TRACY SMITH - HEAD COACH - FIFTH SEASON (23rd OVERALL)

Tracy Smith, the 2013 National Coach of the Year, was hired as the fifth head baseball coach in program history on June 24, 2014, and enters his fifth season at the helm of the Sun Devil baseball program.

Smith has established a reputation of evaluating and developing talent as more than 50 student-athletes since 2000 improved their stock in the Major League Baseball Draft under Smith's tutelage, including four who became first-round draft picks after going undrafted out of high school.

In 22 total years as a head coach, Smith has seen 80 of his players selected in the MLB Draft, including 73 draftees since 2000 and 33 in the first 10 rounds. He has mentored 48 Major League Baseball draft picks over the past eight seasons, including the fourth overall pick in the 2014 Major League Baseball June Amateur Draft (Kyle Schwarber) and three first-round selections in the 2009 MLB June Draft (Eric Arnett, Josh Phegley, Matt Bashore).

In 2018, Smith eclipsed 700 career wins as an NCAA head coach while also overseeing one of the most prolific freshman campaigns in collegiate baseball history as Spencer Torkelson became the first freshman to ever lead the nation in home runs, finishing with 25 on the season.

Torkelson knocked two more home runs than any other player and just one shy of the NCAA freshman record. Torkelson was just the sixth player to reach 25 home runs since the BBCOR batting technology changes took effect in 2011 and the only freshman in the NCAA to reach the milestone in that time.

Against Washington State, he surpassed the previous Sun Devil freshman record of 11 home runs set by Barry Bonds in 1983. Torkelson finished tied with Bob Horner (1978) for second in ASU single-season history, just two shy of Mitch Jones' school record 27 in 2000.

Torkelson slugged .743 on the season (25 homers, 12 doubles), the third-highest total for any freshman in the NCAA in the past two decades and the highest for a freshman in the BBCOR era (since 2011). Only Rickie Weeks (.849 in 2001) and Jeremy Baltz (.771, 2010) have posted higher freshman slugging percentages in the past 20 years.

Smith saw five of his student-athletes taken in the 2018 MLB Draft, including fifth-round selection Gage Canning to the Washington Nationals. Canning wrapped the season as one of the elite five-tool players in the country, finishing with a .369 average and a Pac-12 leading 87 hits on the season. Canning was the national leader in triples with 11, and now has 25 in his career at ASU – good for third in school history and the most since Ed Irvine tied the school record of 26 between 1977-79.

Canning reached base in 54 of 55 games for the Sun Devils this season and logged a hit in 47 of those. He led the team with multiple hits in 26 games and had 11 games with three or more hits, becoming the first Sun Devil player to have at least 10 games with 3+ hits since Brett Wallace did so from 2007-08.

With one more home run, Canning would have become the first player in the BBCOR batting era (since 2011) to record double digit numbers in doubles, triples AND home runs. He finished the season with nine homers, 17 doubles and 11 triples, slugging .648 for the season – good for third in the Pac-12 and 38th nationally.

Defensively, Canning was flawless after shifting to center field and logged just one error on the season on 144 chances for a .993 fielding percentage.

The 2017 campaign saw Canning emerge as one of the elite players in the Pac-12. The Californianative led the team in virtually every hitting category, including batting average (.332), runs (37), doubles (12), triples (8), home runs (6) and slugging percentage (.538). He was the only player in the Pac-12 to finish with a double-digit number of doubles while also posting at least six home runs and six triples.

On top of dominating the leader boards at ASU, Canning's eight triples were the most by a player in the conference and second-most in the NCAA. Canning also recorded 120 total bases on the season, good for third in the conference. The outfielder really hit his stride in the middle of the season, as he went on a 12-game tear in which he hit at a .538 clip, including five three-hit nights and a four-hit performance.

Smith also helped oversee the emergence of Hunter Bishop as one of the exciting young freshmen in the country on the year. The freshman finished his 2017 campaign with an impressive .301 batting average, five doubles, four triples and five home runs. He ranked second on the team – behind only Canning – in batting average, runs scored (27), triples, home runs and slugging percentage (.484). Bishop started 31 games in the outfield season to become just the sixth ASU freshman in the past 15 years to start over 50 percent of the season in the outfield, most recently done by Canning last season. His 10 multi-RBI games were also a team-best.

In 2016, Smith piloted the Sun Devils to a regional final for the first time since 2013. The Sun Devils' 36 wins were the most in the previous three years and they finished tied for third in the Pac-12. Five players were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball Draft, marking 14 total players who

have been taken in the draft during Smith's tenure.

Eight Devils earned All-Pac-12 honors on the season, including first team selections David Greer, Seth Martinez, Brian Serven and Colby Woodmansee. All four players would go on to be selected in the MLB draft with Greer (third team). Martinez (second team) and Woodmansee (third team) earning Louisville Slugger All-America accolades.

In his first season at ASU, Smith led the Sun Devils to a postseason berth, a third-place finish in the Pac-12 and 30-plus wins.

