#BYTHENUMBERS

The Sun Devils and Titans are no strangers and have been perennial juggernauts on the West Coast, having squared off 63 times throughout history. The Devils lead the all-time series, 33-30, and have seen the Titans at least once in nine of the last ten seasons including 2017. Fullerton has been ranked in the Top 25 in eight of those matchups and in the Top 10 three times, including this season. ASU took two from Fullerton on the road last season.

ASU has certainly taken its lumps the first time through the order, not posting a combined team average in any of the first three innings of games over .256. Adjustments have been a key part of ASU's offensive approach, with team averages above .273 in each of the remaining innings of games including .300+ marks in the fifth, eighth and ninth innings. The Devils have scored 51 of their 57 runs (89.5) percent) in innings 4-9 this year.

Freshman Lyle Lin is currently second in the Pac-12 Conference with 20 hits this season. Lin has had three or more hits in three games and has multiple hits in eight of the 11 games so far this season. No other Sun Devil has more than three. Through 11 games last season, no Sun Devil had more than 5 multi-hit games and just one freshman had a single multi-hit game. Lin is batting .476 this season when facing two outs, with no other Sun Devil with more than 6 2-out hits.

Eli Lingos has been absolutely exceptional in three starts this season, going 3-0 with three quality starts. Lingos has gone over 6.0 IP in each of his appearances this season after neving having consecutive games over 6.0 IP in his career prior to this season. The junior lefty has allowed no earned runs in two of his three starts this season, something he had done in a start just once in his career. His three wins this season match his 2016 total while he has issued no walks in two of three starts this season, something he had accomplished in just two starts prior to 2017.

Interview Policy

Arizona State will typically host weekly media availability every Tuesday and Wednesday at Phoenix Municipal Stadium prior to practice at approximately 1 p.m. On weeks of a Tuesday midweek game at home, the Tuesday postgame press conference will serve as the week's availability. Media planning to attend must contact Jeremy Hawkes ahead of time and inform him of their plans. Throughout the season's schedule, ASU will host postgame interviews in the Omaha Room located in the home locker room following after coach's postgame talk with the team. Media members must request players at the beginning of the ninth inning (or earlier in games that look to be blowouts). Please contact Jeremy Hawkes or a member of the media relations staff in the press box to coordinate those interviews. Media members who wish to schedule an interview outside of practice must contact Jeremy Hawkes.

Photography/Videoography

Accomodations for B-Roll purposes at practice can be made through Jeremy Hawkes (jdhawkes@asu.edu). During games, credentials must be worn in plain view throughout the game while on the field and all photographers must adhere to painted lines and instructions given by security personnel and/or Arizona State staff members at all times. Shooting areas are designated camera wells on the far side of both the visitor's and home team's dugouts. Contact Jeremy Hawkes for any details regarding shooting game action.

Media Highlights Policy

Highlights include Pac-12 Networks/ESPN/FOX broadcasts and all home hosted non-televised competitions, including those that are live streamed. ESPN networks (i.e., ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU) will also televise all NCAA College World Series games from Saturday, June 17, through Wednesday, June 28. No other broadcast network or Internet entity, other than ESPN, may air these games, nor show highlights of these games until the ESPN broadcast is off the air. Broadcast networks / television stations may use up to three (3) minutes (per newscast) of video footage from any one game or five (5) minutes total of video footage from all games played on that particular day of competition for up to 72 hours following the game / broadcast. No media entity (commercial or noncommercial) is allowed to display any game video on its website. If a commercial broadcast entity wishes to license video footage beyond the previously described time period (72 hours), all requests to obtain clips or copies of NCAA championships / events (e.g., game / program records, melt / highlight tapes) need to go through the NCAA / T3 Media online footage request system, which can be found at the following website: http://www.t3licensing.com/video/home/ncaa.do.

2017 Media Coverage

There will be no shortage of ways to follow the Sun Devils throughout the 2017 campaign as a record 43 of ASU's 55 total games this season will be broadcast on television or via live stream. Every single one of the Sun Devils' 33 home games will be available to fans via the Pac-12 Networks or the Pac-12 Live Stream online and a total of 17 games overall are scheduled to be televised live through the Pac-12 Networks.

