#### **UP NEXT**

Coming off the program's first win in a postseason conference tournament since 2019, the Sun Devil women's basketball team (No. 15 seed/10-21, 3-15 Big-12) will seek multiple wins for the first time since 2018 when it takes on Iowa State (No. 7 seed/21-10, 12-6 Big 12) on Thursday (5:30 p.m. CST/4:30 p.m. MST) in the second round of the 2025 Phillips 66 Big 12 Women's Basketball Championship at T-Mobile Center in Kansas City.

ASU advanced to the second round after defeating No. 10 seed Cincinnati 82-75 on Wednesday. **Jalyn Brown** (27 points) and **Tyi Skinner** (26 points) combined to score 53 points in the win.

For the game, the Sun Devils drained 50 percent of their shots for the third time this season. And, as has been the case all season, ASU was once again remarkable from the free throw line where it scored 24 of its points in making 80 percent of its 30 attempts.

**Nevaeh Parkinson** scored 15 points to go with seven rebounds and Jyah LoVett added 10 points and three assists. The Sun Devils ended the game with a plus-2 advantage on the glass thanks in large part to **Kennedy Basham**, who led the team in rebounds for the seventh time in eight games with a game-high 10 boards.

The winner of Thursday's game will advance to the quarterfinals where it will face No. 2 seed Baylor on Friday (5:30 p.m. CST/4:30 p.m. MST).

#### NOTES FROM WEDNESDAY'S WIN

- The win was Arizona State's first win in a conference tournament since 2019 when it defeated Colorado 66-49 in the first round of the Pac-12 Tournament.
- With four 3-pointers, **Tyi Skinner** tied the school's single-season record of 76 held by **Katie Hempen** who accomplished the feat in 2014-15. **Skinner** (144 career 3-pointers) also tied **Taya Hanson** (2018-22) for No. 3 on ASU's career list.
- **Skinner** (27/31 games) and **Brown** (24/28) have combined to score in double figures 51 times this season.
- Brown (12) and Skinner (11) have now combined for 23 20-point games this season.
- With 27 points vs. Cincinnati, **Jalyn Brown** now has 1,006 career points/998 in her ASU career.
- Kennedy Basham (10 rebounds) now has six double-digit rebounding efforts this season
- Hanna Miller tied her career high with four points and had career-highs in rebounds (6) and assists (3).

- This will be the fifth all-time meeting between ASU and Iowa State.
- Iowa State leads the series 3-1.
- Prior to their first meeting as members of the Big 12 in January, the last time ASU and ISU squared off was Nov. 25, 1995, a contest won by the Cyclones 69-61 at the Cyclone Classic in Ames, Iowa.

#### NOTES FROM LAST MEETING - IOWA STATE 90, @ASU 83, JAN. 8, 2025

- ASU came up short in what would have been the biggest comeback in program history in a 90-83 loss to Iowa St. Down by as many as 20, ASU was within three points with 13 seconds remaining. An ASU win would have eclipsed the record for the biggest comeback in program history: 18 points vs. Utah on Feb. 17, 2019, a game in which the Sun Devils scored the last 20 points of the game to edge the Utes 60-58.
- After shooting 34 percent in the first half, the Sun Devils hit 48 percent of their field goals in the final 20 minutes. Jalyn Brown scored 14 of her game high-tying 20 points in the second half to help ASU climb its way back into the game. Also totaling more than half of their points in the second half were Tyi Skinner (9 of 12), Jyah LoVett (8 of 13) and Jazion Jackson (6 of 8).
- The first and second quarters could not have been more contrasting. Kennedy Fauntleroy's second triple, ASU's third of the game, gave ASU a 15-14 lead. The Cyclones' 20-8 run over the last 5:21 of the opening quarter gave them a 34-23
- After Iowa State shot 67 pct in the first guarter, it made just 38 pct of its attempts the rest of the way.
- ASU's nine turnovers vs. Iowa State represented its fewest total this season (since eclipsed by seven turnovers at BYU on.
- The 48 points ASU scored in the second half represented the most points ASU has scored in the second half of a game this season.

- In each of her two seasons at ASU, **Tyi Skinner** has proven to be a phenomenal 3-point shooter. On Wednesday, Skinner drained four triples to tie **Katie Hempen's** single-season school record of 76 3-pointers set in 2014-15.
- In just two season, Skinner has ascended all the way up to a tie for No. 3 on ASU's list for career 3-pointers.
- Earlier this season, Skinner reached 1,000 points as a Sun Devil. Including her two seasons at Delaware, Skinner has scored 1,719 points and knocked down 240 3-pointers.
- In her two seasons, Skinner has made six 3-point FGs in a game four times, one 3-pointer short of tying the single-game school record of seven.

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- Jalyn Brown (15x) & Tyi Skinner (13x) have combined to lead/tie for the team lead in scoring 28x. Other single-game scoring leaders: Nevaeh Parkinson (3x), Jyah LoVett (1x) and Kennedy Fauntleroy (1x).
- **Skinner** (27/31 games) and **Brown** (24/28 games) have combined to score in double figures 49x. The duo has also teamed up to score 20 or more points 23x: **Brown** 12x and **Skinner** 11x.
- In their careers, the duo has combined to score in double figures 102x in 115 games.
- **Brown** (998 points as a Sun Devil) needs two points to become the 28th player join ASU's 1,000 point club.
- **Kennedy Basham** has had multiple blocks in a game 20x this season, including a career-high seven rejections at San Francisco (Dec. 17). She has also had six blocks 2x, most recently at Oklahoma St. (Jan. 29). Currently with 77 blocks, **Basham** is No. 2 on ASU's list for most blocks in a season. **Kali Bennett** tops the list with 91 rejections in 2011-12.
- Prior to regular season finale vs. Arizona (Mar. 1), **Basham** led ASU in rebounds in 6 consecutive games. During that stretch she averaged team highs of 9.0 rpg and 2.5 offensive rpg. That span also included 10 boards at Arizona (Feb. 8) and 11 at UCF (Feb. 12). She scored 10 points at Arizona to notch her 3rd double-double of the season. In ASU's overtime win at BYU (Feb. 22), Basham scored 7 points to go with 9 rebounds and 5 blocks. Nearly had her fourth double-double (11 points, 8 rebounds) in ASU's game at Colorado (Feb. 26).
- Makayla Moore was such a tremendous contributor coming off the bench, she earned a spot in the starting lineup. She started four straight games prior to missing the regular season finale vs. Arizona (Mar. 1) due to injury. In the seven games prior to that contest, Moore led the team in 3-point FG pct. (42.3/11-26), was 2nd on the team in 3-point FGs (11), rebounds (6.0 rpg) and offensive rebounds (2.8 O-rpg) and averaged only 1.3 turnovers, the fewest of any player who averaged 20 or more minutes during that stretch.
- Currently shooting 76.1 percent from the free throw line (402-of-528), ASU has a chance to lead a conference for the first time since 2006-07, when its school record mark 75.1 percent (571-of-768) led the Pac-10. That was the only time ASU led the Pac-10/12 in its 38 seasons (1986-87 to 2023-24).
