SUN DEVIL REWIND

This past weekend, the Sun Devils faced yet another obstacle this season starting with the series being postponed a day and then having to play without three key starters, including top power-play unit forward RYAN O'REILLY. JARROD GOURLEY and JACOB WILSON, two of the team's top-four defensemen, were also out for the series. An already thinned out offense then had to play game two without the nation's leading scorer MATTHEW KOPPERUD. The team has also been without WILLIE KNIERIM since the final game at Ohio State, COLE BRADY since the last time they met Minnesota, and SEAN DHOOGHE is likely out this weekend after taking a hit against Wisconsin. That brings the total to seven players out for this weekend's series.

Despite being shorthanded against the red-hot Badgers, the Sun Devils came back on Sunday scoring first with a power-play goal, but couldn't stop the Badgers from getting two on the power play shortly after. Wisconsin extended the lead in the middle frame before ASU came within one goal before they tallied two empty-net goals in the final minutes.

With the absence of **BRADY**, the team added junior goaltender **BRON-SON MOORE** to the roster, per protocol, in case of an emergency. **MOORE** played two seasons with ASU's Division I ACHA team where he posted a .909 save percentage and 3.16 goals against average.

CHINK IN THEIR ARMOR

The previously undefeated Golden Gophers have lost three out of the last four games since playing the Sun Devils, and have fallen to No. 4 in the USCHO rankings after sitting at No. 1 for four-straight weeks. Their first loss came at the hands of the Badgers, but they were able to split the series with a win the next night. This past weekend, Notre Dame was able to secure a road sweep against then-ranked No. 1 Minnesota and was the first team to do so this season.

Before playing ASU, Minnesota had never allowed more than two goals in a game with only nine goals against in nine games. The Sun Devils put together five goals on the weekend and were the first team to score more than three goals in a game on the nation's top-ranked defense. Despite the return of their top-three defenders from the 2021 IIHF World Junior Championship, the Golden Gophers have allowed 11 goals in the last four games while scoring nine.

OUOTES OF THE WEEK

- "I think the mood of the team is actually positive. One of my biggest responsibilities is to maintain perspective and to make sure these kids maintain perspective. We've talked a lot about no excuses and all those things, but we're still a program in our 5th full season as an NCAA team, going through what you could argue is the most difficult schedule in the history of college sports, in the most daunting task in the history of college sports is what we're doing. - "Obviously the three defensemen that they were missing are tremendous players, but it's funny how you know
 the game works. Sometimes when you're short-handed you have guys step up and do things that maybe are
 unexpected, and I think they had a good run without those guys, and with those guys back they're 1-3, so it's
 weird how it works. They're tremendously talented and well-coached team after they just got swept at home, so
 we're going to get their very best." -Head coach Greg Powers on facing Minnesota for the second time in three
 weeks

RETURN OF WALKER

- Senior forward JOHNNY WALKER, who entered the 2020-21 season as the active leader in goals scored in the NCAA, finally returned to the lineup at Minnesota after missing 10-straight games with an injury suffered in game two of the season at Michigan.
- After limited minutes in game one against the Gophers, WALKER returned to the top line and wasted no time
 making his presence felt with a highlight-reel, lacrosse-style goal -- made famous by Mike Legg at Michigan
 and Andrei Svechnikov of the Carolina Hurricanes -- to put the Sun Devils up 3-2 in the 2nd period. The play
 made for SportsCenter's top play of the day on Monday. The goal was WALKER's first of the season, and he
 managed several additional scoring chances on Monday night.
- Since his return, WALKER has tallied eight points over the last five games.

MISSING THEIR IMPACT

- Since the start of the season, four of the Sun Devils' six freshmen have seen significant playing time.
 Goaltender COLE BRADY, who recently departed the team due to non-COVID related sickness, has also seen nearly half the starts before his departure.
- Two of the Sun Devils' top three in points are freshman, including KOPPERUD at the top with 18 points and Detroit Red Wings' draft pick RYAN O'REILLY with 10 points. They rank 1st and T-12th in total points among NCAA freshmen.
- With 10 games to go, KOPPERUD is six points shy of the Sun Devil record for points by a freshman (24 set by JOHNNY WALKER in 2017-18). KOPPERUD is unfortunately out currently week-to-week due to injury.