The Sun Devil Sports Radio Network is scheduled to broadcast 35 Sun Devil Baseball games this season between NBC Sports Radio AM 1060 and 100.7 KSLXHD. Fans can listen to the broadcasts on the radio or via the Tuneln app on thesundevils.com. Links to the streaming audio can be found on the online baseball schedule.

Tim Healey is set to serve his 19th season as the "Voice of the Sun Devils" on baseball broadcasts and will be joined for the second-straight season by color analyst Max Rossiter, who was an all-conference catcher for the Devils from 2012-13.

Head Coach Tracy Smith's weekly radio show, "Dugout Chatter," will debut on March 29 on NBC Sports Radio AM 1060. The 30-minute show will run each Wednesday at 8 p.m. for nine weeks and is hosted by the Tim Healey.

Newcomers Drafted

TEMPE -- The Sun Devils continue a lengthy homestand with a two-game midweek set against No. 7 Cal State Fullerton this week at Phoenix Municipal Stadium, carrying on a streak of 11 home games in an 18-day span in the month of March. The Devils have not played 11 games in the month before March 20 since the 2013 season. The two-game series will get underway Tuesday, Feb. 7 at 6:30 p.m. MT with Wednesday's contest following at the exact same time.

Scouting the Titans

- After claiming their 21st Big West Conference title a year ago and their sixth in the
 last seven years, the Titans are the favorites to do it again in 2017, as Cal State Fullerton has been picked as the team to beat in the Big West Conference, according
 to the nine league coaches that voted on the Big West baseball preseason poll.
- For the Titans, it'll be a good mix of returners and newcomers that should make up a
 team worthy of its top-10 preseason ranking. Fullerton welcomes back 21 letterwinners from a year ago, including four all-conference performers from 2016 in sophomore Colton Eastman (RHP), senior Timmy Richards (INF), junior Connor Seabold
 (RHP) and junior John Gavin (LHP).
- The Titans will also be under the leadership of four-time Big West Coach of the Year Rick Vanderhook, who enters his sixth season as head coach.
- The returners will be joined by a recruiting class that ranked 21st in the nation according to Collegiate Baseball, which includes six pitchers, four infielders, one outfielder and one catcher.
- The Titans entered the 2017 season ranked in every national preseason poll, with Baseball America awarding Cal State Fullerton with the highest ranking of eighth. This is the Titans' highest placing in the poll since being ranked No. 1 in the 2014 preseason poll.

Devils vs. Fullerton/Big West

- The Devils are no strangers to fellow West Coast juggernaut Cal State Fullerton, having squared off against the Titans 63 times in history and owning a 33-30 series advantage.
- After this weekend, the two teams will have seen each other in nine of the last 10 seasons with Fullerton entering those contests ranked in the Top 25 eight times and ranked in the Top 10 three times, including this season.
- ASU took two games against the Titans last season, a year removed from being eliminated from the 2015 postseason by CSUF in Fullerton.
- The Devils have habitually had an exceptional track record against the Big West, holding a 213-97 all-time record against opponents currently in the conference and not having a losing record against any of the nine teams in the league.

Eli's Coming

- Eli Lingos, who earned first team Pac-12 All-Academic honors in 2016, has quickly solidified himself as the team's ace this season after entering the year as the Friday Night Starter
- Lingos has opened the 2017 season with a bang, going 3-0 with three quality starts
 in his first three appearances of the season. Among those wins (currently ranked
 second nationally) are an upset over unaminous No. 1 TCU and a career-best 7.2 IP
 outing against LMU in which he allowed no runs.

Mr. Friday Night

- Lingos is the sixth pitcher since 2014 to assume the Friday Night role, joining Ryan Burr, Brett Lilek, Seth Martinez, Ryan Kellogg and Hever Bueno.
- ASU used four pitchers in the Friday night role in six seasons between 2008 and 2013 with Mike Leake ('08, '09), Seth Blair ('10), Brady Rodgers ('11, '12) and Trevor Williams ('13).
- Lingos joins a long and illustrious line of Mr. Friday Night's at ASU that includes nine Major Leaguers and numerous ASU Hall of Famers, including Eddie Bane, Floyd Bannister, Kendall Carter, Mike Esposito, Larry Gura, Gary Gentry, Mike Leake, Trevor Williams and Brady Rodgers.

