### **#10THINGS** (Twitter-Friendly Notes)

- 1. D.J. Foster has accounted for at least one reception in each of the 32 games he has played at ASU. T-10th longest active streak in FBS.
- 2. D.J. Foster (@ASTATE\_8) has four rushes from scrimmage longer than 40 yards this year. Only 24 total FBS teams can lay such a claim.
- 3. ASU is facing third-straight AP-ranked opponent for just the second time in school history. Went 0-3 in '00 and 1-2 in '94.
- 4. Damarious Randall (@RandallTime) is currently first nationally with 9.4 solo tackles per game. 47 of 51 tackles this year came by self.
- 5. @Pac12 home teams have posted just a 4-14 record in conference games this season. @FootballASU 12-4 at home under Graham.
- 6. @FootballASU is 17-5 in the last 22 games, tied for the second-best record of all @Pac12 teams behind only Oregon (18-4).
- 7. D.J. Foster is one of just two players nationally with over 1,500 career rushing yards and over 1,000 career receiving yards.
- 8. Mike Bercovici (@MikeBerco) became the first player in history to throw for five touchdown passes against the USC Troians.
- 9. @FootballASU has 12 plays from scrimmage over 40 yards this season, tied for 9th nationally. Had 16 total last season
- 10. @FootballASU is 5-1 in since 2012 Arizona game in games decided by 7 points or fewer. Was 6-16 since '07 season to that point.

### **#BYTHENUMBERS**

Quarterback Mike Bercovici has thrown for 998 yards in his first two starts. The 998 yards were a Pac-12 record for most yards in consecutive games for about an hour before WSU's Connor Halliday broke the mark and preliminary research has shown that that tally ranks as the most passing yards in the first two starts of a players career in Division I history. Berocovici has thrown for 8 touchdowns in that stretch with two interceptions and has posted an overall quarterback efficiency mark of 149.4 this season - good for 27th nationally.

ASU's starting safties Damarious Randall and Jordan Simone have been doing their part as the last line of defense for the Sun Devils. The duo leads the team in tackles with 51 and 45, respectively. Their combined 96 tackles this season are 26.3 percent of the total tackles made by the Sun Devils this season. Randall has done much of the work on his own, accounting for 47 solo tackles on his 51 total tackles - a 9.4 solo tackle per game average that currently is tops in the country while Simone isn't far behind in 13th with 6.4 solo tackles per game.

Following the USC victory, ASU has now gone 5-1 in games decided by a touchdown or less since the 2011 Arizona comeback in Tucson. To put that in perspective, ASU had gone 6-16 in such games since the 2007 season. ASU played in four games in 2013 decided by seven points or less, going 3-1 in those contests. The total is notable as ASU was just 4-13 in the previous four seasons in games decided by less than a touchdown. The only blemish in that time was the tough 37-34 loss to Notre Dame in Arlington, Texas last season.

ASU's current schedule puts the team on a collision course with three consecutive AP Top-25 teams (UCLA, USC, Stanford), a streak that ASU has faced only twice in program history. The last that happened was 2001, where ASU went 0-3 against #13 Washington, #8 Oregon and #11 Washington State. In 1994, ASU defeated #20 BYU in between losses to #23 Washington State and #21 Oregon. Todd Graham is 4-6 against AP ranked opponents in his three seasons at ASU - already earning more victories than Dennis Erickson (3) and Dirk Koetter (2) during their tenures.

#### Interview Policy

Due to the nature of Arizona State game dates this season, practices schedules each week will vary dependent upon that week's game. The ASU media relations office will provide a practice schedule prior to each game week for the media. Media members can shoot the first hour of practice, unless the drill is team related, Interviews are conducted at the end of each practice. Due to high demand, several players and members of the coaching staff are available only on a limited basis: Mike Norvell (Tuesday), Keith Patterson (Wednesday), D.J. Foster (Wednesday), Taylor Kelly (Wednesday) and Jaelen Strong (Thursday). All other interviews need to be arranged through the Media Relations office. Following home contests, Arizona State will bring several student-athletes to the Dutson Theater for a post-game press conference. Head Coach Todd Graham will follow the student-athletes.

### Weekly Press Conference

Head coach Todd Graham will resume his weekly press conferences each Monday prior to game week. The press conference is tentatively scheduled for 12 p.m. (Noon) Arizona Time each week. When the team practices on Mondays, Graham will not be available following practice.

#### **Credentials**

All credential requests should be sent via email to Doug Tammaro (tammaro@asu.edu). For road games, please contact Mark Brand (mark.brand@asu.edu) for more information.

### Media Guides/Statistics

Members of the media may request a physical media guide from the Sun Devil Media Relations office. Weekly and seasonal statistics can also be found through the Sun Devil main page at www. TheSunDevils.com. Statistics, which also appear in the back of this note packet, will be available each week at Coach Graham's Monday press conference and in the press box of Sun Devil Stadium.

#### Photography/Videoography

Photographers (still and video) may shoot the first hour of practice, unless the drill is team related. On-camera interviews will be conducted at the end of each practice. For home games, a photographer work area has been established inside the Carson Student-Athlete Center (first floor). Internet access to transmit files is available in the photography workroom. Credentials must be worn in plain view throughout the game while on the field and all photographers must adhere to painted lines and instructions given by security personnel and/or Arizona State staff members at all times.

#### Weekly Teleconference

The Pac-12 Football Coaches Weekly Media Teleconference Call will take place each Tuesday during the season, starting Tuesday, August 26 and concluding Tuesday, November 25. Due to shifting practice schedules during the first six weeks of the season, the first call on Aug. 26 will start at 10:25 a.m. PT/11:25 a.m. MT. calls from Sept. 1 Aug. 20 Will Start at 10:25 a.m. PT/11:05 a.m. MT. Starting Oct. 6, and continuing each Tuesday through the remainder of the season, the calls will begin at 10:25 a.m. PT/11:25 a.m. MT. Todd Graham is slated to speak at 12:05 p.m. PT/1:05 p.m. MT each week. A separate call of the head coaches competing in the Pac-12 Football Championship Game will be scheduled for Monday, December 1.The teleconferences will be recorded and available at Pac-12.com that same afternoon of the call. Members of the media may reach out to the Pac-12 (925-932-4411) for the media-only phone number for the teleconference.

Media Highlights Policy Highlights include Pac-12 Networks/ESPN/FOX broadcasts and all home hosted non-televised competitions, including those that are live streamed.

### Third-Party Website Highlight Policy

No third party organization may post competition footage of any Pac-12 game or any non-conference home game on its website without a license to the content from the Pac-12 Networks or its licensing partner (XOS Digital), with the exception of news window privileges described below. Third parties are permitted to post video on their websites through the use of the Pac-12 Digital embeddable video player (embed code available at http://video.pac-12.com).

