SETTING THE SCENE

Two more duals await No. 11 Lehigh on the final weekend of the regular season. The Mountain Hawks will make the short trip to Philadelphia to battle Penn at the Palestra Thursday before returning home to close out the dual season Friday against No. 5 Arizona State. The Mountain Hawks have now won nine straight duals after kicking off a stretch of three duals over eight days with a 32-6 victory at Bucknell on Friday night. Lehigh won eight bouts against the Bison, with seniors Jordan Kutler and Chase Gallik registering falls and sophomore Jimmy Hoffman and junior Jordan Wood adding major decisions. Lehigh will recognize its senior class prior to Friday's dual with Arizona State.

FAST FACTS

- In the last nine seasons, Lehigh has produced two NCAA champions, seven NCAA finalists, 25 All-Americans and 21 EIWA champions.
- Lehigh is 17-7 in duals versus Penn since the series resumed in 1996. The Mountain Hawks have won 10 of the 11 duals against the Quakers under Pat Santoro.
- The Mountain Hawks have won five consecutive duals against Arizona State. The Sun Devils are competing in Grace Hall for just the second time and are visiting Lehigh for a dual for just the third time in nine meetings.
- With last week's win at Bucknell, Lehigh has now won at least 10 duals in 20 of the last 21 seasons.

LAST TIME LEHIGH MET PENN FEBRUARY 24, 2019 - BETHLEHEM, PA. LEHIGH 34, PENN 6

Tied 6-6 with Penn after four bouts, No. 20 Lehigh won its final six bouts of the dual season, scoring bonus points in four of those wins to top the Quakers 34-6 inside Leeman-Turner Arena at Grace Hall. Freshman Josh Humphreys' 5-3 decision over Joe Oliva at 157 gave Lehigh a 9-6 lead at intermission. The Mountain Hawks won the first two bouts after the break and then closed the regular season in style, getting three consecutive pins from senior Ryan Preisch and sophomores Jake Jakobsen and Jordan Wood to wrap-up the dual season. Sophomore Brandon Paetzell and junior Ryan Pomrinca added wins by decision for the Mountain Hawks in the first half.

LEHIGH HEAD COACH PAT SANTORO

The 2018 NWCA National Coach of the Year, Pat Santoro is in his 12th season as the Lawrence White '64 Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh. In 11-plus seasons Santoro, a four-time EIWA Coach of the Year, has led the Mountain Hawks to a 154-56-1 dual meet record. He has coached 17 individuals to a total of 24 EIWA titles, 14 Mountain Hawks to a total of 26 All-American medals, and two national champions, Zach Rey in 2011 and Darian Cruz in 2017. A former Lehigh assistant, Santoro returned to Bethlehem in 2008 after a five-year stint resurrecting the program at Maryland, where he guided the Terapins to an ACC title in 2008. A 1992 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Santoro won a pair of NCAA titles and is the Panthers' only four-time All-American.

LAST TIME LEHIGH MET ARIZONA STATE JANUARY 26, 2019 - BETHLEHEM, PA. LEHIGH 23, ARIZONA STATE 13

In front of a capacity crowd inside Leeman-Turner Arena at Grace Hall, No. 24 Lehigh scored bonus points in the final three bouts of the night to rally past No. 23 Arizona State 23-13. The Mountain Hawks trailed 13-9 after seven bouts but senior Ryan Preisch tied the dual with a major decision at 184 and sophomore Chris Weiler put Lehigh back in front with a third period pin at 197. Sophomore heavyweight Jordan Wood added a major decision victory to clinch Lehigh's sixth consecutive dual win. The dual was tied 9-9 after six bouts as the teams traded decisions. Josh Humphreys had a big, last second 6-1 win over Christian Pagdilao at 157.

SECOND COACHES PANEL RANKINGS ANNOUNCED

The NCAA released the second of four Coaches' Panel rankings and the first RPI for the 2019-20 season on February 13. The rankings will be one of the tools used as part of the selection process to determine the qualifiers for the NCAA Championships. There was minimal change for the nine Lehigh wrestlers ranked in the top 33. Senior Jordan Kutler continues to lead the way for Lehigh as he is ranked third at 174. He also owns the top spot in the RPI. Junior Brandon Paetzell (125), sophomore Josh Humphreys (157) and junior Jordan Wood (285) all remain in the top 10 in their respective weight classes. Wrestlers need a minimum of 15 Division I matches (forfeits do not count) to earn a RPI ranking.