POPULAR DESTINATION

- The Sun Devils have fallen fortunate to transfers since the program transitioned to Division I, including players like Dylan Hollman. Robbie Baillargeon. Wade Murphy and David Norris.
- In 2019-20, forwards JAMES SANCHEZ (Michigan) and WILLIE KNIERIM (Miami) made immediate impacts in their junior seasons. SANCHEZ led the entire team and became the first player in program history to reach 40 points in a season, while KNIERIM contributed 15 goals and was 5th in scoring for the Devils.
- While CHRIS GRANDO (Boston College) came in a season ago and had to sit out during the 2019-20 season due to transfer rules, he joins SEAN DHOOGHE (Wisconsin) and TANNER HICKEY (Alabama-Huntsville)
 -- all of which were key contributors to their respective programs before transferring -- as the 2020-21 transfers hoping to contribute to the Maroon & Gold transfer reputation.

DEVILS IN THE PROS

- Former netminder Joey Daccord, who helped catapult the program to its first NCAA Tournament berth, recently
 signed a three-year, two-way extension with the Ottawa Senators. Daccord was not only the first Sun Devil
 to sign an NHL contract, but play in the NHL as he made his debut on April 4, 2019. He was also the first Sun
 Devil committed to the program when getting drafted. He is currently on the Senators' taxi squad
- This past season, senior defenseman Brinson Pasichnuk became the program's second player to sign an NHL
 contract and first to sign a free agent deal. Pasichnuk signed with the San Jose Sharks for two years back in
 June, and is currently on the Sharks' taxi squad.
- Most recently in August, rising junior Josh Maniscalco signed a three-year free agent deal with the Pittsburgh Penguins and has recently been designated to the organization's AHL squad. Maniscalco recorded 11 goals and 21 assists last year and was ranked 6th among national defensemen in scoring.

WE GOT THE POWER(S)

Coach Powers enters his sixth season as the head coach of the Division I program in 2020-21, and his 13th overall at the helm at ASU. The two-time finalist for the Spencer Penrose National Coach of the Year led the program to its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 2018-19 and were on track for a repeat appearance in 2019-20 before COVID-19 ended the season. Under Powers, ASU became the fastest start-up collegiate hockey program to qualify for the postseason in 2018-19. At 21-13-1 and No. 10 in the Pairwise rankings, the Sun Devils made the largest jump in all of NCAA Division I year-to-year up from No. 53 at the end of 2017-18. During the 2013-14 season, Coach Powers helped guide the Sun Devils to their first-ever ACHA Division I National Championship. He holds a 240-129-29 career record at ASU.

Himself a Sun Devil, Powers graduated from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism in 1999 and was inducted into the ASU Hockey Player Hall of Fame in in 2009. Collegiately, Greg was a three-time ACHA Division I All-American Goaltender while playing for the Sun Devils under the tutelage of Hall of Fame Head Coach Gene Hammett. The Sun Devils qualified for three national championships during Powers' four-season collegiate career, and he was named Team MVP for the 1996-1997 and 1997-1998 seasons.



BREAKING GROUND

- On Wednesday, Dec. 16, Arizona State University and Sun Devil Athletics announced all required approvals have been received
 for the commencement of construction on a new Multi-Purpose Arena, which will host university and community events and serve
 as the future home for Sun Devil men's ice hockey, wrestling and women's gymnastics. This project continues the development of
 the Novus Innovation Corridor, and will be sited south of Rio Salado Parkway on the east side of Packard Drive, immediately north
 of the existing Packard Drive Parking Structure.
- Construction is scheduled to begin in January 2021, with full completion projected for December 2022.
- The 5,000-seat venue will be managed and operated by Oak View Group, SCI Architects have designed the arena, while Mortenson Construction will serve as the design builder.
- The second full-size ice sheet will also be accessible to students, the community and youth ice hockey programs at every level, providing an additional public sheet to one of the fastest-growing states for youth hockey participation in the country.
- The seating configuration for the Multi-Purpose Arena includes 20 luxury suites, two group suites, a large club lounge and event-level premium club seats. The club lounge will consist of a Center Ice Club on the main concourse that runs along center ice and can host up to 500 fans. On the 300-level, a social deck will run the length of the east side of the venue, providing an open-air, aerial view of the arena where fans can interact while still experiencing exceptional sightlines to the competition. The arena would also be able to serve as a backup for sports played on hardwood, such as volleyball.
- A 942-seat student section will occupy the entire west side of the venue to provide an enhanced gameday experience for ASU students.
- Over 8,000 square feet is set aside for a ASU state-of-the-art ASU locker room, weight room, lounge and coaches' offices on the
 north side of the arena. Eight additional locker rooms are accounted for on the west side of the arena between the main arena and
 community ice sheet that can be utilized for visiting teams, youth programs, ASU club programs, and live events.
