UP NEXT

For the second time in three days, the Arizona State women's basketball team will face one of the top five teams in the nation when it hosts No. 3 and unbeaten Oregon State (15-0, 3-0 Pac-12) on Sunday (2 p.m. MST) at Desert Financial Arena.

Coming off a 72-66 upset of No. 2 Oregon on Friday night, the Sun Devils have an opportunity to achieve one of the most improbable accomplishments for an unranked team: Defeat the No. 2 and No. 3 teams in the nation in successive games. In both cases it would be against teams that – by most estimations – were next in line to be the nation's new No. 1 team when the polls are revealed on Monday.

In Friday's win over the Ducks, Robbi Ryan scored 11 of her team-high 17 points and Reili Richardson scored 10 of her 12 points in the fourth quarter to help the Sun Devils outscore the Ducks 30-14 in the final period and overcome a 12-point deficit. For the Sun Devils, it was their first win over the nation's No. 2 team since they defeated Stanford 70-63 in the championship game of the inaugural Pac-10 Tournament in 2002.

Sunday's game concludes a stretch in which the Sun Devils will have played four Top 25 teams – No. 18 Arizona, No. 10 UCLA (now No. 8), No. 2 Oregon and No. 3 Oregon State – in their first five conference games. ASU started the sequence with a 58-53 loss to Arizona (Dec. 30), which snapped ASU's season-best six-game winning streak. The Sun Devils followed that with a 68-66 loss at UCLA on Jan. 3. In both contests ASU was within two or fewer points in the final minute. ASU rebounded win a 63-54 win at USC last Sunday to pick up its first Pac-12 win.

ASU's success this season has been the product of a team effort as the Sun Devils have had eight different players who have led/tied for the team lead in scoring. As has been the case in years past, the Sun Devils have been especially effective both on the defensive end (29th in the nation in scoring defense) and at controlling the boards (3rd in the nation in offensive rebounds and 12th in rebounding margin).

Oregon State (15-0, 3-0 Pac-12) enters Sunday's game as one of only two unbeaten teams in the nation (fellow Pac-12 school and No. 8 UCLA is 15-0). The Beavers remained perfect after coming away with a 63-61 win at No. 18 Arizona on Friday. The Beavers are ranked among the top 10 in the nation in several statistical categories including field goal percentage (4th), rebounds per game (4th), rebound margin (4th), assists per game (7th) and field goal percentage defense (8th).

COVERAGE

Sunday's game vs. Oregon State will be televised by Pac-12 Network/ Arizona/Oregon (Cindy Brunson, Tammy Blackburn). The game can also be heard on KDUS AM 1060 and the Sun Devil Athletics TuneIn Channel. Coverage will start at 1:30 p.m. Veteran broadcaster and the state of Arizona's 2010 and 2019 Broadcaster of the Year Jeff Munn is in his 16th season as the voice of ASU women's basketball. He will be joined by former Sun Devil head coach Maura McHugh.

