was attempting a potential game-tying 3-pointer with 11 seconds. After two CSU free throws, UNLV again cut it to three with three seconds left, but two more CSU free throws sealed it with one second to play.

SLOW START, BIG COMEBACK: UNLV made just three of its first 19 shot attempts and trailed Boise State, 32-9, with seven minutes left in the first half. The Runnin' Rebels closed the half by making five of their last six shots to cut the deficit to 11 (40-29). The Broncos led by 17 points with 8:55 to go (64-47), but a 15-0 UNLV run over the next three minutes changed the game's momentum.

STAT OF THE GAME: Colorado State shot 62.5% in the first half (15 of 24) and finished the game at 59.3% (32 of 54).

BRING OUT THE BROOM: UNLV also defeated Boise State in overtime in this season's earlier meeting on Jan. 13 (89-85). The Runnin' Rebels recorded their first regular-season sweep of the Broncos since 2019.

30+ POINTS AGAIN: It marked the second straight game that Gibbs-Lawhorn scored over 30 points and was his sixth straight with 20-plus. He now has three 30-plus scoring games this season and has scored 20-plus in eight of the last nine contests.

THREE-GAME WIN STREAKS: The win at Boise State was UNLV's third straight win. The Runnin' Rebels have now recorded three separate three-game win streaks this season.

QUOTABLE: "Credit to Colorado State. They were really good and are playing really well. They made some big shots in the second half when we were putting some pressure on them. Credit to them for their offensive performance tonight. We scored 86; you have to win the game. Unfortunately, we have not been a good defensive team this year. I'm beyond disappointed in that because in all the teams I have been the head coach of, we have been really good defensively. It has been a staple of ours. I haven't done a good enough job as the head coach in that area (defensively) with our group. We are just not getting enough stops." - UNLV head coach Josh Pastner

TRIPLE-DOUBLE: Fleming Jr.'s triple-double was the first for a UNLV player since Marvin Coleman had 11 points, 12 rebounds, and 11 assists vs. New Mexico in 2020. Fleming Jr.'s also marked just the second triple-double in 26 years for a Runnin' Rebel.

TURNING POINT: After Air Force took a 38-36 lead with 18:30 to play, UNLV went on a 14-3 run to take a nine-point lead at 50-41 with 15:23 left. Air Force cut it to six, but another big 20-5 run later on over a seven-minute span gave UNLV a 23-point lead (81-58) with 4:24 to go.

QUOTABLE: "Air Force is well-coached and they are a Division I basketball team. I know they have had some struggles this year, but you are playing on their home floor and they run good offense and make it difficult for you defensively. I thought we were getting baited into shooting threes in the first half, and we were lethargic. Our agenda wasn't the right agenda to play the right way and we were not what we have been and who we have been. Our second half was really good on both ends of the floor. We were able to get three stops in a row seven different times throughout the course of the game today. We were able to pull away in the second half and any time you can get a road win it's a great deal." - UNLV head coach Josh Pastner

- Gibbs-Lawhorn, who has scored 20-plus points in seven straight games and in nine of the last 10, scored 19 of his points in the second half on 7 of 8 shooting, including 4 of 5 on 3-pointers.

RUNNIN' REBEL RALLY FALLS SHORT AT GRAND CANYON

Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored 30 points in an 80-67 loss at Global Credit Union Arena

PHOENIX (UNLVRebels.com) - UNLV junior guard Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn, the Mountain West's leading scorer, scored 30 points on Feb. 25 at Grand Canyon, but it wasn't enough as the Runnin' Rebels lost 80-67.

Howie Fleming Jr. added 14 points with six rebounds for UNLV (14-14, 9-8), while Tyrin Jones contributed 13.

GCU (18-10, 11-6) was led by former UNLV guard Jaden Henley's 28 points and 11 rebounds. Nana Owusu-Anane also had a double-double with 11 points and 11 rebounds, while Brian Moore Jr. scored 17 points, Makaih Williams had 11 and Efe Demirel scored nine points with nine rebounds.

COMEBACK FELL SHORT: UNLV, which trailed by as many as 20 late in the first half, came back to cut its deficit to just six points on a Gibbs-Lawhorn 3-pointer with 2:51 to play. It was the sixth straight made field goal by the Runnin' Rebels, however that would be as close as they would get.