Lin-Sanity

- True freshman Lyle Lin continues to be the highlight of a young freshmen class, second in the Pac-12 Conference with 20 hits this season.
- Lin has had three or more hits in three games on the year while
 registering multiple hits in eight of 11 games on the season
 overall. Through 11 games in 2016, no other Sun Devil had
 more than five multi-hit games and only one freshman (Gage
 Canning) had a single multi-hit game to that point.
- Lin has started every game this season, one of just three players to do so batting .435 with a team-leading 11 RBI in the process, ranking 11th and 6th in the Pac-12 Conference in those categories, respectively.

Re-LYLE-able

- Lyle Lin has an approach at the plate that is tough to find in many freshman. The youngster lead's the team's starters with a .476 average this season with two outs on the board on 10-of-21 hitting. No other Devil has more than six 2-out hits.
- Lin leads the team with six two-out RBIs and also holds a teamleading 10 hits with runners in scoring position on 20 at bats (.500), five more than the next closest Devil.
- Lin is the only Sun Devil to reach base in each of ASU's 11 games this season.

Clutch Hitting

• The Sun Devils have lived and died by their clutch hitting this season, currently batting 25-of-77 (.325) with runners in scoring position in the team's wins but struggling to plate runners in the team's losses at just 9-of-47 (.191).

 The ASU offense has accounted for 23 two-out RBIs out of the team's 52 total RBIs in the first seven games this year (44.2 percent).

12-Gage

- Gage Canning holds the Devils longest hitting streak this season at seven games. Canning had a team-best 13-game hitting streak as a freshman in 2016.
- Canning has spent time at the leadoff spot and turning the
 order backaround in the nine-hole this year and done exactly
 what's expected of him in that role, stealing two bases, leading
 the team with 10 runs scored and laying down two sacrifice
 hunts
- Canning also leads the Devils with three doubles and two triples this season.

Freshmen Frenzy

- There were plenty of fresh faces on the diamond during the first couple games of the season for the Sun Devils. Ten true freshmen made their Sun Devil debuts, including six who made their first career starts (Sam Ferri, Carter Aldrete, Lyle Lin, Hunter Bishop, Myles Denson and Spencer Van Scoyoc).
- Chaz Montoya also received his first action in a closing role, responding with his first career save in his debut.
- Additionally, three junior college transfers made their debuts as Sun Devils in RHP Jake Godfrey, INF Jackson Willeford and INF Taylor Lane. Godfrey earned his first victory in his first appearance in the second game against Northwestern, not allowing a run in three innings pitched in the team's walk-off victory.

Small Ball

- The Devils have done the majority of their damage by manufacturing runs this season. Despite having the third-fewest extra base hits in the conference this year (25), the Devils still sit third in total hits (110).
- The Devils are third in the conference with 85 singles this season as well fourth in stolen bases (10), third in sacrifice flies (5) and have advanced runners a solid .471 percent of the time (99-of-210 oppurtunities).

Getting Their Bearings

- ASU has certainly taken its lumps the first time through the order, not posting a combined team average in any of the first three innings of games over .256 while combining for just six runs.
- Adjustments have been a key part of ASU's offensive approach, with team averages above .273 in each of the remaining innings of games including .300+ marks in the fifth, eighth and ninth innings.
- The Devils have scored 51 of their 57 runs (89.5 percent) in inning four through nine this season.

Not Wasting Time

 Freshman Spencer Van Scoyoc became the first Sun Devil freshman to start a game in the Opening Weekend since Adam

- Van Scoyoc pitched a gem in his start against #1 TCU, going
 6.0 innings with four strikeouts and no earned runs allowed in his first career quality start.
- Van Scoyoc currently sits eighth in the Pac-12 with a 1.35 ERA, good for third among all Pac-12 freshmen hurlers.
- Van Scoyoc was selected in the 19th round of the MLB Draft by the Toronto Blue Jays but elected to attend ASU instead.
- He was rated the #1 LHP and #1 overall player in Iowa and the #8 overal LHP in the nation.

There are eight Sun Devils on the 2017 squad who have a history of baseball in their family: Ryan Hingst (father, David, UT El Paso), Andrew Snow (cousin, Dustin Pedroia, Boston Red Sox), Garvin Alston Jr. (father, Garvin, MiLB), Eli Lingos (brother, Angelos, UC Riverside), Jackson Willeford (brother, Guy, Palomar JC; brother, Alex, Palomar JC/SDSU), Hunter Bishop (brother, Braden, Seattle Mariners), Fitz Stadler (Brothers Sullivan and Walker, Indiana), Carter Aldrete (father, Rich, MiLB; uncle, Mike, New York Yankees).