BISON BEATEN

Lehigh kicked off a stretch of three duals over eight days to close out the dual season with a convincing 32-6 win at Bucknell on Feb. 14. The Mountain Hawks won eight bouts and picked up four bonus point wins. Senior Jordan Kutler recorded his second consecutive win by fall, while senior Chase Gallik bumped up to 184 to win by fall in his first dual appearance of the season. Lehigh has now won 21 consecutive duals against the Patriot League schools that sponsor wrestling (American, Army West Point, Bucknell and Navy).

RANK AND FILE

Five Mountain Hawks appear in the latest InterMat rankings, led by senior Jordan Kutler, who is ranked third at 174. Lehigh also has five wrestlers ranked by FloWrestling, seven by Amateur Wrestling News and eight by The Open Mat. In addition to Kutler, Brandon Paetzell (125), Josh Humphreys (157), Chris Weiler (184) and Jordan Wood (285) are ranked across the board by all four outlets. Sophomore Jimmy Hoffman (149) and junior Jake Jakobsen (197) are ranked by two outlets. Four of Lehigh's ranked wrestlers are rated in the top 10 in their respective weight classes.

A KUT ABOVE THE REST

With a 15-1 start to his senior season, Jordan Kutler has been Lehigh's top performer through the season's first three months. The two-time All-American and two-time EIWA champion is ranked third nationally across the board at 174. Nine of Kutler's 15 wins this season have produced bonus points, including back-to-back falls in wins over Army's Ben Harvey and Bucknell's Mitch Hartman. His lone loss this season is a 7-2 setback against second-ranked Mark Hall of Penn State. Kutler scored his first takedown against Hall in four college meetings.

SCUFFLING DOWN SOUTH

Eleven Lehigh wrestlers rang in 2020 at the Southern Scuffle, Jan. 1-2 in Chattanooga, Tenn. Freshman Jake Logan led the way for the Lehigh contingent, placing eighth at 174 while competing unattached. Sophomore Jaret Lane finished one win shy of a podium place at 133. In all eight of Lehigh's 11 entrants won at least one bout at the tournament.

TACKLING THE TOP FIVE

Lehigh's win over No. 4 Oklahoma State was its fourth over a top-5 team in 11-plus seasons under Pat Santoro. In the Santoro era, the Mountain Hawks also beat No. 1 Cornell in 2010-11, No. 3 Ohio State in 2014-15 and beat No. 4 Michigan in 2017-18.

SECOND HALF SURGE STOPS ARMY WEST POINT

It was a special night at West Orange High School on Jan. 31, as Army West Point celebrated its senior class including the late cadet-wrestler C.J. Morgan. The Black Knights battled Lehigh tough through six bouts, before the Mountain Hawks claimed the final four to post an important 24-9 victory. Tied 9-9 after six bouts, senior Jordan Kutler secured a key late second period fall against Ben Harvey to put Lehigh up by six. Junior Chris Weiler followed with his third win over a higher-ranked opponent in January. Victories from juniors Jake Jakobsen and Jordan Wood in the final two bouts capped Lehigh's eighth straight dual win.

SANTORO HITS TWO MILESTONES

Lehigh head coach Pat Santoro hit a pair of coaching milestones last month. The Mountain Hawks' Jan. 11 win at Cornell was No. 150 for Santoro as head coach of the Brown and White. Add in 48 victories in five seasons as head coach at Maryland and the wins over American and Navy Jan. 17-18 put Santoro at 200 wins for his head coaching career.

