THE GAME - The No. 15/16 Arizona State University Sun Devil football program will host its 2015 home opener on Saturday, Sept. 12 against the Cal Poly Mustangs. The game is scheduled for an 8 p.m. PT kickoff and will be broadcast live from Sun Devil Stadium on the Pac-12 Networks. It will be the first game featuring a renovated south end zone area, representing the first phase of the three-year reinvention project taking place at Sun Devil Stadium.

THE MUSTANGS - Cal Poly is coming off a huge upset over currently eighth-ranked Montana of the FCS, a last second field goal boosting the Mustangs to a No. 20 ranking in this week's FCS Coaches Poll. ASU leads the all-time series, 3-0, but the two teams have not played since 1947. A team that loves to run the football, Cal Poly had two 1,000-yard rushers a year ago and returns one of them this season in quarterback Chris Brown. The Mustangs rushed for 330 yards against Montana, paced by Brown's 130 yards. Running a triple option attack, The Mustangs will be the first of back-to-back contests against teams that run that offense with ASU taking on New Mexico the following week.

THE BIG SKY - ASU is 36-14-4 all-time against the Big Sky with all 14 losses coming to Northern Arizona prior to 1938. The Devils are 18-0 against the conference since 1947.

AN ASU VICTORY WOULD...

- » Improve ASU's home opener win streak to 17 consecutive games, a run that is good for the sixth-longest streak in the country.
- » Improve ASU to 19-0 over the Big Sky Conference since 1947.
- » Improve ASU to 4-0 over Cal Poly in the series history.
- » Keep alive ASU's run of not having back-to-back regular season losses since losing four straight in October/November in 2012.
- » Improve ASU to 274-93-3 (.732) all-time in games played at Sun Devil Stadium, the 14th-best record among all programs that have been at their home stadiums for at least 50 years.
- » Improve ASU to 17-4 at Sun Devil Stadium under Todd Graham.

General

The Sun Devil Athletics media relations staff understands the importance of assisting the media in providing coverage of the institution, its athletics programs, administrators, coaches and student-athletes. We pride ourselves in being able to disseminate information as widely, uniformly and fairly as possible using normally accepted media standards. To this end, the best attempt will be made to fill reasonable requests by recognized media outlets. Members of the media are encouraged to work with the Sun Devil Football media relations staff to assist in that endeavor. It is not permissible for media members to contact any athletics department administrator, associate, coach or student-athlete directly without working through the media relations department.

Practice Policies

Due to the nature of Arizona State game dates this season, practices schedules each week will vary dependent upon that week's game. The ASU media relations office will provide a practice schedule prior to each game week for the media. Media members will be able to view three periods, beginning with team stretch. Media wishing to shoot practice will be able to do so for the first two of the three allowed periods, beginning with team stretch and followed by the individual drills. Following that open viewing period, the members of the media will be escorted out of the facility and reconvene near the end of the practice period for post-practice interviews.

Interview Policies

Interviews are conducted at the end of each practice. Due to high demand, several players and members of the coaching staff might only be available on a limited basis each week. A full availability schedule will be provided to the media each week.

Following home contests, Arizona State will bring several student-athletes to the Dutton Theater for a post-game press conference. Head Coach Todd Graham will follow the student-athletes. Any members who wish to contact a student-athlete or coach outside of the aforementioned interview periods should contact Thomas Lenneberg (480-965-6594) or Thomas.lenneberg@asu.edu to arrange a time outside of practice or post-game for interviews.

Weekly Press Conferences

Head coach Todd Graham will resume his weekly press conferences each Monday prior to

game week. The press conference is tentatively scheduled for 12 p.m. (Noon) Arizona Time each week. When the team practices on Mondays, Coach Graham will not be available following practice.

Following home contests, Arizona State will bring several student-athletes to the Dutton Theater for a post-game press conference. Head Coach Todd Graham will follow the student-athletes.

All press conference will be streamed live via the Pac-12 website at <http://pac-12.com/live/arizona-state-university>. Additionally, ASAP Transcription Services will provide a transcript following each press conference throughout the year that will be made available via TheSunDevils.com and will also be sent to members of the media following each press conference.

Credentials

Media credentials for Sun Devil home games for the 2015 football season will be handled online through Sports Systems. For access to the online portal request system, please contact Doug Tammaro (tammaro@asu.edu). For road games, please contact Mark Brand (mark.brand@asu.edu) for more information.

Photography/Videography

Media wishing to shoot practice will be able to do so for the first two of the three allowed periods, beginning with team stretch and followed by the individual drills. On-camera interviews will be conducted at the end of each practice.

For home games, a photographer work area has been established inside the Carson Student-Athlete Center (first floor). Internet access to transmit files is available in the photography workroom. Credentials must be worn in plain view throughout the game while on the field and all photographers must adhere to painted lines and instructions given by security personnel and/or Arizona State staff members at all times.

Weekly Media Teleconference

The Pac-12 Football Coaches Weekly Media Teleconference Call will take place each Tuesday during the season. Coach Graham is scheduled to speak at 12:05 PT/1:05 MT each Tuesday. The teleconferences will be recorded and available at Pac-12.com that same afternoon of the call. Members of the media may reach out to the Pac-12 (925-932-4411) for the media-only phone number for the teleconference.

Media Highlights Policy

Highlights include Pac-12 Networks/ESPN/FOX broadcasts and all home hosted non-televised competitions, including those that are live streamed.

Live Broadcasts

It is not permissible for any non-rightsholder to broadcast over the air, stream over the internet (audio or video), or transmit in any other way, any live event without the consent of the Sun Devil Athletics Department. Live events include varsity contests, press conferences (including but not limited to weekly scheduled and postgame press conferences) and any other group media availability. Exceptions may be made for any major news-breaking event and will be communicated in the media advisory for the event.

Third-Party Website Highlight Policy

No third party organization may post competition footage of any Pac-12 game or any non-conference home game on its website without a license to the content from the Pac-12 Networks or its licensing partner (XOS Digital), with the exception of news window privileges described below. Third parties are permitted to post video on their websites through the use of the Pac-12 Digital embeddable video player (embed code available at <http://video.pac-12.com>).