### **News Outlet Highlight Policy**

Certified news outlets may use a maximum of 3 minutes of Pac-12 event footage on their newscasts during the 48-hour news window following the conclusion of included events. If these highlights do not contain a Pac-12 mark, the news outlet must insert "Courtesy of the Pac-12 Conference" over the footage. Highlights may also be posted to certified news providers' websites, but must be removed 48 hours after the conclusion of any included event, unless a license for that footage is obtained from the Pac-12 Conference. Highlights may not be posted to YouTube, Facebook, or other social media properties. Beyond the 48 hour news window, certified news outlets are permitted to use a maximum of 1 minute of footage - on their television newscasts only – for 14 calendar days after the conclusion of the game in question. This policy pertains to the 2013-14 academic year only and is subject to change in subsequent years.

Stanford (11-2) raced out to a big lead Sept. 21 in its first game with Arizona State this season and had its way with the Sun Devils again early in the rematch, going up 28-7 early in the second quarter. Gaffney, as he

**TEMPE** -- The No. 17/18 Arizona State University Sun Devil football program returns from the bye week for a weekend tilt against Pac-12 North titan Stanford on Saturday, Oct. 18 at Sun Devil Stadium in Tempe, Ariz. The game is slated for a 7:30 p.m. PT kickoff and will be broadcast on ESPN.

The Sun Devils will look to ride the momentum from a monumental comeback against then-No. 16 USC in Los Angeles two weekends ago, where the team upset the Trojans on the heels of a Hail Mary reception by Jaelen Strong from Mike Bercovici in a 38-34 win. ASU opened up the Pac-12 schedule with a 38-24 victory on the road over Colorado before suffering a tough 62-27 defeat at the hands on UCLA at home two weekends later. ASU used a strong second half and a career day by D.J. Foster to rout New Mexico, 58-23. The Sun Devils opened the season with an efficient and thorough 45-15 victory over Weber State in Tempe on opening weekend, increasing their season-opening win streak to 12 straight games.

Arizona State is now in its 102nd season of competition in 2014. The Sun Devils are 577-371-24 (.606) all-time and have appeared in 27 bowl games, compiling a 13-13-1 record in such contests. The Sun Devils are coming off an impressive 10-4 campaign in 2013 that saw ASU finish as the Pac-12 South Champions and advance to the National University Holiday Bowl as head coach Todd Graham earned Pac-12 Coach of the Year accolades.

**ON THE AIR** Hear the hometown with broadcaster Tim Healey and color analyst Jeff Van Raaphorst as well as sideline reporter Doug Franz call all the action for Sun Devil Football this season. The MidFirst Bank Sun Devil IMG Sports Network airs statewide and is buoyed by Booneville's powerful sports/talk lineup of 620 AM KTAR, 98.7 KMVP and 92.3 KTAR News FM. Don't miss a play this upcoming season with the additional worldwide coverage brought to you by the Tuneln App which can be downloaded to your smartphone, tablet or laptop. This week's game will broadcast on Arizona Sports 98.7 FM. The game's home radio coverage will also be broadcast on Sirius Channel 92/XM Channel 198. The game is also notable as it represents Tim Healey's 200th game on the call for the Sun Devils since taking over as the Voice of the Sun Devils in 1998.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION Saturday's contest will mark the second game for the Sun Devils this season to be broadcast on ESPN family of networks and the first game broadcast on ESPN. Mark Jones will be on the call alongside analyst Rod Gilmore while Jessica Mendoza will roam the sidelines. The Pac-12 will again provide access to Armed Forces Network for carriage of Pac-12 football games in 2014 for the benefit of the men and women in the military.

**ON THE CARDINAL** ASU leads the all-time series between the schools, 16-13, but it has been the Cardinal that have been a thorn in ASU's side of late Stanford has won four straight against ASU, including two games during the 2013 season. ASU is 10-5 all-time against the Cardinal in Sun Devil Stadium. The average margin of victory for Stanford in the previous four victories against ASU has been just over 15 points.

#### LAST TIME OUT - USC

- --The Devils beat USC at the Coliseum for the first time since a 26-16 victory in 1999 and have now recorded consecutive victories over the Trojans for the first time since 1996-97. ASU still trails the all-time series with the Trojans, 19-12.
- --This is the second consecutive season the Devils have beaten a top-25 team on the road, and both occurred in Los Angeles (38-33 win at No. 24 UCLA on Nov. 16, 2013).
- -- The last time ASU beat USC twice in a row was in 1996 (48-35 20T in Tempe) and 1997 (35-7 in Tempe). It is only the fourth time in the history of the series between the two schools that ASU has won two straight (1985 & 1986 and 1982 & 1983)
- --Mike Bercovici became the first player ever to throw for five touchdown passes against the Trojans in USC's storied history. His 510 passing yards were the second most ever given up by the Trojans behind only Notre Dame's Joe Theismann (526 in 1970).
- --He is the first Sun Devil to pass for more than 500 yards since Andrew Walter set the school record with 536 against Oregon on Oct. 19, 2002, and he is just the fifth quarterback in school history to ever throw for more than 500 yards.
- --In the past five years, USC had given up plays of 70 or more yards just four times. All four of those plays were made by ASU. The Sun Devils had two such plays in the victory.
- --The Devils' 4-yard touchdown to open the second quarter was the first passing touchdown the Trojans allowed all season. They allowed five total in the game.
- --Safety Jordan Simone set a career high with 20 tackles in the game, including 12 solo, and is the first Sun Devil to reach 20 tackles since Mark Tingstad against Arizona back in 1988.

#### **NOTABLE NUMBERS**

--Coach Todd Graham is now 9-4 on the road at ASU in his career. He is 8-3 on the road in Pac-12 games and the Sun Devils have won six straight on the road. Graham's eight road Pac-12 victories are the second-most for an ASU coach since 1980 behind only Bruce Snyder's 18 from 1992-2000.

- --Currently there are only four other teams in the nation at the FBS Division 1-A level that boast as many wins (3) on the road in 2014 as ASU (Baylor, Marshall, South Alabama, Maryland).
- --Arizona State is 17-5 in the last 22 games, tied for the second-best record of all Pac-12 teams in the most recent 22-game span with Stanford behind only Oregon (18-4).
  - -Pac-12 teams are now just 4-14 in home conference games this season.
- -Preliminary research has shown that no quarterback in NCAA D-I history has thrown for more combined yards in their first two career starts than Mike Bercovici's 998 yards in the previous two games a total that was actually the Pac-12 record for most yards in consecutive games for about one hour before Connor Halliday broke the mark again for Washington State.