SERIES NOTES VERSUS OREGON STATE

ASU has won 25 of its last 34 and three in a row against OSU, but the Beavers have gotten the better of it in recent years with wins in seven of the last 10 meetings. ASU's 57-51 win in the 2018 Pac-12 Tournament quarterfinals snapped OSU's streak of seven straight wins. Robbi Ryan (12 points, 4-8 FGs/4-4 FTs) and former Sun Devils Courtney Ekmark (game-high 18 points, 5-7 3-point FGs) and Kianna Ibis (14 points, career-high 14 rebounds) combined to score 44 of ASU's 57 points in the win. Last year ASU swept Oregon State for the first time since 2011 and became the first Pac-12 team to accomplish the feat since 2013 after defeating OSU 79-76 (2OT) in Corvallis and 66-54 in Tempe. Ibis (24.0. ppg vs. OSU last season) averaged 18.5 points and made 94 percent of her FGs (15-16) in the second half and OT of the two wins.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- The Sun Devils come into Friday's game ranked among the top 40 in the nation in offensive rebounds per game (3rd/17.5 rpg), rebound margin (12th/+10.9) and scoring defense (29th/55.9).
- ASU is ranked among the top third in the Pac-12 in offensive rebounds per game (1st/17.8 rpg), rebounding defense (2nd/31.8 rpg), rebounding margin (3rd/+10.9), steals (3rd/10.2 spg) and scoring defense (4th/55.9 ppg), 3-point FG pct. defense (4th/27.2), turnover margin (4th/+3.8).
- ASU individual leaders in the Pac-12: **Ja'Tavia Tapley:** 9th in rebs/7.2 rpg, 10th in FT pct./65.2, 19th in scoring/11.8 ppg; **Reili Richardson:** 18th in the nation and 4th in the Pac-12 in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.7); 15th in assists (3.3 apg), **Jayde Van Hyfte:** 2nd in offensive rebs/3.6 rpg, 18th in rebs/6.2 rpg; **Eboni Walker:** 6th in offensive rebs/2.8 rpg; **Kiara Russell:** 12th in steals (1.5 spg).
- On average, ASU's bench has outscored the opponent's reserves 28.6-9.1. Walker is averaging 7.9 points and shooting 63 percent (24-38 FGs) in ASU's last six games and Ruden is averaging 7.4 ppg in the five games she's played since returning from injury.
- ASU has outrebounded all but two of its opponents (USC, Oregon). It has scored 15 or more second chance points six times, including a season-high 32 vs. Army. Van Hyfte (57 of 99) and Walker (44 of 70) both have more offensive than defensive rebounds.
- In its last six games, ASU has averaged 10.7 turnovers per game, 5.2 fewer turnovers than it averaged in its first 10 games (15.9). Reili Richardson (23 A, 7 TO), Kiara Russell (17 A, 8 TO), and Iris Mbulito (18 A, 6 TO) have combined for 58 assists and only 21 turnovers in the last six games.
- Through four games of Pac-12 play ASU is shooting more than nine percentage points higher from the FT line (74.5) than it did in the first 12 games (65.3).
- Robbi Ryan has scored a season-high 17 points twice in ASU's last three games.
- Richardson is currently in 2nd place on ASU's all-time list for career assists (508). She needs 27 assists to pass Briann January and become ASU's all-time assists leader (534/2006-09).
- ASU has allowed 13 or fewer points in quarter 30x (13x in single-digits).
- ASU has scored 20 or more points off turnovers eight times (8-0 in those games), including a season-high 36 vs. Army (Nov. 10).
- Graduate transfer Ja'Tavia Tapley has proven to be a dominant presence thus far. She has played in every game (14 starts) and currently leads the team in scoring (11.8 ppg), rebounds (7.2) and free throws made (41) and attempted (63), is 2nd in steals (1.4 spg), 3rd in FG pct. (48.7) and 4th in assists (1.7 apg).
- With senior post Jamie Ruden's return from injury in ASU's contest vs. Creighton (Dec. 20), Charli Turner Thorne had every player on ASU's roster available to play for the first time this season. After starting the first two games, Ruden missed ASU's next nine games, including its losses at Minnesota and vs. Purdue. Senior guards Kiara Russell (three games) and Robbi Ryan (1.5 games) and sophomore guard Jamie Loera (13 games) have also missed time due to either injury or illness.



POLLS

Both the coaches and media picked ASU to finish fifth in the Pac-12. ASU was ranked 20th in the preseason AP poll and 18th in the USA Today Sports Coaches Poll. ASU moved up one spot to 19th in the AP poll after opening with a pair of double-digit wins over Air Force and Army. It fell out of both polls after their 80-66 setback at Minnesota on Nov. 17. ASU is currently receiving votes in both the AP and coaches polls.

GRAD TRANSFER JA'TAVIA TAPLEY HAS IMMEDIATE IMPACT

The Sun Devil women's basketball team added a strong post player during the offseason when Charli Turner Thorne announced that Ja'Tavia Tapley was joining the program as a grad transfer from USC. A 6-3 forward, Tapley started 41 games at USC the last three seasons, including 26 contests during the 2018-19 season.