#Bishete

- Freshman outfielder Hunter Bishop and infielder Carter Aldrete have history before coming to Arizona State. Both played in the 2015 Under Armour All-American games and selected to play for the Oakland Athletics' Area Code team in 2015.
- Both hail from Northern California and are expected play prominent roles in the Sun Devil lineup this season.

Keeping It Interesting

- The Devils had a knack for success in close games last season and that continued on Opening Weekend. The Sun Devils scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later twice against Northwestern, including one walk-off win.
- Since 2016, the Devils are 6-1 in extra-inning games, with five walk-off wins (1 this season) and are 14-2 (2-1 this year) in onerun games including 5-1 in Pac-12 play. ASU has driven in the game-winning run in the eighth inning or later 12 times (twice this year).
- Arizona State has notched eighth wins since 2016 when trailing after six innings (twice this season).

#OccupyPHXMuni

- ASU drew more than 78,000 fans last season, finishing in the top 30 nationally in total attendance and attendance per game.
- ASU ranked 13th in total attendance and was the only school west of Texas to draw more than 100,000 fans in 2015, and ranked 18th in average attendance with 3,082 fans per game. ASU's 107,010 fans were the program's most since 2010 and ranked as the fourth-highest regular-season attendance since 1988.
- ASU moved back to Phoenix Municipal Stadium in 2015 after playing 40 seasons at Packard Stadium from 1974-2014,

- The Devils played 137 games at Muni from 1964-74, and went 111-26 at the stadium, including 17-6 against Arizona. ASU's first game at Muni was April 10, 1964, and was a 5-3 win over Arizona. ASU's last game at Muni was March 18, 1974, and was 9-6 win over Colorado. ASU won District 7 titles in 1965 and 1967 at Muni before going on to win National Championships in Omaha.
- Former Sun Devil and eventual Major League Baseball Hall of Famer Reggie Jackson was the first college player to hit a home run at Muni.

Erives On Fire

- Sun Devil Baseball senior RHP Eder Erives has been named to the preseason watch list for the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year Award, given to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball, members of the association announced Monday.
- Erives is the first Sun Devil to be named to the preseason watch list for the award since Ryan Burr in 2014.
- Erives, a Pac-12 All-Conference Honorable Mention in 2016, notched a 6-2 record with a 2.95 ERA last season. His 10 saves trailed only Oregon State's Max Englebrekt, whose 11 saves top the list of returning relievers in in the Pac-12.
- Last season, Erives struck out 73 batters and walked 36 in 76.1 innings. The 76.1 innings pitched rank fourth among the 55 players named to the watch list while his 73 strikeouts are good for seventh. Erives held opponent batting average to .192, a careerlow for the right-handed pitcher. He made 23 appearances with three starts and finished fourth in the conference in saves.
- Erives holds a 3.00 career ERA and a 9-4 record overall with 61 total appearances, three starts and 11 saves over 129 innings.

Streaking in February

- The Devils are 19-4 in series' played in the month of February over the past 12 years and have won 11 consecutive series on Opening Weekend.
- ASU had won 16 consecutive February series until dropping a three-game series against top-ranked TCU Feb. 20-22, 2015.
 Prior to that, the last time was Feb. 18-20, 2005 when they were swept by No. 1 Tulane on the road.

HEAD COACH TRACY SMITH



TRACY SMITH - HEAD COACH - THIRD SEASON (21st OVERALL)

Tracy Smith, the 2013 National Coach of the Year, was hired as the fifth head baseball coach in program history on June 24, 2014, and enters his third season at the helm of the Sun Devil baseball program.

Smith has established a reputation of evaluating and developing talent as more than 50 student-athletes since 2000 improved their stock in the Major League Baseball Draft under Smith's tutelage, including four who became first-round draft picks after going undrafted out of high school.

In 20 total years as a head coach, Smith has seen 68 of his players selected in the MLB Draft, including 61 draftees since 2000 and 31 in the first 10 rounds. He has mentored 36 Major League Baseball draft picks over the past eight seasons, including the fourth overall pick in the 2014 Major League Baseball June Amateur Draft (Kyle Schwarber) and three first-round selections in the 2009 MLB June Draft (Eric Arnett, Josh Phegley, Matt Bashore).