WE ARE THE YOUTH GONE WILD In a complete 180 from the strong veteran presence on the 2013 Sun Devil roster, the 2014 ASU squad will rely heavily on the youngsters to help lead the way as the season progresses. Entering the year, the Sun Devil two-deep depth chart featured 26 freshmen and sophomores who could see playing time this season. That total ranked tied for 12th in the nation among Division I programs (Oklahoma State and Tulane lead with 32 underclassmen on the two-deep). In the opener, true freshmen DJ Calhoun and Tashon Smallwood each got the nod as starters, becoming just the seventh and eighth Sun Devils in program history to start in the season opener as true frosh, joining John Jefferson, Terrell Suggs, Zach Miler, Will Sutton, D.J. Foster and Jaxon Hood on the exclusive list.

SENIOR DISCOUNT With such an abundance of underclassmen making their presence felt this season, it should come as no surprise that there is a bit of a shortage on seniors. In fact, ASU's senior class this season sits at 11 members - a tally that ranks tied for the second fewest total among all Division I institutions behind only Temple's eight total seniors. The quality of those seniors is impressive, however, with eight of them appearing on the two-deep depth chart and another participating on special teams. Even with the high percentage of total seniors seeing playing time, ASU's eight seniors on the two-deep are tied for the fourth-lowest total in the nation behind only Temple and Tennessee (6) and Baylor (7). ASU had nine first-time starters in the opener (six on defense, three on offense) and has had 17 first-time D-I starters this season.

STRIKE FIRST Arizona State has scored first in 25 of the 32 games with Todd Graham at the helm and is now 19-6 in the Graham era when getting on the scoreboard first. ASU has accomplished the feat in all but one game this season and is 3-1 when scoring first in 2014.

STRIKE FAST The quick-hitting offense has become a staple of the Todd Graham-coached Sun Devils, with 140 of ASU's 188 offensive scoring drives under offensive coordinator Mike Norvell coming in three minutes or less (74.5 percent). Of ASU's 33 scoring drives this season, 28 have come in under the three-minute mark - including three scoring drives clocking in at under a minute against USC. ASU's high-powered offense resonates with the high number of quick scoring drives, scoring in three minutes or less on 62 of the team's 89 scoring drives in 2013 (70.0 percent).

START STRONG...FINISH STRONG The Sun Devils have now outscored their opposition 341-159 in the first guarter under Todd Graham and have a whopping 63-20 scoring edge in the first quarter in games played this season. The Sun Devils are 15-1 under Graham when holding their opposition scoreless in the first as they have done against both Weber State and Colorado this year. ASU improved to 19-0 when leading at halftime with Graham as head coach following the CU contest as well. ASU's 11.5 points per first quarter against FBS opponents this season is currently ranked 10th nationally. ASU's troubles this season have really stemmed from the second quarter of games, where ASU has actually been outscored 59-56 thus far this season. Under Todd Graham, ASU has not been outscored on the season in any quarter in previous two seasons. ASU is currently giving up an average of 14.8 second quarter points per game to FBS opponents, the sixth highest total of any team in the nation.

FOSTER THE PEOPLE D.J. Foster is the only returning player in the nation to amass 400+ receiving AND rushing yards last year and his 10 career receving touchdowns are the most among all active running backs. He also had a knack for getting to the first down marker and finished tied for second on the team with 53 first downs on 156 touches last season (34.0 percent). This season, Foster leads the team with 20 rushing first downs of ASU's 45 total rushing first downs this season and has 31 total first downs with receptions added. Of his 94 touches this season, 38 have resulted in 'money plays' or plays resulting in a first down or touchdown. Last season. Foster was second on the team in allpurpose yardage with 1,170 yards in 2013 (501 on the ground. 653 by air and 16 on KR). Foster made his mark in the receiving game in 2013 with 63 grabs for 653 yards (10.4 ypc), ranking second on the team in both categories. The 63 receptions set a new school record for catches by a running back.

GO D.J., THAT'S MY D.J. With 216 rushing yards against UNM, Foster became the first Sun Devil since to rush for over 200 yards in a game since Delvon Flowers rushed for 226 yards against Oregon State in 2001. He became just the third Sun Devil since 1994 to rush for over 200 yards in a game out of the 20 total 200-yard rushers in ASU history and his 216 yards are tied for the ninth-highest total in program history. Foster has racked up five 100+ yard rushing games in his last eight games and has nine rushing touchdowns in that span. He had zero 100+ yard rushing games in his previous 24 games with just four rushing touchdowns. Foster is one of just two active FBS players who has accounted for over 1,500 career rushing yards (1,547) and over 1,000 career receiving yards (1,466). Illinois Josh Ferguson (1,613/1,063) is the other. Additionally, there are only four players this season with over 400 rushing yards and 200 receiving yards to date, of which Foster is a part of (553/280) along with USC's Buck Allen (781/227), Boise State's Jay Ajayi (709/280), and Ferguson (470/263)

RUN, D.J., RUN Foster is currently eighth in the nation and first in the league in averaging 7.58 rushing yards per carry this season while his 110.6 rushing yards per game are 21st nationally and fourth in the Pac-12. Foster has 22 "explosive" plays this season (15 12+ yard rushes, seven 16+ yard receptions) to lead the team. He already has four rushes of over 40 yards this season, notable as no Sun Devil had more than two in the entirety of last season. Only 24 total D-I teams have accounted for four or more rushes of over 40 yards this season. Since at least 2000, only Keegan Herring (2007) had four 40+ yard rushes in a season - a feat it took Foster just three games to tie. foster also is currently

tied for the nation's 10th-longest active streak of games with a reception at 32 - or every game he has played in his ASU career - and is the only running back on the list.

A STRONG START Jaelen Strong wasted no time picking things up where he left off in the opener, hauling in 10 passes for 146 yards in just a single half of action. As far as openers go, only Mike Jones' six catches for 162 yards in 2008 vs. NAU and Keith Poole's nine catches for 162 yards in 1995 against UW were more prolific stat-wise in the past two decades. Last year, The junior college transfer led the team in receptions and yards with 75 grabs for 1,122 yards (5.4 rpg/80.1 ypg) and seven touchdowns in 2013. Strong recorded 10 catches for 202 yards and three touchdowns against USC. It was the ninth game a Sun Devil has collected more than 200 receiving yards and the first since Gerell Robinson had 241 yards on 13 catches in the 2011 Las Vegas Bowl. Strong's 202 yards are the seventh most in school history. Strong now has 10 100-yard receiving games in his career following the UCLA contest, trailing only Derek Hagan (18) and Shaun McDonald (12) for the most 100-yard receiving games in program history.