News Outlet Highlight Policy

Certified news outlets may use a maximum of 3 minutes of Pac-12 event footage on their newscasts during the 48-hour news window following the conclusion of included events. If these highlights do not contain a Pac-12 mark, the news outlet must insert "Courtesy of the Pac-12 Conference" over the footage. Highlights may also be posted to certified news providers' websites, but must be removed 48 hours after the conclusion of any included event, unless a license for that footage is obtained from the Pac-12 Conference. Highlights may not be posted to YouTube, Facebook, or other social media properties. Beyond the 48 hour news window, certified news outlets are permitted to use a maximum of 1 minute of footage - on their television newscasts only - for 14 calendar days after the conclusion of the game in question. This policy pertains to the 2013-14 academic year only and is subject to change in subsequent years.



ON THE AIR

Hear the hometown call with broadcaster Tim Healey and color analyst Jeff Van Raaphorst as well as sideline reporter Doug Franz providing all the action for Sun Devil Football this season. The hometown broadcasts are boosted by Bonneville's powerful sports/talk lineup of Arizona Sports 98.7 FM, 620 AM KTAR and 92.3 KTAR News FM. This week's game will broadcast on ESPN Phoenix 620 AM. The home town call can also be heard on Sirius Channel 137/XM Channel 197.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION

Saturday's contest will mark the first game of the season that will be broadcast on the Pac-12 Networks for the Devils. J.B. Long will be on the call alongside analyst Evan Moore while Drea Avant will provide insight from the sidelines. The Pac-12 will again provide access to Armed Forces Network for carriage of Pac-12 football games in 2014 for the benefit of the men and women in the military.

A LOOK BACK - Texas A&M

The No. 15/16 Arizona State University football team was held to 291 total yards of offense as the team dropped the season opener, 38-17, to Texas A&M on Saturday in the AdvoCare Texas Kickoff in Houston, Texas.

The Aggies sacked Mike Bercovici nine times in the contest, keeping the senior quarterback from getting into a rhythm as he finished 24-for-38 on the day for just 186 yards and a touchdown.

Demario Richard rushed 16 times for 73 yards while Bercovici added the first rushing touchdown of his career. D.J. Foster also extended his active FBS-leading streak of consecutive games with a pass reception, which now stands at 41 - every game he has played as a Sun Devil.

A&M's Kyle Allen finished 15-for-26 for 198 yards and two touchdowns with an interception, but it was his final pass of the game - a 66-yard catch-and-run by Christian Kirk that would put the game away.

ASU's Zane Gonzalez kicked a 23-yard field goal with 4:16 remaining in the game to bring ASU back with 24-17 following a 13-play, 70-yard drive in 4:16 but A&M came right back to put the game away on a 66-yard touchdown pass from Allen to Kirk to make it 31-17 two plays later. The Aggies iced it with another touchdown in the waning moments of regulation.

The Sun Devils are 16-4 under Todd Graham when playing at Sun Devil Stadium and are 273-93-3 (.732) all-time between the Buttes, good for the 23rd-best record among all home stadiums in the FBS.

With tight end Kody Kohl's touchdown reception against A&M, he has a touchdown reception in **four of his last five games dating back to last season**. Kohl had a touchdown grab in three straight games against Oregon State, Washington State and Arizona in the streak as well. Of his 18 career receptions, five of them have now gone for a touchdown (27.8 percent).

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

- » Wide receiver D.J. Foster extended his streak of at least one reception to 41 games, the longest active streak in FBS, with a 7-yard catch on the Devils' third play of the game. He matches Derek Hagan for second on ASU's all-time list of consecutive games with a reception and trails only John Jefferson's school record of 44.
- » With six receptions, Foster now has 169 in his career, and stands alone in third all-time on ASU's career list. He trails John Jefferson (188) for second and the school record is 258 by Derek Hagan.
- » ASU has won 16 consecutive home openers entering the week, a mark that is tied for the sixth-longest active streak in the nation.
- » Eight Sun Devils made their first career appearances for ASU against Texas A&M: freshmen defensive lineman JoJo Wicker and cornerback Kareem Orr, redshirt senior wide receiver Devin Lucien, junior running back De'Chavon Hayes, redshirt freshman defensive back Dasmond Tautalatasi, junior wide receiver Tim White, junior tight end Raymond Epps, and redshirt freshman safety Coltin Gerhart.
- » With tight end Kody Kohl's touchdown reception against A&M, he has a touchdown reception in four of his last five games.

STRIKE FIRST

- » Arizona State has scored first in 29 of the 41 games with Todd Graham at the helm and is 23-6 in the Graham era when getting on the scoreboard first.
- » ASU accomplished the feat in all but four games in 2014 and was 7-1 when scoring first on the year.

STRIKE FAST

- » 170 of ASU's 232 offensive scoring drives under offensive coordinator Mike Norvell have come in three minutes or less (73.3 percent).
- » Of ASU's three scoring drives in the opener, two of those came under three minutes.

GETTING STARTED ON THE RIGHT FOOT

- » The Sun Devils have outscored their opposition 391-207 in the first quarter under Todd Graham.
- » The Sun Devils are 18-1 under Graham when holding their opposition scoreless in the first quarter.
- » The Sun Devils finished 36th nationally against FBS teams in giving up just 5.1 points per first quarter in 2014 while being 31st with 8.0 points scored per first quarter.
- » ASU has posted an impressive 24-1 overall record in three seasons under Graham when leading at halftime.

FOSTER THE PEOPLE

- » Foster now has the seventh-most receptions of all active FBS players with 169 and his 11 career receiving TDs were most among all active FBS running backs prior to his position switch.
- » Foster surpassed 4,000 career all-purpose yards on a nine-yard reception in the second quarter against A&M, and now has 4,026 career all-purpose yards (2,088 rushing, 1,922 receiving, 16 return)
- » He is currently ranked second among active FBS players in career all-purpose yards (4,026), despite having just 16 career return yards - a category that is the bread and butter among many leaders in the all-purpose category.
- » With 62 receptions in 2014, Foster became just the third player in program history to log 60 or more receptions in consecutive seasons with Jaelen Strong and Derek Hagan being the others.

GO D.J., THAT'S MY D.J.