30 POINTS AGAIN: The 30-point outing for Gibbs-Lawhorn marked the fourth game this season that he scored 30 or more. He has now scored 20-plus in eight straight games. He has tallied at least 30 in three of the last four games.

SLOW START: UNLV got off to a slow start, trailing 12-0 after three-plus minutes and made just four of its first 23 shot attempts. The Runnin' Rebels trailed 35-15 with 2:47 left until halftime after a 13-1 GCU run, and went into halftime down 42-24.

- UNLV and GCU split the season series as the Runnin' Rebels won the previous on Feb. 7 in Las Vegas, 80-78.

Jacob Bannarbie added 15 points, Tyrin Jones scored 12, and Howie Fleming Jr. had game highs of 12 rebounds and seven assists in an 85-83 rivalry victory at the Thomas & Mack Center

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) - UNLV junior guard Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn, the Mountain West's leading scorer, scored a career-high 42 points on Feb. 28 as the Runnin' Rebels defeated intrastate rival UNR 85-83 in overtime.

Jacob Bannarbie added 15 points for UNLV (15-14, 10-8), Tyrin Jones contributed 12, and Howie Fleming Jr. had game highs of 12 rebounds and seven assists.

The Wolf Pack (19-10, 11-7) were led by Vaughn Weems' 30 points and nine rebounds. Tayshawn Comer added 15 points, while Elijah Price had 10.

END OF REGULATION: UNLV trailed 74-71 when Gibbs-Lawhorn made a game-tying 3-pointer with 33.4 seconds remaining. Out of a UNR timeout, Tyler Rolison missed a leaver that ended up out of bounds, called off UNLV. After a UNLV timeout on the inbound pass, Price was called for an offensive foul on a screen, giving the ball back to UNLV with 2.8 seconds left. Gibbs-Lawhorn missed an off-balance desperation 3-pointer, which sent the game to overtime.

END OF OT: Walter Brown's layup with 48.4 seconds to go gave UNLV an 83-80 lead in the extra period. Rolison was fouled by Jones with 32.8 seconds to go and made both free throws. Jones was fouled around half court on the ensuing possession with 25.7 seconds left, but missed both free throws. UNR called a timeout with 16.9 to play, and Gibbs-Lawhorn was called for his fifth foul with 14 seconds remaining. Rolison made the first free throw and missed the second, so the game was tied at 83-83. Fleming Jr. took the rebound and immediately found Jones, who drove the lane for the winning basket with 8.1 to go. Jones then deflected a pass, sending the ball out of bounds with 3.9 left. Rolison got off a 3-pointer that would have won the game if it went in, but it was long, and UNLV came away victorious.

30-PLUS POINTS AGAIN: It marked the fifth game this season that Gibbs-Lawhorn has scored 30 or more points. He has now scored 20-plus in nine straight games. He has tallied at least 30 in four of the last five games. The 42 points vs. UNR were the most for a UNLV player in a game since Bryce Hamilton also scored 42 in 2022 at Colorado State.

Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored 32 points and Tyrin Jones had a career-high 22 in 89-86 loss at San Diego State

SAN DIEGO (UNLVRebels.com) - Dra Gibbs-Lawhorn scored a game-high 32 points and Tyrin Jones added a career-high 22, but the UNLV men's basketball team came up just short in an 89-86 road loss at San Diego State in the regular-season finale on March 6.

The Aztecs (20-10, 14-6) were led by BJ Davis' 30 points, while Reese Dixon-Waters added 19 points and six rebounds.

Kimani Hamilton was the other player in double-figure scoring for UNLV (16-15, 11-9) with 11 points, while dishing out a game-high six assists.

BACK AND FORTH: The game featured 11 lead changes and 12 ties throughout with UNLV's biggest lead of eight points coming with 14:21 to play in the first half, and San Diego State's largest advantage being seven with 17:36 to go in the game.

CHANCE AT THE END: The Runnin' Rebels had an opportunity to tie the game at the end, but with the ball in Gibbs-Lawhorn's hands at the top of the key with less than five seconds to play he was unable to get off a shot.

Both teams have competitive endurance and neither team broke. It could have gone in either direction, but credit to BJ Davis. He hit big-time shots. He came in averaging 10 points and had 30 tonight."

30-PLUS POINTS AGAIN: It marked the fifth time in the last seven games that Gibbs-Lawhorn scored at least 30 points. He has now scored 20 or more in 10 of his last 11 contests.