THE FORCE IS STRONG Just as impressive as Jaelen Strong's statistics were, his ability to make catches when they count can't be overlooked. Of Strong's 41 receptions this season, 30 have gone for a first down and five have been touchdowns. ASU has 80 first downs by way of passing this season, meaning Strong has accounted for 37.5 percent of those. Last season, a total of 47 of his receptions went for first downs while he also drew 10 pass interference penalties against opposing defenses (six of which resulted in first downs, four were declined as they were all still caught for either a first down, touchdown or two-point conversion), thus playing a role in 53 of ASU's 340 total first downs last season. Additionally, Strong was second on the team in explosive plays (rushes over 12 yards and receptions over 16 yards) with 29 last season. He has 13 such plays this season. Strong is currently sixth nationally with 8.2 receptions per game and his 122.8 receiving yards per game are fourth in the nation and first in the Pac-12.

WORK THAT, BERC THAT When it was announced that starting quarterback Taylor Kelly would miss time to injury, ASU fans everywhere wondered if Mike Bercovici would be able to appropriately run the offense. All he has done in his first two career starts to settle that qualm is pass for 998 yards with eight touchdowns and two interceptions. The 998 yards were a Pac-12 record for most yards in consecutive games for about an hour before WSU's Connor Halliday broke the mark and preliminary research has shown that that tally ranks as the most passing yards in the first two starts of a players career in Division I history. Bercovici threw for five touchdowns against USC, a milestone that no player in history has ever accomplished against the Trojans. Bercovici's passing totals of 510 and 488 yards in his two starts are the 11th and 13th-highest single game totals in Division I this season.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME Or maybe it didn't for ASU quarterback Mike Bercovici, who made his first career start against UCLA. While the redshirt junior didn't come away from the win, all he did do was set school records for completions and attempts in going 42-for-68 with 488 yards, three touchdowns and two interceptions. The 488 passing yards were the fifth most by a Sun Devil in program history and easily the most by a Sun Devil making his first career start, topping Rudy Carpenter's previous mark of 401 yards in 2005. It was also the most yards by a Sun Devil quarterback since Andrew Walter tossed for 559 against No. 6 Oregon in 2002. Since Ryan Kealy's first start in 1997, the 15 quarterbacks making their first career starts in the post-Plummer era are now 9-6, though only four of those victories came against power conference teams.

**THEY SEE ME ROLLIN'** While the score may not have reflected things, the UCLA game showed that the Sun Devil offense is still rolling on all cylinders even without signal-caller Taylor Kelly. ASU racked up 626 yards of total offense while setting school records for plays run (105) and first downs (38). The previous record for plays was 101, accomplished against Wyoming in 1977 and Utah in 1972 while the previous first down mark was 37 against Cal in 1981. After putting up a 500-spot on USC, the Sun Devils are currently averaging 556.8 yards of total offense per game, a total good for seventh nationally and second in the Pac-12.

**DON'T CROSS THAT LINE** ASU prides itself on its aggressive defense under Todd Graham and tackles for loss and no-yardage plays play a big role in that. Against USC, ASU <u>had 10 tackles for loss, four stops at the line of scrimmage and forced 17 incomplete passes for a total of 31 plays that <u>did not earn a single yard out of the 95 total plays run by the Bruin offense (32.6 percent)</u>. In 2013, the ASU defense had 101 tackles for loss and held offenses to 353 plays (out of 942) that did not earn positive yardage (37.4 percent). In 2012, ASU forced 117 tackles for a loss of 497 total yards in 2012 - a 9.00 TFL per game mark that led the nation. In three seasons under Graham, <u>ASU has</u> forced 810 plays that have not resulted in positive yardage out of 2,268 total plays (35.7 percent).</u>

**LIGHT 'EM UP** ASU racked up 58 points against UNM, marking the 10th time since Todd Graham and Mike Norvell arrived in Tempe that the team accomplished the feat. To put that in perspective, ASU eclipsed 50 points 10 times total in the previous 10 years before the current coaching regime (2001-11). Putting points on the scoreboard won't typically be a problem with Norvell heading the offense, as ASU eclipsed 50 points six times in games in 2013, breaking the school record held by the 1973 team. ASU went 86 games without scoring 60 from 2005-2011. Under Coach Graham it has scored 60 three times (63 NAU, 62 Navy, 62 USC). The Sun Devils finished 10th nationally last at 39.7 points per game and scored 556 total points, just six points behind the 1972 school record. ASU is currently 13th nationally in scoring offense, averaging 41.2 points per game. ASU's 43.7 points per game in non-conference games since 2012 is the seventh-highest average in the FBS in that time.

**BETTER SUITED FOR HANDKERCHIEFS** The Sun Devils don't give referees much reason to reach for their pockets under Todd Graham. In each of his eight seasons as a head coach, Graham's teams have been consistently ranked among in the top half of the least penalized teams in the country in both yards and penalties per game. The Sun Devils have just 27 penalties for 214 yards this season, ranked 15th in fewest penaltities and 10th in fewest penalty yards in D-I this season. In 2013, the Sun Devils finished eighth in fewest penalties per game (4.00) and seventh in fewest penalty yards per game (31.4).

MORE ON PENALTIES Todd Graham has had a knack for having some of the most disciplined teams in the nation when it comes to penalty yards. Seventeen of ASU's 20 least penalized games since 2006 have come under Todd Graham. Since Todd Graham arrived at Arizona State, the Sun Devils have had just 138 penalties in 32 games (4.3 penalties per game). The Sun Devils were penalized just four times for 30 yards against UNM and Weber State.

MAKE 'EM PAY ASU isn't in the habit of leaving points off the board following takeaways. The Sun Devils took advantage of three takeaways against CU for a 14-0 scoring advantage in points of takeaways, which also represented the winning margin of the game, and has outscored the opposition 35-24 in the category this year. In 2013, ASU outscored its opponents 146-42 on points off turnovers while posting a +15 takeaway number. ASU put points on the board following 75.8 percent of opponent turnovers (25-of-33) compared to just the 33.3 (6-of-18) percent clip ASU opponents scored off of Sun Devil turnovers. ASU had 18 touchdowns in 2013 on 33 opponent turnovers, aided by five interception returns for touchdowns. In 2012, the Sun Devil offense put points in the bank on 70.0 of its conversion opportunities, scoring 18 touchdowns off of 30 turnovers forced. ASU outscored opponents 139-58 in points off turnovers over the course of that year, despite

posting just a middling +6 number in the takeaway category. That year, ASU's opponents scored on just 41.7 percent of their drives following an ASU turnover and scored just seven touchdowns on 24 turnovers. In three years under Todd Graham, ASU has outscored opponents 310-124 in points off takeaways.