- » Foster is the only active FBS player who has accounted for over 2,000 career rushing yards (2,088) AND over 1,500 career receiving yards (1,922).
- » With 78 more receiving yards, Foster will become just the fourth player in NCAA history to reach 2,000+ rushing AND receiving yards, joining Stanford Darrin Nelson, Tulane's Mewelde Moore and Texas Tech's Taurean Henderson. Should he reach 2,500 yards in both categories, he would be the first Division I player to accomplish the feat.
- » Foster has the nation's longest active streak of games with a reception at 41 and needs just four more games to break John Jefferson's long-standing school record of 44 set between 1974-77.

DON'T CROSS THAT LINE

- » ASU forced 30 plays that resulted in zero positive yardage against Texas A&M (19 incomplete passes, 8 tackles for loss, 3 plays of no gain) of 80 total plays (37.5 percent).
- » Under Graham, ASU has forced 1,048 plays that have not resulted in positive yardage out of 2,941 total plays (35.6 percent).

SERIOUSLY, DON'T CROSS IT

- » With eight tackles for loss against Texas A&M, ASU posted the 27th highest total among FBS teams during the opening weekend of action.
- » ASU's three sacks in the contest were good for the third highest total in the country as well.
- » Entering the season, ASU was second in the Pac-12 and second in the nation (Stanford) with an average of 7.93 TFL per game under Graham and one of four teams in the nation with more than 300 total tackles for loss (Clemson, Stanford, Virginia Tech). They rank third in that time



with 3.25 sacks per game (Stanford/Utah).

LIGHT 'EM UP

- » ASU has scored 50 or more points 12 times since Todd Graham and Mike Norvell arrived in Tempe.
- » To put that in perspective, ASU eclipsed 50 points 10 times total in the previous 10 years before the current coaching regime (2001-11).
- » ASU went 86 games without scoring 60 from 2005-2011. Under Coach Graham it has scored 60 or more three times (63 NAU, 62 Navy, 62 USC).
- » The Sun Devils finished 10th nationally in 2013 at 39.7 points per game and scored 556 total points, just six points behind the 1972 school record.
- » ASU finished 2014 ranked 16th nationally in scoring offense, averaging 36.9 points per game.
- » ASU's 41.9 points per game in non-conference games since 2012 is the 11th-highest average in the FBS in that time.

TAKING OFFENSE

- » Entering the season, ASU ranks second in the Pac-12 and tied for seventh in the nation at 38.38 points per game (Baylor, Oregon, Marshall, Ohio State, Florida State, Texas A&M, tied with Georgia) in the Graham era.
- » ASU ranks second in the Pac-12 and 10th in the nation with 1,535 total points (Oregon, Baylor, Ohio State, Florida State, Marshall, Texas A&M, Alabama, Georgia, Northern Illinois) in that time.

MAKE 'EM PAY

- » Under Todd Graham, ASU has outscored opponents 424-161 in points off takeaways and holds a 7-3 advantage this season.
- » The Sun Devils outscored the opposition 142-62 in points off turnovers in 2014, ranked fourth nationally behind only Louisiana Tech's 172, Nevada's 170 and Oregon's 164.

- » ASU scored 22 times following 27 total takeaways (81.5 percent) and scored touchdowns on 19 of those occasions (70.4).
- » In 2013, ASU outscored its opponents 146-42 on points off turnovers while posting a +15 takeaway number, putting points on the board following 75.8 percent of opponent turnovers (25-of-33) compared to just the 33.3 (6-of-18) percent clip ASU opponents scored off of Sun Devil turnovers.

A HAND IN THE COOKIE JAR

- » ASU finished with 27 takeaways in 2014 (2.1 per game) after having a streak of 29 consecutive games forcing a turnover come to an end in the season opener. The total was good for 24th nationally and third among Pac-12 schools.
- » ASU led the Pac-12 with 33 takeaways in 2013, finishing fifth nationally. The team was seventh nationally with a 1.1 turnover margin that season.
- » The Sun Devils have forced 93 turnovers under Todd Graham in the past four seasons, which is tied for the third-highest total in the country in that span (Oregon, Boise State)
- » ASU has 11 interception returns for touchdowns under Graham, compared to posting just four total in the previous three seasons prior to 2012. The total currently leads the nation in for the most interception returns for touchdown in that span and ASU has added three fumble returns in the span as well for a NCAA-leading total of 14 defensive touchdowns in the last four seasons.

TURNOVER FACTORY

- » Entering the season, ASU ranked second in the Pac-12 and second in the nation with a .88 average turnover margin per game (Oregon) since Graham took over the helm and was second in the Pac-12 and second in the nation with a plus-35 total turnover margin (Oregon).
- » Also entering year, ASU was first in the Pac-12

and tied for second in the nation with an average of 1.4 interceptions per game (TCU, tied with Boise State) since 2012 and is first in the Pac-12 and tied for second in the nation with 56 total interceptions (TCU, tied with Boise State).

GOLD ZONE

- » The Sun Devils scored on all three trips to the red zone against Texas A&M.
- » In 2014, ASU scored on 58 of its 64 trips inside the red zone (90.6 percent), ranked 12th in the nation in conversion percentage. In 2013, ASU points on the board 91.3 percent of the time in the red zone against FBS opponents in 2013, finishing sixth nationally in the category.
- » In 2012, ASU scored on just 76.1 percent of their drives inside the 20 and ranked a lowly 93rd in the nation against FBS opponents.
- » In 2013 ASU allowed its FBS opponents to score 88.9 percent of the time when entering the red zone (ranked 106th nationally). In 2014, however, ASU held its opponents to 35 scores in 46 red zone appearances (76.1 percent) - good for 23rd nationally.
- » The team held Texas A&M to 4-of-5 on red zone conversion attempts in the opener.

WINNING THE BATTLE FOR FIELD POSITION

- » Under Todd Graham, ASU has had an average starting yard line of its own 35.5 in 28 victories compared to a starting yard line of the 25.6 for their opponents in such contests.
- » ASU allowed just 11 drives to start inside its own territory in 2014, tied with Arizona for the fewest as far Pac-12 teams went.
- » Conversely, opponents have an average starting field position of their own 32.2 yard line compared to ASU starting at its own 28.8 in ASU's 13 losses under Graham.
- » In 2012, ASU posted an average starting spot of its own 33-yard line that ranked 10th in the nation, according to the folks at Football Outsiders (www.footballoutsiders.com) and in 2013, the team ranked 13th nationally (average starting yard line: 33.3). With a 32.6 average starting spot in 2014, ASU was 13th nationally.
- » The Sun Devils also held their opponents to an average starting line of their own 28-yard-line, a total that ranked 24th nationally in 2012 and was 32nd in 2013 (average opp. starting yardline: 28.2). ASU jumped to 11th nationally in 2014, forcing their opponents to an average field position of their own 26.9 yard line.