In 2016, Smith piloted the Sun Devils to a regional final for the time since 2013. The Sun Devils' 36 wins were the most in the past three years and they finished tied for third in the Pac-12. Five players were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball Draft, marking 14 total players who have been taken in the draft during Smith's tenure.

Eight Devils earned All-Pac-12 honors on the season, including first team selections David Greer, Seth Martinez, Brian Serven and Colby Woodmansee.

All four players would go on to be selected in the MLB draft with Greer (third team), Martinez (second team) and Woodmansee (third team) earning Louisville Slugger All-America accolades.

Smith was instrumental in Sun Devil Baseball's signing of the nation's top recruiting class in 2016, which included eight players who had been drafted by the Major League out of high school.

career victories.

In his first season at ASU, Smith led the Sun Devils to a postseason berth, a third-place finish in the Pac-12 and 30-plus wins.

He became one of five active coaches, and one of eight all-time, to bring three different Div. I schools to NCAA Regional play as he guided the Sun Devils to a No. 2 seed in the Fullerton Regional in 2015.

He has amassed a 675-503-1 career record in 20 seasons as a head coach at three different schools, including nine seasons at both Miami (Ohio) and Indiana, and one year at Arizona State. His 675 victories rank in the top 50 among active coaches in the NCAA, and his 20 seasons represent the sixth-shortest number of years on the list.

Smith instituted a change in culture at Arizona State and his demand for excellence both on and off the field was represented as the Devils led the Pac-12 in both all-conference and all-academic honorees in 2014.

Nineteen players have earned Pac-12 All-Academic honors in Smith's first two seasons, tied for the most in Sun Devil history for a two-year span. ASU's 10 selections in Smith's first season led the Pac-12.

His emphasis on defense became evident right away as ASU vastly improved its fielding percentage and lowered its number of errors committed in Smith's first season. The Devils finished fourth in the Pac-12 in both categories in 2015 after ranking near the bottom of the conference from 2010-14.

An accomplished fundraiser, Smith played a huge role in helping transition the Sun Devil Baseball program into Phoenix Municipal Stadium. His vision saw a renovated clubhouse, complete with an alumni locker room and an academics center, as well as an increased prominence on the program's historical accomplishments. Capital improvements included a state-of-the art video board, batting tunnel, a weight room and training room, creation of a grass berm and patio installations, and premium seating options.

Smith earned National Coach of the Year honors and was a unanimous choice for Big Ten Coach of the Year after he led IU to the school's only College World Series appearance in 2013. The following season in 2014, Smith led the Hoosiers to the No. 4 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, the first national seed in Big Ten baseball history.

Smith came to Tempe with 18 years of experience as a collegiate head coach, including nine at Miami University (Ohio) and nine at IU, where he was two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year. He led both programs to a pair of NCAA Regional appearances and more than 600 combined

He tallied more than 40 wins in each of the past two seasons at IU and led the Hoosiers to consecutive Big Ten Conference Championships for the first time in school history. IU

to consecutive Big Ten Conference Championships for the first time in school history. IU won the Big Ten regular season and B1G Tournament title in 2013, marking the school's first regular season conference championship since 1949 and the first outright crown since 1932, and advanced to the 2013 College World Series, which ended the Big Ten's 29-year CWS absence.


Smith took an IU program that had finished 10th in the Big Ten six times in an eight-year stretch between 2000 and 2007, and led the Hoosiers to an NCAA Regional in 2009 and to the College World Series in 2013. IU notched a program-best 21 conference wins in 2014 and secured eight first team All-Big Ten selections to tie a conference mark for most first team honorees from one school.

He began his coaching career as head coach at Miami University-Middletown in 1990, served as an assistant coach at Miami (Ohio) from 1993-94 and was the pitching coach at IU from 1995-96.

A four-year letterwinner at Miami (Ohio), Smith was a pitcher and an infielder for the RedHawks, and played three minor league seasons in the Chicago Cubs organization. He also participated in 1992 Major League Scouting Bureau's Professional Scout School as a representative of the Cubs.