He became one of five active coaches, and one of eight all-time, to bring three different Div. I schools to NCAA Regional play as he guided the Sun Devils to a No. 2 seed in the Fullerton Regional in 2015.

A exceptional recruiter, Smith was instrumental in Sun Devil Baseball's signing of the nation's top recruiting class in 2016, which included eight players who had been drafted by the Major League out of high school. His 2017 class was also rated in the Top-5 nationally and was the No. 1 class in the West.

He has amassed a 698-535-1 career record in 21 seasons as a head coach at three different schools, including nine seasons at both Miami (Ohio) and Indiana, and one year at Arizona State. His 698 victories rank in the top 50 among active coaches in the NCAA, and his 21 seasons represent the sixth-fewest number of years on that list.

Smith instituted a change in culture at Arizona State and his demand for excellence both on and off the field was represented as the Devils led the Pac-12 in both all-conference and all-academic honorees in 2014.

Nineteen players have earned Pac-12 All-Academic honors in Smith's first two seasons, tied for the most in Sun Devil history for a two-year span. ASU's 10 selections in Smith's first season led the Pac-12.

His emphasis on defense became evident right away as ASU vastly improved its fielding percentage and lowered its number of errors committed in Smith's first season. The Devils finished fourth in the Pac-12 in both categories in 2015 after ranking near the bottom of the conference from 2010-14.

An accomplished fundraiser, Smith played a huge role in helping transition the Sun Devil Baseball program into Phoenix Municipal Stadium. His vision saw a renovated clubhouse, complete with an alumni locker room and an academics center, as well as an increased prominence on the program's historical accomplishments. Capital improvements included a state-of-the art video board, batting tunnel, a weight room and training room, creation of a grass berm and patio installations, and premium seating options. Smith also played a huge role in facility upgrades at both Indiana University and Miami (Ohio) and was instrumental in the approval and design of both Miami's Stanley G. McKie Field at Joseph P. Hayden Jr. Park and Indiana's Bart Kaufman Field.

Smith earned National Coach of the Year honors and was a unanimous choice for Big Ten Coach of the Year after he led IU to the school's only College World Series appearance in 2013. The following season in 2014, Smith led the Hoosiers to the No. 4 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, the first national seed in Big Ten baseball history.

Smith came to Tempe with 18 years of experience as a collegiate head coach, including nine at Miami University (Ohio) and nine at IU, where he was two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year. He led both programs to a pair of NCAA Regional appearances and more than 600 combined career victories.

He tallied more than 40 wins in his final two seasons at IU and led the Hoosiers to consecutive Big Ten Conference Championships for the first time in school history. IU won the Big Ten regular season and B1G Tournament title in 2013, marking the school's first regular season conference championship since 1949 and the first outright crown since 1932, and advanced to the 2013 College World Series, which ended the Big Ten's 29-year CWS absence.

Smith took an IU program that had finished 10th in the Big Ten six times in an eight-year stretch between 2000 and 2007, and led the Hoosiers to an NCAA Regional in 2009 and to the College World Series in 2013. IU notched a program-best 21 conference wins in 2014 and secured eight first team All-Big Ten selections to tie a conference mark for most first team honorees from one school.

Smith's Academic Progress Rate as a head coach increased each season until it reached a perfect 1000 in two-year stretch between 2008-10.

IU saw eight players on 12 occasions be named All-Americans under Smith, including four in 2014, which was the highest total in program history and the second straight season that IU produced three or more All-Americans.

Smith mentored two Big Ten Players of the Year, three Big Ten Pitchers of the Year and a pair of Big Ten Freshman of the Year in nine seasons at IU, and at least one Hoosier earned Freshman All-America honors in six of the past seven seasons in Bloomington.


He has landed three players on the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team and mentored numerous players at all positions, including outfielder Alex Dickerson, who was named Big Ten Player of the Year and won the Big Ten Triple Crown in 2010, right-handed pitcher Aaron Slegers, who was named 2013 Big Ten Pitcher of the Year, and catcher Kyle Schwarber, who was named an All-American by five major college baseball groups in 2014.

In nine years at the helm of the RedHawks baseball program, Smith compiled eight straight 30-win seasons, two NCAA Regional appearances and advanced to the Mid-American Conference Tournament finals six times.

He began his coaching career as head coach at Miami University-Middletown in 1990, served as an assistant coach at Miami (Ohio) from 1993-94 and was the pitching coach at IU from 1995-96.

A four-year letterwinner at Miami (Ohio), Smith was a pitcher and an infielder for the RedHawks, and played three minor league seasons in the Chicago Cubs organization. He also participated in 1992 Major League Scouting Bureau's Professional Scout School as a representative of the Cubs.

Born Feb. 14, 1966, Smith graduated with a bachelor's degree in Education from Miami (Ohio) in 1989 and completed a master's degree in Sport Organization from Miami (Ohio) in 1992.