**TURNOVER FACTORY** The Sun Devils streak of 29 consecutive games forcing a turnover game to a hault against Weber State, bringing an end to what was the second-longest active streak in the nation. <u>ASU has rebounded with six takeaways in the last three contests</u>. Last season, ASU led the Pac-12 with 33 takeaways in 2013, finishing fifth nationally. The team was seventh nationally with a 1.1 turnover margin. The squad had forced <u>69 turnovers under Todd Graham in the last three seasons, the seventh-highest total in the country in that span. In the Pac-12, only Oregon, ASU and Washington have had a positive turnover ration in each of the last three seasons. Additionally, ASU is the only team in the league with at least 30 takeaways in each of those seasons.</u>

GOLD ZONE One area that saw improvement last season for the Sun Devils was red zone offense, with ASU putting points on the board 91.3 percent of the time against FBS opponents in 2013, finishing sixth nationally in the category, as per TeamRankings.com. ASU has picked up where it left off so far this season, scoring on 21 of its 23 trips inside the red zone this season (91.3 percent), racking up 16 touchdowns in that streak and ranked 21st in the nation conversion percentage. In 2012, ASU scored on just 76.1 percent of their drives inside the 20 and ranked a lowly 93rd in the nation against FBS opponents. On the flip side, ASU allowed its FBS opponents to score 88.9 percent of the time in 2013 when entering the red zone (ranked 106th nationally). ASU has held its opponents to 16 scores in 19 red zone appearances this season (80.0 percent) - good for 74th nationally - but has given up just 11 touchdowns in that span, which is ranked 60th nationally.

WINNING THE BATTLE FOR FIELD POSITION The Sun Devils are largely exceptional when it comes to starting field position and continue to resonate a point Todd Graham makes about being successful in the field position battle to win games. Under Todd Graham, ASU has had an average starting yard line of its own 35.3 in 22 victories compared to a starting yard line of the 25.4 for their opponents in such contests. ASU has allowed just three drives to start inside its own territory thus far this season. Conversely, opponents have an average starting field position of their own 33.4 yard line compared to ASU starting at its own 28.3 in ASU's 10 losses under Graham. in 2012, ASU posted an average starting spot of its own 33-yard line that ranked 10th in the nation, according to the folks at Football Outsiders (www.footballoutsiders.com) and in 2013, the team ranked 13th nationally (average starting yard line: 33.3). The Sun Devils also held their opponents to an average starting line of their own 28-yard-line, a total that ranked 24th nationally in 2012, though the squad dropped a bit to 32nd last season (average opp. starting yardline: 28.2). ASU had 10 scoring drives of 80 yards or longer in 2013, a notable feat as ASU had six such drives in the entirety of the 2012 season. ASU has had four such drives this season, including a school-record matching 99-yard drive against Weber State that was ASU's longest drive since a 99-yard drive in 2008 against Northern Arizona.

CLOSING THINGS OUT ASU has outscored other teams 291-193 in the fourth quarter under Todd Graham. ASU finished 10th in the nation in points per fourth quarter in 2013 against FBS opposition (9.9) after finishing the 2012 season with 9.3 points per fourth quarter, which was good for eighth nationally. ASU's 16.8 second-half points per game against FBS squads in 2013 was 24th nationally.

USE THEM WISELY Todd Graham doesn't hesitate to use his alotted three timeouts per half when his squad is on defense, a coaching technique that has plenty of detractors. A closer look at the result of the play following those timeouts might quiet some, however. Since the start of the 2012 season, ASU has used 41 timeouts on defense in third down situations, forcing fourth down or a turnover on the ensuing play on 28 of those occassions (68.3 percent).

GOLD RUSH The Sun Devils rushing offense has been off with a bang thus far this season, averaging 216.4 yards per game thus far - the 28th-highest total in the nation - even despite lackluster numbers in each of the last two games. ASU put up 423 yards on the ground against UNM for its first 400+ yard rushing game since logging 405 against Oregon in 1997. The Sun Devils already have seven rushing plays over 40 yards this season and are sixth nationally in the category, notable as the squad had just five total 40+ yard rushes in the entirety of last season. ASU finished the 2012 season averaging 205.5 yards per game on the ground, which was the second-best mark in the past 25 seasons (since 1988). Only the 234.1 yards per game put up by the 1996 Sun Devils were better. It was a little bit of a slow start for the Sun Devils in 2013 but the team found its running legs by the end, averaging 191.4 yards per game and ranked 40th nationally. Even after ASU's slow start to the season in the category, the squad still posted the fourth-highest single season rushing mark of the last 25 seasons. The Sun Devils are currently averaging 5.82 yards per rush this season, and ranked 13th nationally in the category and

despite the early nature of things, it can be noted that ASU has not finished in the top 50 in yards per rush since before the 2008 season.

ROAD WARRIORS Winning away from home in college football is difficult, especially in conference games. Under Coach Todd Graham, ASU is beginning to assemble a pretty good resume of road/neutral site victories. In 2013, ASU garnered three straight road wins (at Washington State, at Utah and at #14 UCLA) and are now winners of six straight road contests and seven of the last eight road games under Graham. ASU now has 10 road wins in the past 15 road games, including eight Pac-12 Conference road wins in the past 11 Pac-12 road games. Graham has eight Pac-12 road victories under his belt already, tied for the second-most among all ASU coaches since 1980 behind only Bruce Snyder's 18 from 1992-2000. Prior to UNM, ASU had not won a non-conference road-game since defeating a then non-conference Colorado team in Boulder, 21-3, in 2006. ASU also had not won its first road game of the season since 2007 - a 41-3 rout over Stanford in Palo Alto. In four seasons prior to Todd Graham, ASU was 5-13 in conference road games while Graham has led the squad to a 7-3 record in such games in his three seasons at the helm. Additionally, in three seasons at the helm, Graham has won three regular season games in the state of California - as many as it had won in the state in the previous decade. All three were also conference wins, as many as ASU had won in California in the past 13 seasons.

**EXPLOSIVE** You'd be hard-pressed to listen to a Todd Graham press conference that didn't involve the word "explosive" at some point as the head coach makes no attempt to hide the fact that that's what he wants his team to be. The Sun Devils have a classification of "explosive plays" that equal a run of 12 or more yards or a passing play of 16 or more yards. ASU has 68 explosive plays (41 passing, 27 rushing) this season. ASU finished with 142 such plays in 2013 (82 passing, 60 rushing) and 165 (90 passing, 75 rushing) in 2012. The Sun Devils finished the season tied for seventh in the nation in plays longer than 20 yards in 2013 with 86 after having 72 in 2012, which was good for 19th in the country in the category. ASU is currently ninth nationally with 12 plays over 40 yards this season and 26th nationally in plays of 20 or more yards with 35. There's always two sides to every tale, however, and the Sun Devil defense has also been prone to the big play this season, giving up 101plays of over 40 yards this season - tied for the 10th-worst mark in the country in that regard.