Tapley has already provided the Sun Devils with a strong presence on both ends of the floor as she currently leads the team in scoring (11.8 ppg), rebounds (7.2) and free throws made (41) and attempted (63), is 2nd in steals (1.4 spg), 3rd in FG pct. (48.7) and 4th in assists (1.7 apg). Tapley scored 11 points and led team with eight rebounds in her first appearance as a Sun Devil in season opener vs. Air Force (Nov. 5). She followed that with a (then) career-high 18 points to go with six rebounds, four steals and two assists in 15 minutes of play in win over Army (Nov. 10). Two weeks later, Tapley raised her career mark in scoring to 23 points in ASU's win over Cal Poly (Nov. 24). She came through with outstanding performance in win vs. BYU (Dec. 6), accounting for 11 points, career-high 18 rebounds (most by a Sun Devil in more than 20 years) and a career-high 5 assists. She had her third-straight double-double (12 points, 12 rebounds) vs. New Mexico (Dec. 14).

Tapley started 26 of 30 games in 2018-19 and averaged 6.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per game. She scored in double figures four times and pulled down seven or more rebounds 10 times. Tapley averaged 12.0 points in USC's two games against Colorado, accounting for a career-high 14 points in the first meeting. Against Pac-12 champion and Final Four participant Oregon, Tapley had 13 points and seven boards. She posted season highs in rebounds (nine) and steals (four) against NCAA Tournament participant Texas A&M.

REILI RICHARDSON GUIDES NEAR FLAWLESS ATTACK

One of the biggest reasons for ASU's outstanding execution on the offensive end over the last three seasons is the play of senior guard Reili Richardson. In 2018, Richardson's exceptional play at the point helped the Sun Devils shatter the school record for fewest turnovers per game (11.3). Richardson concluded the 2017-18 season ranked No. 4 in the nation and first in the Pac-12 in assist-to-TO ratio (3.46). Last season Richardson finished No. 4 in the nation and No. 1 in the Pac-12 in assist-to-turnover ratio and led the team and finished 6th in the Pac-12 in assists (5.0 apg). Richardson is currently in second place on ASU's all-time list for career assists (508). She needs 27 assists to pass Briann January (534/2006-09) and become ASU's all-time assists leader. As effective as she has been as a distributor, Richardson has been just as effective scoring the basketball. She ignited ASU's comeback in its win over BYU (Dec. 6), scoring 12 of her (then) season-high 15 points in the 3rd quarter after ASU fell behind by 12 points. Against New Mexico (Dec. 14), Richardson established new career highs for scoring (21 points) and 3-pointers (5). During ASU's recent six-game winning streak, Richardson averaged 10.3 ppg & connected on 42 percent (14-33) of her 3-ptrs. In ASU's 72-66 of No. 2 Oregon, Richardson scored 10 of her 12 points in the final quarter.

DOMINANT DEVIL DEFENSE

- Last season ASU led the Pac-12 in scoring defense (58.2 ppg). It was the second straight season and the third time in five years that ASU has led the Pac-12 in scoring defense.
- ASU has allowed an average of only 56.8 ppg since the start of the 2014-15 season (a span of 185 games). It has held the opposition to 50 or less points 58 times during that stretch (including four times this season). They are 57-1 in those contests. The only loss came at home to Cal (50-49) on Feb. 8, 2015. Over that same stretch (185 games), ASU has allowed the opposition to make only 28.7 percent of its attempts from long range.
- As of Jan. 11, ASU is 29th in the nation in scoring defense (55.9 ppg).
- ASU has allowed 13 or fewer points in quarter 30 times this season (13x in single-digits).
- The 31 points scored by Maine on Nov. 29, 2019 represented the fewest given up by ASU since Harvard scored 29 on December 14, 2015.
- Last season ASU held each of its Pac-12 opponents below its scoring average: UA (-25.4), Utah (-16.1), CU (-1.2), Stan (-8.5), Cal (-10.6), UO (-14.1), OSU (-5.7 in 2OTs), UCLA (-9.6), USC (-8.1 ppg), UA (-24.0), WSU (-21.3), CU (-17.9), Utah (-17.6), Cal (-0.9), Stan (-5.0), OSU (-23.4), UO (-22.0).
- Outstanding team defense helped ASU make the greatest comeback in school history last season. Against Utah on Feb. 17, 2019, ASU held the Utes to only 3 points in the 4th quarter allowing the Sun Devils to rally from 18 down with a 20-0 run in the last 7:45 to win 60-58.