BEN GREENSPAN - ASSISTANT COACH/RECRUITING COORDINATOR

Ben Greenspan enters his fifth season at Arizona State University as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator, and works primarily with the team's offense and catchers.

Greenspan's recruiting efforts were on full display in 2018 as the Sun Devil freshman combined for more starts among freshmen than any other team in the nation. Six different freshmen position players frequently found their name in the starting lineup while three freshman arms toed the mound in prominent innings over the course of the season.

Spencer Torkelson, Alika Williams and Gage Workman combined to post three of the four highest batting averages among freshmen in the Pac-12 on the season.

The 2017 campaign saw Gage Canning emerge as one of the elite players in the Pac-12 with Greenspan helping to oversee that growth. The California-native led the team in virtually every hitting category, including batting average (.332), runs (37), doubles (12), triples (8), home runs (6) and slugging percentage (.538). He was the only player in the Pac-12 to finish with a double-digit number of doubles while also posting at least six home runs and six triples.

Greenspan also helped oversee the emergence of Hunter Bishop as one of the exciting young freshmen in the country on the year. The freshman finished his 2017 campaign with an impressive .301 batting average, five doubles, four triples and five home runs. He ranked second on the team – behind only

Canning – in batting average, runs scored (27), triples, home runs and slugging percentage (.484). Bishop started 31 games in the outfield season to become just the sixth ASU freshman in the past 15 years to start over 50 percent of the season in the outfield.

Catcher Brian Serven earned First Team All-Pac-12 recognition in 2016, as well as Pac-12 All-Academic honorable mention and was a semifinalist for the Johnny Bench Award, given to the nation's top catcher. His prowess on both sides of the plate was evident as he became just the fifth catcher in school history to lead the team in home runs and he caught 17 runners stealing, the most by a Sun Devil since 2009. Serven was the first Devil to go in the 2016 MLB Draft, going in the fifth round to the Colorado Rockies.

Also excelling at the plate under Greenspan was first baseman David Greer, who also earned a First Team All-Conference selection as well as earning a spot on the Louisville Slugger All-America third team. The Arizona-native finished his junior campaign first in the conference in doubles and total bases, second in slugging percentage and third in runs scored. Greer was taken in the 10th round of the 2016 MLB Draft by the Seattle Mariners.

In his first season at ASU, Greenspan helped the Sun Devils excel both offensively and defensively. The Devils ranked in the top half of the Pac-12 in a number of offensive categories, including second in slugging percentage, third in both batting average and hits, and posted their best defensive numbers since 2010 as they finished fourth in the conference in both fielding percentage and errors.

Excelling in his recruiting coordinator position, Greenspan assembled the No. 1 recruiting class in the nation in 2016 according to Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. The class is headlined by Hunter Bishop, who was rated the 15th best outfielder in the nation by Perfect Game. Bishop was originally committed to the University of Washington to play football before joining the Sun Devils in the fall. Bishop is joined by Chaz Montoya, the No. 1 left-handed pitcher in Arizona, and Carter Aldrete, the 23rd best shortstop in the nation according to Perfect Game.

Greenspan followed that up in playing a big part in another Top-5 Nationally ranked recruiting class in 2017, and the top recruiting class in the Pac-12 and the West. The 2017 Sun Devil class features six signees who participated in the 2015 Area Code Baseball Games, an invitation-only elite baseball event held annually in Long Beach, Calif., and one who played in the Tournament of the Stars - a showcase hosted by USA Baseball. Incoming freshman Gage Workman also spent part of his summer vying for a spot on the USA Baseball 18U National Team, spending time in Minnesota at the team trials.

Greenspan spent six seasons as an assistant coach at Indiana, including the past year as recruiting coordinator, and worked extensively with the team's catchers and hitters. The Hoosiers' offense ranked in the top 25 in the nation in batting average, slugging percentage, total hits and extra-base hits in 2014.

Greenspan mentored some of the most prolific hitters in IU program history, including two-time All-American catcher Kyle Schwarber, current Oakland Athletics catcher Josh Phegley, and 2010 Big Ten Player of the Year Alex Dickerson. He also played a large role in developing talent at IU as 11 of his position players were selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, including five in the top five rounds. In the eight years Greenspan has served as a catching coach, his guidance has produced a First Team All-Conference player at that position in five of those seasons with two of them currently playing MLB (Schwarber and Phegley).

Schwarber, who was selected with the fourth overall pick in the 2014 MLB Draft, was a 2013 First Team All-American and was named the best catcher in the country by Perfect Game and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association. Dickerson won the 2010 Big Ten Triple Crown after he batted .419 with 24 homeruns and 75 RBI.

Greenspan's additional hitting protégés include 2012 Big Ten Freshman of the Year Sam Travis, two-time All-American Dustin DeMuth and current major leaguers Micah Johnson and Ethan Wilson.