PROTECT THIS HOUSE Following the loss to UCLA, ASU is now 12-4 at Sun Devil Stadium under Todd Graham. With the loss to Stanford in the Pac-12 Championship, ASU finished last season with a 7-1 record at Sun Devil Stadium.. The 2013 season marked just the second time ASU has gone undefeated at home in the regular season in the past 16 seasons (since 1997), also going 6-0 in 2004. ASU also had a perfect record at home in '59, '64, '68, '70, '71, '73, '75, '81 and '96. After 13 games under Todd Graham, the Sun Devils have averaged 46.0 points per game at home. The lowest score the Devils have recorded in a regular season home game under Graham is 21 against Oregon in 2012 - the only regular season game under Graham that ASU has scored less than 30 points - and ASU has scored 20 or more in 21 consecutive regular season home games, dating back to 2010. ASU's 49.1 points per game at home in 2013 were sixth in the nation, just shy of the school record for scoring offense at home, which was 49.2 points set by the 1972 team. The Sun Devils are 269-99-3 (.727) all-time at Sun Devil Stadium since 1958, the 24th-highest active winning percentage in a stadium among all FBS schools.

A BIG GAME Games between two highly ranked teams are not always commonplace at Sun Devil Stadium. Saturday's contest represents just the second regular season game (the other being the UCLA game this year as well) between two AP-ranked teams in Tempe since 2007 (a 44-24 loss to then-No. 11 USC while ASU was ranked No. 7). In fact, in Sun Devil Stadium's history there have only been 28 regular season games that featured two teams ranked in the AP Top 25.

**RUN THE CLOCK** One of the biggest areas of improvement for the Sun Devils in 2013 was the clock management side of things. In 2012, ASU ranked seventh in the Pac-12 and 80th nationally in time of possession, holding the ball an average of 29:15 per game. In 2013, ASU averaged 30:21 minutes of possession time per game - a total that ranked fourth in the conference and 51st nationally. The team had 13 scoring drives over four minutes in 2013, compared to just three in 2012. In 2014, ASU is currently averaging 27:41 minutes of possession per game. "So, ASU's offense scores fast and thus time of possession is irrelevent," you say? Not so fast, my friend. ASU is 12-3 when leading in time of possession under Todd Graham compared to a 10-7 record when trailing in the time of possession category, though three of those victories have come this season.

IN-ZANE IN THE MEMBRANE Zane Gonzalez is averaging 9.0 points per game thus far this season, tied for 32nd among nationally and his 83.3 percent field goal percentage on 5-of-6 kicking is currently tied for 22nd nationally. Gonzalez finished the 2013 season hitting 25 of 30 field goals (83.3 percent) and booted 63 of 65 extra points. Gonzalez finished No. 10 in the nation in scoring at 9.9 points per game and led the Pac-12 kick scoring category by a large margin. The next kicker on the list was

Stanford's Jordan Williamson at 8.8. His 138 points by kick scoring were No. 1 in the Pac-12, far ahead of No. 2 Travis Coons of Colorado (107 points). Gonzalez was No. 1 in the Pac-12 in field goals at 1.7 per game. Gonzalez led the Pac-12 with 25 field goals, seven ahead of Williamson's 18 field goals this season. Gonzalez was named one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award, given annually to the nation's top kicker.

**FG-ONZAL-EZ** Gonzalez finished with 138 points last season, breaking the long-standing school record in the category that was previous held by Wilford White's 136 in 1950. Gonzalez's 138 points demolished the previous scoring record by an ASU kicker that was 118, set by Thomas Weber (2007) and Mike Barth (2002). With 25 field goals last season, Gonzalez tied the NCAA freshman record of 25 that was set by UCLA's Kai Forbath in 2007 (25-30) and made more field goals than any other player in the FBS in the process and four more than any other freshman in the nation. <u>Gonzalez is currently third NCAA active</u> D-I leader list in field goals made per game in a career at 1.67.

HAACK LIKE A MAN ASU punter Matt Haack (pronounced 'hawk') is having perhaps the single most impressive turnaround from one season to the next this year. The sophomore punter averaged just 38.2 yards per punt last year on an ASU squad that ranked near the bottom of the FBS in the category. Haack has bumped that average to 42.5 this season with seven of his 21 punts downed inside the 20 and a long of 57 with a monster game against Colorado that saw him average 48.1 yards on seven punts - the third highest single game average for an ASU punter under Todd Graham and the highest since 2012. Haack's 42.5 yard average is currently ranked 49th nationally and fourth in the Pac-12.

MAKE SURE THE SAFETY IS ON ASU's starting safties Damarious Randall and Jordan Simone have been doing their part as the last line of defense for the Sun Devils. The duo leads the team in tackles with 51 and 45, respectively. Their combined 96 tackles this season are 26.3 percent of the total tackles made by the Sun Devils this season. Randall has done much of the work on his own, accounting for 47 solo tackles on his 51 total tackles - a 9.4 solo tackle per game average that currently is tops in the country while Simone isn't far behind in 13th with 6.4 solo tackles per game. Randall's 10.2 total tackles per game are currently 22nd nationally and third in the Pac-12.

**SIMONE SAYS** Safety Jordan Simone had the game of a lifetime against USC, logging a team-leading 20 tackles. It was the most tackles for a Sun Devil player in a game since Mark Tingstad also had 20 against Arizona in 1988. Simone is currently second on the team with 45 tackles this season. Against Colorado, he had his first career interception and fumble forced and also had a key fourth down goalline stop in the game to essentially count for three Buffalo turnovers. His 13 tackles were the fourth-highest single-game tally by a Todd Graham coached Sun Devil in the past three seasons at the time (Damarious Randall had 17 at Notre Dame last season, Brandon Magee had 17 at Arizona in 2012 and Chris Young had 14 at Utah last season).

TODD-BITS OF INFO Over his four seasons prior to coming to ASU — one at Pittsburgh and three at Tulsa — Todd Graham's teams rushed the ball on at least 53.4 percent of their total plays. The 2012 Sun Devils rushed the ball on 59.1 percent of their total plays followed by a 55.2 percent tally in 2013. In 2011, ASU rushed just 44.5 percent of the time. Over the past eight seasons at Pitt, Tulsa, Rice and now ASU, only one Graham-coached team has ranked outside the top 50 nationally in sacks. The Sun Devils averaged 4.0 sacks per game in 2012, the second-best mark in the nation, and then 2.9 in 2013 to finish 17th nationally in the category. In eight seasons, Graham is 25-22 in true road games. ASU was 3-3 in such games in 2012 and 3-2 in road games in 2013. In the previous four seasons prior to Graham's arrival, ASU was 5-16. In seven of the past eight years, Graham's teams have ranked 39th or better nationally in fewest penalty yards per game. The Sun Devils averaged only 34.92 penalty yards per game in 2012, which was good for eighth in the nation, and bettered that in 2013 at just 31.36 penalty yards per game (seventh nationally).