NON-CONFERENCE RECAP (10-2)

ASU started the 2019-20 campaign with pair of double-digit home wins, defeating Air Force 87-56 (Nov. 5) and Army 83-51 (Nov. 10). Leading the way were grad transfer senior post Ja'Tavia Tapley (14.5 ppg, 7.0 rpg) and freshman post Jayde Van Hyfte (12.0 ppg, 6.0 rpg), who combined to average 26.5 ppg/13.0 rpg shot a collective 65.6 percent from the floor. ASU came up short in its first road contest of the season, falling at Minnesota 80-66 (Nov. 17), the first of nine games missed by starting senior center Jamie Ruden. ASU struggled from the floor, hitting only 34 percent of its shots against the Gophers. Tapley (16 points), sophomore guard Taya Hanson (career-high 14 points), Richardson (10 points) and senior guard Robbi Ryan (10 points) all scored in

ASU rebounded with a 66-41 win over Cal Poly on Nov. 24. For the second time in three games, Tapley posted a career-high in scoring with 23 points

ASU spent Thanksgiving weekend in Estero, Fla., where it won two of three games - defeated Maine (57-31) and Middle Tennessee (61-60), lost to Purdue

(59-52) – at the Gulf Coast Showcase. Hanson (9.3 ppg), Ryan (8.3 ppg), Tapley (7.3 ppg) and Walker (7.3 ppg) were ASU's top scorers for the weekend. Van Hyfte was ASU's leading rebounder (7.7 rpg). Van Hyfte (6-9/66.7 pct.) and Walker (10-20/50 pct.) combined to shoot 55 pct for the weekend.

A three-game homestand started with a pair of hard-fought wins over BYU (60-52 on Dec. 6) and Idaho State (74-69 in OT on Dec. 8). Tapley recorded double-doubles in both games (13.0 ppg/14.5 rpg) to lead ASU. Her 18 rebounds against BYU were the most by a Sun Devil in a single game in more than 20 years. Richardson had a (then) season-high 15 points against BYU and senior guard Kiara Russell had a career-high 14 points against ISU.

A sweep of the New Mexico schools followed as ASU defeated New Mexico at home 84-47 (Dec. 14) before going on the road to beat NMSU 70-47. Richardson (21 points) and freshman Sara Bejedi (16 points) both posted career highs against the Lobos while Tapley (12 points/12 rebs) recorded her third-straight double-double. Against NMSU, Walker scored a team/season-high 13 points while Tapley added 11 points.

ASU closed non-conference play with its sixth-straight win, a 70-55 triumph over Creighton, which came into the game No. 7 in the NCAA RPI. The highlight of the win was the return of Ruden, who showed little rust, scoring 11 points (5-9 FGs) after missing the previous nine games.

WHERE WE STARTED

The Sun Devils finished 15th in the nation in 2018-19, setting school records for consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances (six) and 20-win seasons (six). ASU won a pair of games in the 2019 NCAA Tournament and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the fifth time since 2005.