SEAL THE DEAL

- » ASU has outscored other teams 391-280 in the fourth quarter and overtime under Todd Graham.

- » The Sun Devils finished sixth nationally against FBS teams with 10.6 points per fourth quarter in 2014.
- » ASU finished 10th in the nation in points per fourth quarter in 2013 against FBS opposition (9.9) after finishing the 2012 season with 9.3 points per fourth quarter, which was good for eighth nationally. ASU's 16.8 second-half points per game against FBS squads in 2013 was 24th nationally.

ROAD WARRIORS

- » The Sun Devils are winners of seven of the last nine true road contests.
- » ASU has 11 wins in the past 18 road games, including nine Pac-12 Conference road wins in the past 14.
- » Todd Graham has nine Pac-12 road victories under his belt already, tied for the second-most among all ASU coaches since 1980 behind only Bruce Snyder's 18 from 1992-2000.
- » Graham is 9-5 in Pac-12 road games at ASU, notable as the Devils were 5-13 in four seasons prior.
- » In four seasons prior to Todd Graham, ASU was 5-13 in conference road games while Graham has led the squad to a 7-3 record in such games in his three seasons at the helm.

T.N.T, WE'RE DYNAMITE

- » The Sun Devils have a classification of "explosive plays" that equal a run of 12 or more yards or a passing play of 16 or more yards. ASU had 138 explosive plays (77 passing, 61 rushing) in 2014.
- » ASU finished 24th nationally with 20 plays over 40 yards in 2014 after having just 16 total in 2013 and eight the year before. ASU was 26th nationally in plays of 20 or more yards with 71.
- » ASU finished with 142 such plays in 2013 (82 passing, 60 rushing) and 165 (90 passing, 75 rushing) in 2012.
- » The Sun Devils finished 2013 tied for seventh in the nation in plays longer than 20 yards with 86 after having 72 in 2012, which was good for 19th in the country in the category.

BETTER SUITED FOR HANDKERCHIEFS

- » The Sun Devils averaged just 4.5 penalties for 32.4 yards per game, ranked 16th in fewest penalties per game and fourth in fewest penalty yards per game in D-I in 2014.
- » In 2013, the Sun Devils finished eighth in fewest penalties per game (4.00) and seventh in fewest penalty yards per game (31.4).
- » Entering the season, ASU ranks first in the Pac-12 and third in the nation with an average of 32.85 penalty yards per game (Navy, Air Force) under Graham and ranks first in the Pac-12 and ninth in the nation with an average of 4.23 penalties per game (Navy, Air Force, Army, Boston



College, Iowa, Michigan, Ball St., Wisconsin).

- » Twenty-two of ASU's 25 least penalized games since 2006 have come under Todd Graham.
- » Since Todd Graham arrived at Arizona State, the Sun Devils have had just 175 penalties in 41 games (4.27 penalties per game).

PROTECT THIS HOUSE

- » ASU is now 16-4 at Sun Devil Stadium under Todd Graham.
- » In 19 regular season home games under Todd Graham, the Sun Devils have averaged 43.3 points per game.
- » The lowest score the Devils had recorded in a regular season home game under Graham was 21 against Oregon in 2012 and ASU had scored 20 or more in 24 consecutive regular season home games, dating back to 2010,

prior to last season's.

- » The Sun Devils are 273-99-3 (.732) all-time at Sun Devil Stadium since 1958, the 23rd-highest active winning percentage in a stadium among all FBS schools.

WIRE-TO-WIRE

- » The 2014 season marked the first time since 1996, and just 11th overall, ASU was ranked in the preseason AP poll and finished in the final top 25 as well.
- » ASU's No. 12 ranking last season was the program's highest final AP Poll ranking since 1996 and was the ninth time in school history the Devils had finished the season with a top-12 ranking, and just the fourth time since posting its best-ever finish in 1975.
- » ASU, which was ranked No. 19 in the preseason poll, improved its position by seven spots to No. 12 in the final poll. It was only the seventh time in school history the Devils improved their ranking from the preseason to the final poll, and the seven-spot jump is the fourth-best improvement in school history.

ON THE RISE

- » ASU is 19-8 in Pac-12 games since 2012, one game ahead of UCLA's 18-9 mark in that same time span for the best Pac-12 South tally.
- » ASU is 14-4 in Pac-12 games in the past two seasons, two games up on UCLA and USC (12-6) for tops in the Pac-12.
- » ASU has finished first or second in each of the last three seasons in the final Pac-12 South standings.

USE THEM WISELY

- » Since the start of the 2012 season, ASU has used 51 timeouts on defense in third down situations, and have forced a turnover or not allowed a first down on the ensuing play on 35 of those occasions (68.6 percent).

RUNNING THE CLOCK -- OR NOT?

- » In 2012, ASU ranked seventh in the Pac-12 and 80th nationally in time of possession, holding the ball an average of 29:15 per game.
- » In 2013, ASU averaged 30:21 minutes of possession time per game - a total that ranked fourth in the conference and 51st nationally. The team had 13 scoring drives over four minutes in 2013, compared to just three in 2012.
- » In 2014, ASU averaged 28:42 minutes of possession per game - ranked 99th nationally and picked up five victories when trailing in time of possession, improving its Todd Graham era record in that category from 9-8 to 14-8. ASU is, however, 14-5 when leading time of possession under Coach Graham.

IN-ZANE IN THE MEMBRANE

- » Zane Gonzalez is currently fourth among active FBS players in averaging 9.7 points per game in his career. Florida State's Roberto Aguayo leads all players at 10.5 points per game.
- » Additionally, he is second among all active kickers with an average of 1.78 field goals made in his career, trailing only WVU's Josh Lambert (2.00)
- » Zane Gonzalez averaged 9.8 points per game in 2014, ranked 12th nationally and four among kickers while sitting first overall in the Pac-12.
- » His 81.5 percent field goal percentage on 22-of-27 kicking was 22nd nationally.
- » As a freshman, Gonzalez led the Pac-12 with 25 field goals and was named one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award, given annually to the nation's top kicker. He was a semifinalist award last season as well and named to the preseason watch list for 2015.

