FIRST MPSF WIN ON THE LINE

No. 10 Water Polo hosts No. 17 Indiana this weekend in a 1 p.m. tilt at Mona Plummer Aquatic Center. The two teams have faced off against one another one other time this season where the Maroon and Gold were able to seize the overtime victory at the Barbara Kalbus Invitational in San Deigo.

Both teams are on the hunt for their first conference play victory this season. ASU has gone head to head with then No. 3 UCLA and No. 1 Stanford so far this season and was unable to top either opponent.

Indiana has also had two conference matchups against then No. 2 USC and then No. 4 UCLA. Both matches had a 9+ goal differential and were on the road.

HISTORY VS THE HOOSIERS

It hasn't been too long since the Sun Devils and Hoosiers have gone head-to-head in regular season play. The two programs faced one another at the Barbara Kalbus Invitational in February when ASU was able to pull off the overtime victory to ultimately claim ninth place in the tournament. The Sun Devils lead the all-time history with 19 wins to the Hoosiers three and have won nine of the last ten matches. Arizona State has played Indiana at least twice every season since 2015.

THE RUNDOWN

- The Sun Devils return 11 from the previous season with Millie Quin leading the way in scoring with a career high 69 goals in 2024.
- Arizona State finished the 2024 season with a win after defeating Indiana in last seasons' MPSF Conference tournament.
- With 11 returners, the Sun Devils also boast 11 newcomers, including transfer Molly Glad who spent two seasons at USC before joining the Maroon and Gold.

LAST TIME OUT

- The Sun Devils have had a two week break since the last time they dove into the pool. Facing off against No. 1 Stanford, the Sun Devils were unsuccessful in upsetting number one. Quin, Almeda, and Sophie Shorter-Robinson combined for 12 points, but ultimately fell short of the win. Goaltender Sanne Keijzer allowed 18 goals for the Cardinal while making 9 saves.

IT'S A FAMILY MATTER

- The 2025 roster boasts two sets of sisters, junior Zoe Frangieh and freshman Karly Frangieh as well as redshirt junior Molly Glad and freshman Keri Glad.

WATER POLO HISTORY

- Originally established in 2002, the Maroon & Gold have an all-time record of 378-279.
- ASU boasts 30 All-Americans and have had at least one all-american in 18 straight seasons.

AROUND THE GLOBE

- The team has talent from all over the world, coming from six different countries totaling ten athletes. The countries are the Netherlands, Hungary, New Zealand, Spain, Canada, and Australia.
- Two freshmen represented their respective countries at the World Aquatics Women's U18 World Championships this past fall. Itziar Almeda took home gold, notching 16 goals throughout the tournament to help solidify the win for Spain. Keri Glad represented the United States and finished in fourth.

LOCAL TALENT

- Ashley Byron is from Chandler, Arizona and attended Corona Del Sol High School, seven miles from Tempe. She is the first Arizona native to rep the Maroon and Gold in program history.

MPSF LEADERS

- Millie Quin continues to top multiple stat categories for the MPSF. She sits in second for goals at 72 and points at 91. She is also fifth in steals with 26. Freshman Itziar Almeda is one of two underclassmen that represent the Sun Devils in the rankings. She currently sits in seventh for assists with 29. Freshman goaltender Keri Glad has a 61.96% save percentage which is fifth in the MPSF and sits in sixth for saves with 101. Sanne Keijzer is close behind at eighth with 72 saves. Senior Marie Rudasics is second for her save percentage at 67.31%.

2025 OVERVIEW

- Arizona State will host 12 home matches in Tempe along with a three-game home stand in March against fellow conference foes before two road MPSF matches.
- The Sun Devils will take part in five tournaments this year, two in Tempe, two in California, and one in the state of Hawaii.
- The postseason begins April 25-27 at the MPSF Tournament in Los Angeles.

BIO BLAST:

Petra Pardi was announced as head coach of Sun Devil Water Polo on May 18, 2022 and is an alumnae of the program and a two-time Arizona State graduate. Pardi ranks among the top of the Sun Devil record books, for goals scored (157), assists (71), and points (228). Pardi is one of 30 All-Americans in program history and served as team captain in her senior season. In August of 2018 she was promoted as assistant coach under Todd Clapper after earning her master's degree in Higher Education Administration and being a graduate assistant upon returning to ASU in 2016. Pardi was part of the 2014 NCAA tournament team, and was an assistant for the team that finished in third at the 2021 NCAA tournament. She played for the Hungarian national team and the youth, junior and senior levels before coming to Tempe.