The Sun Devils returned two starters this season in the form of guards Reili Richardson (started 89 of 101 games entering 2019-20) and Robbi Ryan (started 74 of 101 games entering 2019-20). ASU's three-year starter at point guard, Richardson concluded the 2018-19 season No. 4 in the nation and No. 1 in the Pac-12 in assist-to-turnover ratio and led the team and finished 6th in the Pac-12 in assists (5.0 apg). She started the 2019-20 season in third place on ASU's all-time list for career assists (456). Ryan, who earned All-Pac-12 honorable mention and Pac-12 All-Defensive honorable mention recognition from the league's coaches in 2018, started every game in 2018-19 and concluded the season second on the team in 3-pointers (29), third in scoring (7.2 ppg) and assists (1.8 apg) and fifth in rebounds (2.5 rpg). Sophomore guards Taya Hanson and Iris Mbulito both competed internationally over the summer for the second straight season. Representing Canada at the FIBA U19 World Cup in Thailand, Hanson averaged 10.7 points in the tournament's seven games and led Canada in its final contest with 15 points. Mbulito, who earned Pac-12 All-Freshman honorable mention honors last season, helped Spain claim a fifth-place finish at the FIBA U20 European Championship held in the Czech Republic. Mbulito averaged 10.4 points, 5.1 rebounds and 4.7 assists (second among all players) in the seven games. Also returning for ASU in the backcourt are senior Kiara Russell and sophomore Jamie Loera. Russell, who has 95 games of experience under her belt, finished second on the team in assists (2.2 apg) and fifth in FG pct. (45.7) last season. Despite being limited to 11 games last season, Loera still had an impact as ASU's leader in 3-point FG percentage (50.0/9-18).

The frontcourt is where the Sun Devils lost the most from last year's team as the squad is having to replace its top three scorers and rebounders. Returning posts for the Sun Devils include senior Jamie Ruden (averaged 6.1 ppg in 78 career games), junior Bre'yanna Sanders and sophomore Jayde Van Hyfte.

The Sun Devils started the new campaign with four newcomers. Senior post Ja'Tavia Tapley brought her talents to ASU after being a strong contributor for USC where she started 41 games the last three seasons (26 starts in 2018-19). Also debuting for the Sun Devils were freshman post Eboni Walker (state of Nevada's Gatorade Player of the Year in 2019) and freshman guards Sydnei Caldwell (2019 McDonald's All-American Game nominee from the state of New Jersey) and Sara Bejedi, who represented Finland at the World University Games in July 2019 and finished third among all players in scoring (16.2 ppg), second in steals (3.0 spg) and tied for third in 3-pointers per game (2.7).

BENCH PRODUCTION

Last season the Sun Devil bench more than doubled the production of the opposition's bench (23.2-11.4), an improvement over the prior season

when ASU had a 22.5-12.1 edge. Thus far in 2019-20, ASU has outscored the opposition's reserves 28.6-9.1. Providing the Sun Devils with productive minutes off the bench have been freshman post Eboni Walker (6.8 ppg, 4.4 rpg), freshman guard Sara Bejedi (5.3 ppg) and sophomore guard Iris Mbulito (4.8 ppg, 3.2 rpg, 2.4 apg). Since returning from injury, Jamie Ruden has averaged 7.4 ppg (3rd on team during that stretch).

NIKKI BLUE JOINS SUN DEVIL WBB COACHING STAFF

Former UCLA All-American and Washington Mystics guard Nikki Blue was named assistant coach last April. Blue joined Charli Turner Thorne's staff from nearby Grand Canyon University where she was the top assistant and recruiting coordinator the last two seasons. In that position she oversaw the program's domestic and international recruiting, scouting and planning. In her first season on staff, Blue's guidance was instrumental in guard Brie Mobley earning All-WAC first-team recognition. Blue arrived at GCU after spending three seasons as the top assistant at CSU Bakersfield, where she was part of a staff that helped the Roadrunners to a 2014 postseason appearance with 23 wins. Before Bakersfield, Blue spent six years as an assistant coach at UNLV, where she helped the Rebels land the Nevada Player of the Year out of high school and develop the Mountain West Conference Freshman of the Year in 2008. As a player, Blue had a decorated career at UCLA where she earned Pac-10 first-team honors four times and was named a WBCA All-American in 2006. During her time at UCLA she played an integral role in leading the Bruins to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances and the 2006 Pac-10 Tournament title.

Blue was drafted by the WNBA's Washington Mystics in 2006. She played four seasons with the Mystics and one with the New York Liberty before playing two seasons internationally with FIBA (one in Turkey and one in Greece).

INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

Over the summer three Sun Devils – sophomores Taya Hanson and Iris Mbulito and freshman Sara Bejedi – participated in international competitions.