FG-ONZALEZ

- » Gonzalez finished with 138 points in 2013, breaking the long-standing school record in the category that was previous held by Wilford White's 136 in 1950.
- » Gonzalez's 138 points demolished the previous scoring record by an ASU kicker that was 118, set by Thomas Weber (2007) and Mike Barth (2002).
- » With 25 field goals in 2013, Gonzalez tied the NCAA freshman record of 25 that was set by UCLA's Kai Forbath in 2007 (25-30) that was four more field goals than any other player in the FBS in the process.
- » Gonzalez finished with 118 points in 2014, good for a tie for fourth all-time on ASU's single season scoring list.
- » Gonzalez was perfect from the field in the team's season opener, kicking one field goal while adding an extra point.
- » With 261 career points, he is currently 7th in ASU history.

TODD-BITS OF INFO

- » Over his four seasons prior to coming to ASU -- one at Pittsburgh and three at Tulsa -- Todd Graham's teams rushed the ball on at least 53.4 percent of their total plays. The 2012 Sun Devils rushed the ball on 59.1 percent of their total plays followed by a 55.2 percent tally in 2013 and a 52.1 percent in 2014. In 2011, ASU rushed just 44.5 percent of the time.
- » Over the past nine seasons at Pitt, Tulsa, Rice and now ASU, only one Graham-coached team has ranked outside the top 50 nationally in sacks. The Sun Devils averaged 4.0 sacks per game in 2012, the second-best mark in the nation, and then finished with 2.9 per game in 2013 and 3.0 per game in 2014 to finish 17th and 13th, respectively, in the country.
- » In nine seasons, Graham is 29-24 in true road games. ASU was 3-3 in

such games in 2012, 3-2 in 2013 and 4-2 in 2014 (10-7 overall). In the previous four seasons prior to Graham's arrival, ASU was 5-16 in true road contests.

- » In eight of the past nine years, Graham's teams have ranked 39th or better nationally in fewest penalty yards per game. The Sun Devils averaged 34.92 penalty yards per game in 2012 (eighth nationally), 31.36 per game in 2013 (seventh nationally) and 32.38 per game in 2014 (fourth nationally).

HOLD ON TO YOUR SEATS

- » ASU played in four games in 2013 decided by seven points or less, going 3-1 in those contests. The total is notable as ASU was just 4-13 in the previous four seasons in games decided by less than a touchdown.
- » ASU was 3-1 in 2014 in games decided by less than a touchdown following the team's 36-31 Sun Bowl victory over Duke.
- » ASU has now gone 7-2 in games decided by a touchdown or less since the 2012 Arizona comeback in Tucson. To put that in perspective, ASU had gone 6-16 in such games since the 2007 season up until that Tucson game.

HOLD ON TO THAT BALL, ALSO

- » In 2014, the Sun Devils had six games where they did not turn the ball over and went 6-0 in those contests. That number is notable because in the previous two seasons, ASU had just five combined games where it did not turn the ball over.
- » ASU is now 10-1 under Todd Graham in games where it does not have a turnover.

TODD'S WINNING WAYS

- » Graham has won 28 games in his first three seasons at Arizona State.
- » He has become the only ASU head coach to reach bowl eligibility in each of his first three seasons at the school outside of John Cooper.
- » He has led ASU to three consecutive eight win seasons for the first time since 1971-73.
- » It took Frank Kush until the third game of his third season to reach the 20-win plateau whereas it took Graham until the second game of his third season.
- » Of all the coaching hires made prior to the 2012 season, Graham has posted the fourth-best record at 28-13, ranking behind only Urban Meyer (38-3), Jim Mora (30-11) and Kevin Sumlin (29-11) in the last three seasons.

NOT WASTING TIME

- » In just three seasons, Todd Graham already finds him self with an average of 9.33 wins per year at ASU, which would rank him tops all-time in ASU lore.
- » His 28 wins are already the sixth-most among coaches in program history while his .783 win percentage sits fourth all-time.
- » Graham became the third-quickest coach to reach 28 wins, doing so in 40 games.
- » As far as Bowl Games go, Graham has wasted no time establishing himself in the record books as his three appearances with the Sun Devils are already tied for third among all ASU coaches and his two wins are tied for second.

ELITE COMPANY

- » Head Coach Todd Graham has a school-record 28 wins in his first three seasons as head coach at ASU, one more than College Football Hall of Fame Coach Dan Devine (1955-57).
- » Coach Graham has recorded 10 wins in five of his nine seasons as a head coach (Tulsa 2007, 2008, 2010; ASU 2013, 2014.) Since 2007, Coach Graham currently sits tied for No. 4 nationally in most 10-win seasons with five at FBS institutions, ranking behind only Nick Saban, Bob Stoops and Chris Peterson.

DOUBLE THE DIGITS, DOUBLE THE FUN

- » In 2014, ASU secured back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time since Frank Kush notched double-digit victories from 1970-73. That was drought of 31 years since it last happened, providing further evidence of how difficult an achievement back-to-back 10-win seasons are to come by.

- » Back-to-back 10-win seasons hadn't happened at Arizona State since 1970-73. But a quick look around the nation shows that only 12 schools have posted back-to-back 10 win-seasons the past two years. Here are the double-digit dozen.

BERC-ING FOR THE WEEKEND

- » In Mike Bercovici's first two career starts last season, he passed for for 998 yards with eight touchdowns and two interceptions.
- » The 998 yards were a Pac-12 record for most yards in consecutive games for about an hour before WSU's Connor Halliday broke the mark but the tally ranks as the most passing yards in the first two starts of a players career in Division I history.
- » Bercovici threw for five touchdowns against USC, a milestone that no player in history has ever accomplished against the Trojans.

LIKE MIKE

- » In Bercovici's 186 pass attempts in 2014, only 24 times did he target the same receiver on back-to-back plays. At one point in the UCLA contest, he targeted eight different receivers over the course of 11 pass attempts. Only once did he target a receiver on three straight attempts.
- » Out of all the players on last year's team with a reception that weren't named Jaelen Strong or D.J. Foster, there were 137 total receptions made on the season. Bercovici, in his limited action, was responsible for 61 of those passes (44.5 percent).