Greenspan played for two seasons under coach Smith at IU, and was a Hoosier team captain and Academic All-Big Ten performer in 2007. He spent two years at the University of Connecticut as a catcher and first baseman before joining the IU program. He earned a bachelor's degree in Sport Marketing and Management and a master's degree in Sport Administration from Indiana University.

Greenspan is originally from West Point, N.Y., and is married to his wife, Janine. The pair have two children, Grayson and Adalyn.



MIKE CATHER - ASSISTANT COACH/PITCHING COACH

Mike Cather enters his second season at Arizona State University as assistant coach and pitching coach.

In his first season with the Sun Devil pitching staff, Cather oversaw a team ERA that dropped by an entire point from 2017 to 2018. Three of his pitchers had their names called in the 2018 MLB Draft (Fitz Stadler, Eli Lingos and Connor Higgins).

A pair of freshmen helped pave the way for the Sun Devils as Boyd Vander Kooi and Dellan Raish each led the team with 3.00 ERA while the latter would go on to be named a Freshman All-American.

The 2018 season saw the emergence of Alec Marsh as the team's Friday night ace as the sophomore finished with a 3.89 ERA and 1.29 WHIP. Marsh posted five quality starts in his six starts as the team's Friday night starter, a role he assumed midway through the season. Marsh finished the season in the Top-10 in the Pac-12 ion fewest extra base hits and hits allowed over the course of the season.

Cather coached Eli Lingos to his best season as a Sun Devil as the senior left finished with a 3.83 ERA on the season and a team-leading seven victories. Lingos struck out a career-high 72 batters to just 24 walks on the year in a team-high 91.2 innings pitched. Lingos' performance allowed him to get drafted for the first time in his career, going in the 22nd round to the Cleveland Indians.

Cather joined the Sun Devils with over a decade of experience at the professional level, most recently serving as the Minor League Pitching Coordinator for the Miami Marlins organization beginning in 2015. With the Marlins, Cather oversaw the development for the organization's minor league system and worked closely with Miami's Major League Pitching Coach, Juan Nieves.

Prior to his coaching career, Cather had a 10-year career as a professional pitcher with three seasons spent in Major League Baseball with the Atlanta Braves (1997-99). Cather did not allow an earned run in his first eight games in the MLB and helped the Braves to a spot in the National League Championship Series against the Florida Marlins in 1998.

his professional assignments and developments through the years, Cather has worked with All-Stars Josh Beckett and Clay Buchholz, as well as the likes of Matt Wisler, Carl Edwards, Jr., Joe Ross and Daniel

In 2014, Cather joined the Chicago Cubs organization as the pitching coach for the lowa Cubs at the Triple-A level and oversaw a pitching staff that led the Pacific Coast League in ERA, setting several club records in the process. He developed young and veteran players for the team's postseason run in 2015.

The lowa Cubs' pitching staff finished with a team ERA of 3.73 in 2015 and were led by Carlos Pimentel, who finished with a 2.95 ERA – second in the PCL – while leading the league with 12 victories on the

Cather joined the San Diego Padres organization in 2012 where he served as the Minor League Pitching Coordinator as well as the pitching coach for the El Paso Chihuahuas, the Padres' Triple-A affiliate. In El Paso, Cather worked under former Sun Devil Baseball head coach Pat Murphy.


With the organization, Cather established throwing programs used throughout the system and oversaw development of players for the major league or trades. He also initiated and created the throwing program used for Dominican players at the overseas academy.

Cather began his career in the professional ranks with the Boston Red Sox organization in 2006. He joined the organization as the pitching coach for the Class A Wilmington Blue Rocks before being promoted to pitching coach for the Portland Sea Dogs, the Red Sox's Double-A affiliate, in 2007. In 2010, Cather was named as one of Boston's Major League advanced scouts, where he provided reports and insight to the organization's Major League staff.

During his playing career with the Braves, Cather pitched two scoreless innings of relief in Game 2 against the Houston Astros in the 1998 National League Divisional series after helping the team to the NL Eastern Division title. In the National League Championship Series against the Marlins, Cather did not allow a run over four games

During his 10-year professional career, Cather also played within the Texas Rangers, Florida Marlins and St. Louis Cardinals organizations. His career saw him play alongside fellow Sun Devil alumni Tim Spehr and Jacob Cruz.

Cather will be joined in Phoenix by his wife of nearly 20 years, Kristine, as well as his daughters Lauren and Avery and his son Colby.



MIKE EARLEY - VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH/HITTING COACH

Michael Earley enters his third season as an assistant and second season as the team's Hitting Coach on head coach Tracy Smith's staff at Arizona State.

Earley's work with the Sun Devil hitters could not be understated in 2018 as he coached up one of the elite offenses in the conference, despite fielding, statistically, the youngest lineup in the country. The Sun Devils had the nation's home run leader as well as the nations triples leader in 2018 and three position players were named to various All American Teams, along with two Golden Spike Nominees and a Team USA selection.

Earley's coaching led to one of the most prolific freshman campaigns in collegiate baseball history as Spencer Torkelson became the first freshman to ever lead the nation in home runs, finishing with 25 on the season.

