## **CREDIT UNION 1 MW WOMEN'S BASKETBALL CHMAPIONSHIP – QUARTERFINAL**

### **#1 San Diego State vs. #9 Air Force Postgame Notes**

#### Championship Notes

- Air Force advanced to the semifinals of the 2026 Credit Union 1 Mountain West Women's Basketball Championship with an 83–76 win over top-seeded San Diego State. The Falcons had previously lost both regular season matchups to the Aztecs by double digits.
- Air Force is the first No. 9 Seed to ever make the semifinal of the Mountain West women's basketball tournament.
- Air Force's Milahnne Perry scored a career-high 33 points, which is the fifth-most points in MW tournament single-game history.
- Air Force's 57 second-half points were the second most in a half in MW tournament history. San José State holds the record with 59 second-half points vs Utah State on 3/9/15.

#### Air Force Notes

- Perry is also just the second player ever with a 30-point/8-rebound game in the MW tournament, joining Boise State's Marta Hermida who had 30 points and 10 rebounds in 2019.
- Emily Adams scored 20 points. Her and Perry are the first pair of Air Force teammates to score at least 20 points in the same MW tournament game.
- With her first basket, Perry reached 500 points in a season for the third time, tying the most such seasons in MW history. Additionally, Perry now has three of the seven 500-point seasons in Air Force history.
- With two offensive rebounds, Jayda McNabb moved into fifth alone in offensive rebounds in a single season in MW history.
- This is the first time that Air Force has ever won back-to-back MW tournament games.

#### San Diego State Notes

- Naomi Panganiban scored a career-high 29 points for the Aztecs.
- Panganiban connected of 5-of-9 from 3-point range. She is the first Aztec since Taylor Kalmer in 2020 to make at least four 3-pointers in a MW tournament game.
- Kaelyn Hamilton notched her ninth double-digit scoring game off the bench in conference play this year, the most in the MW.
- As a team, the Aztecs shot 52.7 percent from the field. Entering today, SDSU had been 22-0 when shooting at least 40 percent from the field.