TAKING DOWN THE TOP

- » ASU was 3-2 in 2013 against team's ranked in the AP Top-25 Poll and the three victories were the most since 1997 when the team went 3-1 against teams ranked in the AP poll.
- » ASU's 2014 schedule put the team on a collision course with three consecutive AP Top-25 teams (UCLA, USC, Stanford), a streak that ASU had faced only twice in program history. The last that happened was 2001,

where ASU went 0-3 against No. 13 Washington, No. 8 Oregon and No. 11 Washington State. In 1994, ASU defeated No. 20 BYU in between losses to No. 23 Washington State and No. 21 Oregon.

- » ASU came out of the gauntlet with a 2-1 record with back-to-back victories over No. 16 USC and No. 23 Stanford. It was the first time ASU has won back-to-back games over ranked opponents since 1997, when it took down No. 25 Stanford on Oct. 18 before defeating No. 10 Washington State on Nov. 1 following a bye week.

SLAYING DRAGONS

- » The Sun Devils have gone 7-4 in the last 11 games against ranked teams.
- » In three seasons at the helm, Todd Graham is 7-7 against AP-ranked opponents and the team was 4-2 in such teams in 2014.
- » Graham has more than doubled Dennis Erickson (3) and Dirk Koetter (2) during their tenures.
- » In the previous 14 seasons, ASU was 5-40 in games against teams ranked in the AP poll. -- Other notable victories include the come-from-behind victory over Arizona in 2012, winning a game in the Coliseum last season for the first time since 1999 and defeating USC in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-97. ASU also ended a four-game losing streak to Stanford.

GOLD RUSH

- » Since the Coach Kush era, ASU has scored 20 or more rushing touchdowns in three or more consecutive seasons just one other time (1985-87) outside the current streak (23 in '11, 27 in '12, 36 in '13 and 20 in '14).
- » The current streak of four straight years with 20+ rushing touchdowns is the second longest streak in ASU history since 1960 behind only the seven straight Kush-led teams from 1967-73.

On Mike Bercovici...

Bercovici is no secret in the Pac-12 after a solid stint as Arizona State's starting quarterback last season. Bercovici has a strong arm and isn't afraid to take chances downfield. -Athlon Sports

Bercovici has a cannon arm and can make any throw on the field. -Bleacher Report

If you need anybody to vouch for how hard he can throw, just ask the two Pac-12 schools in Los Angeles after he threw for 488 yards against UCLA and had five touchdowns against USC. -College Football 24/7 NFL.COM

Though he only had three starts last year, Mike Bercovici more than proved he's ready to take over the Sun Devils' aggressive, up-tempo offense. Bercovici will have plenty of opportunities to show off that arm strength. As far as quarterback transitions go, this has to be one of the smoothest in the nation. -ESPN.COM

On D.J. Foster...

Foster is the only returning player in the country with both 1,500 rushing and 1,500 receiving yards in his career, and he's caught at least one pass in 40 consecutive games. Consider this: along with leading the team in rushing last year with 1,081 yards, he was also the Sun Devils' No. 2 receiver behind third-round draft pick Jaalen Strong with 62 catches for 688 yards. There simply isn't a more dangerous pass catcher out of the backfield in the country. -College Football 24/7 NFL.COM

Whether at receiver or running back, Foster's athleticism is the first thing that stands out. He's a fluid runner with impressive lateral agility, balance and stop-start quickness to avoid would-be tacklers and squirt through gaps. -cbssports.com

On Coach Todd Graham...

Clearly, the respect for the Sun Devils program is on the rise, and the proof is in the pudding. Graham is pulling down bigger and better recruits who should keep Arizona State's success at a sustainable level. -Bleacher Report

Under Graham's watch, Arizona State has clearly removed the label of a program that struggles to reach expectations. And the Sun Devils are in the midst of a stadium renovation that will only help Graham and this staff sell a program that has inked back-to-back top-25 signing classes. -Athlon Sports

ASU has the most unique defensive philosophy in the PAC 12. The plays are called by Todd Graham himself - a somewhat unique situation to begin with - and involve the heaviest percentage of blitzing in conference. -SB Nation

On the Sun Devils...

Kalen Ballage and De'Chavon Hayes have emerged alongside Demario Richard in an explosive backfield, while Mike Bercovici gives ASU returning stability at quarterback. The defense is expected to be more consistent too, as nine of 11 starters come back. -ESPN.COM

The Sun Devils won 10 games in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1970-73, and they're bringing back nine starters on defense this coming season. Quarterback Mike Bercovici started three games last season, and tailback D.J. Foster is going to be utilized as a slot receiver to help him play in the NFL. -Mark Schlabach ESPN.COM

ASU returns 16 starters, including most of its skill position players, an all-conference offensive lineman, four of the top five on the line, the top six linebackers, all but one defensive back, and the fruits of another exciting recruiting class. -SB Nation

ASU's defensive mentality mirrors its offense's: fast, multiple, and aggressive. The Sun Devils don't want you to find a rhythm, and they want you to have to react to what they're doing. -SB Nation

On Jordan Simone...

Simone is simply a tackling machine. He is the backbone and safety net of an Arizona State defense that takes a lot of risks. -SB Nation

Simone is an understated safety, but he is a key cog in the secondary. He is the leading returning tackler (100 total tackles) and is a leader for a secondary that has a boatload of talent at the safety position. In a division that has outstanding talent in the defensive backfield, having a safety that can make plays is critical to success. -Bloomberg

On Lloyd Carrington...

It wasn't until last season, however, that Carrington emerged as a fulltime starter. Like his former teammate Randall, Carrington possesses the combination of instincts and grit that could help his stock soar as a senior. Carrington is a highly aggressive defender who isn't afraid to latch on and re-route receivers. -cbssports.com

On the stable of Running Backs...

The backfield is brimming with talent. Between Richard (5.7 yards per carry as a freshman), Kalen Ballage (up 17 pounds from last season), De'Chavon Hayes (known as "Gump" for his breakaway runs this spring), and early enrollee Nick Ralston, an intense competition for carries has taken hold. -ESPN.COM

On Nick Kelly...

Kelly's squatty, powerful frame is well suited to playing along the line of scrimmage as he consistently wins the leverage battle, anchoring against bull rushers and generating movement with proper knee bend. -cbssports.com

On the defensive unit...