Torkelson knocked two more home runs than any other player and just one shy of the NCAA freshman record. Torkelson was just the sixth player to reach 25 home runs since the BBCOR batting technology changes took effect in 2011 and the only freshman in the NCAA to reach the milestone in that time.

Against Washington State, he surpassed the previous Sun Devil freshman record of 11 home runs set by Barry Bonds in 1983. Torkelson finished tied with Bob Horner (1978) for second in ASU single-season history, just two shy of Mitch Jones' school record 27 in 2000.

Torkelson slugged .743 on the season (25 homers, 12 doubles), the third-highest total for any freshman in the NCAA in the past two decades and the highest for a freshman in the BBCOR era (since 2011). Only Rickie Weeks (.849 in 2001) and Jeremy Baltz (.771, 2010) have posted higher freshman slugging percentages in the past 20 years. Torkelson was named to multiple All-American Teams, selected to play on team USA, a Golden Spikes Award nominee, First Team All-Pac12, Pac 12 Freshman of the year and was the NCAA Freshman of the Year.

Earley mentored outfielder Gage Canning, who wrapped the season as one of the elite five-tool players in the country, finishing with a .369 average and a Pac-12 leading 87 hits on the season. Canning was the national leader in triples with 11, and finished with 25 in his career at ASU – good for third in school history and the most since Ed Irvine tied the school record of 26 between 1977-79.

Canning reached base in 54 of 55 games for the Sun Devils this season and logged a hit in 47 of those. He led the team with multiple hits in 26 games and had 11 games with three or more hits, becoming the first Sun Devil player to have at least 10 games with 3+ hits since Brett Wallace did so from 2007-08.

With one more home run, Canning would have become the first player in the BBCOR batting era (since 2011) to record double digit numbers in doubles, triples AND home runs. He finished the season with nine homers, 17 doubles and 11 triples, slugging .648 for the season – good for third in the Pac-12 and 38th nationally.

Defensively, Canning was nearly flawless after shifting to center field and logged just one error on the season on 144 chances for a .993 fielding percentage. Canning was a finalist for the Rawlings Gold Glove Award, named to multiple All-America Teams, First Team All-Pac-12, Pac-12 All-Defensive team and a Golden Spikes Award nominee. Canning was a fifth-round selection by the Washington Nationals.

Lyle Lin and Carter Aldrete both raised their batting averages by 20 points while being selected to an All-Pac-12 team. Lin went on to be drafted by the Houston Astros in the 29th round.

Overall, three of ASU's freshmen (Torkelson, Alika Williams and Gage Workman) finished among the top four freshman batting averages in the Pac-12. Torkelson and Workman were named Freshman All-Americans. The team combined for 50 home runs in 2018 after hitting 38 in 2017. The team's overall batting average also climbed 20 points from 2017 to .290 on the season – the second-highest total in the Pac-12 behind 2018 NCAA Champion Oregon State. ASU improved in every single offensive statistical category from 2017-2018.

In regular season play, ASU was ranked second in the Pac-12 in slugging percentage (.446), hits (549), batting avg. (290) and total bases (843), while leading the Pac in triples (24).

Earley also serves as team's outfield coach and helped pace one of the top outfields in the Pac-12 in 2017. On the year, first-team All-Pac-12 selection Gage Canning started in every single game for the Sun Devils and while providing stellar defense with zero errors on the season and leading the team in outfield assists.

Canning led the team in virtually every hitting category, including batting average (.332), runs (37), doubles (12), triples (8), home runs (6) and slugging percentage (.538). He was the only player in the Pac-12 to finish with a double-digit number of doubles while also posting at least six home runs and six triples.

Earley also helped oversee the emergence of Hunter Bishop as one of the exciting young freshmen in the country on the year. The freshman earned All-Pac-12 honors and finished his 2017 campaign with an impressive .301 batting average, five doubles, four triples and five home runs. He ranked second on the team – behind only Canning – in batting average, runs scored (27), triples, home runs and slugging percentage (.484). Bishop started 31 games
in the outfield season to become just the sixth ASU freshman in the past 15 years to start over 50 percent of the season in the outfield.

During the 2017 pitching coach search, Earley was granted a waiver to recruit by the NCAA. Earley assisted in recruiting during the spring and summer of 2017. During that time Earley helped identify prospects and recruits for the 2017 through 2020 recruiting classes. The 2017 recruiting class was ranked fourth in the country andt tops in the Pac 12.

"The experience I gained recruiting the west coast in my first year of coaching will prove to be invaluable, also being able to learn from Coach Greenspan, who I believe is the one of the best recruiters in the country has helped me tremendously," Earley said.

Earley played under Smith at Indiana from 2008-10 before going on to a professional career with the Chicago White Sox organization. He played professional baseball for six seasons, including time with the team's Triple-A affiliate, the Charlotte Knights.

