One of the hottest tickets on the schedule is finally here - The Journeymen Wrestling Collegiate Wrestling Duals. No. 3 Arizona State is one of eight top-25 teams heading to the campus of Northwest Florida State College for the two-day tournament. Competition runs Dec. 20-21 in a two-pool tournament series that'll see ASU lineup against No. 2 Penn State, No. 7 Virginia Tech, No. 9 Cornell, No. 22 UNI and Hofstra, with the Sun Devils opening their tournament Monday against Hofstra at 11 a.m. MST/noon CT before taking on the Hokies at 1 p.m. MST/2 p.m. CT. The National Duals are split into red and blue pools with no crossover possibilities. Both pools open the tournament with simultaneous competition running all day Monday on two separate mats. Medal rounds then begin at 1 p.m. Tuesday with each pools' 5th/6th place matches, followed by 3rd/4th place matches at 3 p.m., the red pool championship dual at 5 p.m. and the blue pool championship dual at 7 p.m.

ASU is 1-0 in the lone duals its wrestled in so far, a 22-12 homeopening victory over No. 17 Oklahoma on Nov. 19. A crowd of 2,228 saw the Sun Devils earn two major decision wins and register 21 takedowns to Oklahoma's eight in the first dual of the 2021-22 season. The Sun Devils went 7-for-10, taking the first 6 matches and beating four top-25 wrestlers.

Last Meetings

Penn State, Nov. 22, 2019: No. 5 ASU upset No. 1 Penn State 19-18 in Tempe and snapped the Nittany Lions' 60-match win streak. Victories came from Brandon Courtney, Josh Marica, Jacori Teemer, Zahid Valencia and Kordell Norfleet.

Virginia Tech, Jan. 13, 2018: No. 10 Arizona State wrestling earned a historic set of victories on the final day of the Virginia Duals, defeating No. 11 Northern Iowa, 24-16, and No. 9 Virginia Tech, 21-15, en route to their first-ever Virginia Duals championship at the 38th annual tournament.

Northern Iowa, Feb. 14, 2021: No. 8 Sun Devil Wrestling (6-0, 2-0 Pac-12) walks away with two victories to finish the 2020 regular season undefeated Sunday afternoon. ASU slammed in six individual wins and three bonus points in their 20-15 win over No. 13 Iowa State before dominating Northern Iowa 24-10.

Cornell, Jan. 21, 2007: Despite another dominating victory at 157 pounds from Brian Stith, the Arizona State University wrestling team dropped a 38-4 decision to No. 11 Cornell Sunday afternoon inside Newman Arena in Ithaca, N.Y. The Sun Devils slipped to 5-9 on the year with the loss while the Big Red moved to 2-4 on the season.

Sun Devil Coaching Staff

Head coach: Zeke Jones, year 8

Three-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year and 1988 Sun Devil national champion Zeke Jones was hired to lead his alma mater in 2014 and immediately turned the program into a national powerhouse while continuing the Sun Devils' tradition of success in the conference. Jones is directly responsible for bringing four Pac-12 Championships to Tempe since his arrival - tying long-time rival Oregon State at 22 for the conference lead - and developed a two-time national champion in Zahid Valencia. Fourteen Sun Devils have earned All-American honors since Jones' hiring.



Jones took the helm with a resume that features accomplishments at the collegiate and international level. The Ann Arbor, Michigan, native was a three-time All-American, three-time Pac-10 champion, and national runner-up at 118 lbs with the Sun Devils from 1987-1990 before going on to earn the 1991 52kg World Champion title. He followed his world title with a silver medal-finish (52kg freestyle) while representing the U.S at Barcelona 1992. He finished his professional career with four World-Cup titles before shifting over to coaching, guiding U.S. Olympians at the 1996, 2000, 2004 and 2012 Games. His accomplishments earned him an

induction into the Arizona State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2004.

The 2020-21 season was one for the record books, despite the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic. No. 6 ASU earned five titles at the conference championships to post 138 total points en route to earning its 20th title in the Pac-10/12 era. Brandon Courtney (125), Jacori Teemer (157), Anthony Valencia (165), Kordell Norfleet (197) and Cohlton Schultz (HWT) brought home gold, and nine total trophies were earned in Corvallis, Oregon. Jones' athletes went on to collect five All-America nods at the NCAA Championships, with No. 3 Courtney taking silver in 125. The year was capped off with Cohlton Schultz earning a spot on Team USA with his second-place finish at the Olympic Trials, Anthony Valencia earning CoSIDA Academic All-America status, and Cade Belshay earning a Pac-12 Postgraduate Scholarship.

Jones earned his third Pac-12 Coach of the Year honor in four years in 2020 after leading the Sun Devils to their highest conference tournament point total (141.5) since 1993 while winning the program's 19th Pac-10/12 title. He became the first ASU wrestling head coach to win the conference award three times since Thom Ortiz did so in 2003, 2005 and 2006.

As an Olympic head coach, Jones' athletes earned two gold medals and one bronze at the London Games in 2012. His athletes in the 2004 Athens Games, where he was the freestyle coach, earned a gold and two silvers.

In the four World Championships the U.S. competed in with Jones on the coaching staff, Team USA placed seventh in 2009, third in the 2011, and fifth in 2013. He also led the U.S. to five individual World-Champion medals, with Jordan Burroughs earning two World Champion crowns.

Lee Pritts, Assistant Coach Year: 9

Lee Pritts was named assistant coach on September 4, 2012. Pritts, considered one of the top recruiters in the country, previously worked at North Carolina State, Old Dominion, and Missouri. He was a two-time team captain and made three appearances in the NCAA Championships, earning All-America honors in 1996 for Eastern Michigan and qualified for the 2000 Olympic trials. In 2017 and 2018, he was a coach for USA Wrestling at the Cadet Freestyle World Championships. Pritts mainly works with the lighter weights and also helps oversee the academics of Sun Devil Wrestling Student-Athletes.



Frank Molinaro, Assistant Coach Year: 2

Frank Molinaro was named assistant coach on April 9, 2020. Molinaro was training to prepare himself for Team USA's roster for the Olympics before the Olympic Committee announced postponement of the games to 2021. Previously he won the 2016 Pan American games (70kg) and placed second at the 2017 World Team Trials. Molinaro comes to ASU after previously working as an assistant coach with Virginia Tech in 2017-2018. Before coaching at Virginia Tech, Molinaro was also an assistant coach with Rutgers and Penn State, where he helped win the National Championship in 2016. During Molinaro's collegiate career he was named NCAA champion with Penn State, a four-time NCAA All-American, and a two-time Big Ten champion. Molinaro primarily works with the middle weights.



Eric Thompson, Assistant Coach Year: 1

Thompson joined the Sun Devil Wrestling staff in August 2021 as a volunteer assistant coach. Thompson coached at the Nittany Lion Wrestling Club prior to coming to Tempe where he trained Kyle Snyder and David Taylor, five world-team members, and four Olympians. Before joining the coaching staff, Thompson wrestled at NLWC, where he trained to make the 2016 Olympic Team. He took fifth place in the 2016 Olympic trials. During his collegiate career at Grand View University, Thompson was a three-time NAIA National Champion at 285 pounds and was named NAIA Wrestler of the Year in 2012. Other stops for Thompson include a three-year stint with M2 Training Center where he worked with over 100 athletes and a one-year position with Lock Haven University as an assistant coach. Thompson focuses on the upper weights.