Taya Hanson was one of 12 athletes representing Canada at the FIBA U19 Women's Basketball World Cup 2019 in Bangkok, Thailand (July 20-28). Mbulito represented Spain at the FIBA U20 European Championship being held Aug. 3-11 in the Czech Republic. Bejedi just played for Finland at the World University Games in Italy, finishing third among all players in scoring (16.2 ppg), second in steals (3.0 spg) and tied for third in 3-pointers per game (2.7).

During the summer of 2018, Hanson, Mbulito and senior Kiara Russell all played in international competitions and were part of teams that won medals. Mbulito earned Most Valuable Player honors as she helped Spain claim the gold medal at the 2018 FIBA U20 Women's European Championship in Sopron, Hungary. Mbulito posted a double-double (21 points, 12 rebounds) in the championship game in leading Spain to a convincing 69-50 win over Serbia. Mbulito, who had the game-winning basket with five seconds remaining in Spain's 51-50 quarterfinal win over France, averaged 9.7 points, 7.7 rebounds (team high), 2.4 assists and 1.6 steals in the tournament (seven games). She also recorded a double-double (12 points, 12 rebounds) in the win over France.

Russell was a member of the U.S. team that won the gold at the FISU America Games. Russell was part of a squad that defeated its four opponents – Mexico, Uruguay, Chile and Brazil – by an average of 43.8 points. The USA claimed the gold with a 59-42 win in the championship game. The FISU America Games are a multi-sport event sanctioned by the International University Sports Federation (FISU).

Hanson averaged 11.5 points, 4.8 rebounds and 1.7 steals in helping lead Canada to a silver medal at the FIBA U18 Women's Americas Championship. Hanson came one rebound short of a double-double (14 points, nine rebounds) in Canada's opening game of the tournament against Colombia. She would surpass that performance with a 16-point, 11-rebound outing in Canada's quarterfinal victory over Chile. Canada won its first five contests by an average of 23.2 points before falling to the USA in the gold medal game.

GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

- Six Sun Devils were named to the 2019 Pac-12 Women's Basketball All-Academic teams. Headlining the list for ASU was Jamie Ruden, who earned first-team honors for the second consecutive year. Ruden (4.00 GPA in Psychology) was also named to the Google Cloud CoSIDA Academic All-District® VIII Second Team for the second straight year. ASU also had five players named Pac-12 honorable mention recognition: senior F Kianna Ibis, senior C Charnea Johnson-Chapman and guards Reili Richardson, Kiara Russell and Robbi Ryan.
- A league-high and school-record-tying eight Sun Devil WBB players were named to the Pac-12 Women's Basketball All-Academic teams in 2018. The eight awards tied the school record for most student-athletes on the Pac-12's All-Academic Team. The 2006-07 team also had eight (two on first team, one on second team and five honorable mention).
- In 2017 ASU finished among the nation's best in combined team GPA. With a final team GPA of 3.672 for the 2016-17 academic year the Sun Devils finished fifth in the nation (the highest ranking in program history) among Division I institutions in the WBCA's annual Academic Top 25.