The outfielder finished his playing days with the Southern Illinois Miners in the independent Frontier League in 2015. He finished his professional career with 559 hits, 117 doubles, 38 home runs and a .284 average. He was named to four All-Star teams in his professional career and was also named a member of the Southern Illinois All-Decade Team. Earley earned Third Team All-Big Ten recognition during his senior campaign at IU in 2010 after he tied for fourth in the conference in home runs with 13, and finished the season batting .352. Earley was the only player in the Big Ten with double digit homeruns and stolen bases during the 2010 season.

He was selected by the White Sox in the 29th round of the 2010 Major League Baseball Draft. Following his career in professional baseball, he spent time in 2016 as an associate scout for the New York Mets. Earley is married to his wife, Lisa, and together they have a son, Marshall (4), and daughter Mia (2).

He is a former football student-athlete for the Rockets where he was named the Mid-American Conference Special Teams Player of the Year in 2005 and was a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award that season.

Jesse's emphasis remains in arm care, as well as total body health to maintain the performance of the student-athletes.
- A native of Arizona, Lowman grew up in Maricopa, Ariz. He completed his undergraduate studies at California State University Sacramento in 2007 with a bachelor's of science degree in Kinesiology and an emphasis in Athletic Training. During his time at Sacramento State, he was accepted to a student-intern position with the San Francisco Giants in 2006 and worked under the minor league rehabilitation coordinator
- Upon returning to Arizona in the 2008. Jesse attained the position of Head Athletic Trainer at Horizon High School in Scottsdale. 


In July of 2006, Sun Devil legends Bobby Winkles and Bob Horner were part of the first-ever 10 member induction class in the new College Baseball Hall of Fame in Lubbock, Texas.

The Sun Devils' 11 Hall of Famers are the most in college baseball, ahead of Texas with 10, Wichita State with five, and LSU, Miami, Michigan and Oklahoma State each with four.

Players are eligible for the College Baseball Hall of Fame ballot five years after the student-athlete's final collegiate season, not to include any active player or coach on a professional baseball team roster. Former players must have made an All-American team or an All-League team during at least one year at a four-year institution.

Coaches are eligible after ending their collegiate career, not to include an active coach on a professional team. They must have achieved 300 career wins, or have won at least 65% of their games.

The Hall of Distinction, recognizing contributions from coaches and administrators, was inaugurated in 1982 and features over 20 honorees. Plaques describing the athletic achievements of each inductee are displayed on the concourse level of Wells Fargo Arena, while memorabilia and other historical artifacts are on display in the Bill and Judy Schaefer Sports Hall of Fame in the Carson-Student Athlete Center at Sun Devil Stadium.

Forty-nine Sun Devil baseball players, some of whom played multiple sports at ASU, have been inducted into the Arizona State Sports Hall of Fame. Bobby Winkles and Jim Brock are both in the Hall of Distinction.

1 / BOBBY WINKLES 1959-1971

Bobby Winkles, the architect of the modern era of the Sun Devil Baseball program, coached ASU for 13 seasons.

Coach Winkles, a three-time The Sporting News National Coach of the Year honoree, quickly turned ASU into a national power as he won three national championships in the latter half of the 1960s. He compiled a .751 winning percentage, the highest in school history, and notched three 50-win seasons, including a 56-11 mark in 1969.

He mentored 16 first-team All-Americans, 20 ASU Hall of Famers and 39 All-WAC honorees. He also coached 45 Major League Baseball draft picks, including 12 first-round selections, and 21 players who made to the Major Leagues.

A charter member of the College Baseball Hall of Fame, he was inducted into the ASU Hall of Fame in 1982 and the ABCA Hall of Fame in 1997. His No. 1 was retired by ASU on February 25, 1972 and the field at Packard Stadium was dedicated in his honor in 2001.

33 / JIM BROCK 1972-1994

Dr. Jim Brock, the winningest coach in the history of the Sun Devil Baseball program, led ASU for 23 seasons.

Coach Brock, a four-time National Coach of the Year honoree, notched eleven 50-win seasons and four 60-win seasons at ASU, including a school-best 64-6 record in 1972.

He mentored 48 first-team All-Americans, 21 ASU Hall of Famers, and 112 all-conference honorees, including 49 in the WAC and 63 in the Pac-10. He also coached 190 Major League Baseball draft picks, including 15 first-round selections, and 60 players who made the Major Leagues.

A member of the 2007 College Baseball Hall of Fame class, he was inducted into the ASU Hall of Fame in 1994 and the ABCA Hall of Fame in 1998. Coach Brock's No. 33 was retired by ASU on January 21, 1995 and his name was added to baseball facilities at Packard Stadium in 2006.

An Arizona native and holder of three degrees from ASU, Dr. Brock prided himself on the Devils' 93-52 record versus the Arizona Wildcats from '72-'94.