A SOLID START TO 2020

In its first dual action of 2020, the Mountain Hawks won a pair of EIWA duals in New York State. First, Lehigh won the final nine bouts in a 36-3 triumph at Binghamton, then the Mountain Hawks traveled to Ithaca and held off upset-minded Cornell 19-14 in a dual that came down to the final bout. Against Binghamton, Lehigh capitalized on junior Brandon Paetzell's second fall of the season, while the Mountain Hawks also recorded three major decisions. Another highlight of the Binghamton dual was an impressive 6-2 win by junior Chris Weiler over sixth-ranked Lou Deprez at 184. The Lehigh-Cornell dual came down to the final bout for the second straight year. This time it was junior heavyweight Jordan Wood clinching the Mountain Hawks' second straight victory against the Big Red with a 5-0 decision over Brendan Furman. Senior Jordan Kutler won by major decision at 174, while freshman Brian Meyer recorded a key sudden victory decision at 165 to spur the Mountain Hawks.

SOUTH BEACH SUCCESS

Lehigh enjoyed a successful trip to the South Beach Duals, going 3-0 with victories against No. 15 Minnesota, Duke and No. 19 Missouri, Dec. 29-30. Mountain Hawk Wrestlers went 23-7 in 30 bouts to snap a three-dual slide. Five Mountain Hawks went 3-0 at the South Beach Duals: Brandon Paetzell (125), Nick Farro (133), Josh Humphreys (157), Chris Weiler (184) and Jake Jakobsen (197). Fourteen of Lehigh's 23 victories produced bonus points, led by Jakobsen, who went 3-for-3 in bonus wins with a fall and two major decisions.

A STRONG FALL IN THE CLASSROOM

Lehigh wrestlers enjoyed another strong fall semester in the classroom, with 15 Mountain Hawks posting a grade point average of 3.0 or better last semester. Senior Chase Gallik led the way for the Mountain Hawks with a 4.0 GPA in structural engineering. Sophomore Luke Resnick was also over 3.9 in the fall, posting a 3.94 in finance. Gallik is enrolled in a graduate program. Resnick leads Lehigh undergraduates with a 3.76 cumulative GPA, followed by sophomore Andrew Shedleski (astrophysics) and freshman Jake Logan (business), who hold 3.75s. Eight of the 15 Mountain Hawks to post a 3.0 or better in the fall have competed in a dual meet this season, a list that includes Jimmy Hoffman, Jake Jakobsen, Jordan Kutler, Kent Lane, Brian Meyer, Dan Moran, Ryan Pomrinca and Jordan Wood.

LEHIGH BATTLES PENN STATE AT PACKED STABLER ARENA

In its last dual action before the exam break, Lehigh hosted Penn State at Stabler Arena on Dec. 6. The Mountain Hawks set a Stabler Arena attendance record for an athletic event with 6,047 seeing Lehigh battle but ultimately come up on the short end of a 23-10 score against the four-time defending national champions. Junior Brandon Paetzell opened the dual with a major decision victory at 125, while sophomore Jimmy Hoffman and junior Jake Jakobsen posted wins by decision at 149 and 197, respectively. The previous Stabler Arena athletic attendance record was 5,909 from Penn State's last visit to the facility in February 2016. The Lehigh home dual attendance record is 9,896 from Penn State's visit to PPL Center in Allentown in December 2017.

CRITERIA GIVETH AND TAKETH AWAY

Eight days after opening the dual season with a 21-20 criteria victory against No. 4 Oklahoma State, the Mountain Hawks came up on the wrong end of the third criteria against No. 12 Pitt in their first Grace Hall dual of the season. Lehigh and Pitt both won five bouts and both sides had one fall in the dual, with Brandon Paetzell delivering for the Mountain Hawks. A 39-34 edge in total match points helped the Panthers snap a four-dual losing streak to the Mountain Hawks. With two of its first four duals decided by criteria, Lehigh is now 2-4 since criteria replaced ties for dual meets. The Mountain Hawks last tie was a 16-16 deadlock at Cornell in 2010.

COWBOYS DOWN ON CRITERIA

Lehigh opened its dual meet schedule with a 21-20 victory over then-No. 4 Oklahoma State Nov. 16 at Stabler Arena. An Oklahoma State forfeit to Lehigh at 133 left the match tied at 20-20, but the Mountain Hawks' 58-48 edge in total match points gave Lehigh the victory on the third criteria. Senior Ryan Pomrinca opened the dual with a 3-2 victory and sophomore Josh Humphreys and senior Jordan Kutler won major decisions to give Lehigh an 11-6 lead halfway through. Junior Jordan Wood added a win at 285 as Lehigh beat Oklahoma State for just the second time in 12 all-time meetings and the first time since 2008.