HANG ON TO YOUR SEATS ASU played in four games in 2013 decided by seven points or less, going 3-1 in those contests. The total is notable as ASU was just 4-13 in the previous four seasons in games decided by less than a touchdown. ASU is 1-0 this season in games decides by less than a touchdown following the 38-34 victory over USC. ASU has now gone 5-1 in games decided by a touchdown or less since the 2012 Arizona comeback in Tucson. To put that in perspective, ASU had gone 6-16 in such games since the 2007 season.

**TODD'S WINNING WAYS** At one point ranked 11th in the AP Poll, Todd Graham achieved his highest ranking as a head coach in his career in 2013. The team also peaked at 11th in the BCS standings, also a new high for Graham. Graham has won 22 games in his first three seasons at Arizona State. To put that into perspective, its took Frank Kush until the third game of his third season to reach the 20-win

plateau whereas it took Graham until the second game of his third season. Of all the coaching hires made prior to the 2012 season, Graham has posted the fifth-best record at 22-10, half a game behind UCLA's Jim Mora at 23-10 and Fresno State's Tim DeRuyter (22-9) with only Urban Meyer (28-3) and Kevin Sumlin (25-8) ahead of them.

**TAKING DOWN THE TOP** ASU was 3-2 last season against team's ranked in the AP Top-25 Poll. ASU defeated No. 20 Wisconsin, No. 20 Washington and No. 14 UCLA in 2013 while losing to Stanford twice. ASU's three victories were the most since 1997 when the team went 3-1 against teams ranked in the AP poll. ASU's current schedule puts the team on a collision course with three consecutive AP Top-25 teams (UCLA, USC, Stanford), a streak that ASU has faced only twice in program history. The last that happened was 2001, where ASU went 0-3 against #13 Washington, #8 Oregon and #11 Washington State. In 1994, ASU defeated #20 BYU in between losses to #23 Washington State and #21 Oregon.

SCHOLAR-BALLERS The Sun Devils have had a recent history of putting numerous student-athletes on the field that have already earned their degrees and the 2014 roster is no different. ASU will feature eight players this season that have earned their undergraduate degrees and will be pursuing graduate coursework. That total ranks in a tie for 13th nationally and is tops amoung Pac-12 institutions. Additionally. ASU has 40 student-athletes on its roster that are members of Sun Devil Athletics' Scholar-Baller Program, which honors athletes who maintain over a 3.00 GPA in the classroom. The Sun Devils are also the only team in the nation to have two players tabbed as Senior CLASS Award candidates in Taylor Kelly and Jamil Douglas.

WINNING BY WAY OF TKO (TAYLOR KELLY OFFENSE) Following the CU contest (13-for-21, 195 yards, three TDs, no INTs), Taylor Kelly now has 7,390 career passing yards, good for fourth in school history and closing in on Jake Plummer for third. His three TD passes against Colorado also give him 63 for his career, good for fifth in school history and just one behind Danny White for fourth. In 14 games in 2013, Kelly had 3,635 passing yards and averaged 259.6 yards per game, both need in the top five in school history. He is just the second Sun Devil to have multiple seasons with 3,000+ passing yards behind only Andrew Walter (3). Statistically, the team relies heavily on Kelly's ball protection, as ASU is 6-8 with Kelly as the starter when he throws an interception, compared to a 15-1 record when he doesn't - the lone loss coming in the Pac-12 Championship game last season against Stanford. All six of the victories with interceptions came in 2013, showing an improved ability to overcome adversity at the hands of turnovers. Kelly finished last season ranked 13th nationally in points responsible for with 222 (28 passing TDs, nine rushing), breaking the previous school record in the category of 198 previously set by Mike Pagel in 1981. Kelly is responsible for 75 touchdowns in his career (63 passing, 12 rushing) - good for the fourth-highest total among all ASU quarterbacks

**VETERAN LEADERSHIP** There won't be a lot of turnover in the Pac-12 this season at the quarterback position. All but two teams return their starting quarterback from last season. Even with that in mind, Kelly is currently tied with UCLA's Brett Hundley with the second-most career starts for a QB in the conference at 30. Only Sean Mannion (34) has more starts in his career, leading the nation's active quarterbacks in the category. In fact, among all power conference programs, only Rutgers' Gary Nova (31 starts) has more than Kelly and Hundley following the injury to Ohio State's Braxton Miller (34 career starts would have led the country entering the season).

HE'S GOT LEGS, AND HE KNOWS HOW TO USE THEM Taylor Kelly has done plenty to get it done through the air, but its his aptitude in the running game that has made him as potent a quarterback. Kelly has rushed 19 times for 168 yards (8.8 ypc) with two TDs this season. His ability to extend plays has been exceptional from the start, as demonstrated by his 516 net rushing yards on 134 attempts in 2012 - a mark skewed by the fact that sacks count against a quarterback's rushing totals. If you take out sacks, Kelly would have led the team in yardage and yards per carry with 690 net rushing yards in 2012 on 103 carries (6.7 ypc). Sacks aside in 2013, Kelly had 826 rushing yards on 134 attempts (6.2 ypc) and was on fire in the final nine games with nine rushing touchdowns while rushing for 599 yards (sacks excluded) on 106 carries (5.7 yards per rush). Those nine touchdowns

were notable as Kelly had just one rushing touchdown in 18 games prior to the season-ending streak. Kelly was second on the team last season with 43 rushes for first down, trailing only Marion Grice (45). He was also second on the team in "explosive plays" on the ground (rushes of 12 or more yards) with 18 in 2013, trailing only Marion Grice's 19. Kelly has 1.316 rushing yards in his career - the second most of any ASU quarterback in program history. Additionally, Kelly has now punted 15 times in his career, with 11 of those being downed inside of the 20-yard line - including one in the opener against Weber State.

**TAYLOR MADE ON THIRFD DOWN** The senior quarterback led the team in third down rushes in 2013 with 30. Fifteen of those went for a first down and six for for a touchdown, more than the entire team had combined on third down on the season, rushing or receiving (3). Kelly averaged a team leading 7.6 yards per rush on third down and finished tied for second nationally in touchdown rushes on third down with six. Kelly has rushed three on third down this season, logging one first down and averaging a team-leading 6.7 yards per rush on those attempts..

**TEMPE**, **Ariz.** (**AP**) - Ishmael Adams gave UCLA a boost with a 95-yard interception return for a touchdown just before halftime and followed with a 100-yard kickoff return for another score in the third quarter, sparking the 11th-ranked Bruins to a 62-27 rout against No. 15 Arizona State on Thursday night.

UCLA (4-0, 1-0 Pac-12) won its first three games by a combined 18 points against non-ranked opponents, raising questions about just how good the Bruins are this season.

