# **QUICK HITS**

- The Sun Devils lost their last four matches, two coming in five-set battles with Utah and Cal.
- Arizona State is looking to complete the season sweep over Oregon and Oregon State. Earlier this season in Tempe, ASU beat OSU in three sets and Oregon in five, the first time the Sun Devils beat both teams at home since 2006.
- Senior libero Courtney Leffel has a team-high 438 digs on the year. This season, she has had 20-plus digs in 10 matches.
- A pair of Sun Devil seniors are making their marks on the ASU record book. Leffel has moved into seventh place in career digs. She is currently at 1,400 digs in her career, 39 away from sixth place. Outside hitter Ivana Jeremic is closing in on 1,000 career kills, currently at 985 with six matches left in the regular season.
- Led by Leffel, ASU is ranked first in the Pac-12 in digs with 1,187. Leffel is ranked first in the conference in total digs and third in digs per set.
- The setting duties have been split this season between senior Callie Jones, sophomore Noa Miller and senior Nicole Peterson. Jones leads the trio in assists with 437.

# **Scouting the Opposition** Oregon State (9-16, 3-11 Pac-12)

OSU is on a five-match losing streak, the last win coming against Arizona on the road.
 Back in October, the Sun Devils swept the Beavers in Tempe. ASU has won two of the last three matchups, including a road win in 2018.

# Oregon (7-16, 3-11 Pac-12)

- The Ducks have lost three of their last four matches, two coming at home. They are 4-5 in Eugene this year.
- In the first matchup this season, Arizona State came back down 2-0 in the match to Oregon to win in five sets. The Sun Devils swept the Ducks in Eugene last season.

# **Players of the Week**

Two Sun Devils have earned Pac-12 weekly awards this season. Courtney Leffel was the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week on September 2 and Iman Isanovic was named the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week on October 21.

# Can You Dig It?

Senior libero Courtney Leffel is the 20th Sun Devil in program history to reach 1,000 career digs. All she needed was 39 and she totaled 83 over the three matches. Against LSU, she had 39 digs, good for ninth in a single match int he record books at ASU, seventh in the rally-scoring era. Her stellar performance at the Flo Hyman Collegiate Cup earned her the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week nod.

# **All-Tournament Players**

Courtney Leffel and Andrea Mitrovic were named to the Flo Hyman Collegiate Cup All-Tournament Team. Leffel was also named to the Fleur De Lis All-Tournament Team. Mitrovic and Kennedi Boyd earned the all-tournament nods at the OU Nike Invitational.

# **Road Warriors**

For the first four weekends of the season, Arizona State was on the road. ASU played in four tournaments, starting in Houston and ending in Las Vegas. This is the first time since 2016 with no home tournaments in the non-conference schedule. The first home match was on September 26.

# **New Kids On The Block**

There are nine new faces on the 2019 roster: six freshmen and three transfers. Of the six freshmen, three are liberos, one is an outside hitter and the other is a middle blocker. The transfers include two outside hitters and one setter.

# Serbia Squad

Serbia is well-represented on the 2019 Sun Devil roster. In addition to head coach Sanja Tomasevic, three players have Serbian ties. Senior Ivana Jeremic and redshirt sophomore Danica Krstonošic are from Serbia while junior Andrea Mitrovic, Canada natvie, has a strong Serbian heritage and speaks Serbian.

# Oh, Canada

Canadians Andrea Mitrovic and Megan Beedie spent their summers with Canadian national teams. Mitrovic made the Canadian National Team and traveled to multiple tournaments this season, including the Olympic qualification tournament. Beedie was part of the NextGen squad and most recently competed in the 2019 Pan American Games.

### 2019 Outlook

After seeing improvement in 2018, the Sun Devils look to take an even bigger leap in 2019. Arizona State finished the season at 14-18, 5-15 Pac-12. Following a tough 2017 season, the Sun Devils improved immensely, earning four more wins in the season total and five more in conference play. This has been the biggest improvement from season to season for an ASU team since 2012 when the nine 2011 wins jumped to 20.

Last season, the Sun Devils were ranked in the AVCA Coaches Poll at No. 25 on Oct. 8, the first time being ranked since 2015 when they reached as high as No. 5. They also received votes on Oct. 1 and 15. They got recognition nationwide after three ranked wins, all top-15 teams.

# Pac-12 Preseason Poll

The Sun Devils were picked to finish 11th in the Pac-12 preseason poll, ahead of Oregon State. ASU finished the 2018 season 11th as well. Reigning national champion Stanford was picked to win the conference again.