SCOUTING THE QUAKERS

Penn brings a 6-8 dual record into its Thursday evening regular season finale against Lehigh. The Quakers capped a busy weekend with a 27-18 win over Franklin and Marshall Sunday evening, which snapped a four match losing streak. Penn is 5-5 against EIWA opponents, with wins over Binghamton, LIU, Brown, Harvard, and Franklin and Marshall. Three Quakers appear in the latest NCAA Coaches' Panel Rankings, Michael Colaiocco (No. 8 at 125), Doug Zapf (No. 17 at 141) and Anthony Artalona (No. 12 at 157). Artalona is the defending EIWA Champion at 149 and has moved up a weight class. Roger Reina is in the third season of his second stint as Penn's head coach. He is in his 22nd season overall as Penn's head coach and led the Quakers to four straight EIWA titles from 1996-99.

SCOUTING THE SUN DEVILS

Fifth-ranked Arizona State is in the midst of a terrific dual season. The Sun Devils are 14-1 in duals, with the only setback a one-point loss to Ohio State on January 6. Arizona State has won nine consecutive duals, including road wins at Cal Poly and CSU Bakersfield last weekend. Eight Sun Devils appear in the latest NCAA Coaches' Panel rankings, led by senior Zahid Valencia who is ranked first at 184. Valencia was not listed among Arizona State's probable starters. He is one of five top 10-ranked Sun Devils. Heavyweight Tanner Hall is sixth, while Pennsylvania native Josh Shields is seventh at 165. Arizona State finished third at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational and competed at the Journeymen Collegiate Classic, where Sun Devil wrestlers went 2-3 against Lehigh wrestlers. Former U.S. National Team head coach Zeke Jones is in his sixth season as head coach at his alma mater.

DRIVE FOR FIVE

Lehigh's roster features fifth fifth-year seniors, including three who have already earned their undergraduate degrees. Ryan Pomrinca (BS in Supply Chain Management) and Jordan Kutler (Behavioral Neuroscience) are pursuing Master's degrees in Technical Entrepreneurship. Chase Gallik earned his degree in Civil Engineering and is now studying Structural Engineering. Kent Lane and Charlie Sell are the other two fifth-year Mountain Hawks. Both are Supply Chain Management majors.

A FRESH START

Lehigh has added eight true freshmen to its 2019-20 roster, joining five second-year freshmen who deferred eligibility last year. Last year, Jaret Lane and Josh Humphreys saw dual action as true freshmen. Humphreys went 21-8 and won an EIWA title at 157, becoming just Lehigh's second true freshman EIWA Champion since 1980 (Randy Cruz in 2013). Humphreys also reached the All-America round of 12 at the NCAA Championships, finishing one win shy of earning a podium finish. All five of Lehigh's deferred freshmen wrestled their first official bouts in the brown and white at the Princeton Open. Brian Meyer placed fourth at 165. Mitchell Polito took sixth at 125. AJ Burkhart (157), Andrew Shedleski (184) and Eli Jones (197) all debuted as well. Meyer won Lehigh's Deferred Eligibility Wrestler of the Year award following last season. He went 9-6 competing unattached in open competition, highlighted by a runner-up finish at the Wilkes Open and a fourth place finish at the Shorty Hitchcock Memorial Classic. Meyer was the lone Lehigh wrestler to make his dual meet debut against Oklahoma State and has been the lone Mountain Hawk freshman to compete in a dual so far this season. He picked up his first career dual meet win with an 8-7 decision over Duke's Ben Anderson at the South Beach Duals and had a key overtime win over Jake Brindley of Cornell in the Mountain Hawks' 19-14 triumph in Ithaca, N.Y.

LOTS OF LOCALS

Several Lehigh wrestlers didn't have to venture far from home to wrestle collegiately for the Brown and White. Junior Luke Karam and freshman Luca Frinzi both wrestled for nearby Bethlehem Catholic High School, the same program that produced Lehigh head coach Pat Santoro. Senior Charlie Sell (Bangor) sophomore Dan Moran (Northampton) and freshman Nathan Haubert (Palisades) are also from the wrestling-rich Lehigh Valley. Junior Jake Jakobsen hails from Stroudsburg, which is part of District XI. Junior Brandon Paetzell and freshman Brian Meyer hail from Phillipsburg, N.J., just across the state line.