O / ODDIBE MCDOWELL 1983-1984

The first Sun Devil baseball player to have his number honored, McDowell hit a combined .380 with 30 home runs and 31 doubles in his two years in Tempe. His 1984 season, in which he hit .405 with 23 home runs and 117 hits, remains one of the best offensive performances in school history and earned him a spot on the US Olympic team as well as the Golden Spikes Award. Oddibe had his number 0 retired, but legend has it that the digit on his back was actually the letter "O", making him the only player to have a letter retired. McDowell played seven seasons in the Major Leagues after being a First Round pick of the Texas Rangers in 1984.



2 / DUSTIN PEDROIA 2002-04

Dustin Pedroia put together three of the best seasons in Sun Devil Baseball history and his #2 was honored in February 2016 at Phoenix Municipal Stadium. A 2004 Golden Spikes Award Finalist, 2003 Pac-10 Co-Player of the Year, and the two-time National Defensive Player of the Year, Pedroia started all 185 games of his Sun Devil career. He finished with a .384 career batting average and added 71 doubles and 298 hits en route to three first-team All-Pac-10 selections. After leaving ASU, Pedroia was drafted by the Boston Red Sox in the second round of the 2004 MLB Draft and went on to become the 2007 American League Rookie of the Year, 2008 American League MVP, a four-time All-Star, four-time Gold Glove winner and a two-time World Series Champion with the Red Sox.



5 / BOB HORNER 1976-1978

On February 11, 1996, Bob Horner saw his number honored by Arizona State. The first Golden Spikes Award winner in 1978, Horner hit 56 home runs over his three seasons in Tempe. He was the MOP of the 1977 College World Series and the 1978 National Player of the Year. He hit .412 during his senior season and led the Devils to Omaha all three years he played for ASU. Horner was the first pick of the 1978 MLB Draft, going to the Atlanta Braves. He spent 10 years in the Majors, winning the 1978 National League Rookie of the Year Award and playing in the 1982 All-Star Game. He was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame in 2006. He was named a Rosenblatt Stadium Legend at the 2010 College World Series.



6 / SAL BANDO 1964-1965

February 23, 1996 saw Sal Bando's number honored by the Sun Devils. The MOP of the 1965 College World Series, Bando helped lead Arizona State to Omaha in both of his seasons in Tempe. Bando hit .319 over his Sun Devil career, including .364 in 1964. He played 16 seasons in the Majors, appearing in four All Star Games and winning the World Series three times with the Oakland Athletics. Bando spent eight years as the General Manager of the Milwaukee Brewers after retiring as a player. He was named a Rosenblatt Stadium Legend at the 2010 College World Series.



7 / ALAN BANNISTER 1970-1972

A two-time First Team All-American, Alan Bannister had his number honored by the Sun Devils on January 9, 1999. A .355 career hitter, Bannister helped lead the Sun Devils to the 1972 College World Series with his .380 average, 13 home runs and 90 RBI. He rapped out 225 hits during his three seasons in Tempe and went on to play 12 seasons in the Major Leagues. He was the #1 overall pick of the 1973 MLB Draft, going to the Philadelphia Phillies.



7 / HUBIE BROOKS 1977-1978

One of the greatest hitters in Sun Devil history, Hubie Brooks saw his #7 honored by ASU on March 3, 2000. Brooks hit .396 during his career, the third-highest mark in school history, including .432 in 1978, the fourth-highest single-season mark at ASU. That same season Brooks drove in 126 runs, the second-most of any Devil in a year. A member of the 1977 National Champions, Brooks went to Omaha both seasons he wore the Maroon and Gold. Hubie played 15 seasons in the Majors, twice being named to the All-Star Team. He was the third overall pick of the 1978 draft, selected by the New York Mets.




9 / ALVIN DAVIS 1979-1982

Alvin Davis had his Sun Devil #9 honored on May 14, 2006. A four-year player, Davis hit .362 as a Sun Devil, including .395 during the National Championship year of 1981. Davis knocked in 200 runs during his tenure in Tempe and was a sixth round pick of the Seattle Mariners in the 1982 MLB Draft. Davis went on to win the 1984 American League Rookie of the Year Award. He played nine seasons in the Majors and was an All-Star in 1984.



12 / KEVIN ROMINE 1981-1982

On May 14, 2006, Kevin Romine had his number honored by Arizona State. One of only two people in school history to ever hit over .400 twice, Romine closed out his ASU career with a .408 average. A National Champion in 1981, Romine totaled 176 in his two seasons in Tempe. He was a second round pick of the Boston Red Sox in the 1982 MLB Draft and went on to play seven big league seasons.



14 / ANDRE ETHIER 2002-03

A two-time first-team All-Pac-10 performer, Andre Ethier saw his #14 honored in February 2016 at Phoenix Municipal Stadium. He finished his career hitting .371 with 113 runs, 27 doubles, seven triples, 14 home runs, and 118 RBIs. In 2003, Ethier earned All-American honorable mention honors, was named to the Tempe Regional All-Tournament team, and was honored as ASU's Outstanding Defensive Player as he ended his junior season and ASU career with a 23-game hitting streak, the eighth-longest in ASU history. He was selected in the second round of the 2003 MLB Draft by the Oakland A's In 2005, Ethier was traded to the Los Angeles Dodgers, where he won the Silver Slugger Award in 2009, earned a starting spot on the National League All-Star Team in 2010, and won a Gold Glove Award in 2011.



