- The Aztecs begin the Mountain West Tournament Sunday at noon when they play the [9] Air Force in the quarterfinals.
- SDSU won the Mountain West regular season championship outright. This is the sixth time SDSU has won a regular season championship (fourth in the Mountain West) and first since 2012-13. The Aztecs won the Mountain West Tournament championship last season.
- The Aztecs have won 21 of their last 22 games and 27 of their last 28 games against conference opponents.
- SDSU's 19 conference wins are the most in Mountain West history (for men's and women's).
- The Aztecs are one of five teams in the country to win their conference by at least four games.
- SDSU is committing 12.6 turnovers per game, which would be a school record and is 16th in the country. Their assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.08 would be the program's best since the 1983-84 season.
- The Aztecs are averaging 70.4 points per game, which would be the highest since the 1993-94 season. SDSU is shooting 49.0% on two-pointers, also their best since 1993-94.
- SDSU is making a MW-best 8.6 three-pointers per game and shooting 36.1% from beyond the arc, both of which would be school records and are top 25 in the country. The Aztecs have made more threes than their opponent in 25 of their 29 games and have 12 games with 10 or more three-pointers. The Aztecs made 10+ threes just eight times across the previous three seasons. SDSU has made more threes than their opponent in 25 of their 29 games and have 12 games with 10 or more three-pointers. The Aztecs made 10+ threes just eight times across the previous three seasons.
- The Aztecs shot 39% from three in conference play with all five starters shooting at least 36% from distance.
- SDSU led the Mountain West in points per game (71.0), field goal percentage (45.6%) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.10) in conference play.
- Defensively, the Aztecs held teams to 58.4 points on 37.6% shooting in conference play while leading the league in defensive rebounds per game (28.5) and defensive rebound percentage (76.5%).
- The Aztecs finished the regular season 10-1 on the road and 14-1 at home. The Aztecs along with UConn, UCLA and South Carolina are the only teams in the nation that have one loss or fewer at home and on the road.
- SDSU's .909 road win percentage this season would be the highest in program history. They are 19-5 on the road since the beginning of last year.
- As of Saturday, SDSU has a program-high NET ranking of 67. SDSU has won their last five Quad 1-3 games.
- The Aztecs are currently predicted as a No. 12 seed in the NCAA tournament by ESPN (Charlie Creme) and the NCAA (Autumn Johnson). The top 12 seeds avoid playing a true road game in the first round.
- SDSU is ranked No. 6 (and the top mid-major program) in Jeff Metcalfe's Best of the West power rankings.

All-Mountain West Awards Recap

The Aztecs were heavily rewarded in the Mountain West's postseason awards as voted on by the league's head coaches. Stacie Terry-Hutson was named Coach of the Year. Nala Williams was named the Mountain West Player of the Year, to the All-Mountain West Team and to the All-Defensive Team. Kaelyn Hamilton earned the Sixth Player of the Year Award and Naomi Panganiban was named to the All-Mountain West Team.

Williams (Long Beach, Calif.) led the Mountain West in assists per game (4.3) and assist-to-turnover ratio (2.41). She shot 46% from the field and 42% from three in conference play and was the only player in the conference to have a game with 10+ assists. She won Mountain West Player of the Week twice and has the best assist-to-turnover ratio by an Aztec in the Mountain West era (since 1999).

Williams had 12 games with 10+ points and eight with five or more assists. She also finished fifth in the conference in steals per game (1.6). Last season at Cal State Dominguez Hills, Williams was named the DII National Player of the Year and the National Defensive Player of the Year.

Hamilton (McKinney, Texas) averaged 8.2 points on 55% shooting from the field and 44% from three in just 18.8 minutes per game in conference play. Her 8.2 points per game tied for the second most among players eligible for the Sixth Person of the Year Award. She came on strong in the last month, averaging 10.3 points per game over the last 11 games while setting a new career-high for points three times. Hamilton is the first Aztec to win the Sixth Person of the Year award.

In conference play, Panganiban (San Diego, Calif.) led the Aztecs in scoring with 14.4 points per game, good for fifth in the Mountain West. She scored in double-digits in 15 of SDSU's 20 games and had three games with 20+ points. She was at her best against the top teams in the league, scoring 20 points in both games against second place UNLV.

Terry-Hutson led the Aztecs to a Mountain West record 19 wins and won the conference's regular season championship. In the 2025-26 season, the Aztecs have already set a school record for three-pointers, are on pace to break their previous best mark for fewest turnovers per game and are averaging their most points per game in over 30 years.

Terry-Hutson has led the Aztecs to back-to-back 25-win seasons while securing the 2025 Mountain West Tournament championship and the 2026 regular season championship. SDSU is one of four teams in the nation to have one or less loss at home and on the road, joining national powerhouses UConn, UCLA and South Carolina.