JORDAN YEAR

Prior to the start of the season, head coach Pat Santoro announced fifth-year senior Jordan Kutler (Sparta, N.J.) and fourth-year junior Jordan Wood (Gilbertsville, Pa.) as captains for the 2019-20 season. Both Jordan's are two-time EIWA Champions. Kutler is a two-time All-American with sixth and seventh place finishes to his credit, while Wood earned his first All-America honor with a fourth place finish March.

A LOOK AT WHO'S BACK

Lehigh's 38 man roster features plenty of experience to go along with young talent. The Mountain Hawks return a pair of All-Americans in captains Jordan Kutler and Jordan Wood; three EIWA Champions, with sophomore Josh Humphreys joining Kutler and Wood; seven wrestlers who have previously qualified for the NCAA Championships; and seven of 10 starters from last year's EIWA Tournament. Juniors Luke Karam (149) and Chris Weiler (184) are NCAA qualifiers from 2018, who return after missing out on the postseason last year.

FROM COAST TO COAST

Lehigh prides itself in bringing in student-athletes from across the nation. This season, 10 different states are represented among the 38 men on the Mountain Hawks' roster. Pennsylvania leads the way with 21 wrestlers, followed by New Jersey (7) and New York (2) and West Virginia (2). California, Georgia, Florida, New Hampshire, North Carolina and Tennessee are also represented.

COMING UP NEXT...

Lehigh will host the 116th EIWA Championships, March 6-7 at Stabler Arena. The Mountain Hawks have won the last two EIWA titles after ending Cornell's 11-year title streak at Hofstra in 2018. Senior Jordan Kutler and junior Jordan Wood will be pursuing their third consecutive individual EIWA titles, while sophomore Josh Humphreys will bid for his second straight. Also at stake will be automatic berths to the NCAA Championships at U.S. Bank Stadium in Minneapolis.

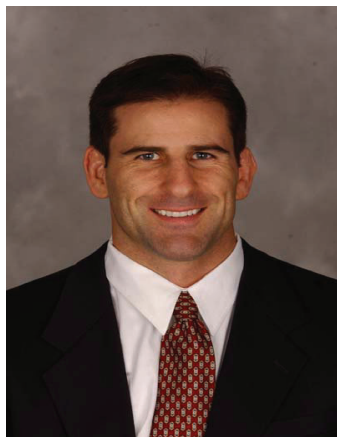

LAWRENCE WHITE HEAD COACH - PAT SANTORO



Bethlehem native Pat Santoro enters his 12th season as the Lawrence White Head Coach of Wrestling at Lehigh.

A four-time EIWA Coach of the Year, Santoro has mentored two NCAA Champions at Lehigh. He has led 17 individuals to a total of 24 EIWA titles, while guiding 14 men to 26 total All-American medals.

For the 2018-19 Mountain Hawks, it was a matter not of how they started, but how they finished. The Mountain Hawks rebounded from an 0-7 dual start to finish 9-9 and went on win the program's second straight EIWA team title and 36th overall.

Junior Jordan Kutler and sophomore Jordan Wood won their second consecutive EIWA titles, while freshman Josh Humphreys also won an individual championship. The Mountain Hawks qualified eight wrestlers for the NCAA Championships and continued their strong finish to the season, crowning three All-Americans. Kutler earned his second straight podium finish while Wood and senior Ryan Preisch earned All-America honors for the first time.

Santoro led Lehigh to its 35th EIWA team title and first since 2006 with an impressive 164.5 point performance in 2018. The Mountain Hawks crowned five individual EIWA champions and had all 10 wrestlers earn berths for the NCAA Championships. After leading Lehigh to its first league title in 12 seasons, Santoro was named EIWA Coach of the Year for the fourth time.

Prior to the NCAA Tournament, Santoro was named NWCA National Coach of the Year, for Lehigh's performance during the dual season and EIWA Tournament. At NCAAAs, Santoro's Lehigh team produced three All-Americans, with Darian Cruz becoming a three-time All-American, Scott Parker earning his second medal and Jordan Kutler reaching the podium for the first time.