They provided an emphatic answer — at least on offense — by turning a matchup of the past two Pac-12 South champions into a rout, scoring 28 points during a 7-minute span of the second and third quarters.

UCLA had 582 yards of total offense, five plays of 80 yards or longer and scored the most points in the 55-year-history of Sun Devil Stadium.

Arizona State (3-1, 1-1) ran a staggering 105 plays and gained 626 yards against the young Bruins' defense.

Mike Bercovici showed flashes of brilliance in replacing injured starter Taylor Kelly, throwing for 488 yards and three touchdowns in his first start while setting school records with 42 completions on 68 attempts.

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Jaelen Strong caught a 46-yard touchdown pass from Mike Bercovici as time expired, and Arizona State scored three TDs in the final 3:53 to shock No. 16 Southern California 38-34 on Saturday night.

Bercovici capped his 510-yard, five-touchdown passing performance with his third scoring pass to Strong, who slipped in front of USC's Hayes Pullard at the goal line and pulled in the Hail Mary, walking into the end zone stunningly untouched.

Bercovici followed up his record-setting, 488-yard passing performance against UCLA with an even bigger night, also hitting Strong for a 77-yard TD midway through the second quarter while filling in for injured Taylor Kelly.

Cody Kessler passed for 273 yards for the Trojans (3-2, 2-1), who led 34-25 with 3 minutes to play, USC recovered two onside kicks and got a 53-yard TD run by Buck Allen in the final minutes, but the Trojans' pass defense — which hadn't allowed a touchdown pass all season — repeatedly came unglued.

Arizona State has won three of the schools' last four meetings, including a 62-41 victory in Tempe last season that led to USC coach Lane Kiffin's firing a few hours later. Sarkisian's first loss to the Sun Devils also stings in a totally different way.

Kessler scrambled for an 8-yard TD in the fourth quarter, and Allen rushed for 143 yards and two TDs for the Trojans, who appeared to be on the way to an impressive win. USC's defense held the Pac-12's best rushing offense to 31 yards, a whopping 231 below its average

## TODD GRAHAM

COACH OF THE YEAR 71-39 OVERALL 22-10 AT ASU (15-6 PAC-12)

Coming off an outstanding inaugural campaign as Sun Devil head football coach, Todd Graham enjoyed much success in his second season and will be looking for his second straight bowl win at the helm of the ASU program.

Coach Graham earned Pac-12 Coach of the Year honors last season as he led the Sun Devils to a 10-4 record, the Pac-12 South Division Title and a berth in the Holiday Bowl, the program's third consecutive bowl game. He was also named a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award.

The Sun Devils hosted the Pac-12 Championship game after winning a conference-best eight Pac-12 regular season games to match a school record set in 1996. Notable games included the team's second consecutive Territorial Cup® win, as well as home victories over top-20 opponents Wisconsin and Washington, and a road win over then-No. 14 UCLA.

ASU was ranked in the top 25 of the AP Poll nine weeks last season, including seven consecutive weeks to end the season, and moved up as high as No. 11 in the Dec. 1 poll, the highest December ranking for the Sun Devils since 1996.

The program has become one of the least penalized in the nation since Coach Graham's arrival in 2012, and this season the Devils rank seventh nationally in penalties per game (3.7) and fourth in penalty yards per game at (29.2), and lead the Pac-12 in both categories.

A staple of Coach Graham's attacking defense, the Sun Devils have forced a turnover in 26 consecutive games, the second-longest active streak among all FBS institutions, and have recorded 21 interceptions this season, including five returned for touchdowns.

On the other side of the ball, Coach Graham's high-octane offense has eclipsed 50 points in six games this season to break the school record held by the 1973 team.

Under Graham's tutelage, All-American defensive lineman Will Sutton became one of the elite linemen in ASU history and became just the second player in Pac-10/12 hsitory to win the Pat Tillman Defensive Player of the Year Award in two consecutive seasons.

Among the accomplishments of last year's Sun Devil football team:

 At 8-5, the Sun Devils posted their first winning regular season since going 10-2 in 2007.

- ASU ended the season with three straight wins for the first time since 1978 and just the 14th time in school history.
- ASU beat Arizona in dramatic fashion in Tucson to reclaim the Territo-
- The Sun Devils won a bowl game for the first time since 2005 and the 13th time in school history.
- · ASU was one of just four Pac-12 teams to win at least three conference road games (3-2), doing so for just the fifth time in the program's Pac-10/12 history.
- One year after finishing last (120th) in the FBS in penalties and penalty yards per game, Graham brought immediate discipline to the program as evidenced by the Sun Devils finishing the 2012 season tied for 10th in fewest penalties per game (4.23) and eighth in fewest penalty yards per game (34.92).

Employing an approach that emphasizes excellent fundamentals and hard and disciplined play, the Sun Devils' extraordinary improvement on defense played a paramount role in the team's turnaround last season. After finishing at or near the bottom of the Pac-12 in several defensive categories in 2011, the Sun Devils experienced an amazing reversal last season as they led the conference in tackles for loss (No. 1 in the nation), pass defense (No. 3 in the nation), and pass efficiency defense (No. 10 in the nation) and finished second in the league in sacks (No. 2 in the nation), interceptions (No. 4 in the nation) and total defense.

In addition to distinguishing himself as an exceptional leader, Graham has also developed a reputation for identifying and hiring some of the nation's top assistant coaches. The teaching and instruction done by Graham and his first Sun Devil staff were responsible for several exceptional achievements in 2012:

• The Sun Devils finished No. 14 in the country in scoring offense (38.3

ppg), scoring 40 or more points seven times.
• In his first season as the full-time starter, quarterback Taylor Kelly set the school single-season record for completion percentage (67.1). Kelly also finished tied for second in single-season school annals with 29 touchdown passes.

 Running back Marion Grice found the end zone 19 times, tying him for third on ASU's all-time single-season touchdown while his 114 points tied him for fifth on ASU's all-time single season scoring list.

• Tight end Chris Coyle set the school's single-season record for receptions by a tight end with 57, one more than Zach Miller had in 2004.

 Punter Josh Hubner finished second in the nation in net punting, helping the Sun Devils finish No. 7 in the nation as a team.

Off the field, the changes were just as obvious. Graham overhauled the football offices, leading a complete facelift that saw new, engaging wallpaper placed throughout the third floor at Carson Center that shows off ASU"s rich history as well as the goals and expectations as a program.

The Sun Devils improved immensely in the classroom as well, with football student-athletes missing just 19 total classes in his first year at the helm - down from 141 the previous season. Additionally, the number of "Scholar-Ballers" (student-athletes with a 3.00 GPA or higher) on the team increased from 30 in 2010-11 to 51 this past season (2012-13). That is the highest total in the program history and makes up just under half of the Sun Devil roster.