- The winningest coach in ASU women's basketball history and No. 2 in the Pac-12 in most career wins (456), Charli Turner Thorne is at the helm of an Arizona State program that has made it to the postseason 19 of the last 20 years, including a school record six consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances (2014-19), two Elite Eight appearances and three Sweet 16 finishes. ASU's 14 NCAA Tournament appearances under Turner Thorne are 11 more than what ASU had in the 15 years prior to her arrival in Tempe. Has also earned a pair of gold medals with USA Basketball.
- The 2019-20 season is Turner Thorne's 23rd at ASU. She has 496 career wins in 26 seasons (includes 40 wins/three seasons at Northern Arizona).
- In 2018-19, Turner Thorne led ASU to a school record sixth consecutive NCAA appearance and 20-win season. The Sun Devils captured a pair of wins in the 2019 NCAA Tournament and advanced to the Sweet 16.
- In 2017-18, ASU matched the school record for consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances (five) and consecutive 20-win seasons (five). ASU won 22 games and made it to the second round of the NCAA Tournament while posting four Top 25 wins, including a 57-51 upset of No. 10 Oregon State in the quarterfinals of the Pac-12 Tournament.
- In 2018 the Sun Devils also matched the school record with eight student-athletes named to the Pac-12's All-Academic Teams. ASU's No. 5 finish (3.672) on the WBCA's 2017 Academic Honor Roll represented the second time in three seasons the Sun Devils were among the top 10 programs in the country after placing seventh (3.558) for the 2014-15 academic year. Since the 1996-97 season, Turner Thorne's first season at ASU, the Sun Devils lead the Pac-12 in the number of first-team All-Academic conference awards (22) and the combined number of first- and second-team All-Academic conference awards (46).
- Despite injuries to key personnel and a young backcourt, Turner Thorne led ASU to its fourth-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance (12th during ASU tenure) and fourth-consecutive 20-win season (12th during ASU tenure) in 2017. The Sun Devils made it to the second round of NCAAs where they came up just short of upsetting eventual national champion South Carolina as the Sun Devils took a lead going into the final minute of the game.
- Was named the 2016 Pac-12 Coach of the Year (coaches and media), the second time she has been recognized with the honor (2001), after leading the Sun Devils to their second regular season Pac-12 championship. ASU would go on to earn its highest NCAA Tournament seed (No. 2) in program history. In 2016 ASU also tied the program records for most conference wins (16) and consecutive wins (15) and set the program record for most road wins (11).
- In 2014-15 Turner Thorne led ASU to 29 wins (second-highest total in school history), a second-place finish in the Pac-12 and a berth in the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. The 2014-15 Sun Devils posted the best overall start (18-1) and conference start (7-0) in school history and reached 20 wins faster than any other squad (22 games).
- In 2013-14, ASU recorded its 10th 20-win season (23) and its ninth NCAA Tournament berth since 2000-01. The Sun Devils advanced to the second round of the Tournament, the seventh time under Turner Thorne the Sun Devils have been among the final 32 teams or better.
- In 2011 led ASU to its sixth NCAA Tournament appearance in seven years and a third-place finish in the Pac-10, ASU's ninth top-3 conference finish in 11 seasons.
- In 2009 guided ASU to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the second time in three seasons. ASU's final 26-9 record in 2008-09 included a school record 15-game winning streak (tied by 2016-17 team).
- In 2006-07 guided the Sun Devils to a school record 31 wins, including a school record 16 Pac-10 wins, and led them to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. ASU concluded the 2006-07 season ranked No. 8 in the final USA Today/ESPN coaches poll and No. 10 in the final Associated Press poll, their highest FINAL rankings in each of the respective polls in school history.
- In 2005-06 led ASU to a 25-7 record. During the season led ASU to its first Top 10 ranking in 22 years.





HEAD COACH CHARLI TURNER THORNE

- In 2004-05 directed ASU to a 24-10 record and its first NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance in 22 years.
- Led her 2001-02 team to a 25-9 record, which at the time had tied the single-season school record for most wins.
- Guided ASU to a share of the Pac-10 title in 2001 and the inaugural Pac-10 Tournament title in 2002, the first league championships in school history.
- Started her head coaching career at Northern Arizona where she spent three seasons (40-40 record from 1992/93 1995/96) and led NAU to consecutive winning seasons in 1994-95 and 1995-96, the first coach in school history to accomplish the feat.
- As a player, lettered four years at Stanford where she played three years under Tara VanDerveer.
- During the summer of 2009 Turner Thorne served as the head coach of the USA Women's World University Games Team which went undefeated (7-0) and captured the gold medal at the 2009 World University Games in Belgrade, Serbia. It was Turner Thorne's second time working with USA Basketball. In the summer of 2007 Turner Thorne served as an assistant coach on USA Basketball's U21 World Championship Team which won the gold medal at the FIBA U21 World Championship in Moscow, Russia.
- Is a past president of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's (WBCA) Executive Committee.
- Graduated from Stanford in 1988 with a bachelor's degree in psychology and later earned her master's degree in education from Washington in 1990.
- Turner Thorne and her husband, Will, have three sons Conor (20), Liam (18) and Quinn (16).