Darian Cruz's national title capped a successful campaign for the Mountain Hawks in 2016-17. Darian Cruz and Scott Parker won individual EIWA titles at the first two weights and both wrestlers went on to earn All-America

honors, with Parker finishing eighth at 133 in addition to Cruz's national title.

Santoro earned his third EIWA Coach of the Year award in 2015-16. He led the Mountain Hawks to a 13-3 dual record that included Lehigh's first win over rival Cornell since 2011. The Mountain Hawks finished second at the EIWA Championships with Darian Cruz and Max Wessell winning their first career titles.

Lehigh crowned three All-Americans at the NCAA Championships for the third straight year with Wessell and Randy Cruz earning their first career All-America medals, while Nathaniel Brown became a two-time All-American.

In 2014-15, Santoro earned his 100th victory as Lehigh's head coach when the Mountain Hawks upset eventual NCAA Champion Ohio State at National Duals.

Randy Cruz won his second EIWA title to help lead Lehigh to a second place conference finish. Nathaniel Brown reached the NCAA finals at 184 while Mason Beckman and Mitch Minotti earned All-America honors for the second straight year.

Santoro led the 2013-14 Lehigh squad through the ups and downs that come with a young roster. The young Mountain Hawks soared at the NCAA Championships with freshmen Darian Cruz and Minotti joining Beckman in earning All-America honors.

In 2012-13, Santoro helped guide a young Mountain Hawk team to ten dual meet wins. Three individuals won individual EIWA titles. Under Santoro's guidance Robert Hamlin became a three-time All-American and a two-time NCAA finalist.

Lehigh continued to make strides in 2011-12. The Mountain Hawks finished eighth at the NCAA Championships for the second straight year and once again had two finalists in Zach Rey and Brandon Hatchett. Lehigh crowned four All-Americans. Robert Hamlin won his second straight EIWA title, while Hatchett won his first. Shane Welsh was the surprise of the tournament, capturing the title at 149 from the No. 6 seed. Santoro was voted EIWA Coach of the Year for the second time.

In Santoro's third season Lehigh returned to the top ten at the NCAA Championships with an eighth place finish. The Mountain Hawks crowned three All-Americans for the first time in five years and placed two wrestlers in the NCAA finals for the first time since 2003. Heavyweight Zach Rey became Santoro's first national champion.

In 2009-10, Santoro guided the Mountain Hawks to a 16-3-1 dual record and a top-ten national dual meet ranking for most of the season. In March, Santoro guided Rey to an EIWA title and All-America honors with a third place finish at the NCAA Championships, the program's first All-American in four years.

Santoro produced an immediate turnaround in his first season back in Bethlehem. The Mountain Hawks' 23-1 dual mark surpassed the school record for dual wins in a

season. Santoro guided Seth Ciasulli and David Craig to individual EIWA Championships.

Before returning to Lehigh, Santoro spent five years as the head coach at the University of Maryland where he helped resurrect the Terrapins program, which in 2008 captured its first ACC title in 35 years; a feat which earned Santoro ACC Coach of the Year honors.

Prior to his stint at Maryland Santoro served as an assistant at Lehigh for nine years, including eight Greg Strobels' staff. During that time, Santoro was part of some of the most successful teams in school history. In 2003, Santoro was named the national Assistant Coach of the Year by the National Wrestling Coaches Association, after helping guide Lehigh to its third EIWA title in four years, and a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships.

Before coming to Lehigh, Santoro spent one season as an assistant at Duquesne and two as a graduate assistant at Penn State.

After wrestling for Bethlehem Catholic High School and taking a post-graduate year at Blair Academy, Santoro wrestled collegiately at Pittsburgh, where he became the Panthers' only four-time All-America while capturing national titles in 1988 and 1989 at 142 pounds.

On the international scene, Santoro was a four time member of the U.S. National Team and served as an alternate for the 1996 Olympic Team and the 1999 World Team. Santoro earned his bachelor's degree in psychology from Pittsburgh in 1992. In addition to his Bethlehem roots and previous coaching stint at Lehigh, Santoro's father, uncle and brother all wrestled for the Brown and White.

Santoro and his wife Julie have a daughter, Leah and a son, Mack.