14 / LARRY GURA 1967-1969

January 18, 1998 saw one of the most dominant Sun Devil pitchers ever have his number honored. Larry Gura compiled a 25-6 career record for ASU, including the 1969 season that saw him go 19-2 with a 1.01 ERA. A two-time National Champion, Gura was a First Team All-American in 1969. He was selected by the Chicago Cubs in the second round of the 1969 Draft and went on to play 16 seasons of big league ball, including his All-Star season of 1980.



16 / PAUL LO DUCA 1993

On January 28, 2005, Paul Lo Duca's #16 was honored by ASU Baseball. Lo Duca spent only one season in Tempe, but it was a memorable one. His .446 batting average in 1993 set the school's single season mark, helping him be named the National Player of the Year by *The Sporting News*. A hitting-machine, Lo Duca totaled 129 hits, 14 home runs and 88 RBI on his way to earning Co-Pac-10 Player of the Year honors. Lo Duca played 11 Major League seasons and was a four-time All-Star, including a starter in the 2006 game.



19 / FLOYD BANNISTER 1974-1976

January 18, 1997 was the day Floyd Bannister, one of the greatest pitchers in Sun Devil history, had his number honored by ASU. Bannister earned 38 wins during his ASU career, including a school record-tying 19 in 1976. He had a career ERA of 1.88 and is second in school history with his 478 career strikeouts. He was a member of two College World Series teams and was a First Team All-American in 1975 and 1976. The first overall pick in the 1976 MLB Draft by the Houston Astros, Bannister played 15 seasons and was named an All-Star in 1982. Floyd was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008.



21 / EDDIE BANE 1971-1973

Eddie Bane had his #21 honored by ASU on February 16, 2000. Bane is ASU's all-time strikeout leader, fanning 535 batters during his career. He is tied for third all-time in school history with 40 wins, and his 11 career shut outs helped him record a career ERA of 1.64. Bane is the only Sun Devil to ever throw a perfect game, turning the trick against Cal State-Northridge on March 2, 1973. A two-time All-American, Bane pitched in two College World Series'. Bane was a first-round pick of the Minnesota Twins in 1973 and played three seasons in the Majors. Eddie was inducted into the College baseball Hall of Fame in 2008 and was named a Rosenblatt Stadium Legend at the 2010 CWS.



24 / BARRY BONDS 1983-1985

On March 19, 1993, one of the greatest sluggers of all-time had his number honored by Arizona State. Barry Bonds hit 45 home runs during his Sun Devil career, fourth most in school history. An All-American in 1985, Bonds played in two College World Series, setting a record with hits in seven consecutive CWS at-bats. The seven-time National League MVP is baseball's all-time Home Run King with 762 round-trippers. He was named a Rosenblatt Stadium Legend during the 2010 College World Series.



24 / MIKE KELLY 1989-1991

Kelly's number 24 was honored on March 8, 2014, and was the last number to be honored at Packard Stadium. The first three-time All-American in ASU history, Kelly won the prestigious Golden Spikes Award in 1991 and was inducted into the ASU Hall of Fame in 2002. He earned consensus National Player of the Year honors in 1990 after becoming the fifth Sun Devil to join the 80-80 Club with 82 RBI and 83 runs scored. A career .350 hitter, his 46 home runs rank as the second most in ASU history. He was selected second overall in the 1991 MLB Draft by the Atlanta Braves and went on to play parts of six seasons on four different teams in the Major Leagues.



27 / RICK MONDAY 1965

Rick Monday's number 27 was honored by ASU on January 25, 1997. Monday made the most of his one varsity season in Tempe, earning National Player of the Year honors from The Sporting News for the 1965 National Champions. He hit .359 that year and blasted two home runs during the College World Series. Monday became the first ever player drafted by Major League Baseball, as he went #1 overall to the Kansas City A's in the first MLB Amateur Draft in 1965. He pitched 19 seasons in the Majors, twice earning All-Star Game appearances and winning a World Series in 1981 with the Los Angeles Dodgers.



44 / REGGIE JACKSON 1966


Perhaps the most clutch playoff performer in baseball history saw his number honored on January 13, 1990, as Mr. October Reggie Jackson was honored by the Sun Devils. Jackson came to ASU on a football scholarship and decided to walk-on to the 1966 baseball team. Reggie went on to win National Player of the Year honors, thanks to his .327 average and 15 home runs. He led the team in hits, runs and RBI and was drafted #2 overall by the Kansas City A's in the 1966 MLB Draft. He went on become a Hall-of-Fame player, hitting 10 World Series home runs, picking up two World Series MVP trophies and the 1973 AL MVP Award. He was inducted into the baseball Hall of Fame in 1993.
