### **#5 Boise State vs. #12 San José State Postgame Notes**

#### Championship Notes

- Boise State advanced with a 68–51 victory over San José State in the opening round of the 2026 Credit Union 1 Mountain West Women's Basketball Championship. The Broncos will take on fourth-seeded New Mexico on Sunday at 2:30 p.m. PT, with the two teams splitting the season series.
- Boise State is now 22-9 all-time in the Mountain West Women's Basketball Tournament. All 22 wins have been under Head Coach Gordy Presnell, who has tied New Mexico's Don Flanagan for the most MW Women's Basketball Tournament wins by a coach.
- This is the fourth-straight year that Boise State has won its opening round game. The Broncos are searching for their first semifinal appearance since 2021, when they lost to Wyoming as a No. 6 seed.

#### Boise State Notes

- Boise State had a pair of double-doubles with Natalie Pasco leading the way with 21 points and 11 rebounds while Libby Hutton added 16 points and 13 rebounds. It was Pasco's first double-double of the season. Her previous season high in rebounds was seven.
- The 13 rebounds were a season-high for Hutton, who registered her third double-double of the year.
- Led by Tatum Thompson (8-for-8) and Pasco (7-for-7), the Broncos connected on 22-of-26 from the free throw line.
- Boise State did not trail and led for 39:35.
- Boise State became the third team with multiple players with 15+ points & 10+ rebounds in the same game in MW tournament history. The others were Colorado State (2017 vs. SJSU) and UNLV (2009 vs. TCU).

#### San José State Notes

- The Spartans had three players reach double figures. Maya Anderson (18), Katarina Anderson (13) and Gabriela Pato (13) accounted for 44 of the team's 51 points.
- Maya Anderson led the way with 18 points and nine rebounds. Anderson scored in double figures in 10 of her last 11 games.
- The Sparts are now 5-12 all-time in the Mountain West Women's Basketball Tournament.