The strength of the defense is the back seven. ASU can rotate five linebackers without much drop-off. Keep an eye on sophomores Christian Sam and DJ Calhoun; they were pressing for starting positions in spring ball and have the sideline-to-sideline quickness Graham loves at the position. -Athlon Sports

2013 PAC-12 COACH OF THE YEAR**

From the moment he was introduced as Arizona State University's head football coach on December 14, 2011, Todd Graham made it clear he was a visionary. A throwback. A teacher who truly believes in the virtues of hard work, dedication and giving back.

He made it clear he was going to infuse the program with a culture that was about winning in all facets of a student-athlete's life. Graham referred to it simply as, 'The Sun Devil Way.'

"Our goal as a program is that we are going to first and foremost bring out the best in every single person's character that's involved in our program," Graham said. "I'm not only interested in winning on Saturday... I want to win every day in every way. We will compete in the classroom as we compete on the field.

"On the field we're going to be passionate and disciplined. Discipline is the key to winning football games. We're going to be involved in the community. The greatest joy that I've had in my life is to learn to be a giver... I want our players to understand that family and character and bringing out the best and being a giver, that's what I call unique character, is giving every day."

Graham, the 2013 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, enters his fourth season at the helm of the Arizona State University football program. Under his leadership, Sun Devil football has reached levels of success not seen in more than 30 years as last year's squad became the first to post back-to-back 10-win seasons since 1973. The accomplishment is the sum of many brilliant achievements orchestrated by Graham and his staff the last three seasons. Since Graham's arrival in Tempe...

- ASU's high-octane offense has eclipsed 50 points in 12 games and the Devils are second in the Pac-12 and seventh in the nation at 38 points per game during that stretch.
- ASU's attacking defense has outscored opponents 417-151 in points off takeaways. The Devils are second in the nation with a plus-35 turnover margin and rank in the top three in the nation in tackles for loss, sacks and interceptions. They are one of only four teams in the nation with more than 300 total tackles for loss, and their 130 sacks and 56 interceptions are both the second-highest totals among FBS teams.
- ASU has become one of the least penalized teams in the nation (third over the last three seasons in fewest penalty yards per game) and the most disciplined team in the Pac-12 (first in fewest penalties per game).
- ASU has earned three consecutive bowl bids and won the Pac-12 South in 2013.
- The Sun Devils are 16-4 at home under Graham and in the last two years have won seven of 10 games on the road.
- The Sun Devils have also reached new heights in the classroom. ASU's 12 Pac-12 All-Academic honorees in 2014 were the most in program history (26 in three years). In addition, 97 football student-athletes have earned Scholar Baller® recognition – which honors Sun Devil student-athletes who achieve a 3.0 GPA or higher – in his three seasons.

In 2014, Graham's Sun Devil squad posted a 10-3 record, including 6-3 in Pac-12 play, a second-

place finish in the Pac-12 South Division and a 36-31 victory over Duke in the Sun Bowl. Tasked with replacing nine starters on defense, Graham led a unit that ranked near the top in the nation in sacks and tackles for loss, forced 27 turnovers and scored five touchdowns during the season.

On the other side of the ball, ASU finished the season ranked 16th in the nation in scoring offense and averaged more than 440 yards per game behind record-breaking quarterback and Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year Taylor Kelly, 1,000-yard rusher D.J. Foster and 1,000-yard receiver Jaelen Strong.

A total of 28 FBS schools hired coaches prior to the 2012 season, 17 of which remain at those schools. Of those coaches, Graham has posted the fourth-best overall record in his first three seasons behind only Urban Meyer (38-3), Jim Mora (29-11) and Kevin Sumlin (28-11).

In 2013 Graham's Sun Devils brushed aside the prognostications from skeptics who felt that an early-season string of games against Wisconsin, Stanford, USC and Notre Dame would be a little bit too much to overcome. Then, sitting with a 5-2 record after seven games and still very much in the race for the Pac-12 South crown, the Sun Devils would have their endurance and desire questioned again as they had to navigate their way through a stretch of three of their next four games on the road. In a gut-check, 20-19 win at Utah, the Sun Devils dug deep and proved they had the toughness and resilience to fight through any challenge that lay before them.

That belief would serve them well two weeks later in a winner-take-all showdown at No. 14 UCLA. At stake: a trip to the Pac-12 Championship game. There would be no hesitation to seize the moment as the Sun Devils ambushed the Bruins, jumping out to a 35-13 halftime lead. Despite its early dominance, ASU could not leave UCLA's Rose Bowl Stadium with a win until having to overcome yet another test.

A furious rally by the Bruins got them to within one score. Down 38-33 and with 3:21 remaining, the Bruins took over possession of the ball at their own 35. In a similar situation one year earlier, UCLA responded by taking the ball down the field for the game winning field goal. Despite Hollywood being only 15 miles away, the Sun Devil defense ensured there would be no sequel on this day as a pair of critical sacks forced the UCLA offense into submission. And just like that, the Sun Devils were champions of the Pac-12 South.

One week later ASU would keep possession of the Territorial Cup after blitzing Arizona 58-21. With the win the Sun Devils clinched a berth in the 2013 Pac-12 Championship Game.

ASU outscored its opponents 146-42 on points off turnovers while posting a +15 takeaway number in 2013. ASU put points on the board following 75.8 percent of opponent turnovers (25-of-33) compared to just the 33.3 (6-of-18) percent clip ASU opponents scored off of Sun Devil turnovers.

The duo of defensive tackle Will Sutton and linebacker Carl Bradford combined to give ASU the most dynamic defensive tandem in the country as the two combined for 24.5 sacks and 44.0 tackles for loss in 2012. Their collective average of 1.92 sacks per game was the highest in the country by two players on the same team since the 2006 season. Bradford racked up 40.5 tackles for loss in two years under Graham, tied for the fourth most by any player in the nation in that time.

Sutton became ASU's sixth winner of the Morris Trophy and the 18th consensus All-American and first since 2007. Sutton also became the fifth ASU player to win the Pac-10/12 conference Defensive Player of the Year award. After accomplishing all of that as a junior, Sutton returned for his senior season and repeated as the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year and Morris Trophy Winner while adding numerous All-American accolades.