Born Feb. 14, 1966, Smith graduated with a bachelor's degree in Education from Miami (Ohio) in 1989 and completed a master's degree in Sport Organization from Miami (Ohio) in 1992.

A native of Kentland, Ind., Smith and his wife, Jaime, have three sons, Casey, Ty and Jack. Casey was a four-year letterwinner on the Hoosier baseball team while Ty was a member for the IU football team. Jack is currently a quarterback on the Sun Devil football team.




- BEN GREENSPAN ASSISTANT COACH/RECRUITING COORDINATOR

 Ben Greenspan enters his third season at Arizona State University as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator, and works primarily with the team's offense and catchers.
- Excelling in his recruiting coordinator position, Greenspan assembled the No. 1 recruiting class in the nation in 2016 according to Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. The class is headlined by Hunter Bishop, who was rated the 15th best outfielder in the nation by Perfect Game. Bishop is joined by Chaz Montoya, the No. 1 left-handed pitcher in Arizona, and Carter Aldrete, the 23rd best shortstop in the nation according to Perfect Game.
- Catcher Brian Serven earned First Team All-Pac-12 recognition in 2016, as well as Pac-12 All-Academic honorable mention and was a semifinalist for the Johnny Bench Award, given to the nation's top catcher. His prowess on both sides of the plate was evident as he became just the fifth catcher in school history to lead the team in home runs and he caught 17 runners stealing, the most by a Sun Devil since 2009. Serven was the first Devil to go in the 2016 MLB Draft, going in the fifth round to the Colorado Rockies.
- Also excelling at the plate under Greenspan was first baseman David Greer, who also earned a First Team All-Conference selection as well as earning a spot on the Louisville Slugger All-America third team. The Arizona-native finished his junior campaign first in the conference in doubles and total bases, second in slugging percentage and third in runs scored. Greer was taken in the 10th round of the 2016 MLB Draft by the Seattle Mariners.
- Greenspan mentored some of the most prolific hitters in IU program history, including two-time All-American catcher Kyle Schwarber, current Oakland Athletics catcher Josh Phegley, and 2010 Big Ten Player of the Year Alex Dickerson. He also played a large role in developing talent at IU as 11 of his position players were selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft,


including five in the top five rounds. In the eight years Greenspan has served as a catching coach, his guidance has produced a First Team All-Conference player at that position in five of those seasons with two of them currently playing MLB (Schwarber and Phegley).

- Additional hitting protégés include 2012 Big Ten Freshman of the Year Sam Travis, two-time All-American Dustin DeMuth and current major leaguers Micah Johnson and Ethan Wilson.
- Played for two seasons under coach Smith at IU, and was a Hoosier team captain and Academic All-Big Ten performer in 2007. He spent two years at the University of Connecticut as a catcher and first baseman before joining the IU program. He earned a bachelor's degree in Sport Marketing and Management and a master's degree in Sport Administration from Indiana University.



FRED NORI - ASSISTANT COACH


- Fred Nori, who owns more than 30 years of coaching experience, enters his second seasons in three years on head coach Tracy Smith's coaching staff at Arizona State.
- This marks Nori's fifth stint working with Coach Smith after he served as the volunteer assistant for Indiana University in 2014 and 2007, for Miami University in 2005 and for the Sun Devils in 2015.
- Nori has three conference tournament championships, three NCAA Regional berths and two regular season conference crowns in four seasons as a Div. I assistant coach.
- He was a member of the 2014 IU team that won the Big Ten Conference championship and tournament championship, and became the first program in Big Ten history to earn a national seed. The RedHawks finished first in the Mid-American Conference, won the MAC Tournament championship and were an NCAA Regional participant in 2005. Nori was also a member of the 2009 Xavier Baseball staff, where he helped the Musketeers win the Atlantic 10 Tournament title and advance to an NCAA Regional.
- Nori has a long history of excellence in Ohio high school baseball and owns more than 20 years of head coaching experience that includes a Class A State Championship.
- Nori went on to play professional baseball for three seasons after his playing days at IU ended and he hit .284 with five home runs and 55 RBI as a member of the New York Mets organization. He was a student-athlete at IU from 1961-65, and earned his IU degree in 1965 and a master's degree from Xavier in 1969.




MICHAEL EARLEY - VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH

- Spent time in 2016 as an associate scout for the New York Mets.


