ACES

- Sophomore libero **Grace Massey** was named Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week following the opening week of the season. Massey accumulated a conference-high 65 digs at the Iowa State Challenge and was named as a tournament co-MVP.
- Freshman setter **Maddie Sheehan** was named as the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week following the SDSU/USD Challenge. Sheehan tied her career-high with 44 assists and added career-bests with six kills and five blocks in a win over No. 23 San Diego.
- Senior **Kayla Ellis** once again moved up OSU's all-time rankings to fourth with 1,313 career digs passing Shelly Smith (1991-94) in the match against Washington. She within striking distance of third (Tricia Becker, 1,483) late in the season.

ON THE SIDELINE

- Senior **Kory Cheshire** is out for the season due to an undisclosed injury.
- Senior outside hitter **Shekinah Clarke** will miss the remainder of the season due to a knee injury.
- Both will apply for another year of eligibility and intend to return to the program in 2019.
- **Haylie Bennett** suffered an injury in the match at Oregon (9/20) and is considered week-to-week.

OFF THE SIDELINE

- Freshman outside hitter **Kyla Waiters** made her collegiate debut in Sunday's match against Washington (9/23). Waiters came on midway through the fifth set when the Beavers were seeking a spark.

AGAINST THE WILDCATS

- The Beavers is 17-47 in the series with Arizona. OSU swept the Wildcats twice in 2017 and have won three straight and four of the last five meetings.

AHEAD OF THE PAC

- The Beavers rank second in the Pac-12 with 2.91 blocks per set in 2018. Middle blocker **Lindsey Schell** ranks second in the conference with 1.40 blocks per set. In addition, **Maddy Gravley** (1.13), **Serena Bruin** (1.00) and **Haylie Bennett** (1.00) all average at least a block per set.
- Libero **Grace Massey** ranks fourth in the Pac-12 with 4.70 digs per set. She has recorded a season-high 29 digs in two of the Beavers' last four matches.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAMS

- SDSU/USD Challenge - **Amy Underdown** was chosen as the MVP after leading the team in kills in each match as the Beavers went 3-0 including a five-set upset of No. 23 San Diego. **Maddy Gravley** was also named to the all-tournament team.
- K-State Invitational - **Haylie Bennett** and **Maddie Sheehan** were named to the all-tournament team.
- Iowa State Challenge - **Maddie Goings** and **Lindsey Schell** were each named to the Iowa State Challenge All-Tournament Team and **Grace Massey** was selected as a tournament co-MVP on the season's opening weekend.

Initiated in 2011, **Beavers without Borders** is a program that offers global service-learning experiences for student-athletes at Oregon State University.

The program has successfully completed eight service projects including trips to Guatemala, Macedonia, Ethiopia, Costa Rica and most recently the Dominican Republic.

Throughout those trips, over 100 student-athletes were able to experience life in a distinct culture, learn about the impact of their work on a community and interact outside of the university context to maximize the intercultural experience.

This year marked the second-straight year that Oregon State Athletics has sponsored two Beavers Without Borders trips. In June, 12 athletes made the trip to the Dominican Republic, with another 12 heading to Guatemala in August. The full list is below:

MARK BARNARD

Head Coach • 3rd Year
14th Year at Oregon State

Mark Barnard enters his third season as the head volleyball coach at Oregon State in 2018. Barnard was elevated to the position on June 27, 2016, after 11 seasons as an assistant coach and associate head coach with the Beavers.

Year two of the Barnard era included a nine-win improvement from 2016 to 2017, the fourth NCAA Tournament berth in program history and the first five-match conference win streak since 1990 – and the Beavers did it twice. In addition, OSU notched the first weekend sweeps of the Washington and Arizona schools since 1990 and 1996 respectively and we on to complete the season sweeps of those schools for the first time since 1984 and 1990.

Mary-Kate Marshall earned All-America honors for the third time in her career while setter Kylee McLaughlin garnered Pac-12 Freshman of the Year honors and AVCA Pacific North Region Freshman of the Year accolades. In 2017, Marshall became the first OSU player ever to be named Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week on three occasions and earned all-conference first team honors. McLaughlin collected all-conference honorable mention while Maddie Goings and McLaughlin were named to the Pac-12 All-Freshman Team. Kory Cheshire and Laneshia Reagan were recognized as Pac-12 All-Academic Second Team selections along with three teammates receiving honorable mention.

In Barnard's initial season leading the Beavers, OSU recorded 12 wins, doubling the program's win total from a year before. Marshall became the first two-time All-American in program history. She was also named All-Pac-12 First Team, and she and six other teammates were honored academically by the conference. That included second team selections Cheshire and Reagan.

Barnard, who oversaw the team's setters and offense during his tenure under former head coach Taras Liskevych, has mentored some of the top student-athletes in program history. Most recently, in 2014, Tayla Woods concluded her Oregon State career with 3,153 assists, which ranks fourth all-time. Woods was teammates for two seasons with Megan McBride, whose 2,605 career assists ranks seventh.

In 2014, the Beavers, under Liskevych and Barnard, advanced to their first ever Sweet 16, defeating UALR and Creighton en route. OSU was led offensively by Marshall, who was named the Pac-12 Conference's Freshman of the Year.

A native of Sydney, Australia, Barnard helped mentor fellow Australian and All-American Rachel Rourke from 2006-09. She concluded her career with a program-best 1,920 kills. Rourke is the program's first and only back-to-back all-conference performer, doing so in 2008 and 2009.

Barnard joined the Oregon State program on July 22, 2005 as an assistant coach under Liskevych. He was promoted to associate head coach in July 2008 after three seasons in Corvallis.

Barnard had International experience prior to his appointment as head coach. He was an assistant for the National Team from 1997-00, including the Sydney Olympics.

During that time, he also served as head coach of the women's national junior team (1999-2000) and women's national youth team (1997-99). In 2001, Barnard led the National Team of Australia to its first qualification to the World Championships in over 20 years. At its height, the Australian team was ranked No. 12 in the world.

He was prolific as an athlete as well, playing on the 1984 Australian Junior Men's Team. He also competed on New South Wales Junior Teams from 1982 through 87, three times winning the National Championships and was an All-Australian 12 selection.

Barnard is a 1991 graduate of the University of Sydney with a degree in Education and Science. Mark and his wife, Louise, have two children, Isabella, and Alexander.