Player Notes

Nala Williams (Senior, Guard, Long Beach, Calif.) Mountain West Player of the Year, All-Mountain West Team & All-Defensive Team

- Nala Williams' assist-to-turnover of 2.37 is the best by an Aztec in the Mountain West era (since 1999), leads the conference and is 114th in the nation among qualified players.
- In her career, she has 1,762 points, 630 rebounds, 452 assists and 350 steals in 120 games. She is one of two players in the nation with at least 1,700 points, 600 rebounds, 400 assists and 350 steals (across all divisions).
- She led the Mountain West in assists per game (4.3) in conference play.
- Williams shot 46% from the field and 21% from three in conference play.
- Her 350 career steals are the ninth most in the nation across all divisions among active players. She ranks 17th in steals per game (2.9) for a career.
- She has scored double-digits in 91 of her 120 career games and has scored 20 or more 31 times. Her career-high is 42.
- Nala Williams won Mountain West Player of the Week award twice this year, giving her nine total conference player of the week awards (seven times with Cal State Dominguez Hills)
- Last year at Cal State Dominguez Hills, Nala Williams was named the DII National Player of the Year and the National Defensive Player of the Year after helping her school go 36-2 and make the national title game.
- She had 152 steals last year (4.0/game), which was the most in the nation across all divisions. No one else had more than 140 steals and only three other players had 130 or more.

Naomi Panganiban (Sophomore, Guard, San Diego, Calif.)

All-Mountain West Team

- Naomi Panganiban has scored 10+ points in 22 of SDSU's 29 games and in nine of her last 10. She has five games with 20 or more points this season.
- She scored 20 points in both games against second place UNLV.
- Panganiban was named to the preseason All-Mountain West Team after leading all Mountain West true freshmen in scoring last season (10.3 ppg).
- Playing for the Philippine National Team at the FIBA Asia Cup, she tied for the team lead in scoring (13.2 ppg) despite being the youngest on the team.

Kaelyn Hamilton (Sophomore, Guard, McKinney, Texas)

- Kaelyn Hamilton averaged 8.2 points on 55% shooting from the field and 44% from three in just 18.8 minutes per game during conference play.
- Hamilton came on strong in the last month, averaging 10.3 points per game over the last 11 games while setting a new career-high for points three times.

Nat Martinez (Sophomore, Guard, San Leandro, Calif.)



San Diego native Stacie Terry-Hutson (13th season) led the Aztecs to the Mountain West regular season championship with SDSU going 19-1 to set a conference record for most wins. The Aztecs have had four straight 20-win seasons and their 95 wins over the last four years are the most ever in a four-year span in program history.

In the 2025-26 season, the Aztecs have already set a school record for seven three-pointers, are on pace to break the previous mark for fewest turnovers per game and are averaging their most points per game in over 30 years. All this success came with a roster that featured a program record seven newcomers and zero returning overclassmen.

In 2025, Terry-Hutson's Aztecs won the Mountain West Tournament championship and qualified for the NCAA tournament, both firsts for the program since 2012. SDSU's 25 wins in 2024-25 tied for the third most in program history, and 15 of those wins came away from home, which set a school record.

The Aztecs won 22 games and advanced to the Mountain West Championship game in the 2023-24 season. SDSU had their second highest points per game in the Mountain West era (25 years).

Armed with an experience squad in 2022-23, the Aztecs won 23 games and made the WNIT, their most wins and first postseason appearance since the 2012-13 season. SDSU led the Mountain West in points allowed (57.3) and had their best assist-to-turnover ratio (1.06) since the 1983-84 season. The Aztecs also won 15 home games, which tied a school record, and saw three players earn All-Mountain West recognition.

Behind balanced scoring that featured four players in double-digits, the Aztecs won 15 games in the 2021-22 season. SDSU averaged 12.87 turnovers per game, the fewest in school history.

In 2020-21, the Aztecs had two preseason all-conference picks (Asia Avinger and Sophia Ramos) suffer lengthy injuries and SDSU went 7-17 and 5-12 in conference.

In the 2019-20 season, the Aztecs went 9-9 in conference and finished tied for fifth place, SDSU's highest placing under Terry-Hutson despite losing Mallory Adams to a season-ending injury after just six games.

The 2019-20 season also saw the Aztecs have two players (Sophia Ramos and Taylor Kalmer) earn All-Mountain West recognition and win five road games, both bests under Terry-Hutson. For the second year in a row, the Aztecs posted a top-three three-point field goal percentage in school history (.358). Their field goal percentage of .417 was SDSU's best since 2013-14 and has improved in each of the last five seasons.

Despite returning just 35 percent of their scoring from the prior season, the 2018-19 Aztecs won 14 games and advanced to the semifinals of the Mountain West Tournament. Both were season-bests for SDSU under Terry-Hutson. They knocked off the No. 2 seed New Mexico in the quarterfinals and pushed the No. 3 seed, Wyoming to overtime in the semifinals.