Although the 2013 Sun Devils would come up short of their ultimate goal of getting to and winning the annual Rose Bowl Game, they proved they had the right people on board. And leading that ship a captain in Graham, who, surrounded by the best lieutenants in the land, would put them in position to get there again.

Graham was named the 2013 Pac-12 Coach of the Year and as he and his staff of talented assistants – all committed to winning, ‘The Sun Devil Way’ – guided the team through a turbulent schedule to post a 10-4 record and an 8-1 record to earn the program’s first Pac-12 Championship game berth.

“The honor says, ‘Coach of the Year,’ but it really should say ‘Team of the Year,’ because none of this would be possible without the work of our tireless coaching – I’m very blessed to have tremendous teachers, men of great character that do a tremendous job – and the trust of our kids to believe what we are teaching them is going to take us where we want to go,” said Graham.

In his first season at Arizona State, Graham guided the team to an 8-5 record as the program recorded its first winning regular season since going 10-2 in 2007. ASU ended the season with three straight wins for the first time since 1978 and just the 14th time in school history.

That season, ASU beat Arizona in a dramatic fourth-quarter comeback in Tucson to reclaim the Territorial Cup and went on to win a bowl game for the first time since 2005 and the 13th time in school history. Additionally, ASU was one of just four Pac-12 teams to win at least three conference road games (3-2) in 2012, doing so for just the fifth time in the program’s Pac-10/12 history.

While known for leading programs that have annually been among the nation’s leaders in offensive production, Graham gained national acclaim for his coaching prowess on the other side of the ball after leading defenses that helped West Virginia (2002) and Tulsa (2003) engineer two of the top single-season turnarounds in recent memory. With head-turning accomplishments like those it is easy to see why Graham believes that defense wins championships.

Employing an approach that emphasizes excellent fundamentals and hard and disciplined play, the Sun Devils’ extraordinary improvement on defense played a paramount role in the team’s rise improvement in 2012. After finishing at or near the bottom of the Pac-12 in several defensive categories in 2011, the Sun Devils experienced an amazing reversal in 2012 as they led the conference in tackles for loss (No. 1 in the nation), pass defense (No. 3 in the nation), and pass efficiency defense (No. 10 in the nation) and finished second in the league in sacks (No. 2 in the nation), interceptions (No. 4 in the nation) and total defense.

Graham was named the 23rd head football coach in program history on December 14, 2011, arriving in Tempe from the University of Pittsburgh.

Graham became well-known on the national scene following a four-year stint at Tulsa (2007-2010) where he led the Golden Hurricane to a 36-17 mark, which included three bowl wins and three seasons of 10-plus wins. Tulsa was one of just 11 schools to post back-to-back 10-win seasons in 2007 and 2008.

The native of Mesquite, Texas, had seasons at Tulsa which included records of 10-4 (2007), 11-3 (2008) and 10-3 (2010) and in his final season the Golden Hurricane won games at Notre Dame and then topped No. 24 Hawaii 62-35 in its own bowl game. The Notre Dame win was dubbed the biggest upset of the 2010 college football season by ESPN’s Kirk Herbstreit.

One distinguishing characteristic of Graham-coached teams has been their propensity for lighting up the scoreboard. On two occasions Tulsa led the nation in total offense (2007 at 543.9 yards per game and 2008 at 569.9 yards per game) and ranked fifth in 2010. His 2010 Tulsa team also led the nation in interceptions (24) and was third in turnovers gained (36). His 2007 squad not only led the nation in total offense at 543.9 yards per game, it set 29 school records, 15 conference marks and four NCAA records. Tulsa routed Bowling Green 63-7 in the GMAC Bowl, the largest bowl margin of victory in NCAA history.

His 2008 team again led the nation in total offense (569.9 yards per game) while ranking second in scoring (47.2 points per game), fifth in rushing (268 ypg) and ninth in passing (301.9

ypg). His team finished 11-3, capped by another large bowl win, a 45-13 victory over No. 22 Ball State in the GMAC Bowl.

Including ASU’s 62-28 win over Navy in the 2012 Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl, Graham’s offense has enabled three different teams (two at Tulsa) to score 60-plus points in a bowl game, making him the only coach to accomplish the feat multiple times.

Prior to taking the head job at Tulsa, Graham led Rice to its first bowl game in 45 seasons in 2006 and earned Conference USA Coach of the Year honors that same season.

Graham began his coaching career in 1988 as an assistant at Poteet High School/Middle School in Mesquite (1988-90) and then helped lead East Central University from a .500 program to NAIA national champions in his third year as he served as defensive coordinator from 1991-93. One year later he was at Carl Albert High School in Midwest City, Okla., and then spent time from 1995-2000 at Allen High School in Allen, Texas. While at Allen, north of Dallas, he also served as athletic director and led a program that had no district wins in the year prior to his arrival to five playoff berths in six seasons (1995-2000).

Graham was hired as the linebackers coach at West Virginia in 2001 and one year later he was promoted to defensive co-coordinator as the Mountaineers went from 3-8 to 9-4, the top turnaround in the country in 2002.

In 2003 Steve Kragthorpe hired Graham as the defensive coordinator at Tulsa. For the second time in as many years, a Graham-led defense proved instrumental in helping a program post the nation’s best turnaround as the Golden Hurricane went from 1-11 in 2002 to 8-5 in 2003. Graham’s defenses would help lead Tulsa to a pair of bowl games before he moved on to take over the head job at Rice.

Graham was an all-state defensive back at North Mesquite High School and, after graduating in 1983, he played for East Central University in Ada, Okla., where he was a two-time NAIA All-American defensive back.

Born Dec. 5 1964, Graham earned his bachelor’s and master’s degrees in education from East Central University. He and his wife, Penni, have six children: Bo, Natalie, Hank, Haylee, Dakota

#5 Zane Gonzalez, Junior - Currently second in the NCAA active leader list in career field goals per game at 1.78 and is fourth in active scoring at 9.7 points per game..Had a field goal and two extra points against Texas A&M (9/5)...Finished fourth in the nation in field goals made per game in 2014...Made 22 of 27 field goals on the year, 50-52 on extra points...Was a semifinalist for the Lou Groza National Collegiate Place-Kicker Award for the second consecutive season... With 118 points in 2014, Gonzalez now holds the first and second all-time single season scoring marks for a kicker in ASU history.