Under Terry-Hutson's guidance, the Aztecs posted their third-best three-point percentage in school history in the 2018-19 season and saw sophomore Najé Murray break the school record for three-pointers in a season. The 2018-19 season also saw two freshmen from Texas step in and immediately make huge contributions for the Aztecs. Point guard Sophia Ramos became the first Aztec to lead the team in scoring and assists since 2007 and her totals for points and assists were the most by a SDSU freshman since 1992. Her sidekick, Mallory Adams was an honorable mention selection to the all-Mountain West team and had the most rebounds by an Aztec since 2000 and the most for a freshman since 1984. The Aztecs have picked up a conference nod each of the last 20 seasons.

In 2017-18, the Aztecs once again were an elite three-point shooting team. For the second straight year, SDSU hit at least 200 three-pointers, the top two totals in program history.

During her first season on Montezuma Mesa, Terry-Hutson was saddled with the unenviable task of replacing four senior starters who accounted for nearly 64 percent of the team's scoring offense from the previous year, as well as overcoming the loss of two key players to injuries prior to conference play. Despite those obstacles and a demanding schedule featuring nine games against teams that eventually advanced to postseason competition, Terry-Hutson's squad flashed its resiliency during the 2013-14 campaign. The Aztecs led the league in rebounding margin and rebounding defense while ranking second in field-goal percentage.

Individually, Terry-Hutson's also oversaw the progress of senior center Cierra Warren, who became the fifth SDSU player in a six-year span to receive first-team all-MW recognition.

Prior to her arrival on The Mesa, Terry-Hutson's gained a wealth of experience as an assistant coach at the Division I level for 14 years, including five under head coach Nikki (Caldwell) Fargas, who transformed UCLA into a powerhouse before restoring LSU to national prominence.

During Terry-Hutson's two seasons at LSU, the Lady Tigers compiled a 45-23 overall record and earned two NCAA tournament bids, including a Sweet 16 appearance during the 2012-13 campaign. Terry-Hutson helped forward LaShondra Barrett garner first-team all-SEC accolades and received honorable mention All-America distinction in 2012 before becoming a first-round draft choice of the WNBA's Washington Mystics.

Prior to her appointment at LSU, Terry-Hutson served as an assistant under Fargas at UCLA from 2008-11, helping the Bruins gain national acclaim with a pair of NCAA tournament appearances. During Terry-Hutson's tenure, UCLA posted 72 overall victories, as the 2010-11 squad finished with a 28-5 record, setting a school record for fewest losses in a single season to go with a No. 7 national ranking. In addition, the Bruins signed the fourth-ranked recruiting class that season, according to ESPN HoopGurlz, while Terry-Hutson helped mentor first-team all-Pac-10 performers in Doreena Campbell, Darxia Morris and Jasmine Dixon, a 2012 honorable mention AP All-America selection.

Terry-Hutson spent the 2007-08 campaign at Southern Mississippi, as the Golden Eagles posted a 21-14 record and earned a postseason berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). Her responsibilities also included working with the perimeter players, scouting opponents and film breakdown, as well as coordinating all the team's community service events.

Terry-Hutson also coached for three seasons from 2004-07 as an assistant under Hall of Fame head coach Theresa Grentz at Illinois, where the Fighting Illini had three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 25 in the nation, according to Blue Star Basketball, and made three consecutive trips to the WNIT. Her primary duties included defensive instruction and working with the perimeter players.

In addition, Terry-Hutson coached at Dayton during the 2003-04 season following a three-year stint at Louisville from 2000-03. With the Cardinals, Terry-Hutson's responsibilities encompassed recruiting, scouting, player development, summer camps and serving as a liaison for the program's community service outreach. Louisville captured the Conference USA regular-season title and earned a trip to the NCAA tournament in 2001 before making a WNIT appearance in 2002. She also assisted in signing the nation's 21st-ranked recruiting class in 2002-03, according to All-Star Girls Report. Terry-Hutson recruited and coached all-Conference USA honoree Lori Nero, a draft choice of the WNBA's Houston Comets, as well as Sara Nard, who finished her collegiate career as the Cardinals' all-time assist leader.

Terry-Hutson enjoyed a successful collegiate playing career at the University of Texas at Arlington, winning four varsity letters from 1994-98 under head coach Mike Dean. She earned first-team all-Southland Conference honors after leading the Mavericks in scoring with 17.4 points per game as a senior in 1997-98. That year she made 66 three-pointers, which is the second most in school history. Terry-Hutson scored 1,169 points during her career at UTA and is third in program history in career 3-point field goals made (third). She is just one of 20 players in Maverick history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau.

Terry-Hutson played one season of professional basketball in Warsaw, Poland, averaging 12.0 points and 6.0 assists with the Polonia Phoenix, before returning to UT Arlington to begin her coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1999.
